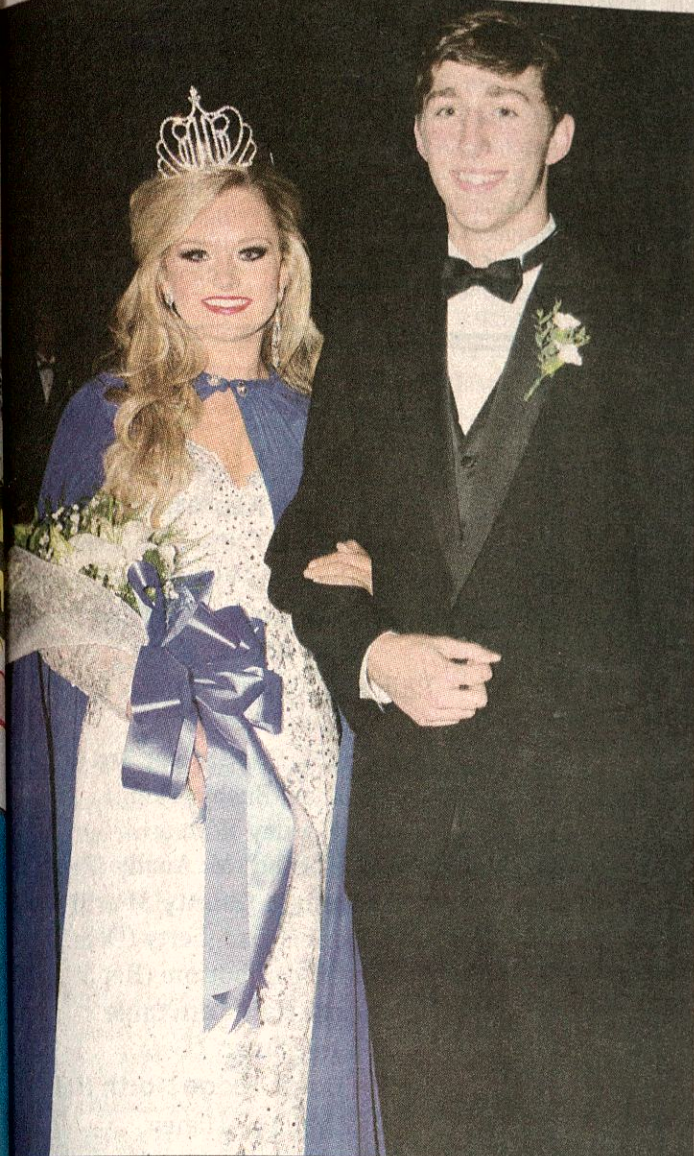

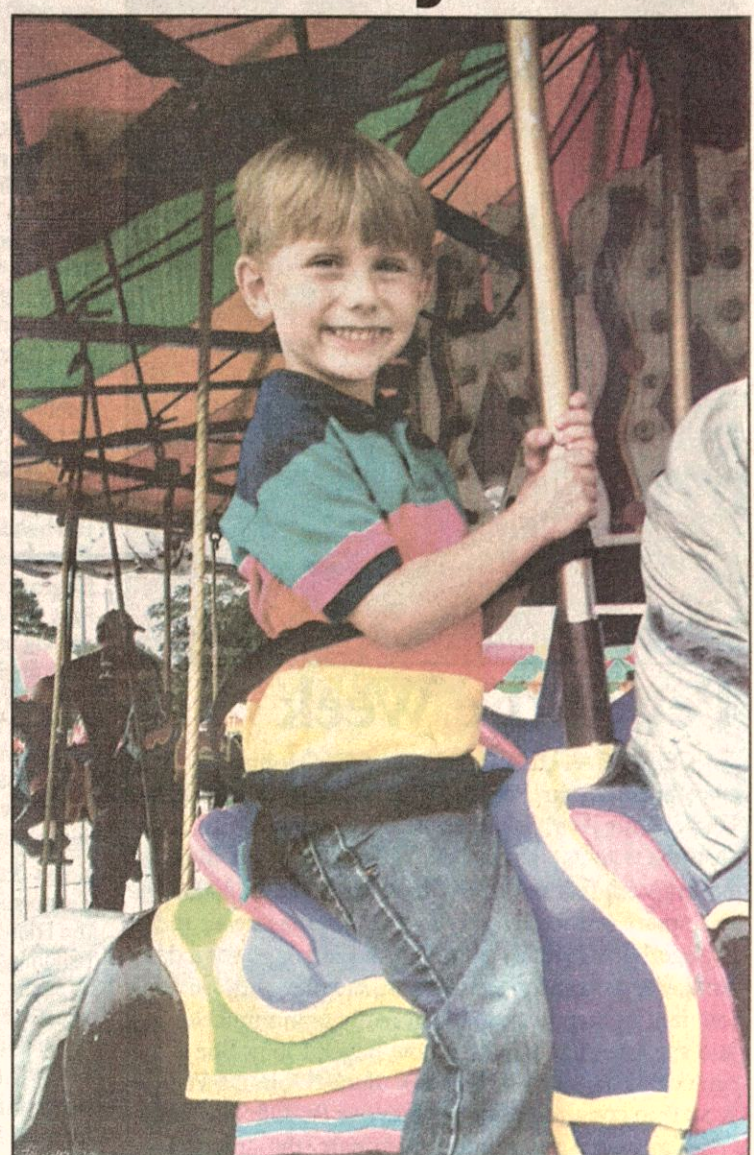

Taxpayer-Owned MDOT Truck Usage Becomes News

Appropriate use of state-owned vehicles became an issue this weekend after pictures appeared online of a Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) law enforcement truck at a Pontotoc gas station. Passengers of the vehicle were pictured allegedly icing down beer to load into the truck.

The truck is thought by many to be one assigned to the state line scales at Iuka, and the passengers are identified as allegedly from Tishomingo County. The person who originally posted the image said, "They were at Pontotoc Kangaroo icing down beer."

Sometimes MDOT personnel volunteer to help direct traffic at college football games,

