Millions in Local Tri-State Funds at Risk with Passage of Smoke Free Ordinance

Millions of dollars of scholarships, and community and education grant funds are at risk

Following the Iuka Board of Aldermen's decision to become a smoke-free city, say owners of one local establishment.

By Mississippi River Charitable Binoculars, operations must support a specific entity. Unlike other bingo operations that have been in Tishomingo County and supported by public charities, Riverhills Bingo, on U.S. Highway 72 in Iuka, supports the very local-

minded Tri-State Educational Foundation that contributes hundreds of thousands of dollars annually to scholarships, grants and other beneficiaries. A short list of beneficiaries who have recently received \$357,000 from Tri-State includes the Iuka Battle-

field Commission, Mississippi State Fire Academy, Music City Drum Corps, Crow's Neck, Tishomingo County Development

Foundation, Pilot Club, the county historical society, and others. The school system has had access to \$314,000 in grants; \$11,600 has gone to support local daycare centers, and more than \$9,000,000 in scholarships has gone to deserving students for college scholarships since August of 2010.

"Tri-State has left money in the pockets of Iuka citizens and organizations to use for other things and has afforded opportunities for education and training that were not available before Tri-State existed," says Ferguson.

Owners Bob and Sylvia Fer-

guson and staff at Riverhills Bingo fear that a no-smoking policy will "cause a severe reduction, or possibly a complete elimination, in scholarship and grant funds made available to the Tri-State Educational Foundation," according to a letter to the editor (see page 2).

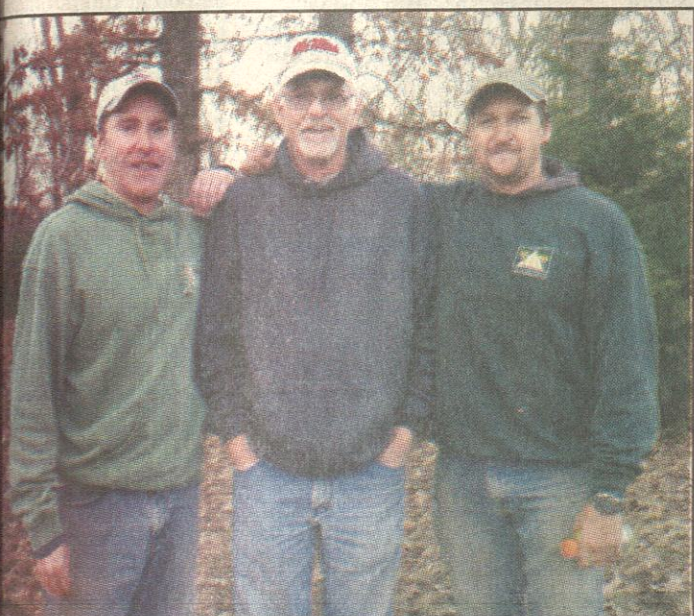
The Fergusons say that most of their patrons smoke as they play bingo, and patrons will find somewhere else to play. Most all of the patrons are from out of state, said the Fergusons.

The Fergusons also question the "seemingly clandestine" way that the no-smoking policy was enacted. Though the Iuka Board

is certainly entitled to make such a policy, there was no public notification of the upcoming decision, and there was no time for the public to add their input to the process. There was no one else at the meeting except local city officials and a non-smoking advocate who offered a \$5,000 grant to the city if they would pass a smoke-free ordinance. Indeed, Iuka Mayor John Castleberry said that it was the first time the issue had ever been discussed at a board meeting, but that he had hoped to enact some

National Geographic Diggers Explore Civil War Sites at Eastport

Some National Geographic Diggers joined forces with some local "diggers" last week to look for relics at the former Civil War encampments at Eastport.

The producers at National Geographic channel's second most popular show, Diggers, contacted local officials about possible Civil War dig sites in the area, and Charles Emmons, Iuka, an avid relic hunter and member of the Tri-State Relic Club was able to locate a few sites for the crew to explore.

