Qualifying for State, County Offices Began Monday

2015 is a county and state election year, and early Monday morning, hopeful candidates filed the Circuit Court office to begin the qualifying process.

statewide office and the legisla-

ture will go through the Secre-

tary of State's Office.

Although independent can-

didates won't have an election

until the November 3 General

election, they also have to meet

the February 27 deadline. Addi-

tionally, they have to collect pe-

ters signed by registered vot-

ers who live within the district

county from which they are

seeking election. The number

of signatures varies based on the county-level office. The circuit clerk's office will have to verify those signatures.

In addition to the qualifying paperwork, candidates must fill out a statement of economic interest online within 15 days of qualifying. The candidates also have deadlines to file campaign fi-

nance reports. If the campaign finance reports are not filed on time and filed properly, it could get them fined. Also, all campaign finance reports have to be filed or the candidate that wins the election cannot be declared the winner.

Candidates for statewide office, state Legislature, and district attorney will file with their respective state party executive committees or with the Secretary of State if they wish to run as independent candidates. Independent candidates will need to have the circuit clerk in the county or counties where they collect signatures verify their petitions before they qualify with the Secretary of State.

Qualifications, Responsibilities for County Office Holders

This information from the "Blue Book" describes the responsibilities of each county office, and salary information is from the Tishomingo County payroll office. Some requirements have been edited for length - full information is available at the Circuit Clerk's Office.

ELIGIBLE CANDIDATES MUST:

be a qualified elector of the State of Mississippi and of the district, county or county district of the Office for which he seeks election. Never have been convicted of perjury or other infamous crime, being a crime punishable by a minimum of one (1) year confinement in the state penitentiary, i.e., felonies, unless pardoned for the offense.

Never have been convicted of a crime in a court of this state, or, after December 8, 1992, of a crime in a federal court, or of an offense in the court of another state which is a felony under the laws of this state, as provided in Section 25 of the Mississippi Constitution; including, however, convictions for manslaughter and violations of the United States Internal Revenue Code or any violations of the tax laws of this state, unless the offense also involved the misuse or abuse of an office or money coming

into a candidate's hands by virtue of an office. Unless listed differently, each candidate for office pays a fee of \$15 made payable to the appropriate County Party Executive Committee; or a qualifying petition, signed by not less than fifty (50) qualified electors (registered voters), certified by the Circuit Clerk of the respective county in which you are

seeking office.

Chancery Clerk

The Chancery Clerk is the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, and of the Chancery Court (family, civil court). The Clerk is responsible for maintaining the records of both the Board and the Court. It is a full-time position and the compensation is variable from year to year, based on

the fees collected for court cases. It is capped at \$90,000 annually, by law.

Each chancery clerk elected for a full term of office shall file in the office of the circuit clerk a certificate of completion of a course of training and education conducted by the Mississippi Judicial College of the University of Mississippi Law Center within six (6) months of the begin-

ning of the term for which the clerk is elected.

84 Turn Out for First Day Hike at Tishomingo

Eighty-four hikers participated in The First Day Hike held at Tishomingo State Park on January 1, 2015. Bill Brekeen, Park Manager, would like to thank everyone whose efforts made the event a success.

"It keeps getting bigger each year," reported Brekeen. "Hik-

ers came from bordering counties, Alabama and a few from the Jackson, Mississippi area."

All fifty states offer First Day Hikes in state parks across the country as a way to promote healthy lifestyles and year-round recreation at America's state parks.

"Seven hundred twenty mil-

lion people visit America's state parks and contribute over \$23 billion to the economy each year," added Brekeen. "State parks are a 'close to home' resource and an important part of our country's fabric, enhancing our quality of life."

Tishomingo State Park was the only Mississippi State Park

participating in the national First Day Hike campaign. After the hike everyone was invited to return to the Loochapola Lodge for refreshments and to view college football bowl games on a 70" flat screen TV furnished by Ferrell's Home and Outdoor, of Corinth, with service provided by VHI Systems, of Burton.

of the Circuit Court and chief elections officer of the county. The Clerk maintains the voter rolls and assists the Election Commissioners in purging the voter rolls, and assists election officials in conducting primary and general elections.

It is a full-time position and the compensation is variable from year to year, based on the fees collected for court cases. It is capped at \$90,000 annually by law. Each circuit clerk elected for a full term of office shall file in the office of the chancery clerk a certificate of completion of a course of training and education conducted by the Mississippi Judicial College of the University of Mississippi Law Center within six (6) months of the beginning of the term for which the clerk is elected. Each newly elected circuit clerk shall complete a computer skills training course within one hundred eighty (180) days of the commencement of their term; all serving circuit clerks shall complete a refresher course within one hundred eighty (180) days of the commencement of every odd-numbered term of service.