and they get paid by MDOT. There was an evening game at the University of Mississippi.

Using a law enforcement truck for personal use, and the use of it for transporting civilians, as well as their alcoholic beverages, has been the subject of much on-line discussion.

MDOT has issued the following statement:

"Based on a report filed with the Mississippi Department of Transportation regarding photos that surfaced on social media over the weekend, MDOT has launched an investigation into this personnel issue. This is an active and on-

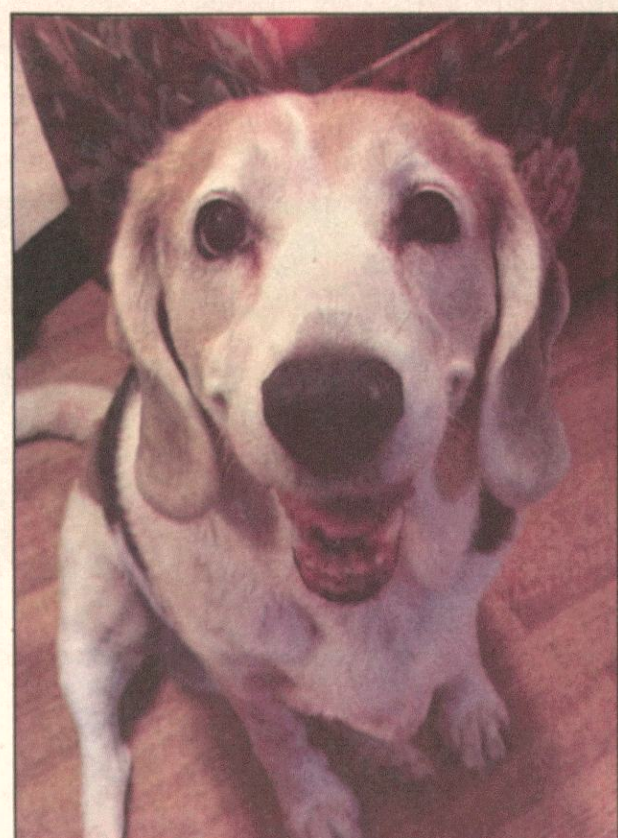

County Fair Tiny Tot Contest and King and Queen Contest Saturday Afternoon

This year the Tiny Tot Contest and King and Queen Contest will be held at the Tishomingo County Fair on Saturday, October 10th.