Diggers has done shows on metal detecting and relic hunting all over the country, at

places like San Francisco, where they found earthquake relics, and Custer's camp.

The Iuka/Eastport hunt may be featured this spring. It is one of eighteen shows they have recorded for the upcoming season, said Emmons. They also explored the battlefield area in Corinth.

Using metal detectors, they had a successful hunt locally and found several Civil War relics that will be on the show.

The cast and crew stayed at J. P. Coleman State Park, courtesy of the Tishomingo County Tourism Commission, who also coordinated food and meals each day they were here.

Ordinance Enacted with No Notice or Warning

On December 2, 2014, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Iuka passed the city-wide no smoking ordinance, which is to go into effect thirty days later. This ordinance was kept in relative secret until December 10th, and they really didn't want it known until the ordinance appeared in the paper. They did this without any public notification that such an ordinance was being considered and without any input from the citizens as to how businesses and governmental offices would or would not (or might or might not) be affected. An ordinance from another city was "borrowed" and only briefly discussed instead of writing one more suitable to the needs of Iuka.

No one can dispute the data indicating that smoking is harmful to human health. We know from personal experiences that it is, but the seemingly clandestine manner in which this ordinance passed is very disturbing. The item was on the agenda, which is not available to the general public without extra effort. It should not have been voted on, as it was listed as a "discussion" item. Also, I understand there was no one at the meeting except for local city officials (one was asked to recuse himself) and a non-smoking advocate who offered a \$5000.00 grant if they would pass the ordinance. Other communities that have passed such an ordinance have published notification that such was being considered and that

input was sought. Why was the Iuka community not given this opportunity? Through the grapevine, we were informed as to what had happened. We immediately requested a meeting with the city officials to ask for an exception on behalf of the Tri State Educational Foundation, which is funded by income from Riverhills Bingo, because we felt such an ordinance would cause those who smoke not to come. However, we were told that a non-smoking ordinance would not affect our patronage and that we would not lose money. We vehemently disagreed, as the person who told this does not know our operations or the people who participate. We felt we do know our patrons and their needs and that this ordinance would cause a loss of patrons and, therefore, a loss of income. The meeting was granted. We spoke and made the request for the exception, as we did not want even one dollar to be lost that could go towards helping someone get ahead. Our request was not granted. We feel as though this ordinance will cause a severe reduction, or possibly a complete elimination, in scholarship and grant funds made available to the Tri State Educational Foundation. We wanted those who are beneficiaries of these funds, as well as those who might anticipate applying for assistance, to know what's ahead for us. It is anticipated that patronage (of which ninety percent is from out-of-state) will decrease significantly,

as over eighty percent of those customers are smokers who may cease to come and spend their money here if they are not allowed to continue to smoke.

If the customers who smoke no longer play at Riverhills Bingo, there will not be enough funds to continue to favorably respond to local grant requests from such organizations as the Boys and Girls Club, Families First, Heritage Day, the City of Iuka, the Tishomingo County School District, the Tishomingo Historical Society, as well as individual requests from people who need help with gas money to drive to school and/or funds for daycare services or to attend a vocational training class. Scholarships are the first priority.

There will also be a significant negative effect on scholarship awards. Funds will be insufficient to continue funding at the present level of numbers of scholarships awarded, and the amount of each scholarship will ultimately have to be reduced. Unspent grant monies and unused scholarship funds might also have to be cancelled and/or recalled because of the expected loss of income from Riverhills Bingo. Other expenditures such as support for local ball teams, scholarships for teachers to earn higher degrees, local advertising, meetings and travel for teachers and administrators, and support for the local drug abuse program will also be eliminated. Just since August of 2010 through November

of 2014, and we could go back further, over \$1,800,000.00 has been awarded in scholarships for just the students in Tishomingo County! In addition to that, over \$206,000.00 has been paid to local gas stations for kids to drive to school; over \$11,600.00 has been paid to local daycare centers; over \$314,000.00 has been paid in grants to the local school district; and over \$357,000.00 has been paid to such organizations or events as the Iuka Battlefield Commission, Mississippi State Fire Academy, Music City Drum Corps, National Leadership Forum, Crow's Neck, Chamber of Commerce, Development Foundation, Pilot Club, and tutoring grants. Local businesses have been supported to the tune of slightly less than \$100,000.00. The list could still go on, concluding with the fact that over 2000 students within our service area have received scholarship assistance since the beginning of Tri State in the year 1999, which has resulted in awards amounting to almost \$9,000,000.00!