Tax Assessor and/or Tax Collector

The Tax Assessor and/or Collector may serve in both capacities in all counties; in Tishomingo County, they are separate offices. The Assessor's role is to maintain the personal, real, and ad valorem tax rolls of the county. The Collector is responsible for keeping the records of tax payments and depositing the money in the county treasury. These are full-time positions, and annual salary for Collector is \$54,000 and Assessor is \$56,000. Each tax assessor and tax collector shall attain certification through the Education and Certification Board, in cooperation with the Center for Governmental Training and Technology within the Mississippi State University Extension Service.

Coroner
The Coroner is the chief county medical examiner and/or county medical examiner investigator. This official is responsible for issuing declarations of death and performing or reporting results of autopsies in cases requiring such action. The coroner is paid \$125 per case for this part-time work. In 2013, the total paid was \$21,975.

A candidate for Coroner shall, at a minimum, possess a high school graduation diploma or its equivalent, be twenty-one (21) years of age or older and be a qualified elector of the county in which he seeks election.
Fee: \$10

County Attorney

A candidate for County Prosecuting Attorney shall be a qualified elector of the county in which he seeks election, possess all the qualifications of other county officers, and, in addition thereto, shall be a regular licensed and practicing lawyer.

The County Prosecuting Attorney represents the State in all investigations for felony in Justice Court and County Court and in all criminal cases appealed to the Circuit Court from the County Court. The county prosecutor may assist the district attorney, present matters to the county grand jury, and in some youth court proceedings. This is a part time position and the salary is \$40,400. Fee: \$15 made payable to the appropriate County Party Executive Committee; or a qualifying petition, signed

by not less than fifty (50) qualified electors (registered voters), certified by the Circuit Clerk of the respective county in which you are seeking office.

County Surveyor

A candidate for Surveyor shall be a qualified elector of the county in which he seeks election and a registered land surveyor as provided for in Miss. Code Ann. §§ 73-13-71 through 73-13-99. The county surveyor executes all orders of survey directed to him by any court, all surveys of land within his county at the request of the owners or proprietors, and to survey, resurvey, measure and divide land as requested by the county board of supervisors. The surveyor is not paid by the county.
Fee: \$10

Sheriff

The Sheriff is the chief law enforcement officer of the county, the chief officer of the Chancery and Circuit Courts and maintains the county law library. The Sheriff is in charge of the county courthouse, jail and protection of prisoners.

Salary for this full-time position is \$90,000, in accordance with Mississippi law and the population for Tishomingo County.

A candidate for Sheriff shall be a qualified elector of the county in which he seeks election and shall not be a defaulter to the state or any county or municipality thereof, or to the United States. Each sheriff-elect shall, at the expense of the county, attend and complete an appropriate curriculum in the field of law enforcement at the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Academy within one (1) year after taking the oath of office; excluding, however, those who have previously

served as a sheriff or have had at least five (5) years' full-time law enforcement experience within a period of ten (10) years prior to the date of taking the oath of office, or have previously successfully completed a course of training at the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Academy or the Jackson Policy Academy within five (5) years prior to the date of taking the oath of office.

Supervisor

Supervisors shall have the power to adopt, modify, alter, or repeal orders, resolutions, or ordinances in their respective county and district not inconsistent with law. In general, Supervisors have jurisdiction over roads, ferries, bridges, tax levies, court-houses, jails, county-owned real property, appropriation of funds, contractual powers of municipality as well as other powers expressly authorized by law. Salary for this part-time position is \$40,400.

Justice Court Judge (North & South Districts)

Justice Court Judges have civil and criminal jurisdiction of all actions where the principal of the debt, amount of the demand, or the value of the property sought to be recovered does not exceed \$3,500. In Tishomingo County we have two districts for justice court - North and South, determined by the board of supervisors. Salary for this part-time position is \$40,400.

A candidate for Justice Court Judge shall be a qualified elector and resident of the county for two (2) years next preceding his selection and shall have a high school graduate or a general equivalency diploma unless he shall

have served as a justice of the peace or been elected to the office of justice of the peace prior to January 1, 1976.

Each justice court judge shall be required to file in the office of the chancery clerk a certificate of completion of a course of training and education conducted by the Mississippi Judicial College of the University of Mississippi Law Center within six months of the beginning of the term of office. In addition, each justice court judge shall be required to file annually in the office of the chancery clerk a certificate of completion of a course of continuing education conducted by the Mississippi Judicial College. See also, Miss. Code Ann. § 9-11-4.

Fee: \$10 made payable to the appropriate County Party Executive Committee; or a qualifying petition, signed by not less than fifteen (15) qualified electors (registered voters) from the district you are seeking office, certified by the Circuit Clerk of the respective county in which you are seeking office.

Constable (North & South Districts)

A County Constable shall keep and preserve the peace within his county by aiding and assisting in executing the criminal laws of the state for the Justice Courts of his

district. Constables shall obey all lawful orders, execute all judgements, and attend all sessions of the Justice Courts within his district. We have two in Tishomingo County - North and South - same as the Justice Court districts.