The Tiny Tot Contest will begin at 2 p.m. and is open to all boys and girls who are residents of Tishomingo County ages 0-23 months old. Age divisions are as follows: 0-6 months, 7-12 months, 13-18 months and 19-23 months as of October 10th. There will be separate categories for boys and girls.

The King & Queen Show is also set for Saturday, October 10th beginning at 5 p.m. This contest is open to all girls ages 2-19 years old and boys ages 2-5 years old as of October 10th who are residents of Tishomingo County. Age divisions are as follows: 2-3 years girls/boys, 4-5 years girls/boys, 6-7 years girls only, 8-9 years girls only, 10-12 years girls only, 13-15 years and 16-19 years girls only.

Entrants must be residents of Tishomingo County- No exceptions! The Fair Board members reserve the right to request verification of age and residence. annulled, never borne a child. Pageant dresses or church dresses are allowed for all contestants.

Out-of-county judges will be selected to judge this contest. Boy winners and girl winners will be selected in each division. Judging will be based upon the child's attractiveness, poise, and personality. A winner and two alternates will be chosen from each category. Each winner and alternate will receive a trophy from the Tishomingo County Fair Association.

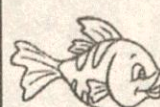
There will be no phone registrations. All registration will be done at the fairgrounds before the event starting at

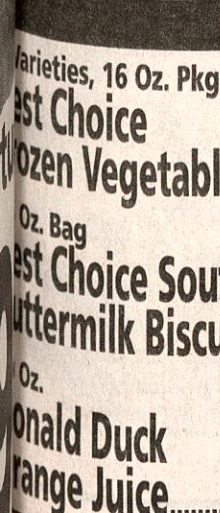

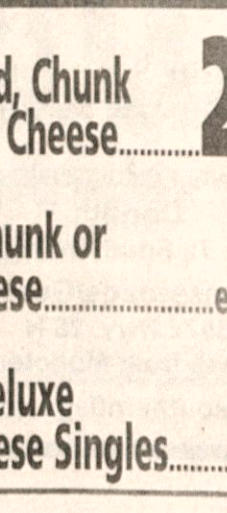

Black and Gold 5K Run in Booneville

The Northeast Mississippi Community College men's basketball team is presenting its fans with a new opportunity to give back to the program and stay in shape at the same time.

The Tigers will host their inaugural Black and Gold Run on Saturday, October 10 in the City of Hospitality.

"We are hoping to have a big turnout," said Northeast headman Cord Wright. "This is a fundraiser, but it is also a time for the people from our local communities to come out and meet our team."

Northeast is offering individuals and families two ways to participate with a long-distance five-kilometer race at 9 a.m. and a one-mile fun run that begins an hour later.

The price to attend increases by \$5 per race after that date and runs through the morning of the run. Sprinters are not guaranteed a t-shirt after the end of the early sign up period.

Squirrels in Mississippi

Squirrels are everywhere these days, more numerous than politicians here in Tishomingo County. My neighbor said she saw twelve in her front yard this week. I cannot look outside, sit on the patio, or water flowers without seeing three or more scurry for cover. A young lady I know runs in Spring Park several times each week. She contends there are more than 200 squirrel residents peeping out, glaring at her. Not at all afraid of humans, often times not even moving out of the way. Dodge the squirrel may be a new exercise program.

I was amazed to learn there are 23 species and 119 subspecies in the United States. Some of these include Delta fox squirrel, flying squirrels, ground squirrels, black squirrels, white squirrels, red squirrels, and most common of all here in Mississippi are gray squirrels. These critters are only 8 to 10 inches and weigh approximately one pound.

Gestation is 28 to 32 days. The average litter is around 7 squirrels. It is not amazing that they are so abundant.

Mississippi has squirrels that live in nests high up in trees and those that burrow in the ground. Some authorities believe Mississippi doesn't have

actual flying squirrels. I beg to differ. I have seen them here on the property. They have bat-like protrusions that fan out from the body to the front legs.

