School District Hiring Back 36 Aides, Maintenance

Thirty-six non-certified personnel will be officially rehired at Monday night's regular Tishomingo County School District Board meeting. According to Superintendent Christy Holly, principals at the county's schools have made their decisions on which positions to hire back.

Last month, the county administration handed out notices of non-renewal to 68 non-certified personnel throughout the district in a drastic measure to get control of the budget. Those released from their annual contracts included many teaching assistants, but also maintenance workers and others who are not certified teachers.

At the time, Holly explained, just like with personal and household budgets, the district has more money going out than coming in, and adjustments had to be made.

Employees let go were advised of the reduced number of positions that will be hired back, and encouraged to apply for the positions that the district could

afford to fund.

Each school will hire back SPED assistants, computer lab assistants and each school also has a "registrar" position who will pick up some paperwork responsibilities from the counselor, and she can also be used as an assistant for lower grades at critical times like during breaks and lunchtimes. Four total dis-

trict maintenance personnel are being asked back, down from six, and they will report straight to the superintendent's office.

Full-time custodians were not included in the initial cut-backs.

The school board meets Monday night at 6:30 at the administration offices on Paul Edmondson Drive in Iuka.

DA's Office to Dismiss Several Drug Cases, Including Brewer

As many as a dozen drug cases that have been pending in Circuit Court have been or are to be retired by the Court, at the request of the district attorney's office, including a high-profile one of a local resident. Paul Howell, of District Attorney Trent Kelly's Tupelo office, confirmed that three cases against Richard "Mooney" Brewer, of Iuka, have been re-

lated to the case in October 2014. Brewer had been released on bond, and Brewer's case has been scheduled to come up in every circuit court term since, but has never been in open court. Those related to the case have only reported that "motions have been filed," as progress in the case.

But April 28th, the Brewer cases were retired by the court, at the request of the state/District Attorney, said Howell. Also in the private negotiation session last week in the judge's chamber was Brewer attorney John White and Judge Jim Pounds. Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock also signed the

motion that says, "the interest of justice would best be served by a Nolle Prosequi of the said cause [extortion]. The State would show specifically that a material witness, Tishomingo County Sheriff Narcotic Investigator, Jeff Palmer, is rendered unavailable due to his retirement and recently unforeseen medical treatment."

Palmer, recently retired from the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department. The DA's office stated that they would not usually subpoena a law enforcement officer to testify. When asked, Howell, of the DA's office, said that "sometime that just happens, that the witness is sick, or has died, or can't come

for some reason."

A brisk informal investigation revealed that Palmer's Facebook account was updated as recently as mid-March, and he is listed living in Rienzi. He reportedly is working for Barney's Police Supplies, an equipment company.

Usually, the process leading up to court is for the DA's office to take the indictment and evidence from the case from the sheriff's department to court. The defendant and his or her lawyer either negotiate a plea deal, or go to court. The investigator would be a prime witness in many cases. Reports from the scene the day of the property

seizure were of about a dozen law enforcement personnel on the scene.

According to Richard "Mooney" Brewer the sheriff's department will be delivering back to the Brewer home on Thursday personal property of the Brewer family that was seized at the home when Brewer was first brought in, including boats, cars, van, guns, tractors and other items. Brewer called the paper and said that he plans to file civil lawsuits (with another attorney) against the County, sheriff's department and district attorney's office.

Special Election Tuesday for 1st District Congressional Seat

Tuesday, May 12th, voters from across the 22 counties of North Mississippi's First Congressional District will choose a new congressman to fill the seat of the recently deceased Alan W. Bland.

There are 13 candidates on the ballot in the non-partisan election. The top two vote-getters will face each other in a runoff.

Polls will be open across the district from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Tuesday. Those wishing to vote absentee prior to the election must do so in person no later than noon this Saturday at the Circuit Clerk's office. All absentee ballots sent by mail will need to be returned to the Circuit Clerk's Office through the Postal Service by 5 p.m. on Monday, May 11, in order to be counted for the May 12th Special Election.

