



Appropriate use of vehicles state-owned became an issue this weekend after pictures appeared online of a Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) law enforcement truck at a Pontotoc gas station. Passengers of the vehicle were pictured allegedly icing down beer to load into the truck.

The truck is thought by many to be one assigned to the state line scales at Iuka, and the passengers are identified as allegedly from Tishomingo County. The person who originally posted the image said, "They were at Pontotoc Kangaroo icing down beer."





County Fair Tiny Tot Contest and King and Queen Contest Saturday Afternoon

This year the Tiny Tot Contest and King and Queen Contest will be held at the Tishomingo County Fair on Saturday, October 10th.

The Tiny Tot Contest will begin at 2 p.m. and is open to all boys and girls who are residents of Tishomingo County ages 0-23 months old. Age divisions are as follows: 0-6 months, 7-12 months, 13-18 months and 19-23 months as of October 10th. There will be separate categories for boys and girls.

The King & Queen Show is also set for Saturday, October 10th beginning at 5 p.m. This contest is open to all girls ages 2-19 years old and boys ages 2-5 years old as of October 10th who are residents of Tishomingo County. Age divisions are as follows: 2-3 years girls/ boys, 4-5 years girls/ boys, 6-7 years girls only, 8-9 years girls only, 10-12 years girls only, 13-15 years and 16-19 years girls only.

Entrants must be residents of Tishomingo County- No exceptions! The Fair Board members reserve the right to request verification of age and residence. Please be prepared to present proof that includes the legal parent or guardian's name and address. Entrants must be unmarried, never married, or marriage annulled, never borne a child. Pageant dresses or church dresses are allowed for all contestants.

Out-of-county judges will be selected to judge this contest. Boy winners and girl winners will be selected in each division. Judging will be based upon the child's attractiveness, poise, and personality. A winner and two alternates will be chosen from each category. Each winner and alternate will receive a trophy from the Tishomingo County Fair Association.

There will be no phone registrations. All registration will be done at the fairgrounds before the event starting at noon. The registration fee is \$10 payable at the gate the day of the eventcash only. Entry forms will be made available after you pay the registration fee. Events will start promptly at their designated times. Due to the fact that we don't know the number of contestants in each category we cannot tell you what time to arrive. You will not be allowed to participate if you register after your category has gone on stage. Black and Gold 5K Run in Booneville

The Northeast Mississippi Community College men's basketball team is presenting its fans with a new opportunity to give back to the program and stay in shape at the same time.

The Tigers will host their inaugural Black and Gold Run on Saturday, October 10 in the City of Hospitality.

"We are hoping to have a big turnout," said Northeast headman Cord Wright. "This is a fundraiser, but it is also a time for the people from our local communities to come out and meet our team."

Northeast is offering individuals and families two ways to participate with a long-distance fivekilometer race at 9 a.m. and a one-mile fun run that begins an hour later.

The race begins in front of legendary Bonner Arnold Coliseum, which is the home venue of a squad that has compiled six National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Region 23 titles and an additional six Mississippi Association of Community and Junior Colleges (MACJC) state championships in its illustrious history.

Entrants will immediately cross Mississippi Highway 145 and enter onto Coach Billy Ward Drive, which is named after the Tigers' winningest football coach who is now enshrined in the NJCAA Hall of Fame.

A majority of the contest takes place on Booneville City Park's walking track that weaves through a picturesque wooded area. The competition then returns to campus where athletes find the finish line at Tiger Stadium.

Enrollment is currently available through Wednesday, October 7 at a cost of \$25 for the 5K and \$15 for the shorter event. This fee covers the cost of an official race t-shirt.

The price to attend increases by \$5 per race after that date and runs through the morning of the run. Sprinters are not guaranteed a t-shirt after the end of the early sign up period.

Squirrels in Mississippi

Squirrels are everywhere these days, more numerous than politicians here in Tishomingo County. My neighbor said she saw twelve in her front yard this week. I cannot look outside, sit on the patio, or water flowers without seeing three or more scurry for cover. A young lady I know runs in Spring Park several times each week. She contends there are more than 200 squirrel residents peeping out, glaring at her. Not at all afraid of humans, often times not even moving out of the way. Dodge the squirrel may be a new exercise program.

I was amazed to learn there are 23 species and 119 subspecies in the United States. Some of these include Delta fox squirrel, flying squirrels, ground squirrels, black squirrels, white squirrels, red squirrels, and most common of all here in Mississippi are gray squirrels. These critters are only 8 to 10 inches and weigh approximately one pound.

Gestation is 28 to 32 days. The average litter is around 7 squirrels. It is not amazing that they are so abundant.

Mississippi has squirrels that live in nests high up in trees and those that burrow in the ground. Some authorities believe Mississippi doesn't have

actual flying squirrels. I beg to differ. I have seen them here on the property. They have bat-like protrusions that fan out from the body to the front legs.



If planning a squirrel hunting outing it might be to your benefit to consult with local wildlife organizations before taking lethal control. A good squirrel hunting dog can cost \$1,000.00 or more. Preferred dogs are several types of Curs and Feists. These are smaller dogs chosen for their impetuous nature.

Words used to describe these critters include pests and or rodents. Tell the man who had his patio furniture shredded how cute they are. Or the lady who planted flowers numerous times just to have them pulled out by the roots by squirrels. Of course, little children think they are cute and could be petted like a kitten if only they could catch one.

Imagine, if you can, those 200 squirrels in Spring Park having litters of 7 or more every month for a year. How many would that be? Will we allow this? I don't have a clue or suggestion on solving this problem. I leave that to those Wildlife Organizations.







