The election is to be the second Tuesday in November this fall, and every four years thereafter, with board members being elected at-large by all the meter-holders in the system. It does not outline any qualifications for board members, or outline the format for the election.

In recent months, a few, but vocal number, of the 920 customers of the Tishomingo County Water District (TCWD), which generally covers rural and lake areas east and northeast of Iuka, have been dissatisfied with bills that have been higher than normal. The District board instituted a rate hike on both the minimum usage and the cost per additional gallons late last summer, after its supplier, the city of Iuka, doubled rates on water it sells to the TCWD. Water cus-

tomers have complained at public meetings of bills that were often more than doubled, even for households with just one or two users, due to leaks in the system that have become a significant issue with the increase cost for the Iuka-supplied water.

In response to the higher bills, TCWD customers have attended board meetings, spoken to Public Service Commissioner Brandon Presley at more than one town-hall style meetings, and urged the current TCWD board to do something about the reported high percentage of

water loss that board members claim is a major problem.

At the town hall meetings, Public Service Commissioner Presley has informed water district customers that he has no jurisdiction on management or rates of water districts (which are organized differently than rural water associations), and of which there are just 10 in the state. Presley explained that the District commissioners or board

The District took a huge step in recent weeks when it let go of all non-certified personnel in order to cut costs. They have confirmed that a limited number of those positions will be re-filled.

Holly told the board that Joel Robertson, her, and Beth White had met last week with Representative Bubba Carpenter, who delivered information on how much funding the district would get from the state, and referenced an email from Legislative leadership that the schools were "getting more than they had ever been given for education" this year.

Carpenter listened as Holly and White explained that regardless of what the legislators have been told, "much of that money is not getting to Tishom-

ingo County." She explained that many of the legislative mandates like the "third grade reading gate," and teacher pay raises take up the money that the individual districts can actually use for things they need.

White pointed out that the District is getting about the same funding as in 2007, but with many more mandates and earmarks, as well as additional students and teachers to pay for.

At the board meeting, Holly reported that the District will have meetings to discuss several ways to deal with a recent attorney general decision that public employees can not be paid

Allen Stepping **Down as NEMCC President**

At the regularly scheduled Board of Trustees this month, meeting Mississippi Northeast Community College president Dr. Johnny L. Allen asked for and received support from the Board to retire from service to the college effective June 30,

"The college is in top financial shape and have building projects going on, we all have to decide on a time to retire," said Jack Ramsey, of Iuka, Chairman of the Board of Trustees. "Now is a good time as any, and he chose to retire."

Allen, 60, was named the ninth president of Northeast in 2004. Previously he served as vice president of instruction and student services (2003-04), dean of instruction and vocationaltechnical director (1990-2003) and as an instructor of agriculture and natural science (1982-1990). He began his career in education as an agriculture education teacher at Alcorn Central High School

Allen, one of only two alumnus of Northeast to serve as its president, led with an unmatched commitment to the students, faculty and staff of Northeast and to the fiscal credibility of the institution.

Under Allen's leadership, the college opened campuses in Corinth and New Albany and completed several construction and renovation projects on the Booneville campus, the highlight of which was the comprehensive student services center, T. Jack Ramsey Hall, named for the current Board chairman.

Allen has been married to the former Christi Cartwright of Booneville for 38 years. They have two children; Jessica Morris and John Jr. They are the proud grandparents of Laura Kate Morris.

The executive committee is starting to look at the process of selecting the next leader of Northeast, said Ramsey.

members are appointed by the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors on a rotating basis - just one rolls off and a new appointment made each year or so. So the water customers don't directly elect board members, as they do in rural water associations, says Presley. The only legal way for the current District board to change is for a unanimous vote of all the board members to dissolve, according to Presley.

So, unable to elect or vote out board members, and frustrated with how long it is taking TCWD to fix leaks in the aging system that allow the (now more expensive) water to leak at higher than acceptable rates, TCWD customers have been pressuring the Board of Super-

At some of the meetings PSC Presley said to either talk to the Supervisors, or have your representative pass a law changing the governance of the system.

