Suspect Caught in
Alabama Monday
Evening After Sunday
Morning Chase

An Alabama man is in cus-
tody facing traffic violation and
arrest charges, as well
drug misdemeanor charges
connection with a three-state
suit that started in Selmer,
Tennessee Sunday morning and
ended with his arrest near the
Alabama-Mississippi state line
Monday evening.
According to the Mississippi
Highway Patrol, Brandon
Anaya, 26, of Gadsden,
Alabama, was taken into custody
by Colbert County officials at
approximately 8:20 p.m., Mon-

Mississippi Highway Patrol car
attempted to force the suspect
to merge off the road, but he
rammed the side of the MHP
car and rear-ended the Selmer
vehicle. At one time, according
to the incident report, the sus-
pect crossed the median and was
driving eastbound in the west-
bound lane for about two miles,
endangering numerous people's
lives. He turned north, and then
exited the vehicle and fled into
the woods. After a day-long
manhunt, Alabama officials ap-
prehended him about 8:20 Mon-
day night.
Anaya faces felony charges
in Tishomingo County for Ag-
gravated Assault on an officer
with a deadly weapon (using his
vehicle as a deadly weapon) and
Felony Fleeing. He was also
charged with misdemeanor drug
possession.
The Mississippi Bureau of
Investigations is investigating
the case in Mississippi.

Entrants must be residents of Tishomingo County- No exceptions! The Fair Board members