Mississippi Deer Archery Seasons Open October 1 & 15

JACKSON – Many sissippians are lookaforward to the opening ideer archery season on Outober 1 for the Hill and Deh Zones and October in the Southeast Zone. Longhows, recurves, comround bows, and crossbows are all considered legal archery equipment and can be used during al hunting seasons for det There is no minimum or maximum draw reight, no minimum artw length, and fixed or mechanical broadheads may be used. "Deer numbers are statewide, and this ear's crop of two year old weks should be outstand-¹⁹ Also, the mast crop is ooking good, which is a

recipe for abundant bowhunting opportunities," says Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks (MDWFP) Deer Program Biologist David Graves. "Hunters should place stands in prime feeding areas, hopefully weather conditions during the season will be conducive to improved deer movement." MDWFP reminds all Wildlife Management Area (WMA) hunters that they are required to wear a full-body harness (fall-arrest system) while climbing a tree, installing a tree stand that uses climbing aids, or while hunting from a tree stand on a WMA. While required on WMAs, MDWFP also

urges all hunters to wear and know how to properly use a full-body harness while hunting from an elevated position. Take time before your hunt to be sure you have all the proper safety equipment, and remember that the most important part of the hunt is making it home.

What Is Jesus Saying **To The Churches?** (part XVI)

The Bible has a great number of references that teach us to fear God, or to fear something else, but it also has many places that tell us not to fear, as is the case in Revelation 2:10: "Fear none of those things which thou shalt suffer: behold, the devil shall cast some of you into prison, that ye may be tried; and ye shall have tribulation ten days: be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown Suffering is of life." a normal part of the Christian life, if we live to please God! Paul



mentioned some of his suffering in II Timothy 3:10-11, then in II Timothy 3:12, he said: "Yea, and all that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution." Paul did not say "some" will suffer for their godly living, but he said "all" would suffer persecution. There is a prerequisite to the suffering here, for it comes because of a godly lifestyle. In America, we have been sold a bill of goods that says everything should be "roses" , if we are living within the will of God, but that is not the case; it never has been the case and it never will be the case, until we are at home with the Lord! I have mentioned before something to this effect: "If you put on the uniform of a Christian, you can expect some shots from the enemy!" It would be unnatural for any of us to love suffering, but we should be willing to endure it for the cause of Christ!

Jesus said that the devil would cast some of the believers at Smyrna into prison, where they would be tried. He said their tribulation would last ten days. It is not clear, and most Bible scholars would not be dogmatic as to just what is meant by "ten days", since the Bible does not tell us. It is interesting that there are always a few people who know more than the rest of us and can tell us exactly what such things mean. A fellow asked me some time ago: "What did the seven thunders tell

John in Revelation 10:1-4, and God told John not to write the things he had heard?" I said, "I do not know, because God didn't let John write them." When we do not know, it is wise to say so! The indication in the "ten days" may be that the time spent in prison would be a limited time, but that is conjecture. At any rate, Jesus told the church to be faithful until death and He would give them a crown of life. It seems that this applies to all believers, in that all who really are saved will continue in the faith, which is usually called James perseverance. 1:12 says, "Blessed is the man that endureth (testing) temptation: for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love Him." Then we have I Corinthians

"If any

16:22 saying: man love not the Lord Jesus Christ, let him be Anathema Maranatha." This means that those who do not love Jesus are under the judgment of God (Anathema means that), and the Lord returns (Maranatha means that) to execute that judgment, as Jude verses 14-15 say. So, it appears that all who are really saved will receive the crown of life. This may mean that eternal life itself, in its fullest reality, will be the crown. It should be noted that the two references that I have given above are the only references in the New Testament to the "crown of Revelation 4:4 life". shows the twenty-fourelders with crowns of gold on their heads, then 4:10 shows them casting their crowns at Jesus' feet. Held nual Nagle Reunion

The 90th Nagle reunion was held in Mineral Springs Park on September 13, 2015, when descendants of Patrick and Emelia Nagle gathered for fun, fellowship and good food. The first Nagle Reunion was held in September, 1925 at Dr. Simmon's house which was located just south of where the Iuka Middle School is now located. Descendants of Patrick Nagle earned their living in the lumber business which fell on hard times in the Depression of 1929. Later generations we find a number of doctors and various careers in education and faculty positions.

The turn-out this year was very good and the weather wonderful. Every one enjoyed spending time in the park. The Millard Nagle Silver Dollar Pitching Tournament fell by the wayside this year, but we hope to revive it next year. Lots of family history was the main topic of conservation and pictures were exchanged and enjoyed. Dean Dyatt of Salt lake City, Utah was the person traveling fartherest to attend. He has been active in preserving early history of the Nagle family and has just this year located a branch of the family that had been lost as far as our records were concerned. Dean located a greatgranddaughter of Cornelia Frances Elizabeth Nagle in Montana just recently on the Saturday night before the reunion on Sunday.

Squirrel Season Opens October 1

JACKSON - The Mississippi fall squirrel season opens statewide on October 1, 2015 and closes February 28, 2016. The special youth squirrel season is September 24 - September 30 on private lands and authorized state and federal lands only. The bag limit is eight squirrels per day.

Squirrel population numbers should be good for the upcoming hunting season, although hardwood mast crops were less abundant in some parts of the state last year compared to previous years. Mast crop abundance will probably vary somewhat again this year. Squirrel populations may vary locally as a result.

For those in search of a place to hunt, most of Mississippi's open public lands and wildlife management areas offer squirrel hunting opportunities. Hunters should generally look for areas with mature, hardwood forest cover for the best squirrel hunting. Many public areas also allow small game hunters to hunt with dogs. Anyone

planning to hunt public land should read the regulations before they hunt. Some areas may have season dates and rules that differ from general statewide regulations.