The Circuit Clerk's Office will be open on Saturday, May 9th (8 a.m. to noon), for absentee voting.

All voters who go to the voting precinct on Election Day and all voters who come in person to the circuit clerk's office to vote by absentee will be required to show an accepted form of photo ID.

Two Charged Trafficking Meth & Heroin

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department arrested two individuals after a two month narcotic investigation. Amanda Dawn Clay, 32, from Anniston, AL and Chrystal Michelle McKinnon, 34, from Munford, AL are both charged with trafficking of controlled substances with intent to distribute.

During the course of the investigation, information was collected concerning the two suspects. A traffic stop was conducted resulting in the seizure of crystal methamphetamine and heroin along with other drug-related paraphernalia. The narcotics seized have a street value estimated in the thousands of dollars. Cash money and a firearm are among the items also seized. The investigation is ongoing and more felony charges are pending.

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department began an internal investigation after contraband was discovered. Kendra Scruggs, who was an inmate at the jail, was seen with contraband while on yard call. Detention officers discovered that Dexter Evettes had thrown a sock containing contraband cigarettes, and controlled substances into the female

inmate's recreational area. Recorded phone calls between Kendra and Dexter were reviewed and provided detailed information concerning the contraband and how the contraband was introduced into the Tishomingo County Jail. Any person that introduces contraband into a correctional facility will be guilty of a felony and be punished by imprisonment in a penitentiary no less than 3 years and no more than 15 years and be fined no more than \$25,000 dollars.

