Man Dead After Jump from Waterway Bridge

An Iuka man died last Vednesday after jumping to the Tenn-Tom Wateray off the bridge north

According to Tishoingo County Coroner fack Wilemon, Michael hane Taylor, 39, apparntly was observed driving

his car to the bridge that goes over the Waterway near the Scruggs Bridge access area. He stopped his car, and jumped over the side of the bridge, where he fell approximately 75 feet into the water, said Wilemon. Eyewitnesses who stopped reported that by the time they stopped

and got out to look, Taylor was floating face-down in the waterway.

Depth of the waterway at that point is between 15-20 feet.

Emergency personnel recovered the body about 50 yards from the bridge. Wilemon said the cause of death was drowning.

Wadkins, Smith Win **School Board in Local** Elections; Constable Runoff Nov. 25th

Local school board and election commissioner positions were decided Tuesday, but there will be a run-off to determine South Half Constable in two weeks.

Tuesday's mid-term elections resulted in the Republicans gaining control of the Senate and have the largest majority in the House of Representatives since the Truman administration. Tishomingo County contributed by giving incumbent Republican Senator Thad Cochran 66 percent of its vote, and incumbent Republican Representative Alan Nunnelee a 76 percent win over challengers.

Locally, it was a low turnout, with only 38 percent of Tishomingo County's 12,166 registered voters casting ballots.

In local races, Iuka's Emily Wadkins won the First District School Board seat with 40 percent of the vote. In school board elections, the victhe most votes, even if it is not 50 percent.

She will be the first woman on the board since the 1997-2002 term of Jeanette Mann.

Her closest competition came from Cynthia Lambert with 23 percent of the vote. Buzz Sanderson and Keith Wimberly had 18 and 17 percent of the vote, respectively.

In the Fifth District School Board race, Gregory Smith won with 43 percent of the vote over opponents Carol Wanner, with 34 percent, and Jeffery Martin with 22 percent of the vote.

Special elections for commissionelection ers from the second and fourth district were won by those already appointed to the posts. Beverly Ragan was unopposed in the second district. Chasity George won with 62 percent of the vote in the Fourth District race over Josh McNatt with 37 percent. George and Ragan turns on page 2.

In the special election to fill the unexpired term of South Half Constable left open by the death of Jeff Kemp, Donald Ray Thomas won 48 percent of the vote, but it must be at least 50 percent, plus one to win outright for that position. Thomas will face Don Hall in a run-off election November 25th. Hall received 29 percent of the vote. Other opponents Hobie Kemp and Larry Bolton each won 11 percent.

A Mississippi state constitutional amendment guranteeing the already existing right to hunt and fish earned a 93 percent approval in the county, and won state-wide, as well.

Iuka United Meth-Church recently pleted renovations to mmodate a new Al-Quantum 285 Digital irch Organ made espely for the historic Iuka rch. It will be dedicatat a special service this nday, November 9th at 1 in the sanctuary. Evone is invited to come ou are to see and hear new organ Sunday af-

The last organ had ife of 35 years, and new one has a wonderful sound that resonates throughout the old church, thanks to a new speaker system integrated tastefully into the historic building. According to the company's site, Allen's Quantum technology offers unprecedented control over even the smallest sound nuance, resulting in tonal realism previously not available from a pipeless organ.

With hundreds of control knobs and buttons, a two-tier keyboard, a full tier of pedal controls, and

a USB port for sampling and recording, organist Jane Rhea says the organ is a joy to play, and it probably does more than she will ever master. Ms. Rhea is one of two organists who alternate playing the organ for Sunday services.

The organ and the renovations were all paid for by memorials and individual donations, a long standing tradition at Iuka Methodist. The memorial stained glass windows paid for decades ago by families in memory of church founding fathers were also recently cleaned and refurbished.

Great Truths In Small Packages (Part VI)

We are still looking at the little Book of II John. Verse 7 says, "For many deceivers are entered into the world, who confess not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh. This is a deceiver and an antichrist." I covered a part of this verse in the last article, but more needs to be said. Have you noticed that John is not bashful or backward about identifying who is anti-christ? (I am not thinking about the man of sin who will come later; I am thinking, as was John, about anybody who takes his stand against the Christ of the Bible!) We have become so liberal in our thinking in this nation

that almost anybody with any teaching can pass as a preacher of the gospel and demand support for a television program, and the sad fact is: he will likely get that support! No, I am not against support for those who preach the gospel in any place by the various means of media. I am against people being so gullible that they do not recognize when one is teaching falsehood, and I am in good company with the apostle John in the epistle (letter is the same word as epistle) before us. Those of our day who want to say only positive things need a primary course in the simple things of the Bible, then they will teach both positive and

negative things! John was not trying to

"win friends and influence people" when he wrote the letter before us; he was being factual, because God had inspired his writing! By the way, I will take any part of the inspired Scripture over anything that men have written that is against Scripture. I think that those of us who preach and teach the Word of God have an obligation to warn people that there are some deceivers out there who are interested only in the fame they can attain and the money they can collect! John said that those who are "off base" on Who Jesus really is are really antichrist, meaning that they are truly against Christ. I do thank God for the good messengers of God who spend much time in studying the Scriptures and then propagating what they have gleaned from God's Word. We are not all in

the same "camp", as far as local assemblies go, but we are all on the "same page", as far as doctrinal truths go. When somebody says that he and his church do not bother with doctrine, I want to warn people not to bother with attending such churches. In John 7:17 we have the words of Jesus: "If any man will do His will, he shall know of the doctrine, whether it be of God, or whether I speak of Myself." Even Jesus used the very word "doctrine" to identify His teaching. The word "doctrine" in the Greek language means: "instruction, either the matter or the process of instructing". In my mind, we need much more instruction from the Word of God than most churches are giving today!






