Bonds Represents Tishomingo County at Boston Marathon

Local runner Tommy Bonds set a personal best record of 2:58 (about three hours 13 minutes) in the prestigious Boston Marathon on Monday. He ran against some 27,000 other runners in poor weather conditions. Many in the county were able to keep up with his progress during the race on social media. Bonds, who is a volunteer coach for Tishomingo County High School Cross Country's team, sported a TC XC shirt for the race!

Kalie Brewer is State Champion Power Lifter!

Congratulations to Tishomingo County sophomore Kalie Brewer for winning another TC female athlete to bring home a state championship ring! At the "Big House" in Jackson, Brewer competed against the other regional champions to win the 123 lb. weight class. She placed first in the division competition, and North Half to make it to state. She is the first female power lifter to make it so far, said Coach Zach Leathers. No one has ever made it in past division competition. She has had power lifting since age 12, and there have been boys

Track Winners Advance to Regional Competition

Several of Tishomingo County's track team members will advance to the regional track competition this Saturday in Pontotoc.
Last Thursday, in 1-4A division competition at Pontotoc High School, several individuals and team members exceeded previous personal and team records, earning the right to participate in the regional event. You had to come in first, second, third or fourth place to advance to regionals, said Coach Preston Leathers. Other schools involved were Corinth, Pontotoc, Itawamba, Amory and Shannon.
The TCHS track team has been only competing since March 17th - when, during the first track meet, several first-time

participants were still learning their event. Poor weather had prevented weeks of practice time, as well as several "snow days" during track preparation time.
"They have come so far, so fast and we expect great things to continue with the track program," said Coach Leathers, who was assisted by other football coaches and Coach Amanda Taylor on the girls track side.
"It not only keeps our football players in shape, but athletes from basketball and baseball came out to compete and it made a big difference," said Coach Leathers.
"We hosted 22 different schools here at our state-of-the-art track facilities, and five different meets. We also hosted the 1A, 2A and 3A district meet

here last week, with our athletes working it," said Leathers.
Senior Logan Locke won 2nd in the 3200-meter with a time of 11:14 seconds.
Sophomore Jermaine Duckett won fourth in the long jump with a personal record of 19.5 feet.
Senior Andrew Hisaw won fourth in the high jump with a jump of 5' 8".
Senior Jagger Brown sailed to first with a 10 foot pole vault.
Dakota Whirley placed in the discus with a personal record toss of 118 feet.
In the 110 yard hurdles, junior Caleb Smith won second place with a time of 17:09 seconds.

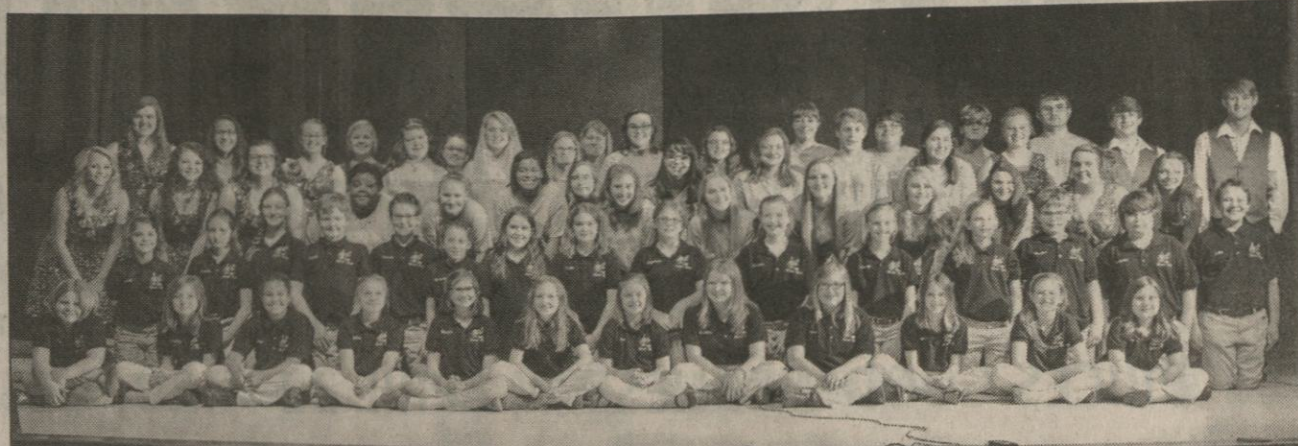

Methodists in Tishomingo County Pack 33,006 Meals

United Methodists from Tishomingo County strengthened their commitment to stop hunger around the world.

