Man Dead, Two Officers Shot at Walmart Confrontation

A Tishomingo man died and Iuka Police officers suffered shot injuries during a confrontation at Iuka Walmart Sunday evening, February 15.

According to reports, Iuka police officers on duty around Sunday evening attempted to pull over a Chevrolet Impala driven by Howard Brent Means, 34, of Tishomingo. Witnesses said the driver had been acting erratically and circling the parking lot of the BP Station at the intersection of Battleground and Quitman Street. The driver refused to pull over when officers boxed him in several different times, and sometime in the pursuit, he drove his car into a median, blowing out the front left tire.

Officers followed Means as he headed south on Battleground Drive. A short distance down the road, he pulled into Walmart's parking lot, and came to a stop in front of the main entrance.

Witnesses at the scene reported seeing him enter the store with the shotgun [later identified by coroner Mack Winick as a 20-gauge] followed by Iuka Police Officers and Chief Randy Stringer had arrived to assist his officer.

His horn was stuck on the roof and the flat tire was making a terrible loud noise when he entered the parking lot, so I turned around and watched the car slide up to me," said eyewitness Julie McBride, who had just exited Walmart to her car in the handicapped parking area nearest the door. McBride watched the Iuka police officers at the scene follow Means into the store, and then left the parking lot as soon as she could.

On a typical Sunday night shopping trip, Iuka parent Julie Perkins Maxcy was in the store with her oldest daughter, Penzie. They heard sirens outside, and then shouting in the store - they imagined there had been a wreck and someone had run into Walmart. Then, she got a call from her son, Braeden, 16, who was in the parking lot in their

vehicle with his younger sister. Their van had almost been hit by a car going through the parking lot, and he told his mother a scruffy man had just walked in the store carrying a shotgun. From their location near the pharmacy, Julie Maxcy could see a man, later identified as Brent Means, who was obviously agitated and upset speaking loudly with police officers near the service desk. He had a shotgun in his hand.

Maxcy started heading to the back of the store, urging other shoppers she encountered to quietly move along there, too, including her father and nephew, who, coincidentally, were also in the store. About twenty shoppers and Walmart personnel huddled near the back door for about twenty minutes waiting to see what happened.

"Everyone thinks it all happened very quickly, but we were back there about 20 minutes, and were told [by Walmart's Billy Horne] that if something happened everyone should leave out the back doors and run," said Maxcy.

Maxcy said they heard gunshots at the front of the store, and they all ran out the back door, some to Hardee's and some to the car wash nearby.

The gunshots were between

police and Means, where officers had been trying to calm the clearly agitated man and get him to surrender his gun. "We just could not reach him," said officers. One of the things eyewitnesses said they heard was Means screaming "they killed my family!"

Police Chief Stringer was shot in the thigh during this first exchange in the front of the store; these shots were heard in many social media released videos. Stringer and his people then pursued Means as he moved toward the back of the store.

"He was back there where we thought all those people were we had sent to the back for their safety," said Stringer of the situation which was deteriorating quickly. The officers observed Means reloading the shotgun and pointing it towards them. Several shots were exchanged near the lay-away desk in the back of the store and Officer Joseph Marlar was hit near his right eye. Means died on the scene.

Other local and state law officers had arrived to assist and were outside the store, clearing the parking lot.

Joseph Marlar was hit above his eye by gunshot and was treated at Iuka Hospital. He was later released. Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer was also shot in the thigh and was treated and released from Iuka Hospital.

No hostages were ever held during the ordeal as reported by some news sources.

Autopsy on Means' body was complete by presstime, but information was being held un-

til the Mississippi Bureau of Investigation could release the information. MBI is investigating, since this was an officer-involved shooting. MBI officers were on site early Monday morning investigating the scene in Walmart, and interviewing eyewitnesses, employees and officers. The entire event is thought to have been recorded on Walmart's video surveillance system.

Walmart opened Tuesday after cleanup was completed, but Walmart officials deferred any questions to their media relations, who failed to return phone calls.

Brent Means lived in Tishomingo and was a former student at Belmont High School. He was a well-known young man with many friends who are in disbelief following the incident. Like many young men, he had some scrapes with the law in the southern end of Tishomingo County over the years, but his behavior had never indicated that this kind of tragedy could occur. His Facebook page indicated that as late as last year, he said, with the support of his family and God, he was winning a struggle with addiction.

Since his arrests were in the south end of the county, Iuka Police officers had not heard of Means at the time of the Sunday night tragedy, and were unfamiliar with any of Means' history.

The Iuka Police Department is in disbelief of Sunday night's events. Officers are trained regularly for this type of situation but few in a small town like Iuka ever have to face such a horrible ordeal. Our small community is in prayer for the family of young Brent Means and also for the officers involved.

Many have praised the local officers for the professional way they handled the frightening situation.

Brent Means

Howard Brent Means, 34, of Tishomingo, passed away on

February 15, 2015 in Iuka, MS.

He was born on October 6, 1980 to Howard and Sherlyn (Jenkins) Means in Meridian. He was a logger, and loved racing cars.

Brent is survived by his son, Cole Means; daughters, Carley Hopkins and Ava Means; parents, Howard and Sherlyn Means; sister, Kristina Means (Ben) Thorn; and grandparents, Betty Means, Gerald and Mae Jenkins.

He was preceded in death by his grandfather, Roy Means.

Funeral services were held on Wednesday, February 18, 2015, at 2 pm at the Wright's Funeral Home Chapel in Quitman, Mississippi, with Rev. Hal Holt officiating.

