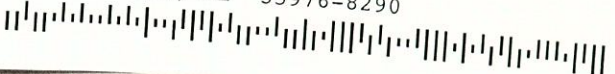

County Primary Election Results in Several Runoffs August 25th

There may have been little surprise in state-wide races Tuesday, but in Tishomingo County, competition was fierce in a few races, and the Democratic primaries resulted in several runoff elections for key offices throughout Tishomingo County.

If the turnout at the Tishomingo County Courthouse was an indication, many people were interested in hearing the results of the races as quickly as possible; the courtroom was packed, and many folks hung around the Courthouse counting center until 10 p.m. waiting for results and then discussing them amongst themselves.

Case Dismissed Against Mississippi Silicon in Burnsville

A federal judge has dismissed a case against Mississippi Silicon that has been moving through courts since the industry first announced it was coming to Burnsville's Waterway Industrial Park more than a year and a half ago.

The efforts to stop construction at the Burnsville plant were primarily headed up by Tri-State Concerned Citizens and the Ridge Environmental Defense League, who claimed the Mississippi Dept. of Environmental Quality issued a permit for Mississippi Silicon for Prevention of Significant Deterioration in just 2 months, a process that usually takes 2-3 years. According to information released by the groups, "MDEQ gives a permit for Mississippi Silicon to build plant in Burnsville to pollute your air and water without your input and adequate safety measures."

Globe Metallurgical, Inc., which operates a silicon plant in Selma, Alabama, has allegedly been behind this and several other attempts to prevent construction of the plant in Burnsville, who would be in direct competition with GMI's plant just about 250 miles away.

CEPA Annual Membership Meeting

The Annual Membership Meeting of Tishomingo County Electric Power Association will be held in the Tishomingo County Courthouse, Iuka, Mississippi, on Saturday, August 15, 2015 at 10:00 a.m. In accordance with the Bylaws, five percent of the members must be present in order to conduct business. The membership may nominate and elect election commissioners to serve with the commissioners appointed to the Board of Directors to conduct the election to be held August 15, 2015, for vacancies on the Board of Directors. Also, nominations may be made for directors. You may nominate, or be nominated, from the floor at the Annual Meeting. Provided five percent of the membership is physically present. See next week's paper for list of candidates and polling

Democratic runoff will be August 25th. There will be no Republican runoff, as all candidates on that side got more than 50 percent of the vote in their races.

All totals are unofficial, as party officials were still looking through some 70 affidavit ballots Wednesday. There were also dozens of provisional ballots cast by people without proper picture identification. They have a week to bring in proper identification and their votes be counted, according to a release by the Secretary of State.

Sheriff

In the hotly contested sheriff race, incumbent Glenn Whit-

lock, with 29 percent of the democratic vote, came in 285 votes under challenger John Dennis Daugherty's 1,932 votes and 35 percent win. But since no candidate won more than 50 percent of the votes, Whitlock and Daugherty will meet in the August 25th runoff. The winner of the runoff will go against Republican primary winner Mike Higginbottom, who won 50 percent of the

Republican vote to beat Ralph Montgomery (35 percent) and Charles Linton (9 percent.)

McNatt Wins Big

Jena P. McNatt owned the biggest win of the night for a county candidate in the Democratic tax collector race. She will take the reins from her long-time boss Paul Whitlock, whose retirement from the tax collector's office left the field wide open. McNatt, with a whopping 65 percent of the vote defeated J. C. Johnson (24 percent) and Car-

rie Morris Fowler (10 percent). There's no Republican tax collector candidate.

Supervisors

In county supervisors races, incumbents from the First, Second and Fifth Districts won their

Democratic races, but all face competition in the general election in November.

In the 1st District, two-term incumbent Brandon Grissom beat challenger Joey

Price by 219 votes to gain 58 percent of the vote. He has no Republican or independent opponent.

In the 2nd District, two-term incumbent Nicky McRae beat several challengers with 62 percent of the vote. He faces Republican P. D. Vanderford, Jr. and independent Mike Trim on the November ballot.

Danny Ryan's retirement opened up the 3rd District Supervisor race for the first time in many years, and six democrats,

two Republicans and an Independent candidate competed. There will be a Democratic runoff between Michael Busby who received 37 percent of the vote, and Ronnie Woodruff, who received 18 percent of the vote. The winner of that will compete against Tabo McAnally, who won the Republican primary yesterday with 61 percent of the vote, and independent candidate Wesley A. Watson.

In the 4th District two-time incumbent Steve Thorne was defeated by Jeff Holt in the Democratic primary. Running against Thorne for the second time, Holt won 56 percent of the vote over Thorne's 37 percent. Holt, who got 645 votes, will go against Leon Patterson, who won the Republican primary yesterday with 61 percent and 99 votes.

