Bill Gurley Elected Chairman of the Board of the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society

Iuka native, Bill Gurley has been unanimously elected to serve as President and Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society (TCHGS) located in the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse. Gurley assumed the Chairmanship at the meeting of the Board of Directors last Thursday.

Gurley is an electrical engineer by profession. Prior to retirement in 2011, he was a Senior Vice President and General Manager for a large business unit of Science Applications International Corporation (SAIC) in Huntsville Alabama. Mr. Gurley graduated from Iuka High School in 1967 and received his engineering degree from Mississippi State University in 1972. He has a strong passion for the preservation of the history, heritage, and genealogy of Tishomingo County and brings more than 30 years of business management, engineering, and scientific knowledge to the TCHGS Board of Directors. He is formerly a mayoral appointee to the Executive Board of the Huntsville, Alabama, Chamber of Commerce, Executive Leader of the public fundraising campaign for the National Children's Advocacy Center in Huntsville, and the Executive Director of the



fundraising campaign for the Huntsville U.S. Space and Rocket Center project to restore and permanently house the nation's first SATURN V Rocket at the Davidson Center for Space Exploration.

"It is exciting for our organization to have Bill as our new leader," said Cindy Nelson, Vice President and Executive Director for TCHGS and former Chairman of the Board. "He is widely respected, has a vision for the future of the County and TCHGS and is passionate about the importance of sustaining our history, heritage and culture."

Bill and his wife, Kathy, are well known and appreciated throughout

the community.

"I am honored to be elected to this position with TCHGS. I believe this organization is a key-stone to the development of increasing and sustaining tourism revenue for our County," said Gurley. "This not-for-profit organization has been conceived, nurtured and grown by a driven and dedicated group of volunteers who for years have devoted their time and energy to preservation and promotion of the rich history and genealogy of the County. Work at TCCTC Earns Taylor Administrator of the Year

The Tishomingo County School District has selected Mr. John-Grady Taylor, Career and Technical Director, as the 2014-2015 Administrator of the Year. Mr. Taylor has twenty years of experience and a forty-year background in education through his family.

John-Grady was raised in Tishomingo where he graduated from high school in 1990 and then pursued his education degree, graduating from Mississippi State "Cum Laude" in 1994. After graduation he worked for the USDA for a year before pursuing a teaching career that began at Ingomar High School where he was the Agriculture instructor for four years. In 2007, Mr. Taylor was offered the opportunity to come home and serve as the Career and Technical Director for the district and readily accepted. As CTE director for Tishomingo County, Mr. Taylor has implemented program changes and improvements in order to offer students better opportunities and give business and industry a better-prepared workforce. From implementing a culinary arts program to serve the growing tourism industry, to installing an engineering and robotics program to help students be prepared for high-skill,

high-wage positions, to serving on the CTE state advisory board, Mr. Taylor always focuses his efforts and the efforts of his programs and teachers on providing Tishomingo County students and communities the best opportunities for education and career possible.

the county and especially the Old Tishomingo Courthouse museum and archives. Now they have set in motion an energized Board of Directors and who will initiate and leverage efforts through the U.S. Department of Parks and Recreation Mississippi Hills Native Heritage Foundation, a strategic relationship with the Chickasaw Indian Nation and several funding and funds-

matching grant opportunities. I look forward to working with the County Board of Supervisors, the Mayors of towns within our County, the various volunteer civic organizations and the Tishomingo Economic Development Board and others to capitalize on our rightful place in the development of tourism as an important factor in our future economic growth while main-

taining and growing our treasure trove of historical artifacts and genealogical archives."

The other present TCHGS Board Executive Committee Officers include secretary, RaNae Vaughn; and past president, Harold Lomenick. TCHGS Board of Directors include Joe Burns, Eddie Carson, Robert Grisham, Bill Gurley, Larry Klatt, Cindy Nel-

son, Steve Smith (Mayoral appointee from Belmont), Janice Switcher, Lee Thorne, Shelia Thorne, and RaNae Vaughn.

The headquarters of the Society is in the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse. Since its development in 1996, TCHGS has been dedicated to the collection and interpretation of the history and culture of Tishomingo County and its sur-

rounding communities. The collection includes an estimated 10,000 three-dimensional artifacts; approximately 7,500 archival documents, ephemera, and newspapers (clippings and full issues); 150 military objects from the Civil War to the Iraqi War; 600 Native American artifacts (some dating back to 8000 B.C.), 3,500 photographs; 120 large format items (maps and

blueprints); 50 media items (film) approximately 20 feet of vertical film more than 1,500 books. In addition, cetry.com and Facebook are available at the library's desk to assist with patron lookups and soon be offered on a designated computer.

