luka Man Faces Charges of **Arson, Burglary, Animal Cruelty**

An Iuka man is being held facing charges of arson, burglary and animal cruelty following a weekend house fire that destroyed the home of an elderly Iuka couple.

According to authorities, about 11:45 p.m. Sunday, neighbors called in the fire at 910 Briarwood, near Iuka Elementary, after seeing flames in the house owned by Steve and Lorraine Sims.

Neighbors went to the house and banged on the doors and windows trying to alert anyone who might be in the house - a vehicle was in the driveway. Firefighters from Iuka Fire Department were soon on the scene, but the house was consumed by the flames. Firefighters Blake Melton and Greg Butler-Ross entered the flaming dwelling looking for potential victims of the fire, but there were no people in the home, said IFD Chief Brian Grissom.

As many as 12 dogs are thought to have perished in the fire, said Grissom, eight adult dogs and four puppies. Homeowner Mrs. Sims is in a nursing home and Mr. Sims was with her there at the time of the fire. Their adopted son, Timothy "T.J." Sims, 27, had also been living in the house with a girlfriend. The dogs were thought to belong to the girlfriend, who had left Sims. Sims allegedly threatened to "burn it all" rather than let her take anything, said neighbors.

Firefighters were on the scene until four in

The cause of the fire is still under investigation, said Tishomingo County Fire Investigator Jesse Jones. The state fire marshal is scheduled to come join the investigation Wednesday, said

Two Injured in Knife **Fight**

One man is hospitalized and one is in custody following an alleged knife fight last Saturday night at a home just west of Bel-

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff Department Investigator Adam Hall, the altercation took place at a home on County Road 14 off Belmont's Main Street. The incident is still under investigation, as one of the participants in the altercation is still hospitalized after being treated for injuries from the fight, including his throat being slit. He was airlifted from Belmont to Tupelo, and can not be questioned yet, due to his injuries, said Investigator Hall.

Another participant in the altercation has been charged with aggravated assault, but bonded out of Tishomingo County Jail. He suffered several surface knife wounds, including a 1.5-inch deep gash across his stomach, but drove himself to a relative's home, who then drove him to be treated at Red Bay Hospital, all according to Hall.

Investigator Hall said the two had a history of a disagree-

Names of the participants are not being released until the investigation is able to proceed, said Hall.

Earlier that day, possibly enraged by the girlfriend leaving, T. J. Sims was acting angry and reportedly beat his dog (which was tied in the yard) to death with a tire iron, said authorities. Chief Brian Grissom said they found where he had buried it out in the yard in a shallow grave. Neighbors said he was going up and down the street saying it wasn't illegal to "put your own dog down."

Authorities are still investigating, said Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer, but Sims is in custody and potentially faces charges of arson in connection with the fire. Sims also faces charges of burglary of a dwelling and burglary of a vehicle for breaking into the home across the

What Is Jesus Saying To The Churches? (part II)

Men are seemingly more interested in some person's idea of what God is telling him, or her, to tell the church than what God actually told the church through Jesus Christ! I think it would be worthwhile for all of my readers to ponder this statement for a moment. You see, we really do not usually have a way to verify what some person is telling us that God told him, but we do have many ways to verify the Word of God which has been written down as Scripture! The idea of some people having supposedly new revelations from God is not exactly a new thing, but the number of such "appointed spokesmen" has been growing in the last several decades. First, I would like to ask why we need some new revelation, since nobody has mastered all 66 books that God inspired men to write down over a period of about 1600 years? Then I would like to ask what it is that some people want to know that is not already in the Bible? Since most people have never read all of the Bible, and certainly not many have read it more than a few times, what assurance do they have that the Bible hasn't already spoken to their needs? I happen to believe that God has given in the Bible all we need for salvation and Christian living, so my prayer to Him is that I will rightly understand His message there. The Book of Revelation is the only book in

the Bible that pronounces a blessing on those who read, hear and keep the things that are written in it. If we cannot possibly understand Revelation, then how can God tell us that a blessing awaits those who read, hear and keep what is written in this book? The fact is that the Book of Revelation can be understood, yet that does not mean that any one of us understands every minute detail of the book. If we could pool all of our resources, mentally and spiritually, we might come very close, as a whole, to understanding all of it. Besides all that, I believe that many of us have gotten the gist of what God is saying here, at least enough to know how to respond to it. Some of Revelation (chapters 2 and 3) were written directly to the seven churches of Asia , with a message to all churches. The rest of Revelation is also for the church's learning, or else God would not have given it!