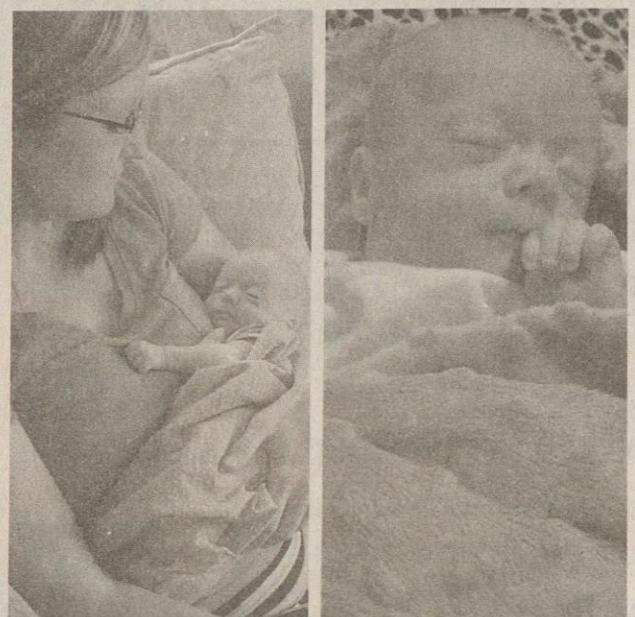

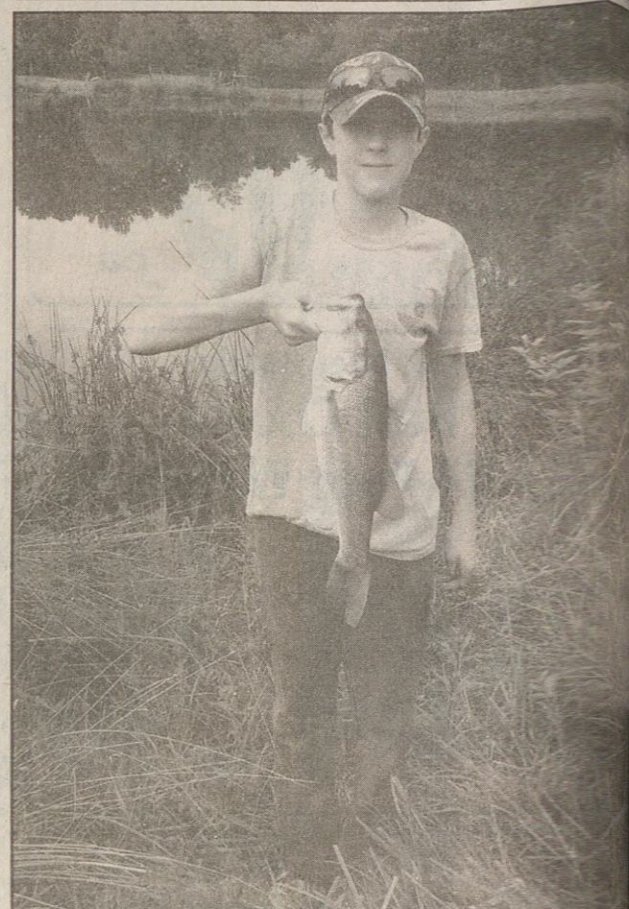

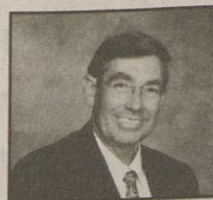

Great Truths In Small Packages

I love to ponder on the things that are so important in the Word of God, yet may have been said in few words or small books. I am thinking of I John and II John, which I will use for the next several articles. It always amazes me that some people say about certain truths: "Oh well, that was said only once in the entire Bible." Does it make something untrue, or unimportant, just because it is mentioned only once in Scripture. I will admit that the major teachings of the Bible are repeated over and over and in several books. Such will be the case with the truth taught in these two little epistles of the Apostle John. Perhaps we need to understand that every part of God's word is true and important, yet some things may carry more weight than others, because I see several important subjects covered in II John, such as the following: "The elder; the elect lady and her children; love; truth; grace; mercy; peace; God the Father; The Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God; rejoiced; walking in truth; commandment; beseech; which we had from the beginning; as ye have heard; deceivers; antichrist; lose; things we have wrought; reward; transgresseth; abideth; doctrine of Christ; both the Father and the Son; receive him not; neither bid him Godspeed; partaker of

his evil deeds; speak face to face; our joy may be in the children of thy elect sister greet thee and Amen. I am giving these words and topics because I think it is amazing that a little book of only 13 verses cover so much "ground"! This makes me think that we may need to weigh our words more carefully, so that we speak more about what is really important!

Now we will take a closer look at some of the things mentioned above. The words "the elder" refer to a man who was indeed a pastor, to which the word "elder" refers in I Peter 5:1. Also, I Timothy 5:17 says, "The elders that rule well be counted worthy of double honor, especially they who labor in the word and doctrine." There are arguments that say that this refers to an office of elders, but here it seems to refer to pastors, for they who usually labor in the Word and doctrine the way, for those who think that doctrine should be emphasized in churches, it needs to be pointed out that such is not the case. The elder who teaches and preaches the Word of God doctrinally is to be counted worthy of double honor, which actually means in the Greek language. (I can say this now, since I am no longer pastor!) There is also something to be said about older Christians, who have spent years in faithful service to God, without necessarily being in the position as a church officer. So, John writes both as an older man and as a teaching, preaching, writing elder. We need to pay close attention to him for these reasons, especially because God inspired him as to what to say.

Also, projection of any current evaluation of the system to future periods is subject to the risk that procedures may become inadequate because of changes in conditions or that the degree of compliance with the procedures may deteriorate.

In our opinion, Tishomingo County, Mississippi, complied, in all material respects, with state laws governing central purchasing, inventory and bid requirements for the year ended September 30, 2012.

The accompanying schedules of (1) Purchases Not Made from the Lowest Bidder, (2) Emergency Purchases and (3) Purchases Made Noncompetitively from a Sole Source are presented in accordance with Section 31-7-115, Miss. Code Ann. (1972). The information contained on these schedules has been subjected to procedures performed in connection with our aforementioned examination of the purchasing system and, in our opinion, is fairly presented when considered in relation to that examination.