The County Board of Supervisors provided Rep. Bubba Carpenter with a unanimous resolution to present a local and private bill requesting the district board be elected instead of under their jurisdiction, said Carpenter.

With the change allowed in the newly passed law, a new board could vote to dissolve the current system with just a majority vote of a quorum present.

Presley has said that one option is to have the city of Iuka take over the system, but that comes with its own set of issues.

"If we abandon the current system and let the City of Iuka take over the operation, running and management of it, we would have absolutely no voice in the running of the system because we can't vote for city officials," explained TCWD customer Harold Lomenick, who is against such action. Most of the system is far outside the city limits of Iuka.

"Furthermore, they have their hands full with what they have, and have the many of the same issues with their aging system; I don't think they are capable of taking over our system and doing any better than what we have," said Lomenick.

Pastor's **Tidbits**

Great Truths In Small Packages (part

Jude verse 8 says, "Likewise also these filthy dreamers defile the flesh, despise dominion, and speak evil of dignities." The word "dignities" is literally the word "glories", meaning that the filthy dreamers are even so bold as to speak against angels, with that idea being supported by Jude verse 9. That verse says, "Yet Michael the archangel, when contending with the devil he disputed about the body of Moses, durst not bring against him a railing accusation, but said, The Lord rebuke thee." The point is that these filthy dreamers count nothing sacred, not the human body, not God ordained dominion and not even God's angels. Michael is the only angel who is called "the archangel". Satan was called "the anointed cherub that covereth", according to Ezekiel 28:14, so he seems to



have had a higher position than Michael before his fall when he became Satan. At any rate, Michael did not consider his position as being that of rebuking the devil, even when the devil was wrong and no longer had a higher position than Michael. (By the way, the only angels named in the Bible are Gabriel, Michael and Lucifer, who became the devil.) Michael resorted to the authority Who is higher than all authority: the Lord, and asked that He rebuke Satan. So, it is not likely that we should run around "rebuking Satan" as some are supposedly doing. Yes, we have power over Satan in Christ, but it seems to be God's job to rebuke

We do not know anything about the dispute that Michael and Satan were having concerning the body of Moses, so there is no real need to speculate on the content of that argument. We do know that God buried Moses body in the land of Moab, as is recorded in Deuteronomy 34:5-6. Yes I am aware of the non-canonical books that tell us more about Moses, Jesus' infancy and a host of other things. In fact, I have copies of most of these books in my library, such as the supposed lost books of the Bible; the Apocrypha; the Pseudepigrapha etc., but I put no stock in these, outside some historical value, for they do not agree with the 66 books of the Bible! Moreover, many of their stories are so far-fetched that a third grade child would see through them! So, we will leave it at that concerning Michael's contention with the devil! Jude verse 10 says: "But

these speak evil of the things which they know not: but what they know naturally, as brute beasts, in those things they corrupt themselves." It is not hard for any of us to "speak beyond our intelligence", at least to say something that lets others know that we are speaking of things we do not understand. Jude is saying that these filthy dreamers were good at criticizing people or positions

about which they were ignorant! Someone has said, "It is better to keep your mouth shut and be thought a fool, than to open it and erase all doubt." All of us could gain from that admonition! One of my professors told our class of ministerial students: "Sometimes the wisest thing you can say is: 'I do not know'." I have repeated those words many times in 53 years of ministry! The interesting thing about the filthy dreamers of whom Jude wrote is that they defiled themselves in the things they knew by nature. Jude said that these were the things that even brute beasts know. Even since our world became "smart enough" to teach that we came from monkeys, we have been seeing more defilement of the natural body. I wonder why? If we are little more than apes, then perhaps it does not matter what we do with the body, but if we are the creation of God, which I firmly believe, then it matters a great deal!
