





Mississippi Silicon

The year 2014 opened with the announcement of a new plant in Burnsville, and though there have been several attempts by competitors through court cases to block the construction, Mississippi Silicon is still under construction. The \$200 million plant on a 100-acre site in the Northeast Mississippi Waterway Industrial Park is supposed to employ about 200. The new facility will produce silicon metal for a broad range of industries in the United States including the aluminum, automotive and chemical industries.

Byrom Death Sentence Overturned

In April, the Mississippi Supreme Court overturned the conviction of Michelle Byrom, after 14 years on death row for the 1999 murder-for-hire of her husband Edward Byrom, Sr. Though they refused to give any

reason for the reversal of the 2000 conviction, the Court sent the case back to Tishomingo County for new trial,



Byrom is a resident of the county jail. A new trial date has been set for Tuesday, September 1st, according to Assistant District Attorney Richard Bowen. Local attorney John White is her court-appointed lawyer, and he will likely be assisted by attorneys from the Innocence Proj-

Since it is a capital murder case, there are a lot of preliminary matters, discovery issues and motions to complete before the pretrial conference in July, if Byrom doesn't plea before that, and both sides come to some agreement. She has served significantly more time than anyone else involved in the case, including the supposed shooter.

luka Closes "Hotel" as "Not Fit for Human Occupancy"

In October, the city of Iuka voted to close down the former Battlefield Inn after years of it being used as a supposed homeless shelter. Operator Jackie Bunns was cited with violations of the state innkeeper statute, which essentially requires managers of facilities run as hotels or inns in the state to-keep guest facilities "in clean and sanitary condition; and to provide each

Sunday Beer Sales A year after legal beer sales began in Tishomingo County, the county board of supervisors responded to requests from marina owners and approved Sunday beer and light wine sales in the county, effective June 1st. The decision was made by a 3-2 vote in the regular May 5th meeting, but it didn't take long for anti-alcohol forces to blast the board members for the decision. After a board meeting scheduled to just be a pre-construction conference on May 12th, First District Supervisor Brandon Grissom read a prepared statement, saying that he regretted his "hasty" decision to support Sunday sales, and asked the board to support a motion to allow him to rescind his vote in favor of Sunday sales. No board members seconded the motion, and it died.

luka Board Passes Smoking Ban

In December, Iuka's city board joined nearly 40 other municipalities across the state in passing a smoking ban that would prohibit smoking in any public buildings. Announcement of the ban was generally well-received, except by a local bingo establishment, Riverhills Bingo, on Highway 72, whose owners fear that clientele will be reduced. This is especially critical because Riverhills funds the Tri-State Educational Foundation, a locally-based organization that pumps millions into scholarships and other funding for local efforts. The owners, Bob and Sylvia Ferguson, met

with the Iuka board of aldermen to ask for an amendment that would allow them to have smoking in their establishment,

Deaths on Trace Result in Federal Charges

Two motorcyclists from Quebec were killed when a vehicle driven by Donnie William Sartain, 50, of Tishomingo, struck them on the Natchez Trace Parkway August 6th.

In October, Sartain pled guilty to involuntary manslaughter in federal court in connection with the deaths of Pauline Demers, 56, and Gerard Nault, 56, of Sherbrooke, Quebec, Canada. Sartain was initially charged with two counts of murder, and accident reports indicated he had been intoxicated when his pickup drifted into the oncoming lane near mile marker 289 in Prentiss County and struck the motorcycle on which the Canadians were riding.

Instead of going to trial in October, Sartain agreed to change his plea to guilty of the lesser charges of involuntary manslaughter.


Faculty, Coaching & Staff **Changes in Schools**

Students in Tishomingo County saw many changes in staff at county schools. At year's end, three schools, Iuka Elementary and Middle, and Belmont Elementary, all were assigned new principals. All the principals were already district

administrators. New coaches in baseball, football, and women's basketball at Tishomingo County, while inspiring some hope in the programs, have not proved to be the cure-all for which athletic supporters had hoped. Even Belmont's historically successful football program will have a new coach in 2015, with Kerry Moody's resignation.

Deadline for Filing the 2015 Homestead Exemption is April 1st

If you filed on the same residence last year and NO CHANGES have been made, it is NOT necessary to file this year. If there were ANY CHANGES to your warranty deed, such as a name change, newly married, divorced, or widowed this past year, please come into the office and file a new application. If you became 65 years of age on or before January 1, 2015, and have not filed for the special exemption, you will need to bring proof of age. If you became 100% disabled before January 1, 2015 you will need to bring your Social Security Awards Letter. Also new this year if you are on a 100 percent

"Disabled American

Veteran" you qualify for Special Exemption, you will need to bring a copy of Statement of Case Letter from the Veterans Service Office to file for Special D.A.V. Exemption. If you are filing on a new residence you will need to bring your recorded Warranty Deed, you and your spouse's social security numbers, and

your Mississippi license plate numbers. Your Warranty Deed must be acknowledged by December 31, 2014 and recorded by January 7, 2015.

The Homestead Exemption Law allows you to file on one residence only. If you are married, you and your spouse's names must both be

on the homestead application. You must be living in the residence January 1 of the year in which you are filing. If you have any



Kennedy spoke of the tears shed when the news came of the grenade attack on Carpenter and his fellow Marine.

