

Time Rolls Back to 1860s This Weekend!

Farmington Joins Iuka for Greatest Battle Reenactments Yet, Parade, Ball, & More!

Time will roll back to 1862 weekend, when the Battle of Iuka & Farmington will be commemorated in a big way with events all weekend in Iuka.

There will be three days of events to commemorate the 152nd Anniversary of the Battle of Iuka, including education on Friday,

and a fundraiser meet-and-greet and illumination Friday evening. A Civil War parade Saturday morning through downtown Iuka and a Grand Military Ball Saturday night. On Sunday and Monday afternoons there will be the largest reenactments ever, with hundreds of reenactors, infantry, and cavalry participating under the leadership of Colonel's Division Artillery.

We hope everyone will be in getting in the spirit of celebrating our history, dressing in period dress for all the events, and helping Iuka welcome all the reenactors," said the Commander (organizer) of the Old Lomenick, overseeing the third Battle of Iuka event in 152 years. "With our fantastic sponsors, every event is free, but we want everyone to remember we will ask for donations at the event for our Historic Old Tishomingo County Courthouse Museum, which relies on community support."

Education Day

Friday's education day presentations in Mineral Springs Park for students from Tishomingo County, Alcorn County, Winston County, and Prentiss County will feature at least 12 reenactors of period demonstrations of Civil War cannons, mule-drawn wagons, and historical reenactments. Having the education day under the shade trees of Mineral Springs Park will help with any potential heat issues. We also allow the organizers to include historic Downtown

Iuka in presentations. Anyone interested in history is invited to attend the education day.

New this year, there will be trolleys used on Education Day

to convey students and visitors from the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse to the Church of Our Savior on Eastport Street, where Iuka musicians Frank and Eddie Thomas will do a sing-a-long.

There will be a stop at Iuka's newest favorite, Heavenly Yogurt!

Lawn Party Fundraiser & Grand Illumination Friday Evening

Friday evening, September 19th, beginning at 6 p.m. there will be an outdoor reception and fundraiser at Twin Magnolias to Meet the Generals. Our honored guests will be available to visit and take pictures with guests who are invited to dress in period costumes for an old fashioned lawn party. The event will take place on the lawns of Twin Magnolias and the Old Courthouse, and the Courthouse will be open for visitors, too.

Local author Dr. Ben Kitchens will be available to sign his books, and local artist Zack Bulard will be signing his limited edition prints of Iuka.

Light snacks will be available for this casual gathering that is a fundraiser for the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse Museum.

The high point of Friday evening will be the lighting of luminaries along the lawns and behind the Old Courthouse commemorating the deaths of the nearly 2,000 men who died in the September 19th, 1862 Battle of Iuka. Bring your camera.

Parade Saturday Morning

Saturday morning, beginning at 9:30 a.m., there will be an old-fashioned Civil War parade down Front Street in historic downtown Iuka! Cavalry, horse-drawn cannons, ladies in 1860s period dress and infantry

will parade down Front Street where bystanders will give them a "snack sack" to take to the Battlefield including, of course, slugburgers from Front Street Snack Bar! Everyone is encouraged to come out for this fun event! This will be a picture-worthy event, so bystanders who dress in period dress will stand on the "building side," or north side of the street, and people dressed in regular clothes on the Jaybird Park side. For picture purposes, NO cars will be on Front Street, but parking will be allowed in the City Hall lot, and in Jaybird Park.

Belmont Man Killed by Exploding Tire

A Belmont man was killed when a tractor tire he was repairing exploded.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, Chester Ray Marsh, 46, of Belmont was working to inflate/replace a tractor tire at his workplace, Parker Tire Center in Belmont when the tire exploded,

killing him instantly.

The explosion caused significant damage to the roll-up door and part of the roof of the metal building, said Wilemon, and injured the tractor tire owner, George Curry, of Fulton, who was treated and released from Red Bay Hospital.

Newest Event is Saturday Military Parade

Crowds Dressed in 1860s Clothes Needed!

Join the crowds Saturday morning downtown when the troops, cavalry and cannons will roll through historic downtown Iuka, just like the townfolk of old would have. Their boys off to battle. The parade will start at 9:30 at the north end of Front Street, and turn onto Eastport Street, then turn back onto Front Street on Eastport Street and circle back to the downtown area on Eastport just west of downtown.

