Runoff Election for South Half Constable Next Tuesday

Next Tuesday, voters in the south half of the county will elect a constable in a runoff election between Donald Ray Thomas and Don Hall. Thomas received 1,139 votes, or 48 percent, in the November 4th election, just 41 votes shy of 50 percent-plus-one of those cast in the special election for constable. The next best vote count was for Don Hall, who had 686 votes (29 percent) of the total constable vote. The special election is to fill the unexpired term of Jeff Kemp, who died in office last year. Paul Thorn has been the interim constable - appointed by the county board of supervisors shortly after Kemp's passing. Thorn did not run for election. Polls will be open in only the following precincts for the runoff: Springhill, Tishomingo, Eden, Dennis, North Belmont, Belmont, Golden, Cotton Springs and the old West Iuka precinct. If you are not sure which constable district you are in, you can call the circuit clerk's office at 423-7026 to find out. The circuit clerk's office is open now for absentee voting in this special runoff election, and will be open November 22nd from 8 til noon as well. Braves Beat Biggersville for 3-1 Record; Play Saltillo Thursday Night at New Site Journey

The Tishomingo County Braves will defend a 3-1 record Thursday night after defeating Biggersville Tuesday night in New Site Tournament. The Braves beat Biggersville 66-64 Tuesday in their first game of the annual meeting at New Site. Seniors Andrew Hinds and Austin Smith led the team with 15 each and junior Ben Powell had 11 points. In one of the best early seasons in years, the Braves have also posted wins against Granger (71-55), and Booneville (68-54) under second year head coach Josh McCalmon. The Braves face a major challenge Thursday night when they meet Saltillo for the second game of this season. The first match ended up 95-46 in Saltillo's favor, but reports are that the Braves have greatly improved since that first game. The Lady Braves have a record of 1-3 after a 55-16 loss to New Site at the tournament Tuesday night. Both teams will play in the South tournament next week.

A suspect in a break-in at the Burnsville TVA Substation last week is reportedly being treated for injuries sustained during the attempted theft of copper wiring.

Officials are not releasing the name of the suspect, but have confirmed that there was a lot of evidence at the scene that will help prove the case once the suspect has recovered enough to be questioned. The suspect is being treated for burns that he probably sustained during the event, as well as injuries that left blood at the scene.

TVA police and Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department are investigating.

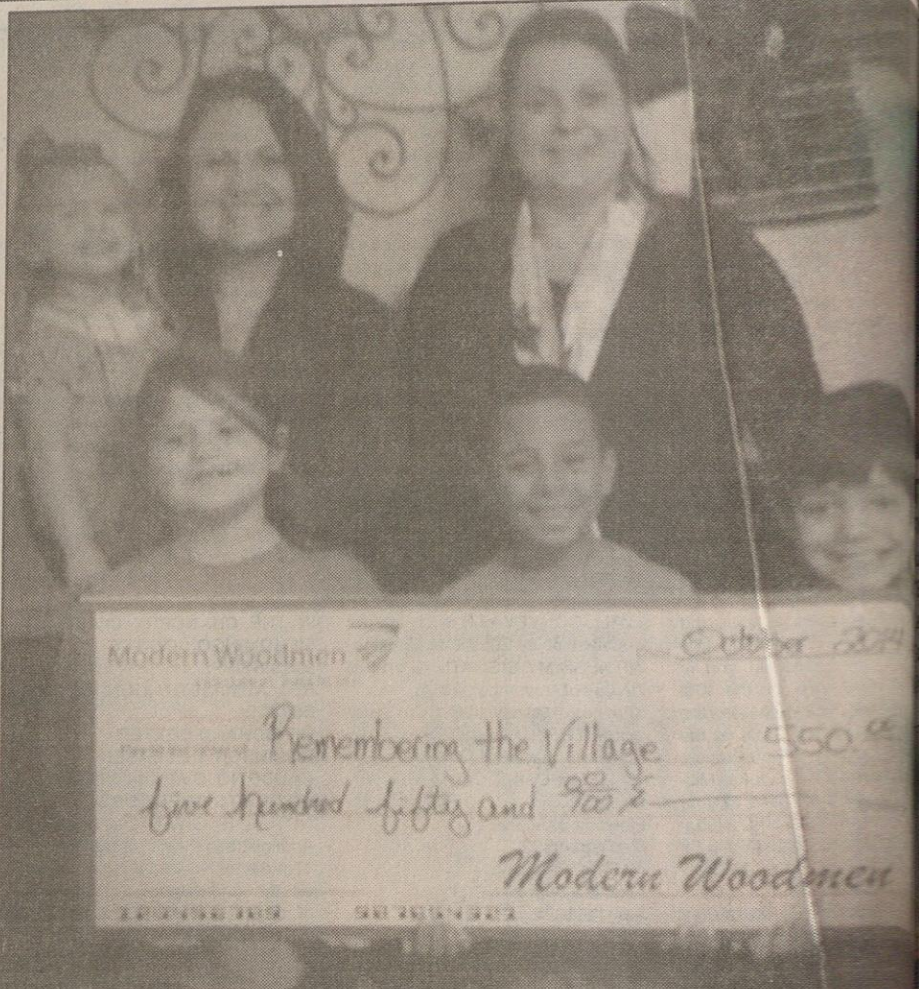
New Business - Council Officers will meet Monday, November 17th at 10 a.m. at the Extension Office to plan the Activities Calendar for next year.