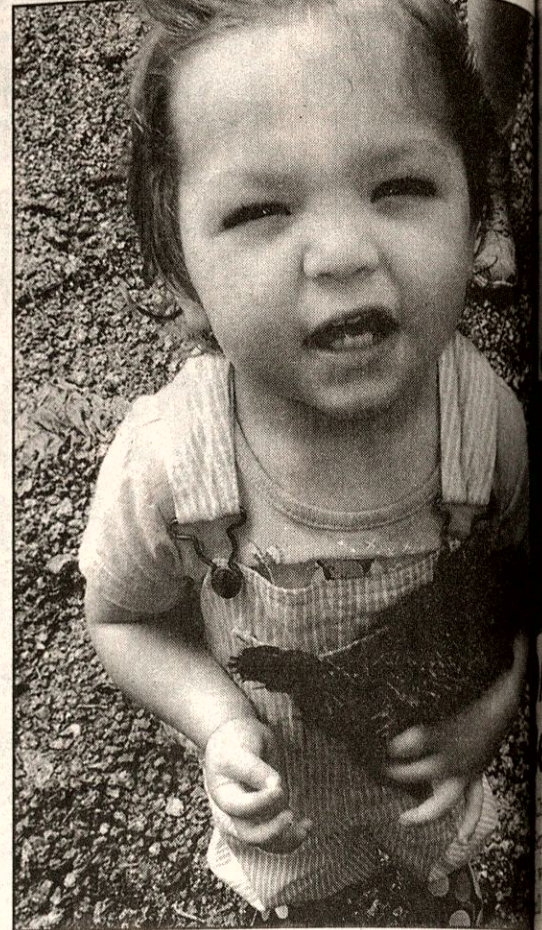
Several species of squirrels are on the endangered wildlife lists. If planning a squirrel hunting outing it might be to your benefit to consult with local wildlife organizations before taking lethal control. A good squirrel hunting dog can cost \$1,000.00 or more. Preferred dogs are several types of Curs and Feists. These are smaller dogs chosen for their impetuous nature.

Words used to describe these critters include pests and or rodents. Tell the man who had his patio furniture shredded how cute they are. Or the lady who planted flowers numerous times just to have them pulled out by the roots by squirrels. Of course, little children think they are cute and could be petted like a kitten if only they could catch one.

Imagine, if you can, those 200 squirrels in Spring Park having litters of 7 or more every month for a year. How many would that be? Will we allow this? I don't have a clue or suggestion on solving this problem. I leave that to those Wildlife Organizations.

