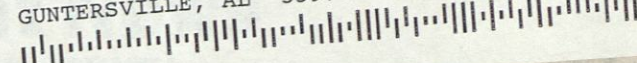

Woman Charged with Murder of 1-year-old

First degree murder charges were leveled Monday against Kyle, an Adamsville woman accused of killing a 1-year-old child in her care. Kyle, 26, who authorities say is 18-weeks pregnant, was charged with murder in the death of her boyfriend, Anthony Worth, 39, (who was also the father) faces felony child abuse charges after an investigation by the McNairy County Sheriff's Department. Reports indicate that the couple recently

Holly Heading Up Balancing Act for County Schools in First Year as Superintendent

Christie Holly is putting her background in testing and assessments to good use in her first year as Tishomingo County School District Superintendent – as the district goes through the growing pains of transitioning from MCT to Common Core standards.

"It's a balancing act," she said last week during an in-depth interview. Mrs. Holly, 40, was the district curriculum and testing director for the district last year, and was principal at Iuka Middle School before that. Originally from Prentiss County, she has been in the education field for 19 years, all but three of them in Tishomingo County.

The entire district has been transitioning to Common Core in the past few years, and kindergarten through second graders have been doing all Common Core curriculum for several years.

Common Core standards are designed to ensure students are prepared for today's entry-level careers, freshman-level college courses, and workforce training programs. The Common Core focuses on developing the critical-thinking, problem-solving,

and analytical skills students will need to be successful. With more focus on "how" they get to the answer, assessments are changing, explained Holly. The standards and benchmarks are changing, and the method is changing, too – much of the testing will now be online and the district is gearing up for that with technology improvements.

There are also changes in how teachers are held accountable, with newly-defined growth standards that place significant emphasis on the students that score in the lowest 25 percent of the class. There is also increased focus on getting a real high school diploma, and encouraging more students to take Advanced Placement (AP) tests. Currently, very few students take the AP tests for the many AP classes in which they are enrolled.

The district is also looking at a national trend towards using the ACT test as the standard for high school graduation – an exit exam. This is being piloted in some Mississippi districts, explained Holly, with the district getting credit for the student's highest ACT score. Along with the state area tests (SATP2) tests for Biology I and US History, and SATP3 (new Common Core assessments) for English II and Algebra I, 11th graders will take the ACT this year, and those results will factor into the calculations of Mississippi's new accountability model.

With all these changes to absorb, it's a huge transition for the district – and one of the biggest hurdles is managing these disconnects between Common Core requirements and existing testing frameworks like MCT and the State Area Tests necessary for graduation.

The Mississippi Department of Education applied for a waiver with the US Dept of Education last spring. In that waiver was a request that schools and districts be "held harmless" un-

Water Rates Rise After Iuka Increases Rates

Water customers of the Tishomingo County Water District, and Iuka are seeing increased water rates, since the city increased its water rates for the first time in decades.

According to reports, the city of Iuka has raised their rates on water used by city customers, as well as rates on the water it sells to the Tishomingo County Water District, that serves about 920 water clients in the Eastport, Snowdown, Mill Creek, and Oldham areas, down into the portions of Alabama that are on this side of Pickwick Lake.

Iuka doubled the rate (from \$1 per thousand gallons to \$2) it charges for water it sells to TCWD, Short-Coleman Water Association, and Walker Switch Water Association, but Short-Coleman and Walker Switch are not passing the cost increase on to customers, yet.

The increase for Iuka city residential customers is an increase in the minimum bill from \$7.50 to \$8.50, and the minimum, which used to be 4,000 gallons, has been reduced to 3,000 gallons. Over the minimum, the cost is \$1 more per thousand - from \$1 per thousand gallons to \$2 per thousand gallons.

For city industrial customers the increase is from \$1 per thousand gallons to \$3 per thousand gallons.

"It's the first time in 40 years, I'm told, that we have raised the rates, and we need the funds to pay the indebtedness of \$2.2 million of upgrades to the system, plus keep the city in the black on the water system," explained Iuka Mayor John Castleberry. The \$2.2 million of upgrades included changes to the system south toward the Midway area, a system the city annexed years ago, and to the city water plant.

