ONE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE YEARS

Two Face Social Host Charges for Teen Party Last Week

Agents from the Mississippi Alcoholic Beverage Control and the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office filed Social Host charges against two Iuka residents following a party Friday, March 6.

After receiving a call concerning the welfare of a juvenile, Tishomingo County Deputy Sheriff made contact with an intoxicated fourteen-year-old female found walking on Tishomingo County Road 196. The deputy determined that the juvenile had been at a house party at 102 CR 196, Iuka. A search warrant was obtained after the deputy observed that a large number of underage persons were still at the residence.

The homeowner of the house where as many as 25 juveniles attended a party where alcohol, beer and drugs were available was Phillip A. Harris, age 60, of 102 CR 196, charged with eight (8) counts of violating the Social Host Law.

Rebecca Creel Bridges, age 49, of 3 CR 437, Iuka, is charged with four (4) counts of violating the Social Host Law for bringing four female juveniles to the party. Both were arrested and booked at the Tishomingo County Jail, said Tishomingo

County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock.

The Social Host Law was enacted in 2011 making it unlawful for an adult to knowingly allow minors to possess and consume alcoholic beverages on his or her property.

There were also 8-9 adults in attendance at the party, said Whitlock.

Approximately twenty-five (25) underage persons were suspected to have attended the party with ten (10) minors still at the party when law enforcement officials arrived with the search

warrant. Alcoholic beverages and beer, alcohol-infused candies and gelatin shots, marijuana, crystal methamphetamine, and various prescription narcotics were seized from the home.

The homeowner was also charged with one count of possession of paraphernalia, and additional charges are pending, as the investigation continues.

Juveniles who registered a Blood Alcohol Content level on a Personal Breath Test ranged from thirteen (13) to seventeen (17) years in age. The parents of

the juveniles were called to come to the scene to pick up their children, and deputies showed the parents the beer, alcohol and drugs that had been seized at the scene.

The law provides that a person convicted of the Social Host law shall be punished by a fine of \$1000 or by 90 days in county jail, or both at the discretion of the court, for each count. A court date of May 5th has been set in Tishomingo County Justice Court.

Ten Now Trying for Nunnelee's Seat

The list has grown to ten candidates vying to fill the U.S. House of Representatives seat left vacant by the death of Alan Nunnelee in February.

The election will be decided from a single, non-partisan ballot. The election date is set for May 12th, and the runoff June 2nd, should no candidate win a majority in the general election.

Boyce Adams - From Lowndes County, Adams is an executive and co-owner of BankTEL Systems, a technology software provider. He previously ran for Public Service Commissioner against Brandon Presley.

Danny Bedwell - A retired U.S. Navy diver. He previously ran for this same seat as a libertarian against Nunnelee, but is now listed as a Republican.

Nancy Collins - State Senator from District 6, including Lee and Pontotoc Counties.

Trent Kelly - District Attorney in Lee, Pontotoc, Alcorn, Monroe, Itawamba, Prentiss and Tishomingo counties

Quentin Whitwell - Former Jackson city council member, now lawyer in Oxford; originally from Southaven

Chip Mills - Itawamba County Prosecutor

Greg Pirkle - Attorney with Phelps Dunbar in Tupelo

Daniel Sparks - Belmont native and Attorney with Oxford's Sparks Law Firm

Mike Tagert - Transportation Commissioner for the Northern district

Starner Jones - of Pontotoc; Emergency room physician in Memphis

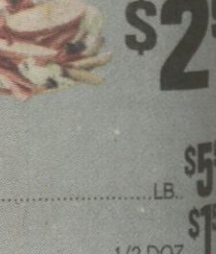

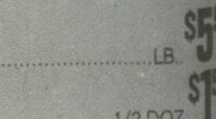

TCHGS Becomes Tishomingo Historical Foundation

The Tishomingo County Historical and Genealogical Society (TCHGS) is a not-for-profit Corporation registered as a 501-c-3 with the Mississippi Department of State. As such, the company has an opportunity to establish a "doing-business-as" title and we have chosen the Tishomingo Historical Foundation (THF) as our everyday business name for future reference. In addition to being shorter, easier to write and easier to remember, the new moniker also establishes us as a "foundation" possessing the commendable attributes of benevolence of service, philanthropic giving and lifelong commitment to a cause. These are the thoughts we would hope to be most prevalent in the minds of those who will fund our future through private (individual, family, estates and corporations) and public (city, county, state and federal) resources.

Organizations like ours are typically at least partially funded from the private and public sectors through grants and awarded based on highly structured rules and processes. Grants vary in scope, funding and schedule depending on the needs of the proposing organization and on the rules and criteria of the granting organization. Grants are often awarded on a "cost-matching" basis. For example a 50% cost matching grant would say that the grant would be for 50% of the total funded amount for the project being proposed. For a total project cost of \$100k this would

mean that THF would have to fund \$50k of the project up front before being awarded the cost-matching \$50k. For most matching grants, our \$50k up front could be cash or tangible evidence of pledge commitments available in time to meet project needs.