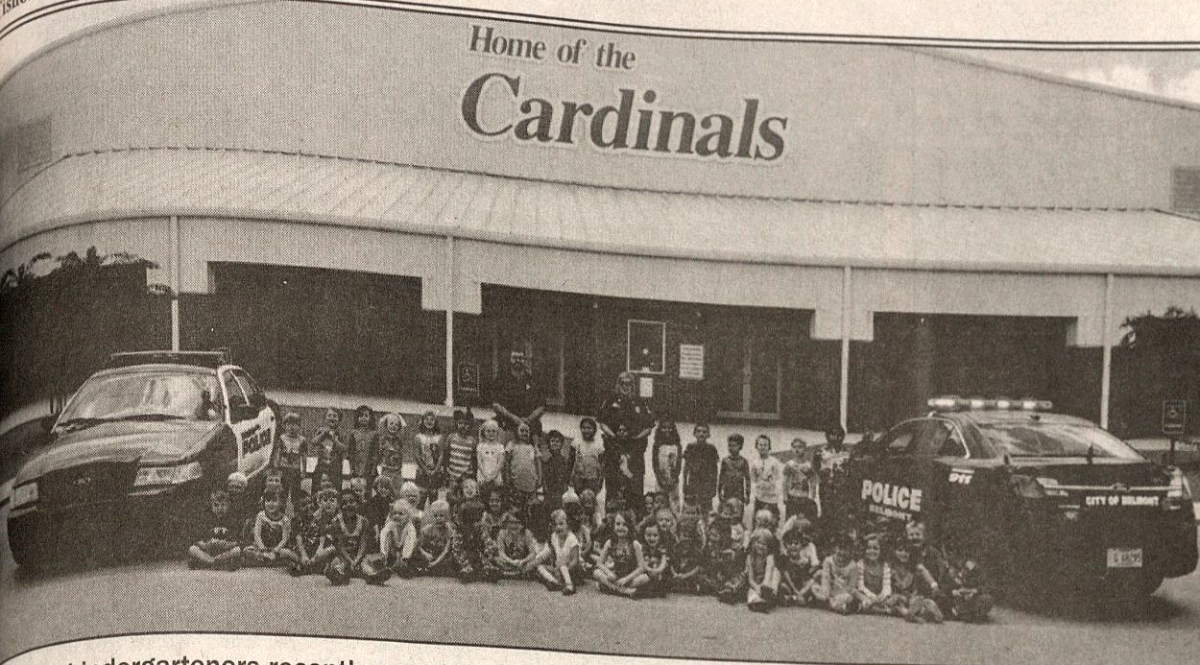

Mississippi Deer Archery Seasons Open October 1 & 15

JACKSON — Many Mississippians are looking forward to the opening of deer archery season on October 1 for the Hill and Delta Zones and October 15 for the Southeast Zone.

Longbows, recurves, compound bows, and crossbows are all considered legal archery equipment and can be used during all hunting seasons for deer. There is no minimum or maximum draw weight, no minimum arrow length, and fixed or mechanical broadheads may be used.

"Deer numbers are high statewide, and this year's crop of two year old bucks should be outstanding. Also, the mast crop is looking good, which is a

recipe for abundant bow-hunting opportunities," says Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks (MDWFP) Deer Program Biologist David Graves. "Hunters should place stands in prime feeding areas, hopefully weather conditions during the season will be conducive to improved deer movement."

MDWFP reminds all Wildlife Management Area (WMA) hunters that they are required to wear a full-body harness (fall-arrest system) while climbing a tree, installing a tree stand that uses climbing aids, or while hunting from a tree stand on a WMA. While required on WMAs, MDWFP also

urges all hunters to wear and know how to properly use a full-body harness while hunting from an elevated position. Take time before your hunt to be sure you have all the proper safety equipment, and remember that the most important part of the hunt is making it home.

Guests are welcome and encouraged to bring a quilted item if they have one they would like to share.

