School Board Looking at Calendar Options

The Tishomingo County School Board met Monday and they are considering to handle the 8 days that to potentially be made up to inclement weather.

The state school board is this Thursday and Friday they have asked the attorney general for an opinion on whether the schools will be extended for the days (2) that the board declared a state of emergency.

Right now, it is looking like the 2nd will be the last day of school, said Superintendent Josie Holly, but they are hoping to reduce that back a little, depending on the AG opinion on those "emergency days."

The board also discussed the year's calendar and they are

considering changes that would possibly take out the three days at Thanksgiving and also fall break. If the district ends up not using snow days that year, it could mean an earlier dismissal in May.

The board is also working on a plan to charge out-of-district students tuition for attending. Right now, they don't pay "tuition" but have to be board approved.

Based on the number of taxpayers and the amount the schools get each year, each county tax-paying family (with or without children) pays about \$6,000 a year per student. Out-of-district students pay to their own counties, and none of that tax money comes over county lines.

High Speed Chase Through Tennessee, Tishomingo County Lands One in Jail

After a high speed chase through two states, county deputies apprehended an Iuka man near the Alabama state line.

Around 8 p.m. Monday, county officers responded to a report of a potential drunk driver in the North Crossroads area.

County deputies located the Buick and pursued it north through Hardin County, Tennessee, then back to Tishomingo County, where it sped through Iuka. Iuka Police put out "stop-ops" attempting to assist in apprehension of the suspect, which eventually forced the vehicle to stop near the Alabama

state line on Rock Crusher Road about 9:45.

Mississippi Highway Patrol was also pursuing, and charged the driver, Jason Christopher Brown, 38, of Heritage Drive in Iuka with 21 counts of traffic violations.

The county charged him with driving under the influence-2nd offense, felony fleeing, and possession of paraphernalia. There may be additional charges for destruction of public property in Tennessee and there were existing warrants for his arrest, too.

Brown is still in custody at the Tishomingo County Jail.

\$8,000 in Crystal Meth Seized by Iuka

A routine welfare check of a parked car by Iuka Police Officer Jamie Stewart led to one of the largest crystal meth seizures in Iuka's history.

According to Iuka Police Chief, Randy Stringer, on Thursday, March 5 around 7:45 a.m. Officer Stewart spotted a vehicle pulled off of Hwy. 72 due to the weather. He stopped to see if he could assist the driver, which led to the discovery of the 7.76 ounces of the illegal "ice" with a street value of \$8,000.

Arrested was Danny Lee Michael of 55 CR 104, Lexington, Alabama. It

is believed that the 48-year-old Michael was transporting the "ice" from Oklahoma to Alabama.

He was charged with felony possession of crystal meth in a motor vehicle and felony firearm possession. Seized in the arrest was a 2005 Chevrolet Silverado pickup, \$1,000 in cash, and a 44 magnum pistol.

Bond was set for Michaels by the Iuka Police Department who has asked the DEA to take over the case and present it to the Grand Jury.

Michaels was released on bond.

Joslin Meets with Members of Congress, Discusses Policies for Schools and Principals

Tina Joslin, Services Director of Tishomingo County School District recently met with 200 elementary and middle-level educators and school leaders from across the nation's capital for the National Association of Elementary School Principals' (NAESP) National Leadership Conference (NLC). Joslin advocated on behalf of principals, schools, and districts to ensure that all children receive a quality education.

of TSCD schools directly to Congressional leaders, who were in the process of debating reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), commonly referred to as No Child Left Behind. Providing access to early childhood education, opposing the use of school vouchers, and improving principal training and recruitment were priorities that principals pushed for on Capitol Hill.

Joslin believes that all children in Tishomingo

County deserve the best educational opportunities. With under funding of MAEP (Mississippi Adequate Education Program) and no guidance from Congress, teachers and parents are often left to supplement missing resources. She hopes that state and federal leaders will step up and do what is best for all students.

With support from NAESP staff, Joslin called on federal lawmakers to oppose Title I "portability," support the Principal Recruitment and Train-

ing Act of 2015, oppose the House ESEA bill in its current form, and encourage early pre-kindergarten programs and P-3 alignment.

Great Truths In Small Packages (part XXI)

I gave Jude verses 6-7 in the last article, but I want to give them again, because I have some other comments to make about them: "And the angels which kept not their first estate, but left their own habitation, He hath reserved in everlasting chains under darkness unto the judgment of the great day. Even as Sodom and Gomorrah, and the cities about them in like manner, giving themselves over to fornication, and going after strange flesh, are set forth for an example, suffering the vengeance of eternal fire." I mentioned in the last article that I have the idea that the angels who left their own habitation are the "sons of God" mentioned in Genesis 6:1-2: "And it came to pass, when men began to multiply on the face of the earth, and daughters were born unto them, That the sons of God saw the daughters of men that they were fair; and they took them wives of all which they chose." Although we cannot be dogmatic in saying that the sons of God were those who took wives of the daughters of men, there is some pretty good evidence that this is what happened!

The term "the sons of the living God" is applied to Israel in Hosea 1:10 concerning their blessing in the land of Israel after their final restoration, which is still future, however, the term "sons of God", as used in the Old Testament is generally applied to angels. Job 1:6 says, "Now there was a day when the sons of God came to present themselves before the LORD, and Satan came also among them." The same kind of thing is said in Job 2:1. These are clearly angels who come before God, with even Satan, a fallen angel, coming with them. Job 38:4-6 tells of God's creation of the earth, then verse 7 says, "When the morning stars sang together, and all the sons of God shouted for joy." These "sons of God" have to be angels, for man was not created when God "laid the foundation of the earth", as verse 4 says. Genesis 6:4 shows that the offspring from the union between the sons of God and the daughters of men brought about mighty men, men of renown. Whatever may be your opinion on this subject, we still have to do something with the teaching that certain angels left their first estate and are now bound.

Jude 7 shows that Sodom and Gomorrah, and the cities about them, in like manner, gave themselves over to fornication. If the words "in like manner" tie the action of the fallen angels of verse 6 to the action of Sodom, Gomorrah, Admah and Zeboim (these are the names of the four cities God destroyed, as Deuteronomy 29:23 states) then sexual sin was the nature of the sin committed by both the fallen angels and the cities destroyed with Sodom. Be that as it may, we know that Sodom and the other three cities gave themselves over to fornication, with homosexuality being at least one of those sins (see Genesis 19:4-8). Jude verse 7 says that the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah went "after strange flesh", meaning sexual relationships that were not ordained of God! (In my next article I will give other sins of Sodom, so keep reading!)

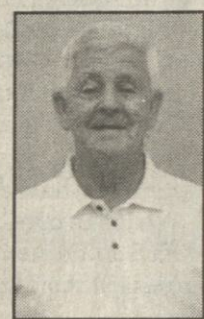

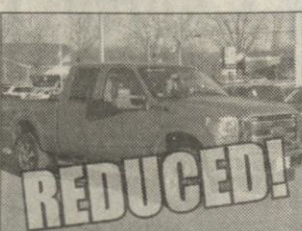
