Bravada Presents The Curious Savage October 3-4

TCHS Bravada presents *The Curious Savage* on Saturday, October 3 at 2 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. and on Sunday, October 4 at 2 p.m. Admission will be \$5 for all.

The Curious Savage is a length three act play that features heart-warming characters and a compelling storyline. While there are plenty of laughs the show will have you in tears by the end. It is a story of hope, greed, love, loneliness, pride, and finally acceptance.

The setting of the play is in the 1950's in a private mental institution called "The Cloisters." A lovely lady, Mrs. Ethel Savage (played by Brandi Smith), has been committed by her step-children (played by Abbey Rickard, Marcus Rose, and Casey Flack), because she insists on using her million dollars for a memorial fund for her late husband. While there, she realizes that "crazy" people are the ones on the outside. With the help of

her caring doctor (played by Davis Hill) and her understanding nurse (played by Avaline Morris), Mrs. Savage learns to accept her world for what it is and learns to see her "housemates" for who they want to be instead of who they really are. Jeffrey (played by Logan Talley) is a former military officer who lost his entire platoon in the war and now suffers from PTSD. Fairy (played by Kellee Cornelius) is a plain jane who believes she is beautiful. She is also a compulsive liar. Her delusions carry over into every area of her life. Florence (played by Baileigh Johnson), is a grieving mother who believes her young son is still alive. Mr. Paddy (Ross Taylor) is a mentally deranged patient who doesn't speak except to say what he hates. He also thinks he is an artist. Rounding out the ensemble cast is Hannibal (played by Blaine McDeavitt). Hannibal, a former mathematician, suffers from OCD and

believes he is a concert violinist. Extras in the show include a firm nurse (played by Zane Riddle) and quirky patients who have escaped the higher security wings to join the main cast from time to time. These patients include Sarabeth Bray, Harlie Dover, Aswyn Floyd, Lee Garner, and Alex Thornburg.

The support crew includes Raylianna Brown (stage manager), Ben Coker, Sabrina Brown, and Robert Williams. The play is directed by Cindy Howie with the help of her student directors Colten Howie, Stephanie Parsons, and Megann Gaylor. The technical director for the production is Austin Whitfield, and the business manager is Mrs. Kristy Counce. Set designers and acting coaches are Riley Floyd, Lauren Long, Lauren Sheffield, Katelyn Barnes, and Caleb Smith.

Tishomingo State Park to Get Help from Friends of the Park

A group of concerned citizens has met to form a Friends of the Park organization to help maintain historic Tishomingo State Park. The next meeting is Monday, October 5th at 6 p.m.

One of Mississippi's natural treasures, Tishomingo State Park has 13 miles of nature trails, a swinging bridge and access to Bear Creek, numerous rock outcroppings, caves and shelters and other features unique to its Appalachian foothill location. There are flora and fauna in the Park that are found no where else in Mississippi. And there are dozens of structures and other infrastructure built in the 1930s by the Civilian Conservation Corps,

a New Deal program that put thousands to work on civic projects after the Depression.

Tishomingo County is the only county in the state with two state parks, and this time of year, hundreds of tourists and especially photographers will descend on Tishomingo State Park to enjoy what some say is the best fall color in the state.

Despite its uniqueness and the numbers of tourists it draws to Mississippi's northeastern-most county, the Park staff has been reduced in recent years, and it is clear that the state has cut funding.

A quick survey of Park facilities shows some shuttered and unused, and others in need of repairs

that are also closed to public use. This volunteer group will develop a list of priorities and a work plan and dates.

Recently, Friend of the Park Tommy Cadle organized a team of Prentiss County inmates to come help out with some projects at the Park.

Much help is needed to get this park back to its best shape, and volunteers are encouraged to join the group. The group will meet again Monday, October 5th at the lodge at the Park. 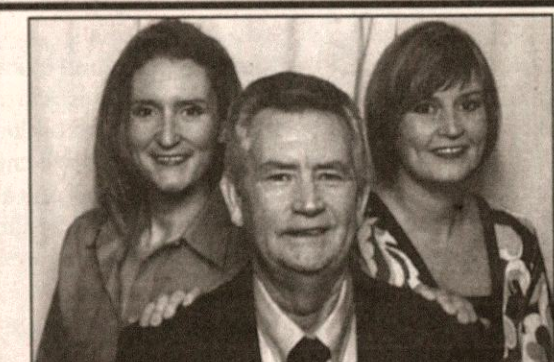