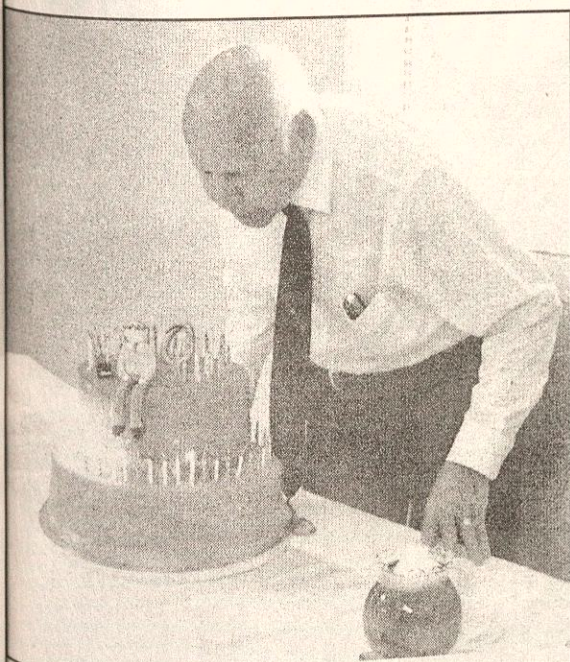

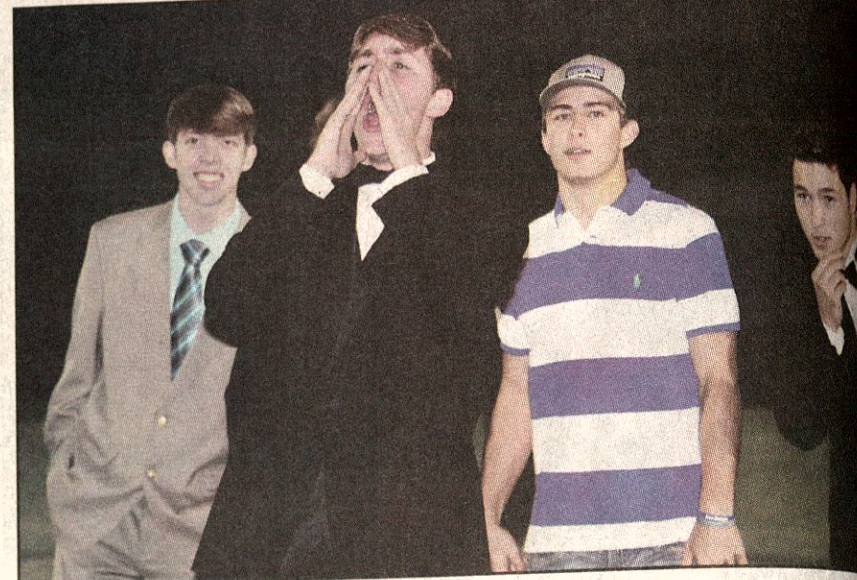

What Is Jesus Saying To The Churches? (part XVI)

The Bible has a great number of references that teach us to fear God, or to fear something else, but it also has many places that tell us not to fear, as is the case in Revelation 2:10: "Fear none of those things which thou shalt suffer: behold, the devil shall cast some of you into prison, that ye may be tried; and ye shall have tribulation ten days: be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life." Suffering is a normal part of the Christian life, if we live to please God! Paul

mentioned some of his suffering in II Timothy 3:10-11, then in II Timothy 3:12, he said: "Yea, and all that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution." Paul did not say "some" will suffer for their godly living, but he said "all" would suffer persecution. There is a prerequisite to the suffering here, for it comes because of a godly lifestyle. In America, we have been sold a bill of goods that says everything should be "roses", if we are living within the will of God, but that is not the case; it never has been the case and it never will be the case, until we are at home

with the Lord! I have mentioned before something to this effect: "If you put on the uniform of a Christian, you can expect some shots from the enemy!" It would be unnatural for any of us to love suffering, but we should be willing to endure it for the cause of Christ!

Jesus said that the devil would cast some of the believers at Smyrna into prison, where they would be tried. He said their tribulation would last ten days. It is not clear, and most Bible scholars would not be dogmatic as to just what is meant by "ten days", since the Bible does not tell us. It is interesting that there are always a few people who know more than the rest of us and can tell us exactly what such things mean. A fellow asked me some time ago: "What did the seven thunders tell

John in Revelation 10:1-4, and God told John not to write the things he had heard?" I said, "I do not know, because God didn't let John write them." When we do not know, it is wise to say so! The indication in the "ten days" may be that the time spent in prison would be a limited time, but that is conjecture. At any rate, Jesus told the church to be faithful until death and He would give them a crown of life. It seems that this applies to all believers, in that all who really are saved will continue in the faith, which is usually called perseverance. James 1:12 says, "Blessed is the man that endureth temptation: (testing) for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love Him." Then we have I Corinthians

16:22 saying: "If any man love not the Lord Jesus Christ, let him be Anathema Maranatha." This means that those who do not love Jesus are under the judgment of God (Anathema means that), and the Lord returns (Maranatha means that) to execute that judgment, as Jude verses 14-15 say.

So, it appears that all who are really saved will receive the crown of life. This may mean that eternal life itself, in its fullest reality, will be the crown. It should be noted that the two references that I have given above are the only references in the New Testament to the "crown of life". Revelation 4:4 shows the twenty-four elders with crowns of gold on their heads, then 4:10 shows them casting their crowns at Jesus' feet. All the elders are crowned; the

elders represent people from every tribe and nation (Revelation 5:6) thus all the saved have at least one crown of life.

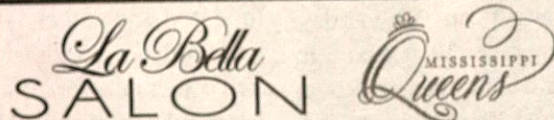

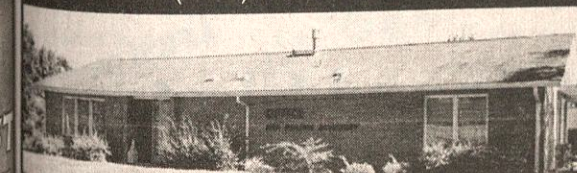

"He who drinks of this spring so clear,
Finds health and often returneth here
Though he may search the wild world o'er,
He shall ever long for one draught more."