The city rate increase only includes customers within the city limits and within a one-mile radius of the city limits. Midway-Pleasant Hill customers already pay a higher rate (\$12.50 minimum for 3,000 gallons and \$2.50 per thousand after the minimum), according to Iuka authorities.

School Board Approves \$28M Budget for 2014-15

The Tishomingo County School Board recently approved a \$28 million budget for the districts 2014-15 school year. New superintendent Christie Holly says that they have tried to slim down the budget as much as possible without cutting jobs.

Even with \$28,152,427 in revenue from state, local, federal and other sources, the proposed expenditures exceed the revenue, and administrators are using \$1.3 million of savings. This is the third year the district has dipped into savings to meet the budget shortfall.

Salaries and benefits make up 77 percent of the budget for the largest employer in the

Byrom Assigned Attorney in First Hearing

Michelle Byrom was in court Tuesday morning for the first time since a re-trial for her case was ordered by the state supreme court.

The 57-year-old Byrom was convicted of murder for hire in 2000 and sentenced to death. As her execution date approached earlier this year, a press campaign and efforts by attorneys resulted in her being granted a new trial in March. She was recently transferred from Rankin County to Tishomingo County, where she awaits her new trial as a county inmate.

Tuesday, Judge Paul Funderburk assigned attorney David Calder of Oxford to continue to represent her until further order of the court, saying it was in the best interest of all concerned. Assistant District Attorney Richard Bowen agreed on behalf of the prosecution.

Calder will be aided by Christie McCoy and local lawyer Clay Cummings.

Byrom's new trial was not scheduled for the current term, but the next term of Circuit Court for the county starts January 12th.

She was originally convicted in plotting the death of her husband Edward Byrom, Sr. in 1999 and was sentenced to death. She appealed her case three times, and each time the conviction was upheld.

moved there from Iuka.

The upgraded charges against Kyle were announced during a press conference last Monday with Sheriff Guy Buck and 25th District Attorney Mike Dunavant at the justice complex in Selmer. The charges follow several related child abuse charges against the two adults in the case concerning the four-year-old male child who sustained a head injury while at a residence in Adamsville and under the care of Kyle.

The affidavit of complaint against Kyle stated that the child was injured when Kyle allegedly pushed the child into a hard object causing blunt force trauma to the head which caused a closed head injury.

"We were called to the (McNairy Regional Hospital) emergency room and met with the staff there and were advised that we were dealing with a four-year-old child who had a significant brain injury and there were signs of possible ongoing child abuse," Buck said.

The child was then immediately air lifted to Le Bonheur Children's Hospital in Memphis.

Buck said that because of the child's injuries his department was not able to conduct an interview with the child, however, they did speak to the hospital staff who were able to determine the severity of the child's injuries. He said that after speaking with hospital staff, they interviewed both of the child's parents at the hospital and made the determination that the father

and his girlfriend would be placed in custody.

While in custody, Buck said that Kyle and Dilworth have given several interviews with law enforcement officers and he said that his officers worked closely with Le Bonheur staff and also participated in the child's autopsy on Saturday.

"At this time, we have met with the district attorney and the decision has been made to charge Ms. Kyle with his death... there will be a first degree murder warrant written today," Buck said during the press conference.

"Over the weekend, on Saturday the child passed away as a result of the traumatic brain injury sustained Wednesday night and the child's body was taken to the medical examiner's office in Shelby County where forensic pathologists there provided us with a final detailed report detailing the cause of the manner of death," Dunavant said. "We certainly believe there is sufficient proof to charge felony first degree murder in the perpetration of aggravated child abuse and aggravated child abuse as well."

Dunavant said during the press conference that the charges of child abuse against Dilworth will stay the same at this time.

Both subjects are being held at the McNairy County Jail with Dilworth being held on a \$500,000 bond and Kyle being held on a \$1 million bond and could face an additional bond at her next hearing scheduled for Aug. 14.

der No Child Left Behind by allowing them to use test data from the 2012-2013 school year for accountability purposes for this past year. This, in essence, allowed districts to totally transition to Common Core in grades K-8

if a district's scores were good. Of course, high schools still had to use Mississippi frameworks to prepare students for SATP2 exams, which students are required to pass for graduation. Holly explained that the decision was made for the district to freeze scores since all schools in the district were either "A" or "B" schools in the current model in 2012-2013. However, the US Department of Education began to re-evaluate this decision, and a warning was issued by the state superintendent to districts in April to understand that our scores may count, depending on the ruling from Washington. Holly explained that teachers and students quickly began trying to fill gaps between Mississippi curriculum standards and the Common Core to prepare for the test.

