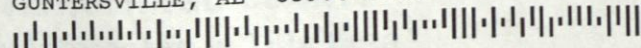

A few more candidates have filed with the circuit clerk to run for the county election primaries this summer, and general elections this fall. So far, the only courthouse office that has more than one candidate running is the office of Tax Assessor. Of the five supervisors, there is a race in each position except in

the fifth district, where, so far, incumbent Greg Collier is still the only contender.

For State offices, all the incumbents for district senate and represen-

tative seats have qualified with their respective parties, and there are contests in Senate District 4 and House District 21, which includes the southern end of Tishomingo County.

Teachers of the Year Announced

Belmont's Hughes District Teacher of the Year

Superintendent Christie Hughes announced the teachers and administrators of the year for the Tishomingo County schools, and Christy Hughes, language arts teacher at Belmont Middle School was selected as Teacher of the Year.

Teachers of the Year are selected by a process at the discretion of each head principal, explained Holly. Principals from throughout the district come together to choose the teacher of the year for the district. The assistant administrator and administrator of the year are chosen at the central office level.

Christy Hughes-District Teacher of the Year

According to Mrs. Hughes, it is very humbling to be honored by her colleagues—her friends. She says that she has been fortunate to work alongside kind,

unselfish people for the last fifteen years. She considers it a gift from God to be a teacher at Belmont schools. From the age of five

until she graduated in 1988, Mrs. Hughes attended Belmont schools. She says of her teachers at Belmont, "I knew my teachers genuinely cared about me. They did much more than teach me academic subjects—they invested in my life. They were examples of high moral character and true professionals who influenced my life in positive ways." After high school, her parents made it possible for her to attend Northeast Mississippi Junior College and the University of North Alabama where she earned her B.S. in English. After earning her Master of Arts from the University of Mississippi, she worked to

become Nationally Board Certified.

"My teachers set the bar high, and I follow in the footsteps of true greatness," Christy said of the teachers she had growing up. "My success as a teacher is largely due to the influence of my teachers and coaches. Kyle Cooper - Burnsville Middle

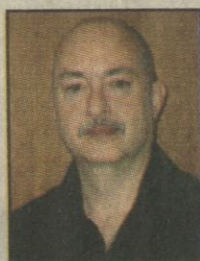