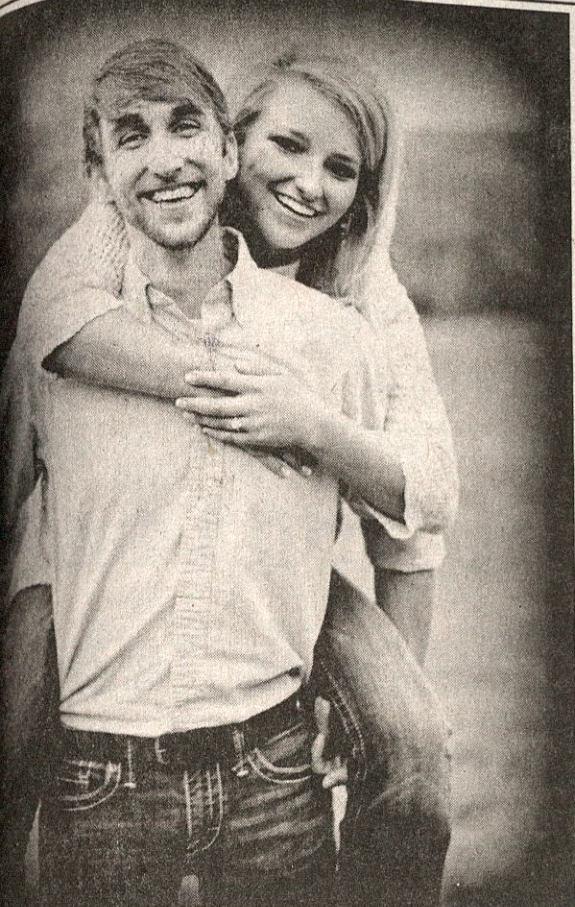

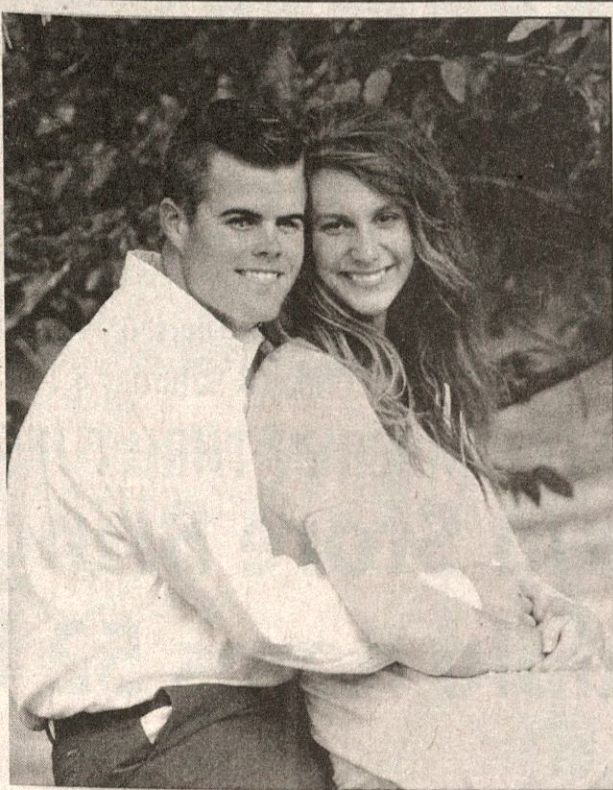
Kayla is the granddaughter of Billy and Faye Phillips of Iuka and Janie Dean Marlow of Texas and the late Joe Dean.

Mayecilla Hart was unanimously voted on and accepted as a new member.