Finally, it goes without saying that the use of Tri State funds has left money in the pockets of Iuka citizens and organizations to use for other things and has afforded opportunities for education and training that were not available before Tri State existed. Right now, we feel like we've been thrown under the bus. We seem to have four choices: 1) try to adjust and survive as best and as long as we can; 2) move outside the city limits; 3) move to a different town without such an ordinance that will support and appreciate the efforts made to assist the people in that community; or 4) shut down.

Right now, we do not know what we want to do or can do, but we would like to thank all the people who have supported the Tri State Educational Foundation and Riverhills Bingo over the years. MDOT Supports National Drunk & Drugged Driving Prevention Month: "Under the Influence, Under Arrest"

In every great coming of age story or superhero movie, we are taught the importance of making smart, sound decisions and that "with great power comes great responsibility." The same can be said for driving responsibly: whether you're heading out for a night on the town with friends or simply going from one place to another, the Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) reminds all motorists that driving while under the influence is not only dangerous for you but puts others at risk as well.

Impaired driving is a serious problem nationwide and continues to take too many lives in Mississippi. Alcohol isn't the only thing that impairs your ability to drive a vehicle. Anything that compromises your judgment, driving skills or reaction time is a hindrance, including illegal drugs and prescription medications.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), each year in the U.S., more than 10,000 people die on our roadways due to impaired driving; which is the equivalent of about 20 jumbo jets crashes each year. In 2012, impaired driving fatalities represented 31 percent of all traffic fatalities in Mississippi. In addition, 684 Mississippi drivers were involved in fatal impaired driving accidents in 2012.

Remember, "Buzzed Driving is Drunk Driving," and drunk and drugged driving is a crime. There is never an excuse for getting behind the wheel if you're under the influence. The best thing to do is to have a plan in place before going out: designate a sober driver, call a friend or family member or utilize your community's public transportation or taxi system. There are no impaired driving "accidents" because all crashes involving an impaired driver could have been prevented with forethought and proper planning.

No matter your situation or where you're headed, safety is the name of the game. MDOT offers these tips for safe driving:

Don't drive distracted and concentrate on the road and your surroundings. That text, call or email can wait; it's not worth someone's life.

Buckle up. It provides your best defense against injury or death in a crash. Facts don't lie: seat belts save lives.

Be aware of other drivers; don't assume that everyone else is driving as safely as you.

Don't speed. Slow down and be mindful of construction work zones and animals darting across the roadways.

"Don't Drink and Drive, and You'll Stay Alive."

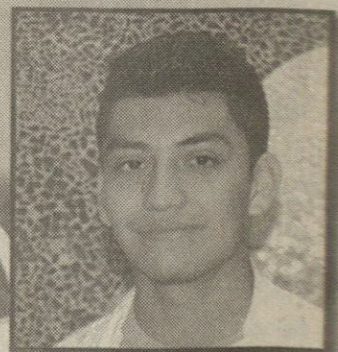

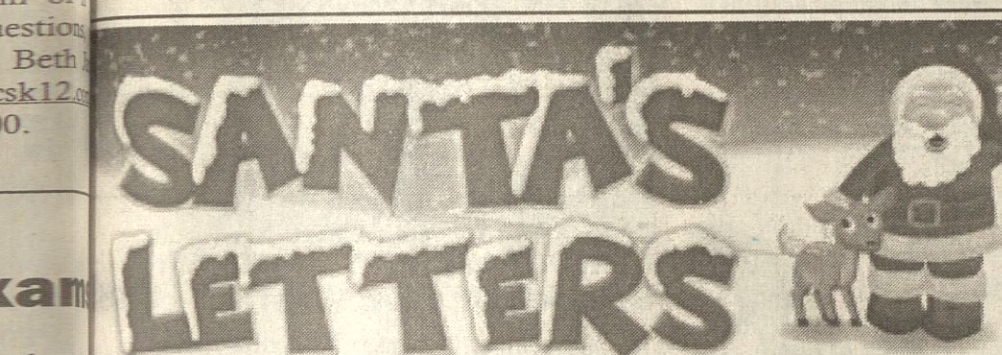

Homestead Legal Notice

Diana Turner, Tishomingo County Tax Assessor The deadline for filing the 2015 Homestead Exemption is April 1, 2015

If you filed on the same residence last year and NO CHANGES have been made, it is NOT necessary to file this year. If there were ANY CHANGES to your warranty deed, such as a name change, newly married, divorced, or widowed this past year, please come into the office and file a new application. If you became 65 years of age on or before January 1, 2015, and have not filed for the special exemption, you will need to bring proof of age. If you became 100% disabled before January 1, 2015 you will need to bring your Social Security Awards Letter. Also new this year if you are on a 100% D.A.V. "Disabled American Veteran" you qualify for Special Exemption, you will need to bring a copy of Statement of Case Letter from the Veterans Service Office to file for Special D.A.V. Exemption. If you are filing on a new residence you will need to bring your recorded Warranty Deed, you and your spouse's social security numbers, and your Mississippi license plate numbers. Your Warranty Deed must be acknowledged by December 31, 2014 and recorded by January 7, 2015. The Homestead Exemption Law allows you to file on one residence only. If you are married, you and your spouse's names must both be on the homestead application. You must be living in the residence January 1 of the year in which you are filing.

Carpenter, 24, lived with his parents, Jim and Robin Carpenter, and younger twin brothers, Peyton and Price, from 2003-2006, while he was in middle school and high school. Carpenter, now a sophomore at the University of South Carolina, has been elevated to a level of fame since receiving the Medal of Honor, and has been interviewed on numerous TV talk shows in recent months. He was recognized at the Texas A&M vs South Carolina game at Columbia, South Carolina, when Carpenter was invited to lead the "Game-Cocks" cheer in front of more than 80,000 football fans. As soon as Carpenter finishes his semester exams and flies to Hardin County at the end of the month, in addition to attending the ceremony in his honor, he will be spending a few days with longtime friends, twins Will Roser and Cliff Roser, at the home of their parents, Chris and Leslie Roser and their daughter, Karlie. "Our families attended church at Hopewell Baptist together. Our boys played with their boys," said Chris Roser. "We think a lot of him and always did." Chris said with Carpenter's heavy speaking schedule, he was sure "Kyle would enjoy just being normal, relaxing with friends in Hardin County."

The William Kyle Carpenter Ceremony will be held on Saturday, Dec. 20, at 1:30 p.m., at Court



Square, where the program will include the unveiling of his name which has been etched into granite of the Veterans Monument beside the Courthouse.

"The act of heroism he showed as a soldier stands to his credit and exemplifies him as doing the highest act a person can do," said County Mayor Kevin Davis. "December 20 will be proclaimed as William Kyle Carpenter Day in Hardin County." Donations have been made to cover Carpenter's travel expenses. The public ceremony is open for anyone to attend. Hardin County Veterans Services Officer C.D. Rickman invites "all Hardin County veterans to be in attendance, and a special invitation to all Kyle's friends who attended school and church with him." The Hardin County High School Band, The Pride, will play a march at the event. The National Anthem will be sung. Carpenter will be presented with a key to Hardin County and be a recipient of a flag. Keynote speaker will be Billy Kennedy. State Sen. Dolores Gresham will be in attendance, as will Carpenter's parents of Gilbert, South Carolina and his grandmother, Barbara Carpenter of Iuka, Mississippi. Carpenter will share his story at the ceremony, which will close afterward with the playing of Dueling Taps. The Historic Savannah Theater has been reserved for the William Kyle Carpenter Ceremony in case of rain. According to "Marine's Marine" in Vets in Focus, while standing on a rooftop in Afghanistan's Marjah district of Helmand province on Nov. 21, 2010, Lance