Parade viewers are encouraged to dress up in 1860s period dress for the event. Ladies and children will hand

out slugburgers and snacks (courtesy of Front Street Snack Bar) to the infantrymen as they march by. Be sure to bring a hankie to wave at the soldiers, and there will be lots of battle flags to wave to cheer them on their way.

Spectators in modern clothes are asked to stand on the Jaybird Park side of Front Street, and those in 1860s dress on the building side.

All of Front Street will be closed to parking, but several areas around downtown will be available, including downtown in Jay Bird Park.

Life on the Southern Home Front Will Be Portrayed This Weekend

Students will be excited to see Ms. Terre Lawson, a long time weaver, handspinner and dyer, depict life on the Southern home front during the Civil War on Friday at Mineral Springs Park. Lawson will set up again on Saturday at the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse Museum.

The Blue-Gray Alliance, one of the most respected "umbrella groups" in re-enacting, elected Terre Lawson "Governor" to be in charge of coordinating civilian matters during its four-year calendar of 150th anniversary events.

Lawson, a resident of Tuscaloosa, has been

a re-enactor since 1958. Her historical interests range from French Settlement of Alabama (1720-1765), American Revolutionary War, War of 1812, the Civil War and the years and wars in between.

Her area of special interest is "the life and work of the rural lower class, women's work in general and home textile produc-

tion, specifically," she says. "I was a woman informally known as 'Spinster' because of her textile-related work."

Mississippi Historian Pat Arinder Will Return to Iuka for Education Day

Mississippi Humanities Educator of the Year, William "Pat" Arinder, of Amory, has studied the history and music of the War Between the States for over 50 years. Arinder is among the favorites of students each year at the Battle of Iuka Civil War Education Day.

He will be educating the students on Music of the Civil War period.

John Marshall Stone Rose to Prominence in Eastport & Iuka

Mississippi's Longest Serving Governor will be portrayed by Dr. Ben Earl Kitchens

Governor John M. Stone was one of the best-known figures in late 19th century Mississippi history. Dr. Ben Kitchens will portray Stone on Friday morning at the Meet and Greet the Generals museum fundraiser, and in the parade on Saturday morn-

John Marshall Stone moved to Iuka in the fall of 1857 and shortly thereafter found a job in the new railroad depot. By then, Iuka was thriving, as was Tishomingo County as a whole. At that time (1860), the population of Tishomingo County was 1,479 with a cotton crop of 1,479 bales. It was one of the richest counties in the state of Mississippi with land, personal property and slaves valued at \$100,000. He became mayor of Iuka when the position became available and competently served from 1866-1868. Later the same year, 1866, he was elected county assessor of Tishomingo County. In 1870, when a new courthouse was to be constructed in Iuka, John Stone was appointed as commissioner to supervise construction. The new county courthouse was necessary since the "State of Tishomingo," with the addition of 86 sections of land taken from Tippah County, had been divided into Prentiss, Tishomingo and Alcorn Counties. Each of the three smaller counties needed their own courthouse for legal affairs. The Tishomingo County seat had been, until that time, at Jacinto; the Tishomingo County

seat was established at Iuka. The site selected for the new Tishomingo County courthouse was in the northern portion of the newly formed county on a corner lot midway between the area of the celebrated Iuka Mineral Springs and the business district of Iuka.

During the Civil War, he served in the Confederate Army, achieved the rank of colonel. He was taken prisoner on 12 April 1865 and remained in a Union Prisoner of War camp in Ohio until 25 July 1865. After the war, he entered politics in Mississippi, was elected to the Mississippi State Senate, and eventually served three terms as governor of Mississippi.

During his tenure as governor, Stone set standards for honesty, integrity, and good government that have rarely been matched by other Mississippi politicians. At times he even encouraged the State Legislature to pass laws that would improve the condition of the former slaves.

Tennessee Reenactors Portraying General William Joseph Hardee & Confederate Spy Felicia Shover

We are delighted to welcome Fred and Paula Lincoln from Eads, Tennessee to the 152nd Battle of Iuka - Battle of Farmington Re-Enactments. Fred, a retired graphic artist and his wife, Paula, an artist and jewelry designer, have been Civil War reenactors for 18 years. They

have participated in major national reenacting events at locations such as Gettysburg, VA and Chickamauga, GA. They have recently been portraying Lt. General Hardee and Felicia Shover in 150th Commemorations Re-enactments at Shiloh and Farmington. Mr. Lincoln

has participated in several movies including the "Battle of Shiloh" Film for the Visitor Center for Shiloh National Military Park.