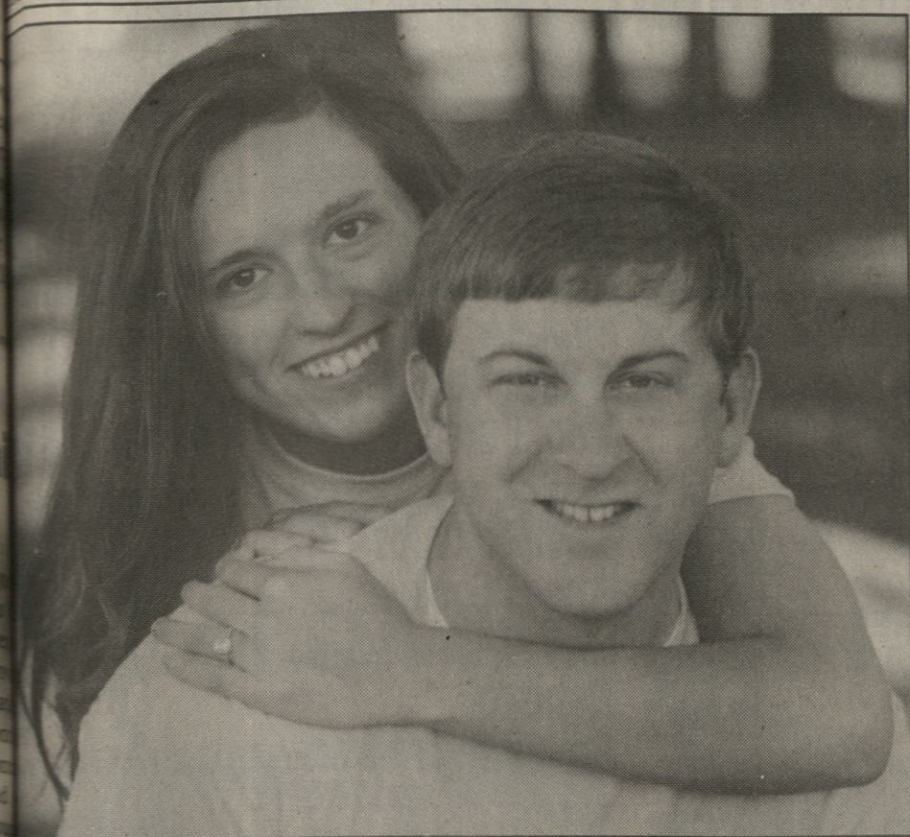



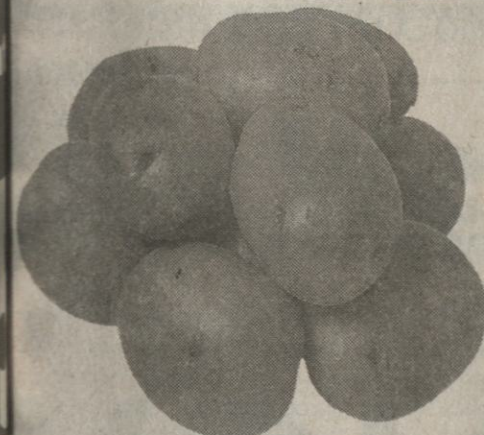

"The first 700 always slips up on you," added Plaza Lanes owner David Curry.

According to Curry, Betty Brooks held the scoring record after rolling a 688 during the Friday Night Mixed Couples League in 1987. April has her sights set on the next prize when it comes to bowling.

She hopes to join her

husband, who has two 300 games and the 800 series, as part of perfect game club.

"I am shooting 300," she said. "I have ready told Justin I was going to do it."

"She is really competitive," added her husband with a smile.

April has four weeks to reach bowling perfection at Plaza Lanes before the winter season ends.

If she can put up a game over that period would be Sweeter Than Yoo Hoo and make bowling like a girl the thing to do.

She got her love for the game from her late grandmother Christine Cornelison, her grandmother Peggy Wadley and her mother, Karen Osborn, all avid bowlers from Iuka.

Daughters Of The Confederacy Met at Courthouse Museum

The United Daughters of the Confederacy, "John Marshall Stone, #394" met April 25th at 11 a.m. at the Tishomingo County Archives and History Museum.

We honored Confederate Memorial Day which was observed on April 26th, by placing a wreath on the Confederate monument followed by a program. The history of Confederate Memorial Day was explained; a poem was read about the lives of Confederate Soldiers; several other Confederate poems, stories and songs were read.

We then went into the museum for our monthly meeting. Those present were Eunell Handy, Mary Ledbetter, Vickie Durham and Sharon Hairrell. We completed the UDC rituals and singing of "Dixie". The meeting was well attended.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. Old business was discussed.

Applications at the workshop and we discussed several people took applications with them.

Eunell Handy gave a treasure report and it was approved. Registrar Vickie Durham stated that several ladies had taken applications at the workshop and that she had given the other applications to Eunell Handy. Eunell

stated that she had four applications that would be sent, there was just a little more information needed.

New business was discussed. Eunell Handy talked to us about maybe giving \$20.00 a year to the museum to cover the cost of Ancessorym. Vickie Durham requested that we take a vote and it was approved. Eunell Handy and Jessica Wileman attended the

District meeting in Booneville on April 11th.

Our program was presented by Sharon Hairrell, the topic was "York's Secret Helper". One of York County's most compelling whodunits appears to have an ending.

Who was the young girl who handed a bouquet of flowers to the Confederate general as his rebel brigade marched through York toward Wrightsville and its coveted covered bridge in late June 1863?

This story has been told and retold since Gen. John B. Gordon recounted the tale of the anonymous floral gift in his 1904 autobiography. Biographers and military historians writing about the famed Confederate general often tell the tale.

Now they apparently have a name attach to the story: 12 year old Margaret Small, part of a obscure branch of York's prominent 19th century family.

It wasn't the flowers that made the moment important. Many belles socialized with the butter-nut-and-gray-clad soldiers during the 40 hrs. plus they were in and around York. The bouquet hid a note showing Union troop positions in Wrightsville and the best route to go around and to capture the mile long bridge.

Margaret Small never knew that she would be written about in history books. She died the next year and was only remembered at that time by a small obituary in a local paper.

Our next meeting will be May 19th at 4 p.m. at the Tishomingo Archives and History Museum. Visitors are welcome.

Mature Remonstrations by Tita B

Do you ever have days when life doesn't seem worthwhile? A day when you wonder just why God put you here? Do you ever wake up and wonder just what it is you are supposed to do after you drink your coffee and read the newspaper? Am I the only one in the world that is a widow with no living children? I am having fewer days like this as my life settles in around me. I am adjusting to being alone. I try not to be a burden to those around me, yet not feel so all alone.