Incumbent Greg Collier won the Democratic primary in the 5th District with 59 per-

High School Football Player Drowns During Outing at Coleman Park

An East Union High School football player drowned in Pickwick Lake Friday evening, during an outing at J. P. Coleman State Park with his teammates.

The East Union Urchins football team had come to the lake for a team trip, in anticipation of the fall football season, and as a reward for their hard work at practice. According to Tishomingo County Coro-

ner Mack Wilemon, Terry Joe (T.J.) Hamblin, 17, a 6-foot-2, 230-pound junior lineman with the Urchins, was swimming in Pickwick Lake with teammates off the primitive camping area of Coleman Park, when he came up missing a little before 6 p.m. Teammates and coach Kevin Walton searched the area and called in the event. Hamblin's body was found about 9 p.m.

The Ellistown community was rocked by the news and late Friday, friends and family gathered at the field house to console one another over the teenager who they say never had anything bad to say and never had anything bad said about him. Services for Hamblin were Sunday in Pontotoc.

cent of the vote, and will face Republican Jonathan Haney on the November ballot.

Other Contested County Races

There will be a runoff in the Tishomingo County Tax Assessor's race between incumbent Diana

Turner, who got 47 percent of the vote, and challenger Wayne Crum, who won 33 percent of the vote. The runoff winner will take office, and there are no Republican or independent challengers.

In Justice Court North Judge race, first-

time candidate Matthew Clay Cummings won 36 percent of the vote in the Democratic primary, and will compete in a runoff against former judge J. R. Blakney. Winner of that runoff will compete against Republican Michael R. Haney, who won

without competition.

The Justice Court South Judge's race will be decided in November as incumbent Democrat Donnie Joe Sparks takes on Republican challenger Freddie Means.

At presstime, officials were still not calling the Democratic North Half Constable race, because leader Jamie Stuart was still short of the required 50 percent plus 1 needed to avoid a runoff. Stuart needed at least 1,485 votes, and had 1,468 without any of the 70 affidavit votes that party officials were still opening.

It looks like Stuart and Harold Lynn Barnes, who

got just 20 percent of the vote, will be in a runoff August 25th. The winner will go against Republican Chris Davis in November.

Thomas will go against Republican Don Haney in November.

District Makes Changes to Address Student Absenteeism

Tishomingo County schools have a "chronic absenteeism" rate of more than 18 percent, higher than most all surrounding school districts, and school officials have made changes in the attendance policy to make improvements.

"Good attendance is essential to student success," explained Tishomingo County School Superintendent Christie Holly. "In the primary grades, it can help predict reading success and even possible drop-out rates."

Missing three or more days of school a month can set students back one to two full years of learning behind their peers, according to the 2015 Mississippi Kids Count report, which is released each year to show school attendance data and trends as well as other indicators for each county in the state, as well as state-wide.

"Chronic absenteeism" is ten percent or more of the academic year missed for any reason, explained Holly. "So based upon a 180-day school year as we are, that would be 18 days per year," she said.

Tishomingo County's numbers are higher than the state rate of 15 percent, and surrounding county and city school systems numbers are all lower than ours.

"We are headed toward one of the higher rates in the state if we don't address the problem of chronic absenteeism and other attendance issues in our schools," said Holly. "The school board, superintendent, and administrators in the district are all taking steps toward addressing the problem, and changes to the attendance policy will go into effect when school starts this Thursday. Parents are urged to read the hand-

book for complete information."

The district is committed to going to "next steps" if data does not improve during the upcoming school year, but following are the current changes:

- Parents can excuse, by note, THREE absences per semester, down from five.
- Each day requires documentation, for example, if a student is out four days, a parent note can excuse up to three of those days, and the fourth would be unexcused if other applicable documentation is not presented.
- Students have just two days to bring documentation for an absence; this used to be five days.
- Parents/guardians must meet with administration after their student's fifth unexcused absence during the nine weeks, to develop a plan of action for attendance.
- Students must be present 63 percent of his/her instructional day to be counted present, same as last year.

We ask all parents to be sure and completely review the handbook.

construction of the \$200 million facility located in the Northeast Mississippi Waterfront Industrial Park. Construction for the plant with a planned annual capacity of 36,000 metric tons continues on-schedule. Upon completion Mississippi Silicon will be the first new North American silicon metal production operation constructed in the past 40 years.

In March Mississippi Silicon began hiring for permanent positions, interviewing and hiring continues. Commissioning of the facility will begin within the next few weeks. The company expects to employ 200 workers at the facility, located in the Northeast Mississippi Waterfront Industrial Park, within the next several years."