"The district knew that MCT2 scores would more than likely drop since the MCT2 test is not aligned to Common Core Standards. Looking at preliminary data, this theory has proven true in some areas. So scores will not look as good as compared to last year." However, the waiver was approved, and the district is using 2012-2013 test data for accountability.

"Our schools, teachers, and students have endured huge transitions this past year. With that behind us, we hope to move forward more comfortably in Common Core this year as we prepare for tests in the new system. This will continue to be a difficult process, but I am confident our faculty, parents, students, and communities will rise to the challenge," said Holly.

county, according to a budget overview.

State money makes up the largest portion (58 percent) of income for the district with \$16,325,951, but the state again shorted the district by 10.62 percent, explained Holly. The state has under-funded the district by more than \$9 million in MAEP (Missis-

issippi Adequate Education Program) revenue since 2010.

Twenty-two percent of the revenue, about \$6 million comes from local ad valorem taxes, which are paid on property, car tags, business fixtures, equipment and rental property.

Current millage for Tishomingo County

schools is 45 mils, but they reach 55 mills, the request an increase to 4 percent of each year with issue having to vote.

Currently, the system gets 60 mils of every county

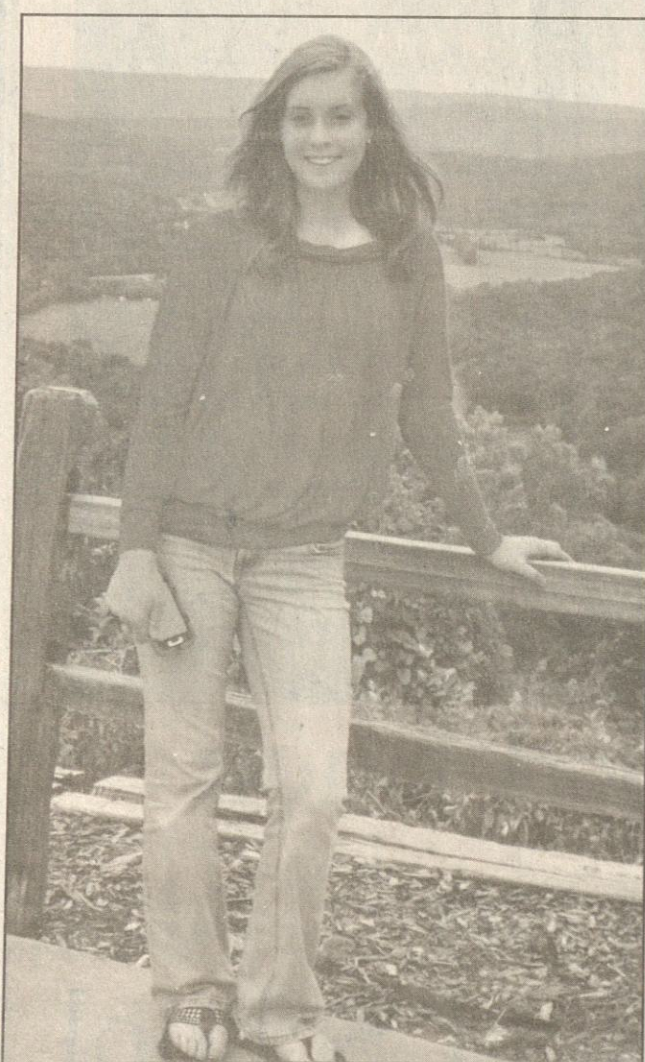

Doan House Featured in New Ornament

Annually, the Iuka Methodist Women and sell a commemorative ornament featuring a historic feature of Iuka or the county. This year the IUMW honor the landmark Doan House of Iuka.