"After many surgeries, Kyle was on the mend but still in the hospital. We arranged a phone conversation where all the church members could hear Kyle's voice for the first time. As Kyle spoke, there wasn't a dry eye in the place," said

"Today we want to thank Kyle for doing what most of us are incapable of doing," he said.

Kennedy said the ability to sacrifice for another comes from "something deep inside" and is a rare

Tennessee state Sen. Dolores Gresham, a former Marine herself, said, members of the lo- "The Marines did good on this one. When we joined, they told us, 'Don't look for awards for doing what a Marine is supposed to do anyway.' Kyle went above and beyond the call of duty and deserves to be recognized."

Gresham invited the audience to stand, whether military background or not, and "salute Cpl. Kyle Carpenter" for being an exemplary Marine.

Other remarks came from Tennessee District 26 Rep. David Byrd, Mississippi State Senator J.P. Wilemon Jr., Marsha Blackburn representative Johnny Blakely, Hardin County Mayor Kevin Davis, Veterans Affairs C.D. Rickman, American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Blakely read a proclamation declaring Dec.

ter Day in the state of Tennessee. Davis had a similar proclamation making the day a significant one in Hardin County.

Retired U.S. Air Force Lt. Gen. Joe Hurd shared the history of Medal of Honor and told the stories of the three Medal of Honor recipients in Hardin County - Carpenter, Bolden Rush Harrison and Vernon McGarity.

Carpenter was invited to view the veteran memorial in Court Square where his name had been etched next to the title, "Medal of Honor Recipient."

As Carpenter approached the podium to speak, a hush came over the audience while the flashing of cameras from several media organizations snapped their best shots of the honored guest who had traveled from South Carolina to attend the ceremony.

"I usually know what I'm going to say at these sorts of events. I had a speech prepared for today, but that all went out of my head," said Carpenter. "You all came here today to thank me. And all I can think of, is to thank you. I remember living about three minutes down the road from here and how many things have happened since that time. I feel the support of the people in Hardin County. Words cannot express how I feel today.'

Carpenter talked about wearing the Medal of Honor and how he is the "face of it," but he wears it for many reasons. For him, it stands for the dedication of thousands of service men and women, the support families and friends give to them and the high standards the United States has in the world for democracy and freedom.

Taps closed out the event, then crowds of well-wishers gathered for a chance to shake Carpenter's hand and give him personal words of gratitude.

The Best Reason To Rejoice

People often think of the Christmas season as a time to rejoice and enjoy the company of family and friends, and I do not think this is bad, for most of us do enjoy such times of rejoicing. Jesus, however, gave a better reason for rejoicing, which may not have entered the minds of some people. In Luke chapter 10, we have the record of Jesus having sent 70 people out to publish the message of His kingdom.

Luke 10:17-20 shows what happened when the 70 returned to Jesus: "And the seventy returned again with joy, saying, Lord, even the devils are subject unto us through Thy name. And He said unto them, I beheld Satan as lightning fall from heaven. Behold, I give unto you power to tread upon serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy; and nothing shall by any means Notwithhurt you. standing in this rejoice not, that the spirits are

subject unto you; but rather rejoice, because your names are written in heaven."

It has always interested me that some people love to talk about the "power of God on their lives", even though such "power" may not be evident to others. It is also interesting to me that God chooses to use whom He will in whatever way He chooses, and all of us do not do the exact same things in the kingdom of God. Even though the main work of God in time is to bring men into reconciliation with Himself, as II Corinthians 5:18-20 so clearly shows, yet not all of us do the exact same things to bring men to God. The 70 in

our verses were more than pleased that God had made demons to be subject to them, but Jesus said that should not be their biggest reason for rejoicing. He told them that they should rejoice, because their names were written in heaven. The very language of this statement indicates that not everyone has his name recorded in heaven. Only those who are saved would be included in such a record. If, as some suppose, we cannot know that we are saved in the present time, how could anyone know that his name is recorded in heaven, so that it would be a real reason for rejoicing? The fact is that we can

know that we belong to God and that our names are already written in heaven, thus we can rejoice over this fact at any season of the year and under any circumstance! Is your name written there?







Early Roman Calendar: March 1st Rings in the **New Year**

The early Roman calendar designated March 1 as the new year. The calendar had just ten months, beginning with March. That the new year once began with the month of March is still reflected in some of the names of the months. September through December, our ninth through twelfth months, were originally positioned as the seventh through tenth months (septem is Latin for "seven," octo is "eight," novem is "nine," and decem is "ten."

January Joins the Calendar

The first time the new year was celebrated on January 1st was in Rome in 153 B.C. (In fact, the month of January did not even exist until around 700 B.C., when the second king of Rome, Numa Pontilius, added the months of January and February.) The new year was moved from March to January because that was the beginning of the civil year, the month that the two newly elected Roman consuls—the highest officials in the Roman republic—began their one-year tenure. But this new year date was not always strictly and widely observed, and the new year was still sometimes celebrated on March 1.

Julian Calendar: January **1st Officially Instituted** as the New Year

In 46 B.C. Julius Caesar introduced a new, solar-based calendar that was a vast improvement on the ancient Roman calendar, which was a lunar system that had become wildly inaccurate over the years. The Julian calendar decreed that the new year would occur with January 1, and within the Roman world, January 1 became the consistently observed start of the new year.