Of another spring that ran close by, the witch whispered, nodding sly, "And this spring flows beauty power, and makes the maid fair as a flower." a leafy cup in its brink she dips, then holds it to her red lips. Now it chanced ere Iuka fell ill, his blood hot - or shivered chill. Then his braves bore him to Tishomingo amongst the red hills where the pine grow. She bade them set his wigwam there, crystal spring in the dell so fair, and he drank the pure and clear, grew strong and well, yet lingered. He wed the maid as fair as a flower, and happy till his last sweet hour. The years have flown and dians sleep, but the springs still flow and the charms keeps. And chant as they bubble, "Drink, all men health, 'tis wealth - return again."

This legend was printed in the Iuka Vidette (Iuka) March 12, 1915. The Tishomingo County's Old Courthouse Museum obtained a copy from the scrapbook of Abner Mangum.

Squirrel Season Opens October 1

JACKSON - The Mississippi fall squirrel season opens statewide on October 1, 2015 and closes February 28, 2016. The special youth squirrel season is September 24 - September 30 on private lands and authorized state and federal lands only. The bag limit is eight squirrels per day.

Squirrel population numbers should be good for the upcoming hunting season, although hardwood mast crops were less abundant in some parts of the state last year compared to previous years.

Mast crop abundance will probably vary somewhat again this year. Squirrel populations may vary locally as a result.

For those in search of a place to hunt, most of Mississippi's open public lands and wildlife management areas offer squirrel hunting opportunities. Hunters should generally look for areas with mature, hardwood forest cover for the best squirrel hunting. Many public areas also allow small game hunters to hunt with dogs. Anyone

planning to hunt public land should read the regulations before they hunt. Some areas may have season dates and rules that differ from general statewide regulations.

2015 Photography Contest

Rules and Regulations Youth & Adult Division

All photos must be turned in between 11:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on Monday, October 5, 2015.

The contest is open only to Tishomingo County residents. There is a youth (under 18 years old) and an adult division (18 years or older). Premiums will be paid in each division.

This competition is for AMATEUR photographers only. For the purpose of the competition, professionals are defined as those who sell their work, or who are employed as photographers or teachers of photography.

All photos must be the original work of the exhibitor. Copyrighted images are not permitted.

Photos may be taken with a digital or 35mm camera.

All photos must be 8"x10" in size.

All photos must be mounted on a 10"x12" piece of BLACK foam board which may be found at Wal-Mart and other places in the area.

Each exhibitor may enter a maximum of 2 total entries.

The categories are as follows:

People: Photo including one or more person(s).

Pets, Animals, and/or Wildlife: Shall include one or more animal(s).

Nature: May include landscapes, skies, water-scapes, horticulture, etc.

Action: Should show action such as football, baseball, soccer, running, skiing, dancing, auto-racing, etc.

Black & White: All photos must be black and white in this category.

All Black & white photos must be entered in the Black & White category.

All material deemed inappropriate by fair management will be disqualified and not displayed.

Premiums: \$20 First place in each category

\$50 to one overall winner

Youth and adult divisions will be judged and awarded premiums separately.

Art Contest Returns to This Year's County Fair

1. Artist must be a Tishomingo County resident 18 years of age or older as of October 5th.

2. Limit two entries per artist. May be paintings or drawings in any media and should be no more than two (2) years old.

3. Only original work and original idea is acceptable. Copies of paintings or drawings will be disqualified. Artwork that contains nudity will not be accepted.

4. Any works that have been previously exhibited in the Tishomingo County Fair will be disqualified. Entries will be exhibited according to space available.

5. The judges reserve the right to refuse entries.

6. Specifications: All art must be suitable for hanging and measure no larger than 4 feet x 4 feet or artist must furnish own display. Space is limited. If you need more than 4 feet please get prior approval.

7. Reasonable care will be used at all times in handling entries, but entries will not be insured. The Tishomingo County Fair Board will not be responsible for any loss or damages whatsoever.