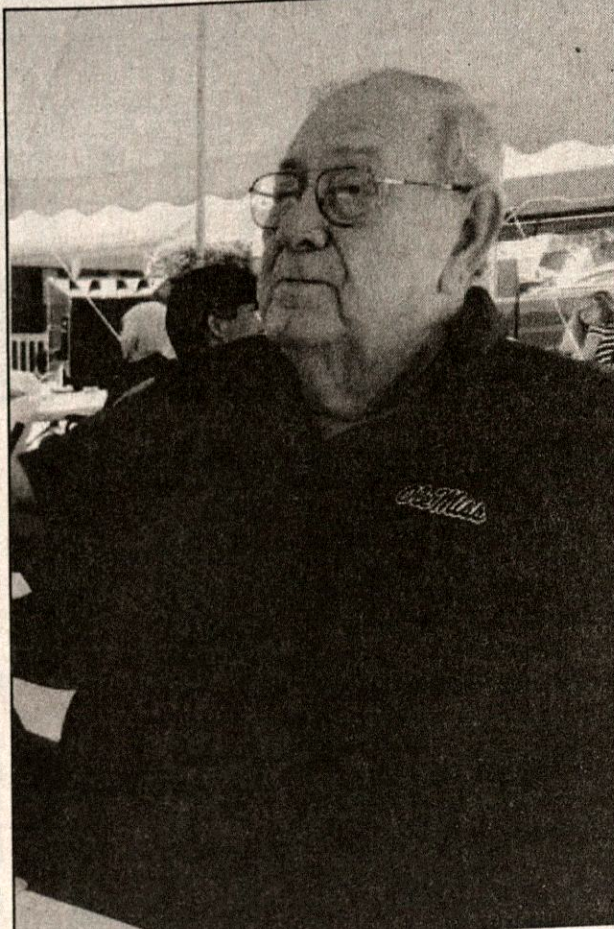

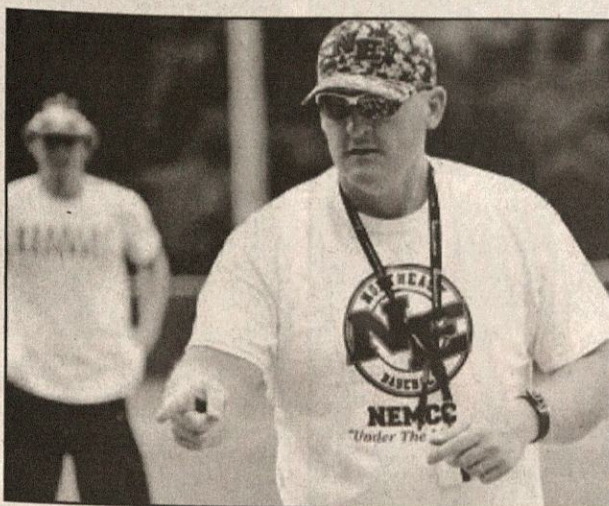
Athletes have the opportunity to learn from Harrelson, who is a local legend that has over 15 years of coaching experience and was recently tabbed as the headman of the Tigers.

"The Bazooka from Iuka" appears in the Mississippi Baseball Record Book an incredible 23 times for his offensive and pitching prowess. He still holds nine state records over two decades after his graduation from Tishomingo County High School.

Harrelson saw action at both third base and pitcher for the University of Mississippi (Ole Miss) from 1993-96. He led the Rebels to a then-school record 40 wins in 1995 and a second place finish at the NCAA Atlantic I Regional at Florida State University that same year.

He has tutored 17 professional players since beginning his career in 1999, including former Tigers Phillip Chapman of the Minnesota Twins and Brandon Farley, who recently concluded his tenure with the San Francisco Giants organization.

His teams have won multiple state championships at the prep level and two Conference USA titles while at the University of Southern Mississippi. Harrelson also made an appearance at the NCAA College World Series at historic Johnny Rosenblatt Stadium in 2009 while with the Golden Eagles.