William Joseph Hardee (October 12, 1815 - November 6, 1873) was a career U.S. Army officer, serving during the Second Seminole War and fighting in the Mexican-American War. He served as a Confederate general in the west during the American Civil War. He opposed Sherman in Georgia, retreating into Carolina, before surrendering with Joseph E. Johnston. Hardee's writings about military tactics were widely used on both sides in the conflict.

Hardee resigned his U.S. Army commission on January 31, 1861, after his home state of Georgia seceded from the Union, he joined the Confederate States Army as a colonel on March 7 and was given command of Forts Morgan and Gaines in Alabama. He was subsequently promoted to brigadier general and major general. By October 10, 1862, he was one of the first Confederate lieutenant generals. His initial assignment as a general was to organize a brigade of Arkansas regiments and he impressed his men and fellow officers by solving difficult supply problems and for the thorough training he gave his brigade. He received his nickname, "Old Reliable," while with this command. Hardee operated in Arkansas until he was called to join General Albert Sidney Johnston's



Army of Mississippi as a corps commander for the Battle of Shiloh. He was wounded there in the arm on April 6, 1862. Johnston was killed at Shiloh and Hardee's corps joined General Braxton Bragg's Army of Tennessee. Hardee's Third Corps at Shiloh undoubtedly accounted for the Confederate Armies success on the first day.

Hardee and Mr. Shover knew each other from the Mexican War years. Mrs. Shover had a drayage business in Memphis and at that time was active in the social scene. During those functions, he established a relationship with Felicia and they corresponded frequently, as she was a spy for the Confederate Army supplying information to General Hardee about the Federal Army in Memphis.

Lincoln says, his whole reason for portraying General Hardee is to teach people more about him. "I feel he should be better recognized as a more important General to the Confederate

souri for the Confederacy.

Price crossed the Mississippi River to reinforce Gen. P. G. T. Beauregard's army at Corinth, Mississippi. Price was able to seize the Union supply depot at nearby Iuka, but was driven back by Maj. Gen. William S. Rosecrans at the Battle of Iuka on September 19, 1862. A few weeks later, on October 3-4, Price (under Van Dorn's command) was defeated with Van Dorn at the Second Battle of Corinth.

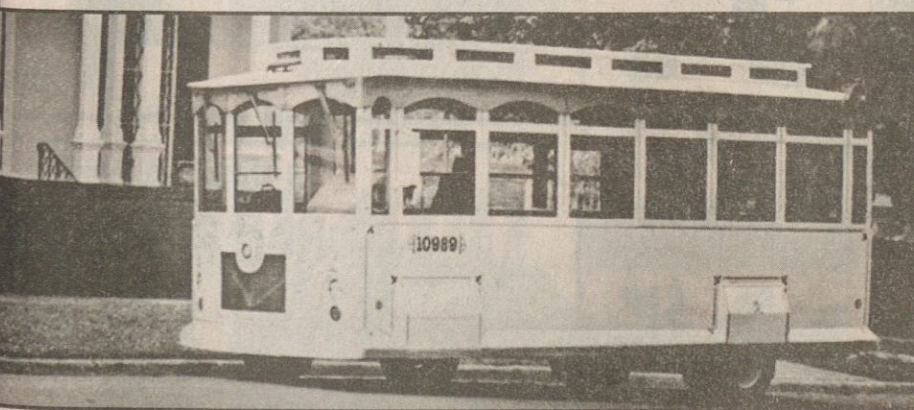
James Branson will Portray General Sterling Price

We are delighted to welcome James Branson to Iuka this weekend, as he teaches about and portrays one of the leading figures of the Battle of Iuka, General Sterling Price. Like General Price, Branson will use a horse and buggy, so he will be easy to identify.

A retired school teacher, Mr. Branson resides on the White River near Preston Bluff, Arkansas.

Sterling "Old Pap" Price (1809-1867) was a lawyer, planter, and politician from the state of Missouri, who served as the 11th Governor of the state from 1853 to 1857.