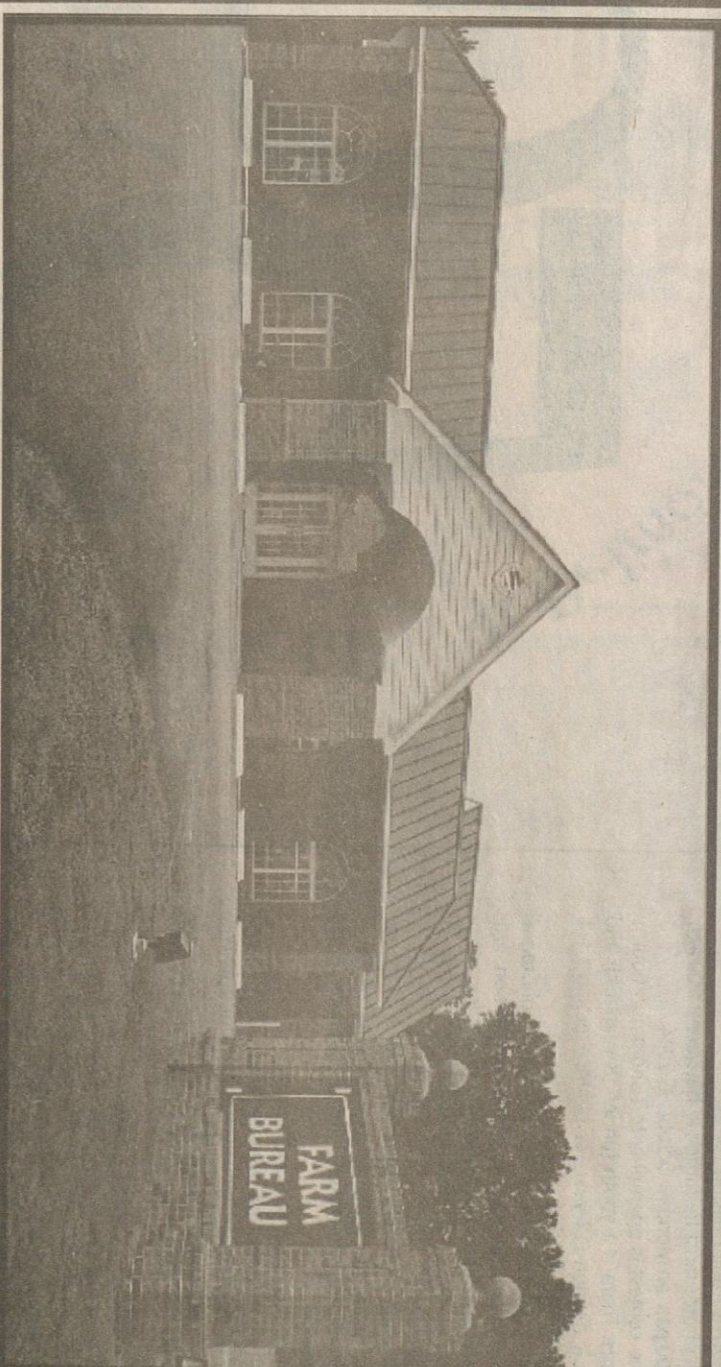

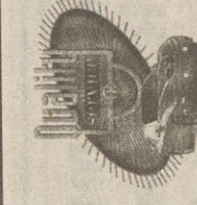

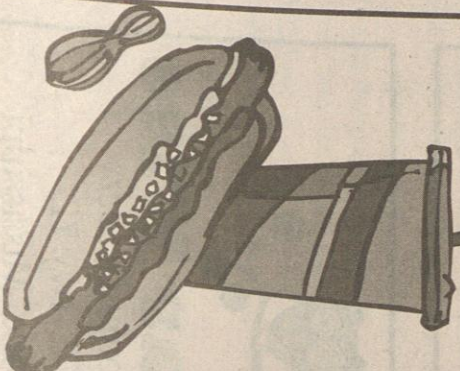