Burial was in the Jenkins Family Cemetery. Pallbearers were Tony Jenkins, Zack Broadway, Freddie Means, Dooby Means, Brooks Woods, Scott Woods, and Ben Thorn. Online condolences can be given at www.wrightsfuneral.com.

Sheriff Warns of Phone Scam

"Do not provide any information to these individuals especially credit or debit card numbers," warned Chief Deputy Mike Kemp. The callers claimed to represent Walmart but could use any retailer's name.

County Survives Widespread Ice

Tishomingo County and north Mississippi woke Monday morning to fall-sleet and freezing rain that coated every surface and caused many as 9,000 customers to lose power the first of the week.

According to Tishomingo County Electric Power Association Executive Director Robert Grisham, crews started Monday morning working dozens of power outages caused by hanging branches. At the worst, Tishomingo and Holcut lines were affected, leaving the most out power overnight Monday/Tuesday. But by Tuesday afternoon, no main lines were out and power was restored to all but a very few households.

When this writer visited the EPA offices Monday afternoon, they were frantically fielding dozens of calls reporting power outage and ice damage, some were thinking that it was going to get as bad as the historic 1994 ice storm. In fact, they were answering calls by flashlight and lantern - the power was out at the TCEPA offices! Grisham said that advance preparation by field crews, as well as a lot of timber having been cut helped keep the situation manageable, and the coun-

ty was spared the dreaded 1994 storm conditions, when hundreds were out of power for as long as three weeks.

Most damage this week was caused by limbs falling on lines. Only two poles broke, one from an automobile wreck in Golden, said Grisham.

Crews from Tombigbee Electric and 4-County Electric assisted the local crews who did a great job restoring power, and

then having to re-fix problems when other branches fell on the same lines later.

School was cancelled in anticipation of bad weather Sunday night, and with temperatures not getting above freezing, Tuesday classes were cancelled as well. Then, a light snow fell Tuesday night and the mini-winter break stretched into Wednesday.

Fulton Street Burger Voted One of 10 Best in Mississippi!

Local restaurant Café Memories' Fulton Street Burger has been recognized as one of the top burgers in the state!

The Mississippi Cattlemen's Association and Mississippi Beef Council Best Burger Contest made the award recently, and local rancher Paul Whitlock presented Café Memories owner Reed McNatt with a canvas photo award to post at the Downtown Iuka café that is a huge favorite with locals as well as visitors.

More than 110 restaurants throughout the state were nominated for the best burger, and more than 1,200 votes were cast. The Fulton Street Burger placed high in the Top 10, and recently, Beef Council representatives dropped in on a Saturday night to sample the award-winning burger. They reported it was a great burger and that the only thing wrong with it was the low price, recalled McNatt.

Whitlock, who will be president of the Mississippi Cattlemen's Association next year, said that it was

an honor to have someone from Tishomingo County voted in the top 10, when you consider the competition that exists across the state.

"We appreciate all those restaurants, who not only serve beef, but go to great lengths to help promote beef products," said Whitlock.

Since reopening in 2013, owner McNatt and

co-owner Ric Tiebe have added to Downtown Iuka's business by having a popular restaurant to anchor the historic area. Since the county voted to legalize alcohol sales, Café Memories instituted an immensely popular "Beer & Burgers Night" on Thursdays, where the Fulton Street Burger is the star.

"It's a huge night for

us," said McNatt. He works hard to come up with creative recipes for burgers to served along with the now-famous Fulton Street Burger - Elvis burgers, breakfast burgers, Mexican versions, and many more are served for the more adventurous burger lovers that flock to Café Memories every Thursday night.

Honorary pallbearers were Gerald Cissom, Mark Wilkins, Fred Wilbanks, and Rebon Crum.



Great Truths In Small Packages (part XIX)

Jude has a lot to say about sin and judgment in the twenty five verses of his letter. It amazes me that so many people who claim to speak as representatives of God say so little about such things! Please do not continue to listen to any preacher or teacher who says that he is not going to speak of anything negative. Nobody can preach and teach the word of God without covering many passages that have negative words in them. The word "not" appears nine times in the ten commandments, with the word "no" appearing once. Both "not" and "no" are called "negative particles" in Webster's

Dictionary. Thus, we cannot get through the ten commandments without being confronted with ten "negative" words! It is absurd for anyone to suppose that he can be a Bible preacher without saying anything negative. Such people are not only wrong, but they are also leading masses of people down a wrong path. This is what Jude had in mind in Jude 1:4, as he spoke of those "ungodly men" who turn the grace of God into lasciviousness.

Jude 1:5 says, "I will therefore put you in remembrance, though you once knew this, how that the Lord, having saved the people out of the land of Egypt, afterward destroyed them that

believed not." For forty years God allowed Israel to wander in circles in the wilderness, because of the sin of those who refused to believe Joshua and Caleb's report about the land of Canaan. The "majority report", that of the ten other spies beside Joshua and Caleb, said that Israel could not overtake the people of Canaan and inhabit the land. Guess what, the people believed the majority, because the majority of the spies could not be wrong, or could they? While it is true that those who never put their faith in Jesus Christ for salvation will be eternally in the lake of fire, there

are also many judgments that can fall on the earth in the form of chastisement because of unbelief in certain areas, or even sin. Jude is giving a message that it is not to believe God, but to bring eternal damnation and it can bring all of other judgments in life. To be saved from Egyptian bondage is a great thing, but to forfeit the blessings of a promised land by unbelief on themselves by who refused to believe report of Joshua and concerning Canaan Israel's ability to conquer it. Many saved people today are living by their unbelief concerning God's promises. I hope all of us have missed a bit of what God promised us by our unbelief to simply believe Him. By J. 