Cpl Carpenter became a hero. In an interview with WLTXTV, Carpenter spoke of his response to throwing himself onto the grenade, absorbing 99 percent of the blast and saving the life of fellow Marine Lance Cpl. Nicholas Eufrazio. "I am not in any way patting myself on the back," said Carpenter. "As Marines, the only people we have and that we deploy with and that we live and die beside, is each other. I know if a thousand Marines were put in the same situation I was in, they would do the same thing for me." Serving with the 3rd Platoon, F Company, 2nd Battalion, 9th Marines, Carpenter survived the blast, as did Eufrazio, though both were severely wounded. Losing his right eye and most of his teeth, Carpenter's jaw was shattered and his arm broken in multiple places. He had 30 surgeries in nine weeks following the accident. Eufrazio suffered damage to the frontal lobe of his brain, where shards of shrapnel remain lodged. Carpenter plans to complete college and become a teacher. "It's human nature for everyone to say 'what if,' but I try to snap out of it as quickly as I can," Carpenter said, "because I'm never going to be able to go back and change what has happened. I will never stop helping people that need to be helped or trying to make a positive impact on people's lives." Carpenter is the third Hardin countian to receive the Medal of Honor. The others are Bolden Rush Harrison and Vernon McGarity, for whom the Tennessee River bridge at Savannah is named.

Great Truths In Small Packages (part XI)

III John verses 5-8 says, "Beloved, thou doest faithfully whatsoever thou doest to the brethren, and to strangers; Which have borne witness of thy charity before the church: whom if thou bring forward on their journey after a godly sort, thou shalt do well: Because that for His name's sake they went forth, taking nothing of the Gentiles. We there-

fore ought to receive such, that we might be fellow helpers to the truth." Keep in mind that the word "truth" is a key word in this short letter from John the apostle. Gaius is a faithful Christian, who is involved in taking care of travelers who are witnesses of the truth of Christ. Both brethren and strangers have given witness to John about the faithfulness of Gaius in helping to forward the gospel message by tak-

ing care of those who were carrying that message. There have to be some people to "hold up the hands" of those who carry God's word, and Gaius was that kind of man! He made no difference between hometown brethren and traveling brethren whom he had not known before, and that is a plus for anybody! The word "charity" is actually the word "agape" in the Greek; it is the same word as "loved" in John 3:16. So, the Bible is saying that the highest kind of love was displayed before others in the life of Gaius!

We have the idea of "bring-

ing forward" in our verses, which means that Gaius was helping fellow believers along their journey with whatever provision they needed. These travelers were actually "traveling evangelists", because they were carrying the truth of God, and Gaius was helping them to carry that truth by his supply of their material needs. These witnesses refused to ask support from the "Gentiles", meaning the unsaved, for their conviction was that the work of God should be supported by the people of God, which is a good conviction! John admonished Gaius and all others to con-

tinue receiving those who were traveling with the message of Christ, for in helping them, others could be "fellow helpers to the truth". It is strange that some people have given the idea that the only people who are in the "ministry" are the pulpit preachers. Such is far from the truth, for every believer is in the "ministry", whether he is doing a good job or a poor one! Paul pointed out that all believers have had the ministry of reconciliation committed to them. II Corinthians 5:18 says, "And all things are of God, Who hath reconciled us to Himself by Jesus Christ, and hath given to us

the ministry of reconciliation." not speaking Paul, but of all who have been reconciled to God through Christ. If you are a child of God, you have been given the word of God, and you are to be reconciled to God by the ministry of reconciliation. Gaius does not have to be a pulpit preacher, but he is to be a witness every day by his walk; by his witness and support of those who are traveling the gospel to others.

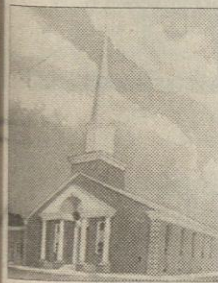