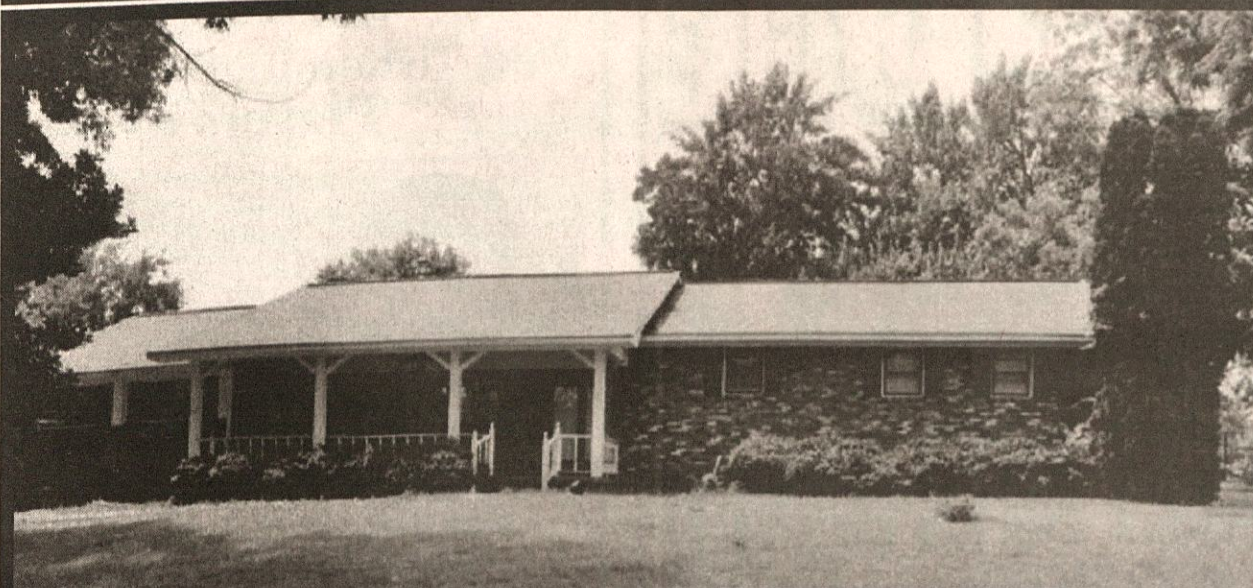

Braves Fall to Booneville; 2015 Homecoming This Friday

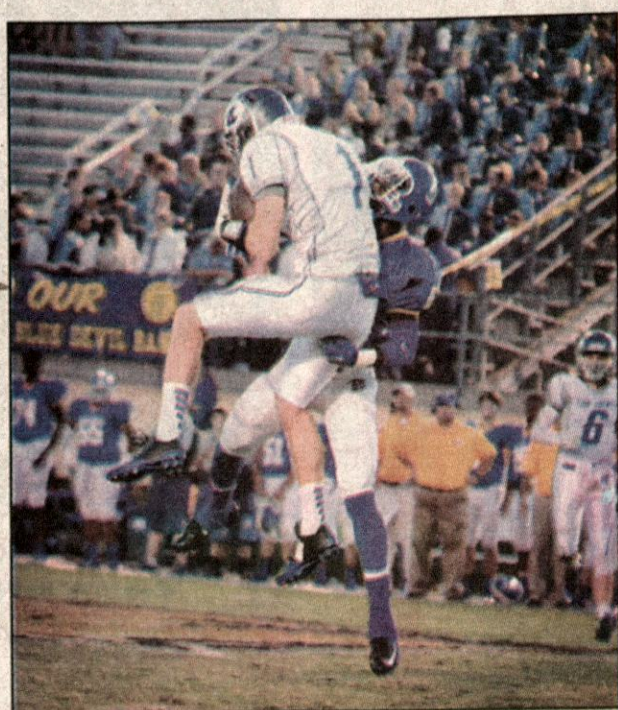

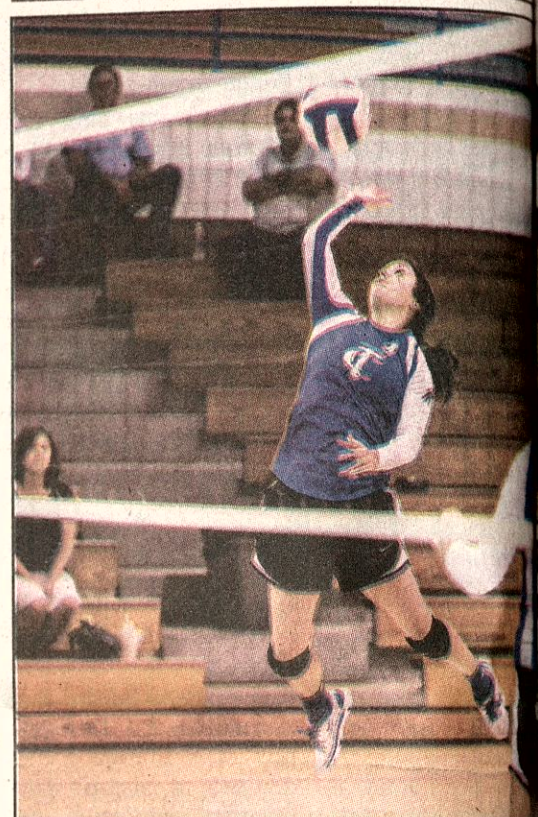

Sat. Sept. 26 9:00-12:00 pm the sale is open to everyone.

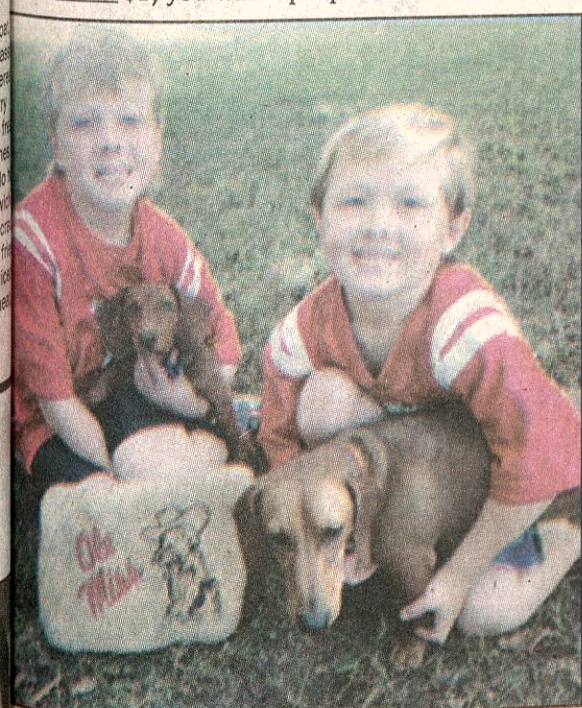
So what is this "Book Sale Extraordinaire"? For a donation of at least \$1, you will
