Two Die in Wrecks Related to Ice

 Poor driving conditions caused by intermittent icy weather over the past week have led to numerous fender benders and at least two fatalities in Tishomingo County. Mississippi Highway Patrol Troop F responded to approximately 106 crashes/assistance calls Friday, February 20th, due to icy conditions. Specifically 28 crashes were reported on US 72 in the Corinth area.

Killed Friday
 Two women are dead after an ice-related accident last Friday afternoon on Highway 72.

The Mississippi Highway Patrol is still investigating the crash east of Corinth in Tishomingo County, that claimed the lives of two people. Troop F responded to US 72, east of Corinth, near APAC, at approximately 1:30 p.m. Upon arriving at the scene, two or three vehicles were in the ditch due to icy conditions. During this time a good Samaritan had stopped to help one of the vehicles that had become stuck. Then, a semi-tractor-trailer, traveling eastbound, hit the same ice, jack-knived and rolled into a parked vehicle on the shoulder, and killed two pedestrians.

Two of the pedestrians were a mother and son from Belmont, Mississippi. They had already been in one of the minor wrecks and had walked up to the roadway. The mother, Anahi Ramirez, 25, of Belmont, was transported to Magnolia Regional Medical Center in Corinth

and died from injuries sustained in the crash. Her son, a 9-year-old child, was taken to Magnolia Regional Medical Center in Corinth and later transferred to LeBonheur Children's Hospital in Memphis.

A good Samaritan, who stopped to assist with the crashes, was the third person struck. Anna D. Hill, 47, of Burnsville, died on the scene from injuries sustained in the crash.

Serious Injuries Near Corinth

In a collision around noon Friday, two Iuka women sustained serious injuries in a wreck just outside Corinth on Highway 72.

Theresa "T.J." Stricklen, of Iuka, suffered several broken bones and lacerations in her legs when her eastbound vehicle was struck by a westbound vehicle

driven by Dawn Dexter Laster. Laster was ejected from her vehicle, according to reports. According to a friend, Laster is "sore and bruised, but otherwise okay - it is a miracle she's in one piece."

Stricklen is in the Regional Medical Center in Memphis, where she has undergone several surgical procedures and will likely face more leg surgeries.

Means Caused Disturbance at Fulton Walmart

Just a few days before the shootout that resulted in his death at the Iuka Walmart, Fulton officers dealt with a confused Howard Brent Means, Jr. at the Fulton Walmart.

According to Fulton Police Chief Reggie Johnson, officers from his department responded on Wednesday, February 11th, to a report of a disturbance at the service desk at the Fulton, Mississippi Walmart store. According to the report, Howard Brent Means, Jr. had come to the service desk at the store and was refusing to leave. Officers who responded reported that Means said "his father was trying to kill him," and he could not leave the store.

Based on their experience, it appeared that Means may have been "off his medication," said Johnson. As is commonly done in situations like this, said Johnson, an ambulance was called and Means agreed to be transported to behavioral health services at North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo.

Johnson said that Means was not threatening anyone during the incident.

Iuka Investigation Continues

Just four days later, Means lead Iuka Police on a chase that ended up at the Walmart in Iuka. After a 20-minute standoff and several rounds of shooting, Means was shot and died, and two Iuka officers were injured by gunfire.

According to spokesman Warren Strain of the Mississippi Highway Patrol, the Mississippi Bureau of Investigation is completing its investigation of the February 15th shootout at the Iuka store. When complete, the report, including the autopsy, will be turned over to the district attorney for his review, and he will decide if any further actions will be pursued.

One Dead, One Hospitalized After Monday Night Wreck

Late Monday night, a wreck by Tishomingo County High School resulted in the death of one man and hospitalization of another passenger.

About 9:15 p.m. Monday night, a 1994 Nissan Pathfinder was westbound on Highway 72 when it apparently left the road on the north side, and rolled several times. The occupants Paul "Pee-Wee" Enlow, Jr., 44, of Iuka and Miles Williams, 32, of Iuka, were ejected from the vehicle.

Enlow died at the scene, and Williams was transported to the hospital for treatment. On Tuesday, it was reported he was in critical condition in the Regional Medical Center in Memphis.

The cause of the wreck is still under investigation by the Mississippi Highway Patrol.

The qualifying deadline for candidates is 5 p.m. on March 27.

If no candidate receives a majority of the votes cast in the special election, a runoff election will be held June 2.

Two Injured as Tanker Topples

 Emergency personnel and other officials worked for about 15 hours last Thursday to right a tanker truck that lost control and ended up on its side in the median of Highway 72.

According to reports, the tanker went off the road and rolled several times before coming to a stop on its side around 5 a.m. February 20th.