Yes, I am old. I always heard that anyone 10 years older was old. But now, I am really old, past 70. Mind you, I am not complaining. I count my blessings as one by one I lose family and friends to mortality. I thank God I am still here for a few more days.

I never dreamed long-life would include so many complications and need for such quick changes. Since 2000 I have lost both of my children as

young adults. Never did I dream of this. I was supposed to go to my great reward first. Isn't that the way it should be? My great-grandparent, my grandparents, my parents all have passed away leaving their children to follow with very few exceptions.

My husband died this past year while undergoing what we thought would be minor heart surgery, leaving me a widow. As we struggled through life, I most often was the person with illness. I had two rounds of cancer treatments, a Pacemaker, a Titanium insert in my back, carpal-tunnel, and Trigger-fingers. We both assumed I would go first. I am a full-body donor to Mississippi State Research Hospital. He had minimal insurance payable to me. He had the foresight to purchase certificates of deposit, payable to his children, to cover his funeral expenses. Yet another indication, that I would not be around to handle these things.

As a widow, I have faced new problems. I was forced to move quickly, within a few days from being hospitalized for 88 days, from a home I had expected to be my last and had decorated over the six and a half years of our marriage. Imagine how frightened I was when I received the legal letter. I could not walk, pack or pick-up anything weighing over 5 pounds. I sold furnishings to pay for the move. I was so lucky that I was able to get into a retirement center in Iuka where I have new friends, all my bills are consolidated into one monthly payment. Imagine if you can no payments for: cable, water, electricity, heat or air conditioning. The yard work is done and there are amazing management and maintenance staff. I did not know there were such places in Tishomingo County. I was extremely lucky that a "villa" was available.

It is perfect for this chapter of my life.

I lost 40 pounds during this time; none of my clothing fit. I tease that I am now the Queen of LL Bean. I order from catalogs because of the difficulty shopping real stores. For months I had to pay for two persons to care for me day and night. It was a difficult time but with the help of God, Home Health, TC Living Center Rehab, NMMC rehab, NMMC Wellness Center, family, friends and paid helpers I am getting better every week. Of course, I have my "Oh me" days. But don't we always have those. Smile and go on. I certainly don't forget to count Medicare and my supplement insurance when I count my blessings before I go to sleep at night. A habit learned during childhood.

I had to reach retirement to appreciate Medicare, Social Security (I paid into forever it seemed), and the little I had managed to put aside. However, I have found it confounding when I can-

not get the same benefits as some who never paid SS or saved a cent. It has, at times, seemed like I was being punished for saving for this period of my life.

In October 2014 my brother passed away. Leaving another hole in my life.

Life will always have challenges. I will get into others that influence all of us at a later time. Let me just say that I have found things to do that make my life better. I read two or three books a week because I enjoy them and don't sleep a lot. The library is an excellent place to start. There is the book club that meets there once a month. The NMMC wellness center has morning exercise programs led by a staff person and machine, weights, etc. available all day long for a nominal fee. I have volunteered to help others in the past. I cannot do this until I can walk without a walker or walking stick. Church is available, to all. There are evening services

and some have Bible classes. The church will pick up those who wish to attend morning services. people for assistance will find most more willing to guide you.

We don't need to go too far to find things if we put our best foot forward.

I am still adjusting. life seems more while when we get there with other people don't pretend to know that is available but I started on the journey away from those selling days to a more full life. I know, there always be challenges will face them with from above. Don't think you are the only having these sad thoughts. Reach out. Help from unusual sources. Yes, we will always have problems but we struggle to not let them define us.