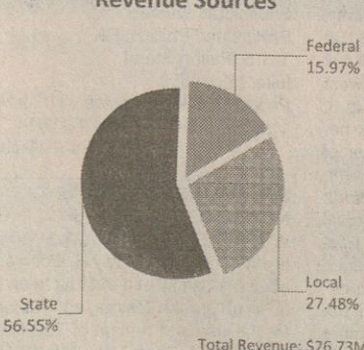

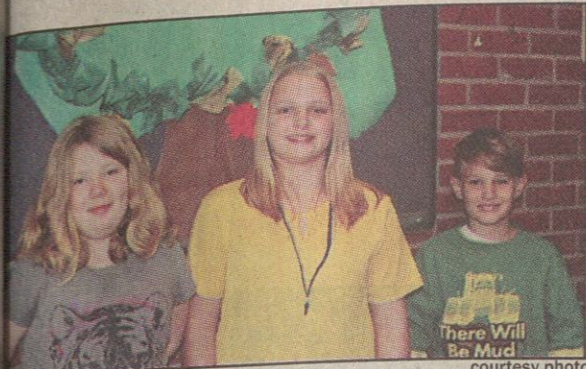
Actual Expenditures

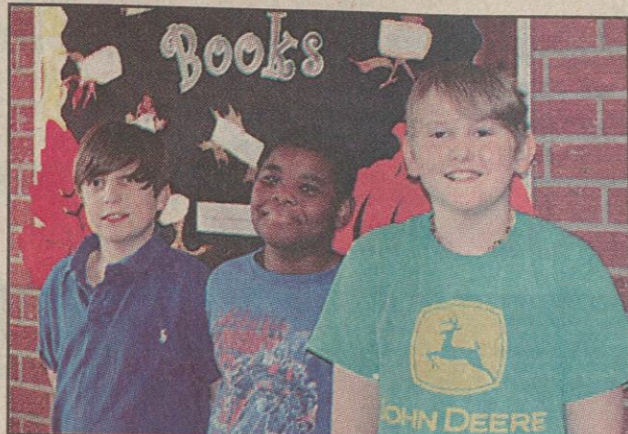

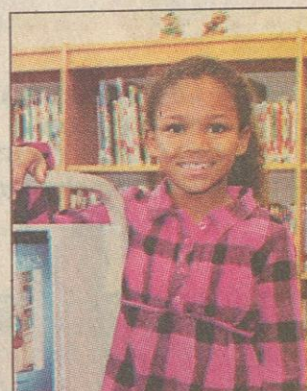