In 1857, James Headman and wife, Emme, moved their Eastport oxcart to the town of Iuka. His new home at 203 Main Street, was built in 1858, shortly after the onset of the Civil War. James joined the Confederate army and was captured. The story of his capture by the Union under Rosecrans, his imprisonment in a tent in the backyard of the old home, which was Rosecrans' headquarters, and his escape is a vital part of the lore of Iuka. After the war, James served as President of the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo Co., managed the building of the old courthouse burned in 1886. By 1886, James Doan moved to Memphis and the Iuka



residence was sold to Capt. Watson. The James H. Doan House is one of only a few antebellum homes remaining in Iuka and is featured on this year's commemorative ornament in honor of the reenactment of the Battle of Iuka, September 19th-21st, 2014.

Hunter Orange Regulation Changes for Upcoming Deer Season

JACKSON - New for the 2014 - 2015 deer hunting season are changes in "hunter orange" regulations. When hunting deer during any firearms season for deer, a hunter must wear in full view at least five hundred square inches of solid unbroken fluorescent orange unless hunting in a stand at least twelve feet above ground or in a fully enclosed deer stand or blind. However, hunters must wear hunter orange while traveling to and from their stand. Hunters are also encouraged to carry a light while walking into the woods before daylight or leaving after dark.

"Hunter safety rules are vital to having a safe hunting season. Hunters are urged to practice good hunting ethics and follow all safety rules to avoid hunting and firearm-related accidents," said Lann Wilf, Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks, Deer Program Leader. Please remember the most important part of each hunt is making it home safely.

Bible Proofs Of Salvation (part V)

I never cease to be amazed at the people who seem to think that there is no way one can know that he is saved in the present time. The Book of I John was written for the specific purpose of giving us assurance of salvation while we still live on planet earth! I have covered three proofs of salvation given in this short book, now we will look at a fourth proof that is found in I John 2:18-19: "Little children, it is the last time: and as ye have heard that anti-christ shall come, even now are there many anti-christs; whereby we know that it is the last time. They went

out from us, but they were not of us; for if they had been of us, they would no doubt have continued with us: but they went out, that they might be made manifest that they were not all of us." I have often overlooked this particular proof in this little book, but it is a proof of salvation. It says that those who are really saved will continue in the faith! When we use the term "the faith", we are referring to the teaching of the Word of God, often called doctrine. Please do not allow anyone to mislead you on the word "doctrine", because Jesus used it several times to refer to right teaching, since its actual meaning is "a teach-

ing". Our verses show that those who separate themselves from foundational Bible truths have never actually come to salvation. We call this separation: apostasy, thus apostates are those who may have looked like believers at one time, but never have actually received Christ. Their separation shows their true colors!

The fifth Bible proof of salvation is the anointing that we have within us, called the Holy Spirit. I John 2:20-21 says, "But ye have an unction from the Holy One, and ye know all things. I have not written unto you because ye know not the truth, but because ye know it, and that no lie is of the truth." I John 2:27 says, "But the anointing which ye have received of Him abideth in you, and ye need not that any man teach you: but as the same anointing teacheth you of all things, and is truth, and is no lie,

and even as it hath taught you, ye shall abide in Him." These three verses are often misunderstood, for some people speak about a certain person having a "special anointing" on him. Actually, the New Testament does not teach that concerning believers in the church, for the verses above are speaking of the presence of the Holy Spirit as the anointing in all believers. II Corinthians 1:21-22 will help: "Now He which stablisheth us with you in Christ, and hath anointed us, is God; Who hath also sealed us, and given the earnest of the Spirit in our hearts." The anointing and the presence of the Holy Spirit in the lives of believers is the same thing, for His very presence is called the anointing. Notice that our verses from I John 2:20-21, 27 show that all the believers to whom John is writing have the unction, or the anoint-

ing (these two words are the exact same word in Greek). The anointing gives us knowledge of "all things", so that He is the final teacher, even though God does use human teachers. He also abides in all who are saved, so that we should not use the word "anointing" for a special few; we should use the term: "filled with the Spirit" for those under His control and power to do God's work. The references above are all that are given in the epistles concerning anointing; the gospels use the word other times, along with Acts, to refer to Jesus' being anointed to preach the gospel and the physical anointing with oil done by the apostles.