Funding the Tishomingo Historical Foundation will allow Tishomingo Countians to benefit from grant application requests for a multitude of worthwhile projects such as cultural signage, national landmark designations, historic town revitalization projects, museum operating grants, etc.

The THF will continue to attract visitors and promote tourism within the County through collection, preservation, interpretation and public display of the rich historical and multi-cultural heritage of Tishomingo County, Mississippi. Founded on the principals of the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society, the Tishomingo Historical Foundation, Inc. will better serve the community with a broader outreach. The headquarters of the new foundation is at the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse, 203 East Quitman Street, Iuka, MS 38852. The Old Tishomingo County Courthouse Museum provides a central repository of historical artifacts, comprehensive library, and genealogical information from across the County, the state of Mississippi and adjoining states.

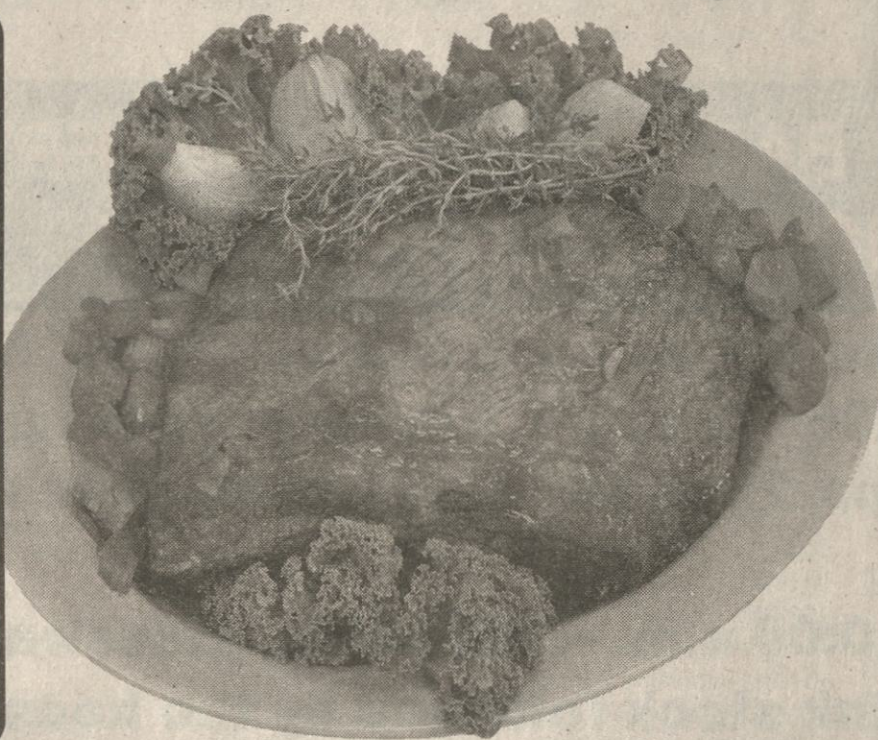

Great Truths In Small Packages (part XX)

In this series of articles, we are seeing some profound truth being written in few lines, that is why I have used the title given above. We often think that a speaker or writer has to use hours or pages of print to convey his message, but the writers I am using here did it in "small packages". Jude, for example, covers many things about sin, while using few words. In Jude 1:6-8 we read: "And the angels which kept not their first estate, but left their own habitation, He hath reserved in everlasting chains under darkness unto the judgment of the great day. Even as Sodom and Gomorrah, and the cities about them in like manner, giving themselves over to fornication, and going after strange flesh, are set forth for an example,

suffering the vengeance of eternal fire. Likewise also these filthy dreamers defile the flesh, despise dominion, and speak evil of dignities."

These verses give more than I can cover in a single article, but I will start in this article and likely continue with these same verses in other articles within this series. There are different ideas among even good Christians about what is meant by the angels who kept not their first estate. It means, at least, that they did not stay with God, to praise and serve Him. They left their own habitation, or place of residence with God, but our verse seems to indicate that they did something more than follow Lucifer in his rebellion against God, for these particular angels are "reserved in chains" awaiting their future judgment. Satan, however, as well as other

fallen angels, is not chained. Job 1:6-7; Job 2:2 and 1 Peter 5:8-9 show clearly that Satan walks around on the earth. It is a misnomer to think that Satan is now in hell, or that he will be some kind of "king" in hell, for such is not the case. So, if a part of the angels who fell with Lucifer (Satan) are bound in "everlasting chains", I would like to know why they are bound, but other fallen angels, including Satan, are not yet bound.

This article will not have enough room to cover all that one might say about the angels who are bound, but it might be worth noting that Jude 1:7, which talks about Sodom and Gomorrah and their sins, shows that there is a sexual nature to the sins of Sodom. Might there also be a sexual nature to the sins of the angels who are bound? I think they co-habited with women in the days of Noah to produce a generation of giants before the flood, thus making it even more necessary that God wipe out the race of Noah's day, with the only exception being Noah and his family. Yes, I