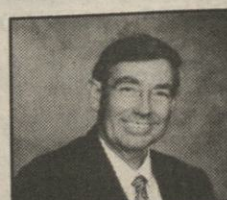

Great Truths In Small Packages (part XXVIII)

Jude verse 16 says: "These are murmurers, complainers, walking after their own lusts; and their mouth speaketh great swelling words; having men's persons in admiration because of advantage." The art of flattery is as old as mankind! The first thing said about the ungodly described in this verse is that they murmured, or grumbled. It is not hard to find grumblers in almost any place, profession or meeting, and church is no exception. I pastored nine churches over a period of thirty-six years, and I had a few grumblers in every one of them. I hasten to say that I also had some very godly people in all of those churches. I have preached as an evangelist for most of the balance of my 53 year ministry, and I have even run into grumblers in churches where I have preached perhaps only a few days, or even in only one service! The murmurers also complain about leadership or about other church people, yet they are walking after their own lusts! They speak words that "blow up the heads" of those who they admire, and they do it to get an advantage! We all know people who can get things done politically, because they know certain people. We also know people in churches who can get close to those who visit for the first time, because they speak "great swelling words" to them. It is not surprising to read about those who walk after their own lusts (passionate desires), for our world is filled with many such people today.

Jude verses 17-19: "But, beloved, remember ye the words which were spoken before of the apostles of our Lord Jesus Christ; How that they told you there should be mockers in the last time, who should walk after their own ungodly lusts. These be they who separate themselves, sensual, having not the Spirit." Memory is not only a good thing, it is also a necessary thing! We need to remember what the apostles of Christ have said, that is why we need to read the Word of God! When we read the Bible, we do not get very far, until we are warned about those who mockers (scoffers) in the last time, or in the church age. I have never seen a time exactly like our time, for it is marked by those who make light of the Bible; Christians, churches and even God Himself, but this is par for the course among those who are given to their own lusts and to the devil! Jude did not hesitate to say that their lusts (passionate desires) were ungodly; we seem to be having trouble in our day, especially among the preachers, in forming our mouths to say, "That is ungodly"! Until God's men begin again to cry out against sin, we need not expect any real revival among the churches! Those mentioned in our verses set themselves apart from the true believers, because of their sensuality! It is a bad day, when churches parade the bodies of women across "stages" in sensual ways under the guise of worship. The Israelites did that same kind of thing in Exodus chapter 32 when Aaron made the golden calf and God's judgment brought 3,000 people to their deaths! The reason for the sensuality of those in Jude's day was the absence of the Spirit of God in those who were sensual, and I suspect the problem is the same with sensual "church stage actors" today!

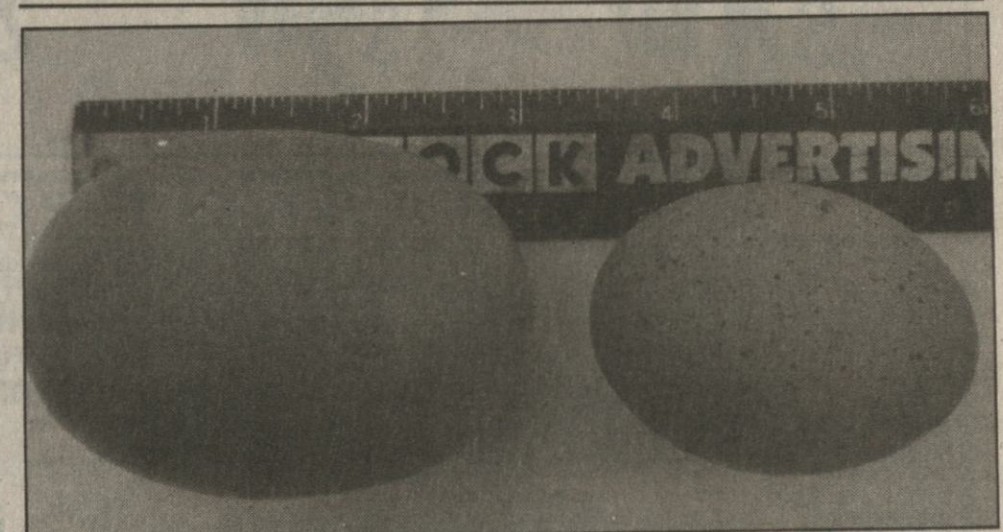