Applications have to be submitted to the academy and an interview process must be done before acceptance. This class is offered every summer through the academy. Some of the training process includes firearms safety training, CPR class, physical fitness, obstacle courses, K-9 demonstration and community service.

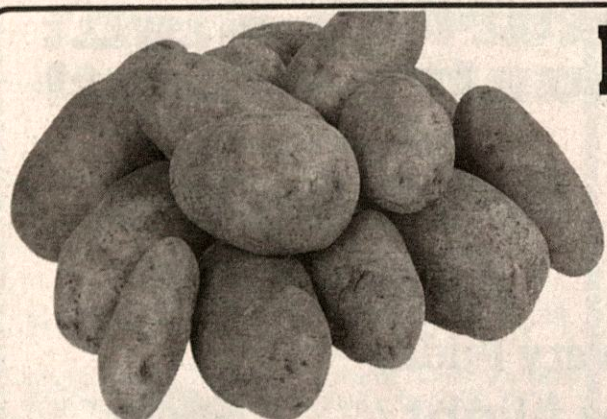

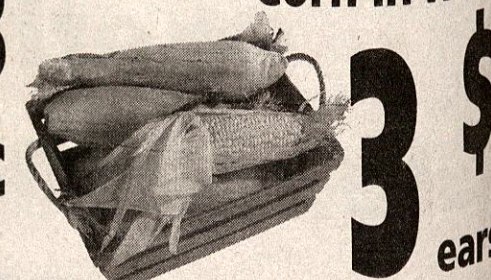

Brady Davis

Chickasaw Nation employee Brady Davis is the manager of the Homeland Affairs Department. Stationed in the heart of the homeland and Tupelo, MS his department focuses on the protection, preservation and interpretation of Chickasaw history and culture. As an archaeologist, Brady conducts research as well as develops programs, school curriculums, and leads tours of the homeland for Chickasaw citizens.

The forces that led to Indian removal in the 19th century can be said to have started with the arrival of Europeans on the North American continent. His presentation will highlight important events in Chickasaw history focusing on interactions with Spanish, English, French and American governments with a detailed overview

of removal to Oklahoma Territory and the treaties leading to it.

P. Z. Horton will present "Maximizing Your Use of Ancestry & Family Tree Maker"

P. Z. Horton is an amateur genealogist with special interests in technology. He has been working on family genealogy for over 20 years and has worked with

computers for 50 years. He has traveled to societies, libraries, courthouses, and cemeteries in 20 states. He supports over 25 genealogy or historical society organizations and is the Technical Advisor to the Board of the Tennessee Genealogical Society (TGS). He teaches Family Tree Maker, Ancestry, and Family Search for TGS.

John Ware, a native New Mexican and long-time Tennessean, recently retired from a major pharmaceutical firm. Cindy has spearheaded the restoration of two other historic buildings in Tishomingo County, including the full restoration of the Midway School in Iuka's Midway Community and the relocation and total restoration of the Burnsville One-Room Colored School in Burnsville.

Cindy's interest in genealogy was instilled by her grandfather, Lester Whirley, Sr., whose father, Jess Whirley, died when he was a small child. As the family traveled to the annual cemetery Decoration Day event in Tippah County from their home in Alcorn County, she was intrigued by the fact that her grandfather lived in Tishomingo County, previously lived in Alcorn County, and the family was buried in Tippah County, Alcorn County, and Tishomingo County. This inspired her to learn

more about the history of Old Tishomingo County and how the history intertwined as she explored her family history.