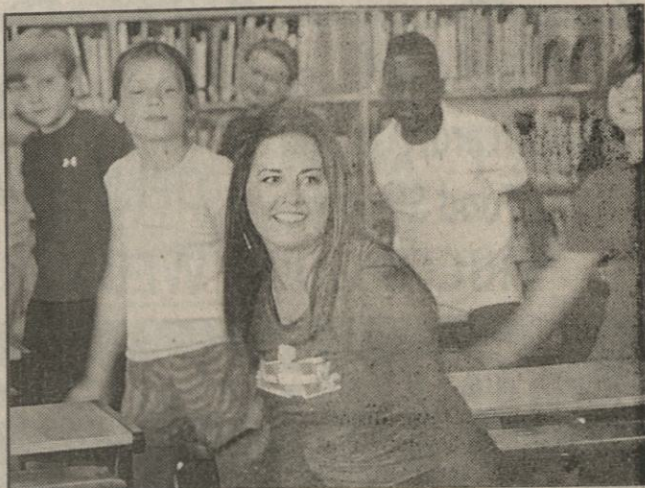

Move To Learn Team Comes to Visit Iuka Elementary School

Coach Terry Leigh Clayton, one of the stars of the Move to Learn exercise break videos, will be at the Iuka Elementary School campus on January 29, 2015 to introduce administrators, teachers and students to the Move to Learn Initiative.

A team from The Bower Foundation and the Mississippi Department of Education's Office of Healthy Schools will accompany Clayton to present a live demonstration of the Move to Learn videos. The presentation will be held at 9:00 am (grades K-2) and 10:00am (grades 3-4) in the gymnasium.

"Improving nutrition and physical activity levels for Mississippi school children is a priority; healthy children are more likely to be academically successful," said Anne Travis, CEO of The Bower Foundation. The foundation is partnering with the MDE OHS to improve the health of students statewide through the program. "Brief physical activity and increased fitness improve learning and test scores. With this in mind, Move to Learn was designed to be fun for students, improve learning, and assist teachers with classroom management," said Scott Clements, Director of MDE's Office of



Healthy Schools.

The Move to Learn videos feature coaches leading students in simple movement exercises that can be done in a small space. Teachers are noticing that incorporating the fitness breaks in the classroom has increased their students' ability to learn and to focus on schoolwork. The fitness breaks help teachers create positive learning environments and promote effective classroom management.

These brief, organized, and free classroom movement breaks can help teachers manage their students' energy levels so that after a fitness break children's brains are

more focused and ready to learn or take a test. These breaks were developed by Mississippians for Mississippi children. Research shows us that when we exercise our body we are also exercising our brain.

Mississippi teachers are excited about this resource as they prepare students to meet education standards.

Studies have shown that physical activity increases a child's ability to learn, and as fitness improves, test scores improve. More information about The Bower Foundation's Move to Learn programs may be found on the Internet at www.movetolearnms.org.

The Master Gardener Program in Tishomingo County

What is the Master Gardener Program? It's simply a group of people interested in horticulture who enjoy the fellowship of others with the same interest. What do they do? They attend meetings, workshops, field trips, etc. but more importantly, they volunteer their time toward projects in Tishomingo County. These projects can be in the local community or another area of the county. MGs have the freedom to choose as long as it fits the criteria for a volunteer horticulture project. How do you become one? You must fill out an application which you can get by contacting the Tishomingo County Extension Office at 423-7016 or by stopping by at 238 Kaki St. in Iuka. You must then complete a 40 hour in-depth training taught by Mississippi State University's Extension Service along with local Master Gardeners. This training program will be held on Mondays, Tuesdays and

Thursdays from 10:00 to 3:00 p.m. with a lunch break at noon, beginning February 12th and ending March 5th. All sessions will be taught by Extension Service professionals or current Master Gardeners at the Extension Office in Iuka. If you miss a session, you will be able to make it up later. Enrollment

will be limited to 30 participants, who, following training, will commit to donating 40 volunteer service hours to community projects in Tishomingo County. Training begins with instructions on the Master Gardener program concept, basic botany, and soils. Other training sessions include vegetables,

ornamental plants, home fruit and nut production, invasive plants, diseases, insects, weed control, pesticides and lawn care. Plus, we will have hands-on demonstrations and a field trip to look at different operations in the county. A one-time fee of \$90.00 covers materials, refreshments and a 1-year membership in the Mississippi Master Gardener Association. The deadline for application is January 30th.

