During this time a good aritan had stopped to help of the vehicles that had hed. Then, a semi-tractor/ er, traveling eastbound, hit same ice, jack-knived and ded into a parked vehicle was on the shoulder, and pedestrians.

and died from injuries sustained in the crash. Her son, a 9-yearold child, was taken to Magnolia Regional Medical Center in Corinth and later transferred to LeBonheur Children's Hospital in Memphis.

A good Samaritan, who stopped to assist with the crashes, was the third person struck. Anna D. Hill, 47, of Burnsville, died on the scene from injuries sustained in the crash.

Means Caused **Disturbance** at Fulton Walmart

Just a few days before the shootout that resulted in his death at the Iuka Walmart, Fulton officers dealt with a confused Howard Brent Means, Jr. at the Fulton Walmart.

According to Fulton Police Chief Reggie Johnson, officers from his department responded on Wednesday, February 11th, to a report of a disturbance at the service desk at the Fulton, Mississippi Walmart store. According to the report, Howard Brent Means, Jr. had come to the service desk at the store and was refusing to leave. Officers who responded reported that Means said "his father was trying to kill him," and he could not leave the store.

Based on their experience, it appeared that Means may have been "off his medication," said Johnson. As is commonly done in situations like this, said Johnson, an ambulance was called and Means agreed to be transported to behavioral health services at North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo.

Johnson said that Means was not threatening anyone during the incident.

luka Investigation Continues

Just four days later, Means lead Iuka Police on a chase that ended up at the Walmart in Iuka: After a 20-minute standoff and several rounds of shooting, Means was shot and died, and two Iuka officers were injured by gunfire.

According to spokesman Warren Strain of the Mississippi Highway Patrol, the Mississippi Bureau of Investigation is completing its investigation of the February 15th shootout at the Iuka store. When complete, the report, including the autopsy, will be turned over to the district attorney for his review, and he will decide if any further actions will be pursued.

One Dead, One Hospitalized **After Monday Night Wreck**

About p.m. Monday night, a 1994 Nissan Pathfinder. was westbound



on Highway 72 when it apparently left the road on the north side, and rolled several times. The occupants Paul "Pee-Wee" Enlow, Jr., 44, of Iuka and Miles Williams, 32, of Iuka, were ejected from the vehicle.

Enlow died at the scene, and Williams was transported to the hospital for treatment. On Tuesday, it was reported he was in critical condition in the Regional Medical Center in Memphis.

The cause of the wreck is still under investigation by the Mississippi Highway Patrol.



"Alaina's story will have a happy ending. One where she will go to college and perhaps, one day, write about her experiences. The hardship she faces, is a temporary one. Yet never a hardship anyone expects to face at the tender age of 11," said Katie Melvin as she pondered her daughter's bravery and humility. "Her strength epitomizes our own humility, for the greater good of person-hood. This little girl survives and she survives in us all."

House Turns Focus to Budget Matters

Week of February 16, 2015 Summary

This week, members of the House turned their focus toward budget matters, with both the Appropriations and Ways and Means committees very active. The Appropriations committee deals with spending the state's money and is charged with designing the Fiscal Year (FY) 2016 State Budget, which begins July 1. The Ways and Means Committee focuses on sources of state revenue. This committee crafts bills used as vehicles to fund the government. Early projections suggest the budget for FY2016 will be close to \$6 billion.

The Ways and Means Committee passed several bills out of committee and onto

the House floor, including:

-- House Bill 38 (HB38) authorizes the issuance of bonds to provide funds for the Small Municipalities and Limited Population Counties Fund. This allows counties under populations of 30,000 and cities under populations of 10,000 to apply for grants with the Mississippi Development Authority (MDA) of up to \$250,000 a piece.

-- House Bill 155 (HB155) increases the historic property income tax credit from \$60,000 to \$100,000 and extends the time taxpayers may be eligible to receive it

through 2030.

--House Bill 216 (HB216) freezes the assessed valuation of a person's home (ages 65 or older or totally disabled) as long as they live in that house and do not increase the value of the home through renovations.

On the House floor Wednesday and Thursday, House members first addressed Special Funds Appropriations bills and then moved to tackle General Funds Appropriations bills. Special Funds are amounts set aside in separate accounts in the State

Treasury for specific spending purposes. This money is typically generated from fees and licensing expenses collected by agencies, and also includes federal funds available to agencies. General Funds are state revenues that are not restricted to specific spending purposes. General fund money is, for the most part, collected through taxation of individuals and businesses.

The amounts appropriated to each agency were determined based on agency needs, not what the agency already had in its coffers. The deadline to address these bills is February 25 at midnight.

During the presentation of the first Special Funds bill, an amendment was adopted to authorize a pay raise for employees of state agencies who have not had a pay raise since 2011. This amendment, which was also adopted for each additional appropriation bill, allows agencies to provide the raises, within their authorized budgets, up to five percent. Adoption of this amendment does not increase expenditures from the General Fund, and it will apply to all state agencies, not just those funded through Special Funds.