At the beginning of the Civil War, Price was personally opposed to secession. But events lead him to throw in his lot with the Southerners, and was assigned by pro-Confederate Governor Claiborne Fox Jackson to command the newly reformed Missouri State Guard in May 1861, leading his young recruits (who affectionately nicknamed him "Old Pap") in a campaign to secure Mis-

Brig. General Henry Little Was Heart of Troops Who Fought at Iuka

Little's Descendant Fielding Tyler will portray Henry Little During Battle of Iuka Commemoration this weekend

Brigadier General Henry Little came east of the Mississippi River with Maj. Gen. Earl Van Dorn's army and served under Gen. P. G. T. Beauregard at Corinth. There, he caught malaria and was in poor health for the few remaining months of his life. Even so, he was regarded as a thorough soldier and an excellent disciplinarian. At Corinth, he was given command of the 1st Division in Price's Army of the West.

Little led his division at the Battle of Iuka on September 19, 1862. While sitting on his horse behind the front line next to Sterling Price, he was struck in the head by a Minié ball and killed instantly. He was buried in Iuka, Mississippi, and after the end of the war, he was reinterred in Green Mount Cemetery in Baltimore.

The following excerpt is from Chapter 19 of *Rosecrans Meets Price: the Battle of Iuka, Mississippi*, written by Dr. Ben E. Kitchens.

As the terrible battle on the hills south of Iuka waxed hot and furious and General Hebert's troops met unyielding resistance from the determined Yankees, General Price realized that the Union force he had encountered was stronger than what he had originally thought. Reinforcements were needed immediately, and he sought his trusted division commander, General Henry Little, for consultation.

General Little was born Henry Little on March 19, 1817. He was a native of Baltimore, Maryland, and the son

of a long-time Maryland Congressman and War of 1812 veteran, Peter Little. In 1839, after attending St. Mary's College in Baltimore, he was commissioned directly into the U.S. Army and was awarded for meritorious and gallant conduct at the Battle of Monterey in the Mexican War. In 1858, he participated in Colonel Albert Sidney Johnston's expedition to Utah. His marriage in 1855 produced two daughters, Kate and Irene. Kate died at the age of four in 1860. In 1861, he resigned his U.S. commission and cast his lot with the Confederacy. Initially, he was commissioned as a major of artillery in the regular service. He soon, however, became attached to the staff of General Price as a colonel and assistant adjutant general and became one of General Price's favorite officers. Little distinguished himself while commanding a brigade at the Battle of Elkhorn. Upon recommendations of General Price and General Van Dorn, Little was promoted to brigadier general on April 16, 1862. After the evacuation of Corinth, General Braxton Bragg assigned General Little the command of a division. He grew to become General Price's "most trusted Lieutenant," the best division commander he ever knew.

In August 1862, General Price highly recommended Little's appointment to Major General. In part, he said:

"General Little commanded this (1st) brigade during my retreat from Springfield and at the Battle of Elkhorn, and on

both occasions displayed distinguished coolness, and skill, and the military ability of a very high character, thus demonstrating his ability not only as an organizer and disciplinarian but as a commander upon the field. His officers and men place the greatest confidence in him, and everyone from Missouri has appeared willing to yield precedence to him, though he is not and has never been a resident of that State. I cannot commend him too highly . . ."

General Price and General Little met at the base of a hill about 100 yards east of the Jacinto Road near the battle line, close to the sector held by the 3rd Texas,

Fielding Lewis Tyler and wife, Betsey of Virginia Beach, Virginia will participate in the 152nd Battle of Farmington - Battle of Iuka Re-enactment. Fielding, a 5th generation descendant of Brigadier General Little, will portray Little during the weekend event.

Price ordered Little to immediately bring forward the other two brigades of his division, Gates' and Green's, which were about two miles distant. This meeting occurred around 5:45 p.m. The whole party was close together at that moment; General Price and General Little were both mounted. The two generals were only a few feet apart. General Price had his back toward the Yankees' line and General Little was facing Price. Before General Price had finished speaking, and just as General Little was preparing to go after the two brigades, a Minié ball passed under General Price's arm and struck General Little "square in the forehead." This occurred approximately three-fourths of an hour after the fight commenced. The projectile entered on the line of the scalp over the left eye, passed through his skull, and stopped under the skin on the posterior portion of his head. His death was without pain, and his passage was instantaneous. He did not speak nor move after he was shot. "When he was hit, General Little threw up his arms, the reins dropping to the horse's neck, and he fell limp and lifeless into the arms of a comrade. Victor Rose says that Little's body was caught by Sergeant T. J. Cellum of Company A, 3rd Texas while Dudley, in his account, says that Colonel Celsus Price, the son of General Price who was a member of General Price's staff, caught the dead general. The accident occurred just as General Little's aide-de-camp, Frank Von Phul, reached the scene.

Horrified over the loss of his dear friend and faithful subordinate, General Price jumped from his saddle and knelt over the lifeless body of General Little, weeping "as he would for a son." With teary eyes and a husky voice, the General ordered Sergeant Cellum: "Bear his body from the field, my son; and remain with it, yourself, until I can join you." Then, pulling himself together, "Old Pap" remounted and took personal charge of the battle, at the same time sending word to Brigadier General Hebert that he now commanded Little's division.

Reverend Johnathan Bannon of St. Louis took charge of General Little's body and conveyed it to Little's headquarters, a small cottage in the center of Iuka. There the body was laid out and afterwards decently buried.

The fall of General Little was immediately

True Story: Little's Diary

Little's last diary entries read as follows:

1862—Sept. 12

Rained in camp a mile east of the decrepit village of Bay Springs. Gen. Little retired to his ambulance. Men were joined by Gen. Maury's forces. Gen. Little's diary contained notes of a likely battle at Iuka.

1862—Sept. 13

Division was on the road at 0300 and reached Peyton Mill at 0500. Gen. Little wrote in his diary and retired to his ambulance. He rose at 11 p.m. and was at the head of the column as it moved out. Gen. Little was suffering from fever and fleas. Federal cavalry departed Iuka leaving behind a large amount of supplies and food. Iuka, a railroad town, had a population of 1,500 in 1860.

1862—Sept. 14

8 a.m.—Gen. Little and 1st Division arrived at Iuka. Entered home of Mr. Pride, read a captured Yankee paper, and went to sleep.

1862—Sept. 15

Gen. Little awoke after a good night's sleep; still had problem with fleas on his body.

1862—Sept. 16

In his diary notations, Gen. Little reported some artillery firing and a continued problem with fleas.

1862—Sept. 17

Gen. Little moved his headquarters into a dilapidated house, but had breakfast and dinner with the Pride family. Picked up a Federal Dragoons coat; worried about family in St. Louis.

1862—Sept. 18

Took a bath and put on some clean clothes. Received pickles, preserves, and marmalades from captured Federal stores.

1862—Sept. 19 LAST DIARY ENTRY. Gen. Little slept nearly all night and thought they would return to Baldwyn or Jacinto. He dreaded another night march. Around midday, the Federal's 3rd Division moved on Iuka from the south. Gen. Little was ordered to move his brigades.

At 5:45 p.m., Brigadier General Henry Little was leading his troops and Hébert's Brigade south of the Jacinto Road. Gen. Price arrived to confer and had his back to the action. A bullet passed under Price's arm and struck Gen. Little above the left eye. He died instantly. The battle continued into the evening until about 8 p.m. Sunset was at 6 p.m.

The body of Gen. Little was taken back to the Coman place. Father Bannon kept watch. At midnight, some soldiers dug a grave in the garden beside the Coman cottage, and a candlelight ceremony was held. A plain board was placed upon the grave, and the officers dispersed.

known throughout the Confederate lines, but far from creating consternation, panic, or confusion, most of the officers and soldiers seemed to become filled with new determination to win. Their leader, whom they had learned to love and esteem, and in whom they had full confidence, had fallen. The Yankees had deprived them of him and revenge was within their grasp! The men of Hebert's division pushed steadily ahead up the hill, selling their lives clearly for each yard of the hillside that was gained.

General Price later said in his official report:

"It will thus be seen that our success was obtained at the sacrifice of many a brave officer and patriot soldier. Chief among them was Brig. Gen. Henry Little, commanding the 1st Division of this army. Than this brave Marylander, no one could have fallen more dear to me or whose memory should be more fondly cherished by his countrymen. Than him, no more skilled officer or more devoted patriot has drawn his sword in this war of independence. He died in the day of his greatest usefulness, lamented by

his friends, by the brigade of his love, by the division which he so ably commanded, and by the Army of the West, of which he had from the beginning been one of the chief ornaments."

One of the Missouri-ans later wrote:

"In Henry Little, our brigade lost its main stay and support, and the army its best subordinate general. He did more, both while belonging to the Missouri State Guard and in the Confederate service, towards organizing and disciplining the Missouri troops than any man connected with them. To him it owed its proficiency, steadiness in danger and excellence of drill, and to his labors it was greatly indebted for the high rank it achieved among the armies of the South. His death was an irreparable loss to the army, to his State, and to the Confederacy.