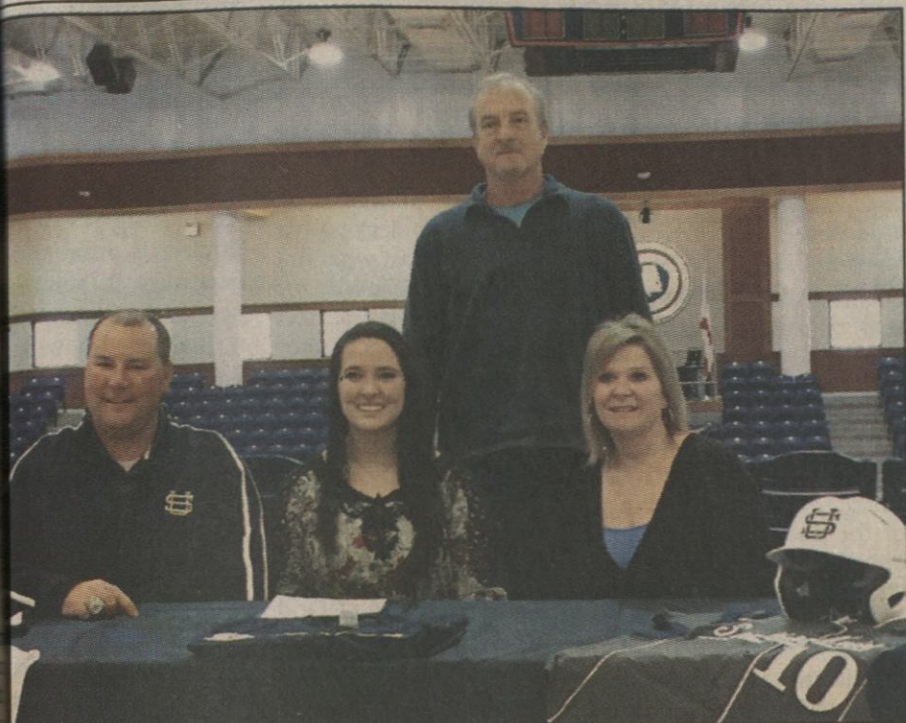

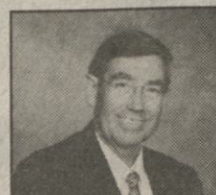

Great Truths In Small Packages (part XVII)

We were looking at Jude 1:3 in the last article in this series. I want to return to that verse, because there is one more thing that needs to be said about it. Jude 1:3 says, "Beloved, when I gave all diligence to write unto you of the common salvation, it was needful for me to write unto you, and exhort you that ye should earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered to the saints." I want to major on the words "once delivered" in this article. The Greek meaning for the word "once" as it is used in this verse is: "one (or a single) time (numerically or con-

clusively)." The idea is that "the faith", as a set of Bible teachings, was delivered one time forever to the saints, meaning to the people who are saved and thus set apart for God. There is to be no changing of the doctrines that were once for all delivered to the church, so the new wave of supposed "insight" into the Word of God certainly should not conflict with what was at first, and one time for all, delivered to the people of God! Jude has given us the idea that we will have to contend, like one seeking to win a wrestling match, for the true faith that God delivered by His Word to the church. Those who are always coming up with some "new teaching", of which nobody else in

the church, especially in the early church, has ever heard, need to reconsider their positions!

Why is it that some people are always trying to "outwit" the rest of us and teach something so far different than what the church has believed for centuries? I am not saying that someone cannot receive new light on what has been revealed, which we call illumination, or a shedding of light on a truth. I am saying, however, that any teaching that changes the actual meaning of what has been given in the Word of God is heretical! Every believer has the Spirit of God dwelling in him, therefore he can learn and understand Bible truths to the degree that he has studied and prepared himself to understand what is written. The Spirit of God is the final teacher for all of us, as is clearly pointed out in I John 2:20, 27. If Jude thought it necessary to exhort the believers to whom he wrote that they should

Thomas Jefferson was a very remarkable man who started learning very early in life and never stopped. His portrait is on the \$2.00 bill.

At five, began studying under his cousin's tutor.

At nine, studied Latin, Greek and French.

At 14, studied classical literature and additional languages.

At 16, entered the College of William and Mary. Also could write in Greek with one hand while writing the same in Latin with the other.

At 19, studied law for five years starting under George Wythe.

At 23, started his own law practice.

At 25, was elected to the Virginia House of Burgesses.

At 31, wrote the widely circulated "Summary View of the Rights of British America" and retired from his law practice.

At 32, was a delegate to the Second Continental Congress.

At 33, wrote the Declaration of Independence.

At 33, took three years to revise Virginia's legal code and wrote a Public education bill and a statute for Religious Freedom.

At 36, was elected the second Governor of Virginia succeeding Patrick Henry.

At 40, served in Congress for two years.

At 41, was the American minister to France and negotiated commercial treaties with European nations along with Ben Franklin and John Adams.

At 46, served as the first Secretary of State under George Washington.

At 53, served as Vice President and was elected president of the American

Philosophical Society.

At 55, drafted the Kentucky Resolutions and became the active head of Republican Party. At 57, was elected the third president of the United States.

At 60, obtained the Louisiana Purchase doubling the nation's size.

At 61, was elected to a second term as President.

At 65, retired to Monticello.

At 80, helped President Monroe shape the Monroe Doctrine.

At 81, almost single-handedly created the University of Virginia and served as its first president.

At 83, died on the 50th anniversary of the Signing of the Declaration of Independence along with John Adams.

Thomas Jefferson knew because he, himself, studied the previous failed attempts at government. He understood actual history, the nature of God, His laws and the nature of man. That happens to be way more than what most understand today. Jefferson really knew his stuff. A voice from the past to lead us in the future:
