Two Killed in Dennis Collision Wednesday

Two men were killed in a collision that happened at 4 a.m. Wednesday on Highway 25 in Dennis.

According to Tishomingo Coroner Mack Williams, Blake Lam-32, of Corinth was driv-northbound on Highway when his Ford pickup was head on by a Chevrolet driven by Jacobb Mur-30, of Tishomingo. The col-happened about a quarter south of Liberty Church of

Christ in Dennis, said Wilemon. Murphy's vehicle was engulfed in flames where it landed in the middle of the highway. Traffic was blocked about two and a half hours. The highway re-opened about 6:30 a.m.

The collision is still under investigation, but Wilemon said authorities believe Murphy was going to work in Fayette, Alabama, and Lambert had left work at Sun Air Products in Belmont on an errand to Dennis.

The Paden Tornado-1949

It's early summer, 1949, I'm 4 years old and I'm sitting here in Uncle P. T. Woodruff's store in Paden. It's mid-morning and cloudy, bad cloudy. Mother and Daddy let me stay here with P. T. and aunt Lena this week while they went back to Memphis to work.

Uncle P.T. is sitting behind the cash register by the window on his big stool, behind the rack where he kept all the credit slips, some new, and some yellowed from age. And then there was the cheese cutter with that big hoop of cheese on it with the oil spots. It sat out all day; I guess you don't have to refrigerate cheese. Customers would come in and gather up their groceries and lay them on the counter to pay. If they had any money left, they might say, "gimme some of them cheese."

"Them cheese." I

thought that was the brand. And then there was the ice cream box. It had two lids on it and when it was opened, cold smoke billowed out. He has three flavors, chocolate, strawberry, and "maneller." "Maneller" is my favorite.

We had already had an exciting morning. Aunt Lena had killed what she called a garter snake in the garden. But that was nothing compared to what was about to happen.

These are different times, no air conditioning, no television; it's summer and all the doors and windows in Paden are open. The only sound you might hear will be a slamming screen door, or some husband and wife into it. People would say, "Well, they're into it again," or maybe a dog barking.

Aunt Lena had been cooking a pot of tur-

nip greens that morning and the house was full of the smell. I hated turnip greens and the smell. If you don't like them, that smell will really hit you hard. Thank the Lord I got over that. My Aunt's name was Lena, but we didn't call her that, we called her "Lener." I was nearly grown before I learned there wasn't an R in her name.

Across the road from the store is the Masonic Lodge; a big two story frame building shrouded in mystery.

"What do they do up there," I asked?

"They ride goats" was the most common answer. The downstairs was rented out in apartments, my mother was born there, but right now the bottom is empty. I would learn afterwards that some of the best people in Paden belonged to that Lodge and they would be the first to show up and help when the destruction hit.

"This is a bad cloud," one of them said. "Maybe we need to get to the storm house."

"I think it's gonna blow over," Uncle P.T. said. He said that several more times before it hit.

The store is full of people. Simmy Green had walked up from south of town to get a sack of groceries. He had on his snap-billed cap. He always had on his snap billed cap.

"Yo folks be ok, Simmy?" one asked. "Yep, they in the storm house by now," he answered. I learned later that most of the people in Paden were in the storm house, except us.

It happened suddenly, as it always does, hard wind, hard rain, some hail, and then the Ma-

sonic Lodge across the road exploded, boards, furniture, glass everywhere. Next door to the Lodge is Della Luttrell's house, a small unpainted frame house, it was untouched, and she knew that because I was sitting in her lap. In the store. I loved her, she was like a grandmother to me. We didn't call her Della either, it was "Deller," just like "Lener."

And then, it was all over, and amazingly, no one was hurt. Someone came running up and said, "It got Billy West's house, but they're ok, they were in the storm house." Storm houses in Paden are all pretty much the same, crossties for the sides, pine slabs on the floor, with a tin roof. You could really tell when the rain changed to hail. The insides were all the same too, a bench around three sides and a shelf up top to put canned stuff from the garden, a coal oil lamp for light and a hoe to kill the snake. There was always a snake.

We didn't escape completely; it took the tin roof off the store building. I can look up and see daylight through the cracks in the ceiling planks.

It was maybe an hour later, after all the rain had stopped and we learned that no one got hurt that the real excitement started. A big red truck drove up. They came pouring out, all dressed in uniforms asking if we were hurt and then handing out sandwiches and cookies and cokes and yes, candy. It was the Red Cross. God bless the Red Cross, they put a tarpaulin over Uncle P.T. store and gave me some more candy. My first tornado.

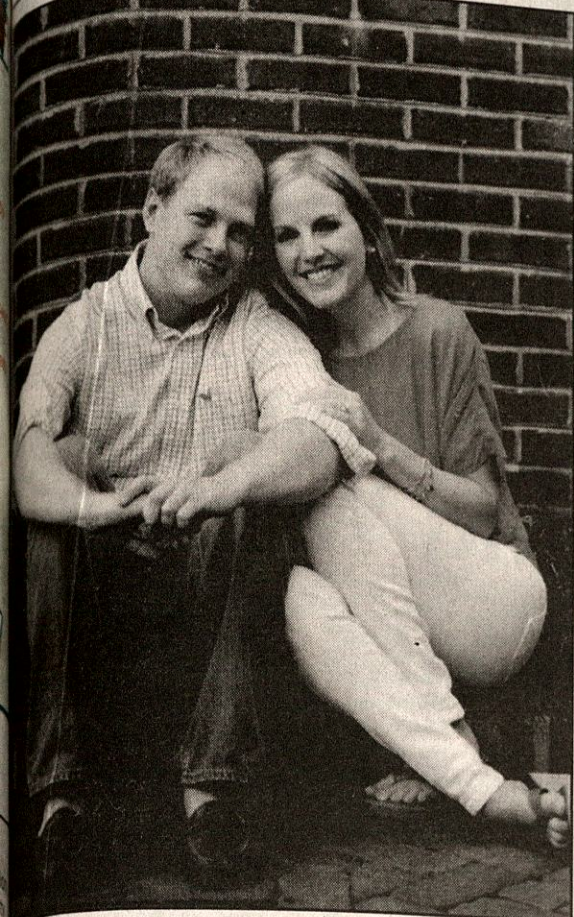

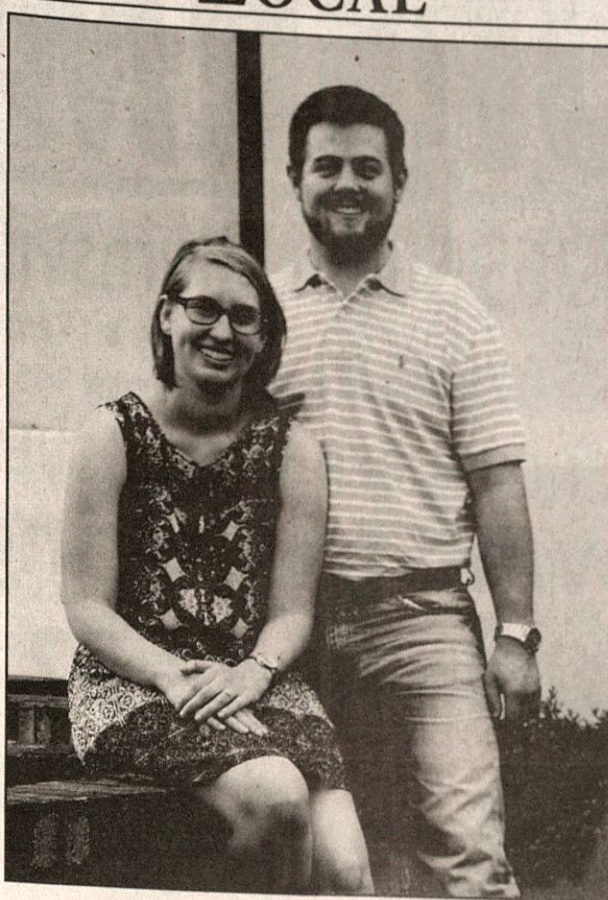
The picturesque Chapel of Memories on the campus of Mississippi State University will be the setting of the Allen-Thorne nuptials.