Around 75 men, women, and young people met at the Old Midway School to pack meals for Stop Hunger Now, an organization committed to ending hunger in the world. Since 2005, the organization has provided rice, soy, dehydrated vegetables and a flavoring mix including 21 essential vitamins and minerals which are assembled into small meal packets that are boiled before consumption.

A little over two hours later, 33,006 meals had been packed for the cause. About 10 percent of the meals are reserved for crisis situations like floods or earthquakes while the rest are used to meet the needs of those suffering from hunger.

Pat Ware, a representative for Stop Hunger

Now, said, "When you break it down into numbers we can understand, the importance of working to end hunger is clarified. The meals that we packed today could literally give around 33,000 people another day to live."

Lou Ann Staggs, the director of Missions for the New Albany District of the United Methodist Church said, "When the Conference Mission Committee set one million meals as a goal for the Mississippi Conference

to achieve in one year for Stop Hunger Now, I knew it would be a tough goal to reach. Some of the county clusters of United Methodist Churches raised enough money for the minimum number of meals in a packing event which was 10,000. Great Truths In Small Packages (part XXVI)

Jude verse 11 says, "Woe unto them! For they have gone in the way of Cain, and ran greedily after the error of Balaam for reward, and perished in the gainsaying of Korah." When we see the word "woe" in the Bible, it usually indicates that somebody is in danger of getting into trouble with God! In this verse we see three men who were in trouble with God, because they went against God's plan; God's promise and God's authority. Cain had a way of life that did not include God's plan. Genesis 4:3 shows that Cain "brought of the fruit of the ground an offering unto the LORD". I have heard perhaps most of the arguments concerning why Cain's offering was wrong, and most of them have to do with the fact that his sacrifice was not a blood sacrifice. This is certainly true, yet we have no direct command concerning blood sacrifices given to Adam or his family. Of course, it may be true that God instructed Adam concerning blood sacrifices when God made coats of skins and clothed Adam and Eve (Genesis 3:21). It does not directly say that any sacrifice was made at that time, although it could have been. To keep away from speculation, and without denying the need for a blood sacrifice, I believe we can see a more important reason that Abel's sacrifice was accepted and Cain's was rejected, and we can see it clearly spelled out in Hebrews 11:4: "By faith Abel offered unto God a more excellent sacrifice than Cain, by which he obtained witness that he was righteous, God testifying of his gifts: and by it he being dead yet speaketh." Faith is what made Abel's sacrifice acceptable to God, the Scripture clearly says so, thus we do not have to speculate. Cain could have brought all of the blood sacrifices in the world, but they would not have been accepted without faith in God (Hebrews 11:6). (Isaiah 1:10-19 shows that God hated Israel's sacrifices and worship, when they were presented without faith and with sin in their lives!)

Now we will take a look at Balaam, who sought to act against God's promise to the nation of Israel. I cannot give all of the Scriptures relating to Balaam, but Numbers chapters 22-25 will give you the information needed. Balaam was in error, because he disregarded the fact that God had promised Israel a great future and had blessed them, yet Balaam sought to curse them for a payment from Balak, king of Moab. Jude said that the filthy dreamers of his day were running greedily after the same error that Balaam pursued! It is a terrible mistake to assume that we can reverse what God has decreed! It cannot be done! Then we have the presumption of Korah that his leadership was just as important as that of Moses and Aaron. (See Numbers chapter 16.) The word "gainsaying" means: "to dispute, to contradict". Korah said (Numbers 16:3) to Moses and Aaron: "You take too much upon you, seeing all the congregation are holy, every one of them, and the LORD is among them: wherefore then lift ye up yourselves above the congregation of the LORD?" The problem of Korah was that he did not recognize that God had delegated authority to Moses and Aaron that He had not given to the whole nation, after all, some people have to be leaders! Jude's filthy dreamers were doing the same thing Korah had done, and Korah died for his rebellion against God's authority!