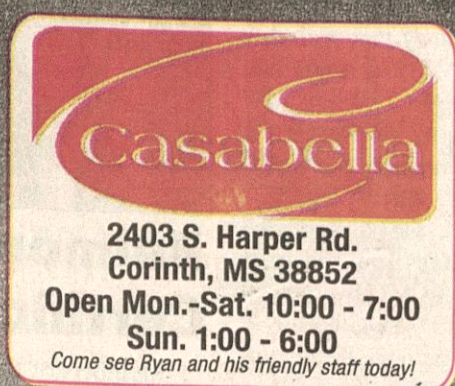

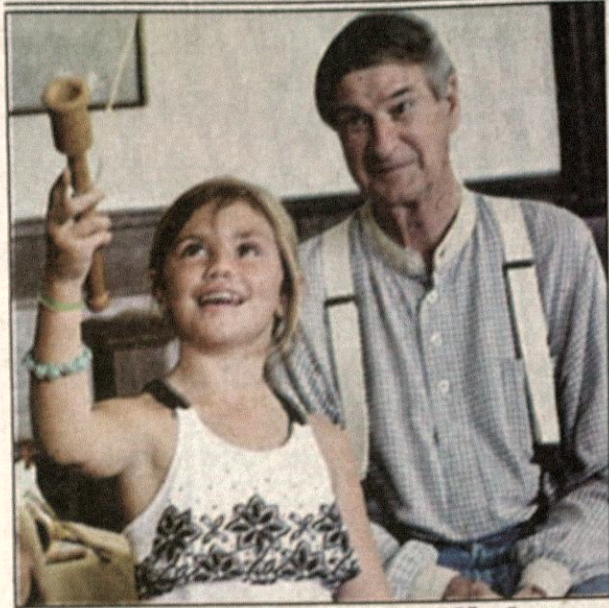

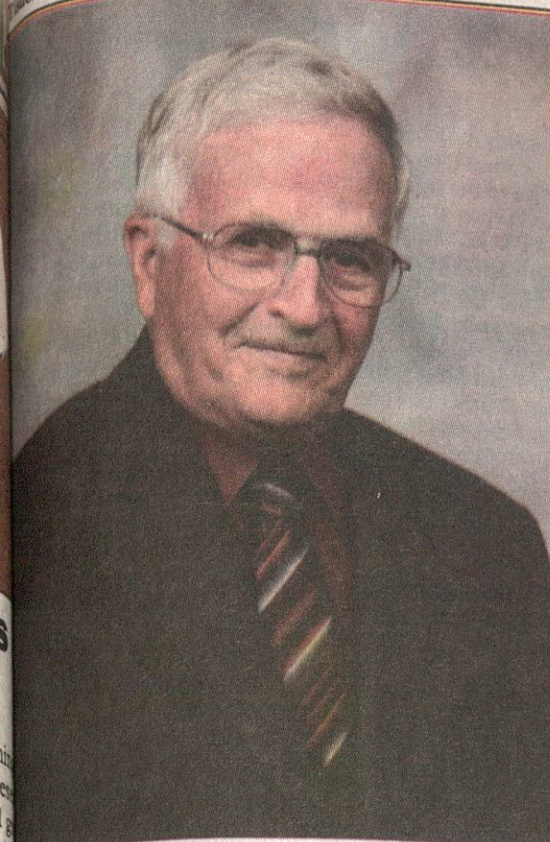

Previously available only a few days each month in NMMC's Mobile Mammography Unit, NMMC-Iuka's Radiology Department now offers this service on-site weekdays. The mammograms are read by radiologists at NMMC-Tupelo.

Paired with breast self-exam and physical exams, regular mammograms are still the front line of defense in the fight against breast cancer.

Digital mammography takes an electronic image of the breast and stores it directly into NMMC's computerized Picture Archiving and Communication System (PACS). Radiologists can enhance, magnify or manipulate these digital images, making it easier to detect abnormalities.

Every woman is at risk for breast cancer, and her risk increases with age. Breast cancer is the most common cancer among women.

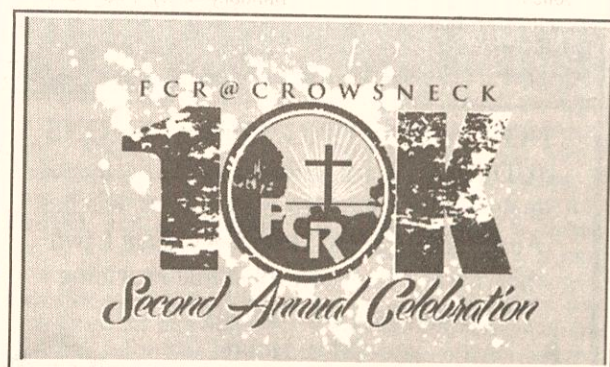

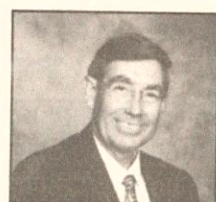

What Is Jesus Saying To The Churches? (part IX)

If we want to know what our Lord is saying to His bride, we must look at the letter He left for us in the writing of John found in the Book of Revelation! It amazes me over and over that so many people have the idea that God is going to give some special message to the church that is something "extra" to what the Bible teaches. It would be a worthwhile project if all pastors would learn as much as they can about the Bible and then go and preach it to their churches. Certainly, as I have said in my articles, we need to be sensitive as to what part of the Bible to preach at what time, but there is certainly ample information in the Scriptures to keep any of us busy for a lifetime!

Revelation 2:4-5 says, "Nevertheless I have somewhat against thee, because thou hast left thy first love. Remember therefore from whence thou art fallen, and repent, and do the first works; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will remove thy candlestick out of his place, except thou repent." Repentance is a dirty word to many people today, especially to many who are already Christians. It is interesting that the last message Jesus had written to the churches contained the admonition for wayward churches to repent! The problem at Ephesus was that the church had left its first love for Christ. I hear many people say, "The day I was saved was the greatest day of my life."
