School Starts Next Thursday!

Remember hearing about how school was going to start later in the year since the Legislature passed a bill about that a few years ago? Well, the Legislature changed that, under pressure from the education system - so school starts here on Thursday, and registration is ongoing at all county schools.

Elementary and middle schools throughout the district (except IMS) will have open house/registration Tuesday evening, August 5, from 3 to 7. There will be information pertinent to each school given out then, but some important district-wide facts are:

- Parents must submit two proofs of

residence (drivers license, utility bill, etc.) for each child for registration.

- Seventh graders must have an updated TDAP immunization, and you have to submit the form to the school.
- School meal prices have increased to \$2.50 for lunch and \$1 for breakfast.

books.

- School supply lists, for applicable grades, are on the school website at www.tishomingo.k12.ms.us.

Brooks Will Open Tupelo Location in 2015

One of Iuka's most successful businesses is branching out to build a location in West Tupelo, and the groundbreaking for the new Brooks Grocery was this week.

Brooks and Lisa Davis have operated Brooks Grocery in Iuka since 2011, when they converted the former Nelson's Supermarket into their own store. The years since, Brooks has made a name for itself with its "fresh food-friendly service" and that they do well to provide a day, and a strong commitment to community support.

They are carrying the successful business model to west Tupelo, where they plan to build a 27,000-square foot store at the corner of West Jackson and Col. Road. Davis saw a void in the area, with lots of "rooftops" and grocery stores in the immedi-



ate vicinity for a growing section of Tupelo.

The success of the Iuka store, with a wonderful staff of employees, is the reason we can do this, explained Davis.

"At the groundbreaking last week, it was a showcase and reflection of what we have here, with our great team, and the service they provide," said Davis.

Recounting the welcoming speeches given by the speakers at the groundbreaking, including Tupelo's mayor, Jason Shel-

ton, and Community Development Foundation President/CEO David Rumbarger, Brooks said that several of them have shopped at Brooks Grocery in Iuka (they have houses at Pickwick Lake) and the level of service and quality of products impressed them.

The development will include a 3,000 square foot AT&T store. The Brooks Tupelo store will employ about 70 people and will be open in early 2015.

Local Races on November 4th Ballot

After a contentious primary season that some say still isn't over, some may be glad to turn attention to the November 4th general election, as there will be a couple local races on the ballot, in addition to the congressional, and court positions.

School Board

For Tishomingo County School Board, the 1st District and 5th District seats are up for election and qualifying dates are August 6th through September 5th to be on the November ballot.

For school board, candidates must have a high school diploma, and a petition with 50 signatures of qualified electors from their district. Qualifying papers may be picked up at the Circuit Clerk's office beginning August 6th. The candidate with the highest number of votes on November 4th will be elected.

Election Commissioners

Special elections will be held for election commissioners for the 4th District and 2nd

District on November 4th to fulfill the unexpired terms of Geneva Ware (4th), and Mary Sue Wright (2nd).

If a run-off is necessary, it will be November 25th. Qualifying papers are now available at the Tishomingo County Circuit Clerk's office in the courthouse. The deadline to qualify is Friday, September 5th, 2014.

Chasity George, currently the appointed interim election commissioner for the 4th District, and Josh McNatt have qualified in the race for 4th District Election Commissioner.

South Half Constable

The unexpired term of the late Jeff Kemp will be filled by special election, and three persons have qualified: Don Hall, Donald Ray Thomas and Larry Bolton.

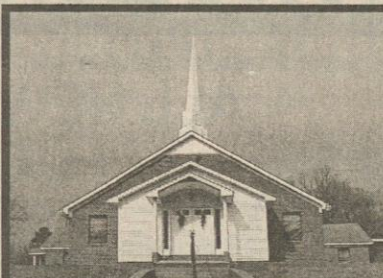


Bible Proofs Of Salvation (part IV)

Have you ever seen people who say they know God, yet they want to live as much like the unsaved world as they can? What is wrong with such people? It is obvious that they have never come to know God, for those who know Him do not love the world system of wickedness, even if they do slip back into worldly practices at times. I John 2:15-17 gives a third proof of salvation; it is the mark of separation from the world system of wickedness: "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world. And the world passeth away, and the lust thereof: but he that doeth the will of God abideth for ever." As some people would say: "This is plowing pretty close to the corn". God tells us that those who really are saved do not love the world system of wickedness. It would be like saying: I love God, but I also love the devil and what he is doing in the world. This cannot be, for Jesus said in Matthew 6:24: "No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon." Mammon means the material things of this world, or money and what it can buy. Jesus is doing the speaking, and He says that no one can love both God and the things of the world; I am going to take Him at His word, and I advise others to do the same!

The world, in I John 2:15-17, does not necessarily mean the earth, or even things that are in the earth, for I Corinthians 7:31 says, "And they that use this world, as not abusing it; for the fashion of this world passeth away." Here Paul is saying that we should not "over-use" the things that are in the earth; it is not wrong to use them for the purpose that God intended them to be used. I John 2:15-17, however, is speaking of something different, for it is speaking of the lust (passionate desire) that leads to sin, and it is speaking of the pride of men, which is always wrong. No, I am not talking about the matter of "taking pride in our work", as we use that term, for those who do work for me need to take that kind of pride, or else they will do only one job for me. Our verses are saying we should not love the world's way of desiring what God does not want us to desire, or of thinking that we can make it just fine on our own power, so we do not need God. When one loves the world, system of wickedness, he does not know or love God. That wicked system is passing away, but those who know God and thus are doing His will shall abide forever! What we love tells the world who we are and to whom we belong!