Compensation for the time position is in accordance with Justice Court Clerks served - \$35 per hour. In 2013, the total paid for North Half Constable was \$22,450. A candidate for constable must be a qualified elector in the county and district in which he seeks election. During a constable's term of office, each constable must be a qualified elector, which he is physically able to participate in a course of training having a duration of at least four (4) weeks which addresses the nature and scope of the duties and responsibilities of a constable and which includes firearm use, safety training, established by the Board of Law Enforcement Officers Standards and Training in the field of law enforcement at the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Training Academy. Such other training programs that are approved by the Board on Law Enforcement Officers Standards and Training. In addition, each constable shall complete (8) hours annually of education training. Fee \$10

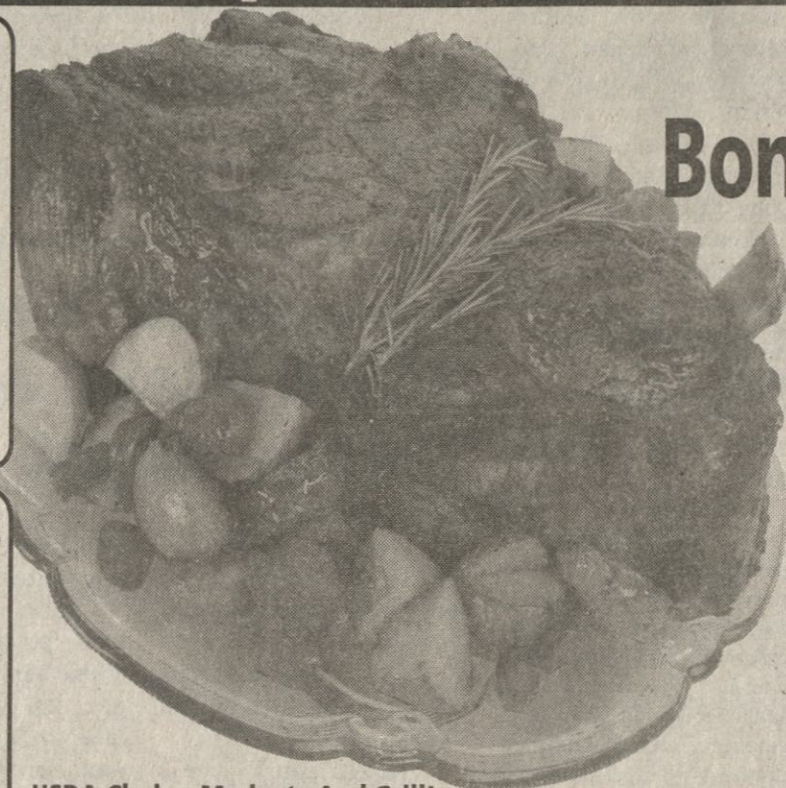

Great Truths In Small Packages (part XV)

Jude, the brother of Jesus and James, wrote to believers to remind them of their position as those who had been sanctified, preserved and called. Then in verse 2 he said, "Mercy unto you, and peace, and love, be multiplied." Perhaps some readers may need at least a refreshing on the meaning of the word mercy. It means that God is withholding the judgment that we really deserve. Even believers, who have been justified by the death and resurrection of Jesus, still need God's mercy, for we still sometimes sin against Him. Jude also asks that his readers experience peace, evidently the peace

of God for believers, since all believers have already experienced salvation that brings peace with God. Philippians 4:6-7 says, "Be careful (anxious) for nothing; but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." When believers stop worrying about things and start praying about everything properly, with thanksgiving, God floods the spirit with peace that is beyond our ability to understand! This peace "keeps" our hearts and minds. This word "keep" is a military term, for it is

like a garrison of soldiers who guard our hearts and minds. Jude wanted this kind of peace for his readers!

Jude wanted mercy, peace and love to be multiplied in the lives of those to whom he wrote. The word Jude used for "love" is the Greek word "agape"; it is the highest kind of love, for the same word is used of God's love for us in John 3:16. The indication is that believers can experience more of God's mercy, peace and love in their lives; believers can then share what God is doing in their hearts with others. Every church I know could use a multiplication of all three of these things, especially toward each other!

Now Jude embarks on a different thought, for he had wanted to write about "the common salvation", but there was a necessity for something different, as verse 3 shows: "Beloved, when I gave all diligence to write unto you of the

common salvation, needful for me to write unto you, and exhort that ye should earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints." Preachers do not always have the privilege of writing speaking in tongues, but the desire at a given time for God may have something different in mind for them! Many preachers never seem to get other than the message of salvation, as good may be, but there is need to speak about things. God did not write the writing of 66 books nothing; He meant to preach something than the four gospels. Jude was impressed with the need to encourage readers to contend for the truth of God that is called "the faith".