Revelation 1:4-5 says, "John to the seven churches which are in Asia: (now called Turkey) Grace be unto you, and peace, from Him Which is, and Which was, and Which is to come; and from the seven Spirits Which are before His throne. And from Jesus Christ, Who is the faithful witness, and the first begotten from the dead, and the prince of the kings of the earth. Unto Him that loved us, and washed us from our sins in His Own blood." So, the message of Revelation is from the Father, the Spirit and the Son to the churches! With this being the case, does it not seem reasonable that the church today should at least read and study the message of Christ to these seven churches of Asia, which is also a message to all churches?

Tishomingo County School District Attendance Policy

The following attendance policy was approved at the last board meeting -

Punctual regular and of attendance is upmost importance to a student's academic success. Tishomingo County School District encourages each student to attend classes

In order for a student to counted as present according to Average Daily Attendance Guidelines as outlined by the Mississippi State Legislature, the student must be present 63% of his/her instructional day, which is defined by the **Board of Trustees.**

When absent from school, it is required the student bring to the office a note from home stating the guardian was aware of the student's absence. This note must be brought within two (2) days upon the student's return to school.

following information is required on all absentee notes:

- * student's name
- * guardian signature
- * date of guardian signature
- guardian acknowledgement absence
- * date(s) of absence
- **An absence can be excused by administrators without written documentation** Any time a student plans an extended absence from school, the administration and teachers should be notified of this as early as possible. [Refer to H-1, Students - Subsection z(19) Make-up for Absences, z(20a) Excused/Unexcused Absences, z(31a) Checkout Policy]

Excused/Unexcused Absences (K-12)

A student will be given an excused absence on a parent note for three (3) occurrences per semester. Each parent note will apply to each occurrence (i.e. if a student is out for three days, each day will require a parent note to be excused without other acceptable documentation). After that, a student must

have documentation as defined below, to receive an excused absence. **Tishomingo County**

- **School District adheres** to the Mississippi Compulsory School Attendance Law (MS Code 1972 Annotated, Section 37-19-91) which states "when the child has accumulated five (5) unlawful absences during the school year of public school in which the child is enrolled, the school district superintendent or his designee shall report, within two (2) school days or within five (5) calendar days, whichever is less, the absences to the school attendance officer."
- Five (5) or more unexcused absences deems a student as truant and results as the student being reported as such to the attendance officer.
- After twelve (12) or more unexcused absences, the attendance officer will petition the court for excessive absences.
- An excused absence is one which results from a personal illness/ injury, medical or dental appointment, isolation ordered by county health officer

or appropriate school official, death or serious illness involving an immediate family member (sibling, parent, grandparent), observances of religious holidays of a student's own faith (requires prior approval); or circumstances such as court ordered appearances, family emergencies, extreme weather, etc. that require immediate attention and that the school principal deems necessary.

- An absence is considered unexcused if proper documentation is not received within two (2) days of the student's return to school; if the documentation is unacceptable; or, if the absence is the result of Out of School Suspension.
- When students are sent home by the school nurse, the absence is considered excused for that day only.
- Students participating in school-approved or school-sponsored activities are considered present.
- Written documentation concerning an absence must be provided to the school office within two (2) days of the student's return to school
- Written documentation from a doctor/dentist/ court officer/etc. must contain dates of service in order for the date(s) of the absence to be excused.
 - o Upon reaching five (5) unexcused absences during the 9 weeks, the parent shall meet with the Principal and Counselor to develop a plan of attendance for the student. The plan will determine future consequences and guidelines to improve student attendance.
 - Failure of the parent to meet with school officials will result in after-school detention for the student as set and determined by the Principal until the meeting occurs.

get to school and class on time. TARDINESS prevents students from achieving all that is academically possible. Parents are encouraged to make sure that their children are prompt. Students that check-in late or out early will be given a tardy for that particular class (by that class period teacher) if they miss 25 minutes or less of that class period (late in/early out). 