General Little's red waist sash and his gold epaulets worn when he was a Captain in the 7th Infantry Regiment, as well as his diary containing his final entry prior to his death at Iuka are on display at the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse.

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors will hold a public hearing on its proposed budget for fiscal year 2014-15 Friday September 19th 2014 at 10:00 AM at the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors Office. At this meeting, a proposed ad valorem tax revenue increase in the proposed budget will be considered.

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors is operating with projected total revenue of \$12,343,893 and \$3,884,972 (31 percent) of such revenue is obtained through ad valorem taxes. For next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$12,086,727. Of that amount \$4,250,141 (35 percent) is proposed to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

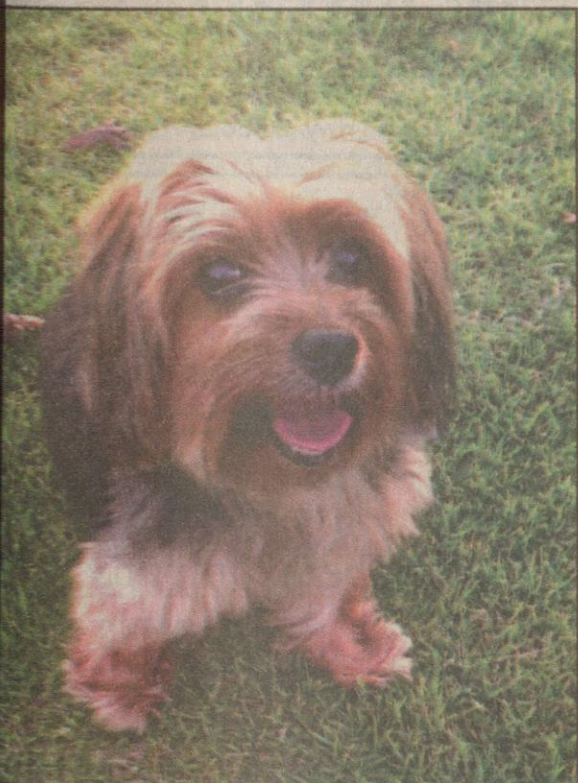

Bible Proofs Of Salvation (part XI)

I John 4:15 says, "Whosoever shall confess that Jesus is the Son of God, God dwelleth in him, and he in God." Short verses in the Bible often have long meanings, as is the case with this verse! To confess that Jesus is the Son of God is, in essence, confessing that Jesus is God, just as much as the Father is God, or as the Holy Spirit is God. Our verse is teaching that those who belong to God know the truth about Jesus; those who do not confess this truth do not know God; it is that simple! I really have no trouble at all in seeing the fact that Jesus is one with the Father, as He plainly said in John 10:30. Yes, He willingly limited Himself when He was on earth, because He had become a man, minus any sin nature, of course. Luke 2:52 says, "And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man." This could be true only of His human nature, for God cannot grow in wisdom etc. While Jesus did not always exercise all of His attributes and abilities while He was on earth, He still had not given up any of them! (By the way, this is our eleventh proof.)

The confession of Jesus as the Son of God should be a public thing, yet it may not always be possible for one who comes to faith in Christ to publicly confess the truth about His position as the Son of God. For example, the thief on the cross who repented did not give a public confession, as far as the record goes, but he did confess in his heart and to Jesus that he believed the truth about Him. By the way, the confession may not always be in the exact words that I John 4:15 gives, for many have been saved without actually saying these exact words. When it comes down to "where the rubber meets the road", it is our faith in Christ that brings salvation! Galatians 3:26 says, "For ye are all the children of God by faith in Christ Jesus." One cannot truly have faith in Jesus, unless he believes the truth about Who He is! The problem with the religions of the world is that they do not recognize Jesus as the Son of God; they do not believe that He is God in the flesh; they have no conception that He alone could pay the price for man's sins. Many, therefore, are working their "fingers to the bone" in an effort to do enough good works to be acceptable to God. How futile are these attempts, when the Bible plainly says that works do not save anyone (Ephesians 2:8-9; Titus 3:5). Good works do have a place, however, but only as the product of salvation, not as the means of it, as is clearly stated in Ephesians 2:10: "For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them." God does not want only a "step in the right direction" after we are saved; He wants us to "walk" (a continual action) in good works! When one gets good works in their proper place (their being the result of salvation that has already taken place), he is in a good position to do those works for the glory of God!