The driver reportedly suffered head injuries and was airlifted from the scene to North Mississippi Medical Center, and another occupant was taken to Iuka Hospital for treatment.

The cargo in the truck was reportedly Coca-Cola syrup. Coke had clean-up crews come out to assess the situation. They attempted to pump out the cargo before attempts began to right

the truck, but the cargo was too cold and thick to pump, according to reports.

Late in the day, recovery crews tried to use inflatables to raise the truck and tank up, but in the end, about 10 p.m., Bill Timbes used his equipment to pull it upright and tow it to Burnsville.

Friday Last Day to Qualify for 2015 Elections

Only three county officials, and third term State Senator J. P. Wilemon are running unopposed so far for the 2015 county and state elections.

Circuit Clerk Donna Dill, now in her fifth term, and second term Chancery Court Clerk Peyton Cummings, and County Coroner Mack Wilemon remain unopposed in the

county. Deadline for qualifying is Friday, February 27th.

Both House of Representatives incumbents that represent Tishomingo County, Bubba Carpenter and Donnie Bell face opposition. Lisa Benderman Wigginton, former public school administrator from Corinth is running against Lester "Bubba" Carpen-

ter. Wigginton's father, Harvey Benderman was a State Representative in this district, according to a Facebook post.

Rep. Donnie Bell (R - Fulton), has a popular Democratic challenger in Aaron Loden. Itawamba County Tax Collector Aaron Loden, a county-wide elected Democrat, has filed his qualifying

papers against Bell. Rep. Bell was elected in 2011 as a Democrat, but switched parties shortly thereafter to become a Republican.

Loden is very popular in Itawamba County, which is home to the majority of the district. Loden was first elected as Tax Assessor in 2003 with over 60% of the vote.



"We loved her so."

The Twins vividly remember Josephine having to explain the state of race relations in the 1950s to the girls, even though Josephine was only 16 herself. "I remember walking up to the colored fountain," Margaret said. "I thought I might get color-

ful flavored water. It never occurred to me then that that was segregation."

A copy of Our Josephine has been donated to the Iuka Library and will be available for checking out soon.

1st place was won by a junior from Greenwood, Mississippi, and the 2014 Defending Department of Education (State) winner.



House Turns Focus to Budget Matters

Week of February 16, 2015 Summary

This week, members of the House turned their focus toward budget matters, with both the Appropriations and Ways and Means committees very active. The Appropriations Committee deals with spending the state's money and is charged with designating the Fiscal Year (FY) 2016 State Budget, which begins July 1. The Ways and Means Committee focuses on sources of state revenue. This committee crafts bills used as vehicles to fund the government. Early projections suggest the budget for FY2016 will be close to \$6 billion.

The Ways and Means Committee passed several bills out of committee and onto the House floor, including:

--House Bill 38 (HB38) authorizes the issuance of bonds to provide funds for the Small Municipalities and Limited Population Counties Fund. This allows counties under populations of 30,000 and cities under populations of 10,000 to apply for grants with the Mississippi Development Authority (MDA) of up to \$250,000 a piece.

--House Bill 155 (HB155) increases the historic property income tax credit from \$60,000 to \$100,000 and extends the time taxpayers may be eligible to receive it through 2030.

--House Bill 216 (HB216) freezes the assessed valuation of a person's home (ages 65 or older or totally disabled) as long as they live in that house and do not increase the value of the home through renovations.

On the House floor Wednesday and Thursday, House members first addressed Special Funds Appropriations bills and then moved to tackle General Funds Appropriations bills. Special Funds are amounts set aside in separate accounts in the State Treasury for specific spending purposes. This money is typically generated from fees and licensing expenses collected by agencies, and also includes federal funds available to agencies. General Funds are state revenues that are not restricted to specific spending purposes. General fund money is, for the most part, collected through taxation of individuals and businesses.

The amounts appropriated to each agency were determined based on agency needs, not what the agency already had in its coffers. The deadline to address these bills is February 25 at midnight.

During the presentation of the first Special Funds bill, an amendment was adopted to authorize a pay raise for employees of state agencies who have not had a pay raise since 2011. This amendment, which was also adopted for each additional appropriation bill, allows agencies to provide the raises, within their authorized budgets, up to five percent. Adoption of this amendment does not increase expenditures from the General Fund, and it will apply to all state agencies, not just those funded through Special Funds.

top placing in the Summer Yearling Angus Heifer Class. Emily placed 4th overall in the 16 year old showmanship class of more than 40 exhibitors. She also was named the Premier Exhibitor for the beef division. Emily

is a 2nd year student in the AEST program and an active FFA member. She is also a junior at the Tishomingo County Career & Technical Center. She is also a junior at Tishomingo County School.