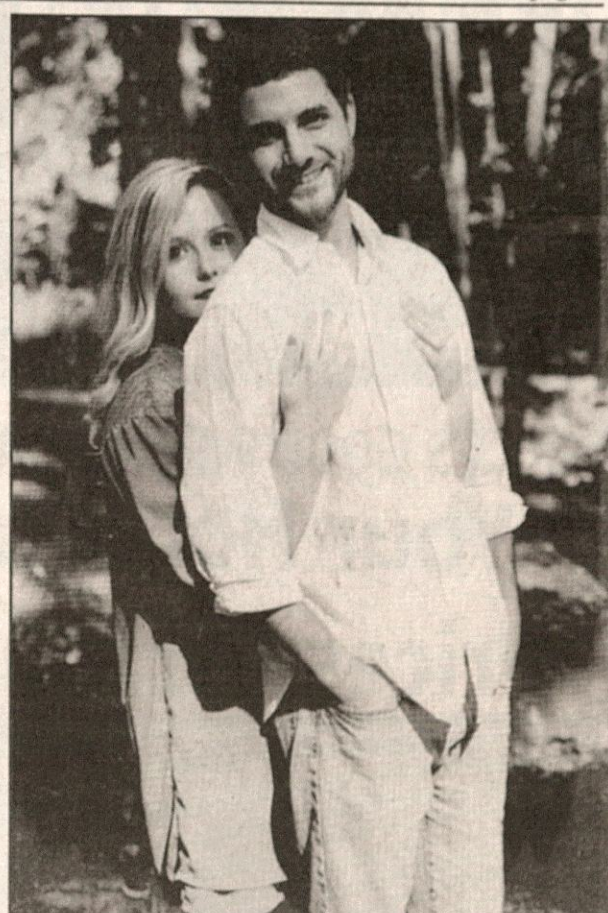
marksmanship, armed and unarmed combat, map reading, field tactics, military courtesy, military justice system, basic first aid, foot marches, and field training exercises.

Mama Said Always Respect a Lady

My Daddy always said “God invented nothing better than a good woman or worse than a bad one.” He said many times he was lucky and married a good one. She was totally devoted to him and 13 kids. We boys slept on a back porch Daddy walled in as the family grew. The only heat in our old “dog trot” house was a fireplace in the living room and a wood burning cook stove in the kitchen. Many of you older folks were reared similarly.

At age 80, I still have a sweet dream occasionally of on many cold nights hearing Mama’s bare feet, she had no bedroom shoes, around 2 a.m. coming across a rough oak porch bedroom floor. She would place a warm hand on my forehead, then pull covers up around my neck, kiss me gently on the forehead, whisper softly “I love you”. She did all of us that way. Her action did not wake me completely, so as I drifted back into a deep-little-boy sleep, I felt safe and was King of the World. With an eleventh grade education, she taught us many things. In the small local school she had learned a great deal of Latin and some French. You could not give her a word she could not spell or pronounce correctly.

One of the many things she taught us boys was respect for women. We were to say “Yes mam, stand when a lady entered the room (I know I’m in trouble with the politically correct bunch . . . using that disrespectful word “lady”), if no more chairs . . . give her your chair, open doors for them, be kind, carry heavy loads for them and never say “bad” words in their presence.

I have always believed my daddy’s diagnosis of the female gender. I love watching a mother take care of her baby; most of them will do anything for the health, protection and well-being of her child. I have read of Mamas picking up a car when her knuckled-headed-teen-age-boy did not block it properly before crawling under for repair, have knowledge of them giving body parts to their child in need, read about one who insisted on giving a dying son her heart. A good Mama may be gentle, loving, and kind, but most will fight like a wounded Bengal tiger for a child if and when the need arises.

My respect for women was sorely tested about twenty years ago—not in Mississippi. I held an elevator door for a woman. At that time we were the only passengers in the elevator. She stopped the elevator between floors turned and hung a Marine Corps . . . boot camp cussing on me. Now I was in the Corps, have worked heavy construction, played sports and was certain I had heard all created cuss words . . . I was wrong. She then said, “I’m gonna kick your condescending ass,” as she went into a karate stance, moving to a position that would allow her to put a fast moving foot onto the tenderest part of my body. This was a bit funny at first until I thought about Mama . . . then I became confused.

I had fought enough in my young life to know I could break her jaw with one right hand shot, or burst her right eardrum with a left hook, or wrap my arms around her to keep her from hitting or kicking me, but the holding solution could well have resulted in an attempted rape charge . . . one of Dad’s bad women. I knew what Mama would do if I decked this uncommon woman. Mama would rise from her grave with a privet switch, switching me from



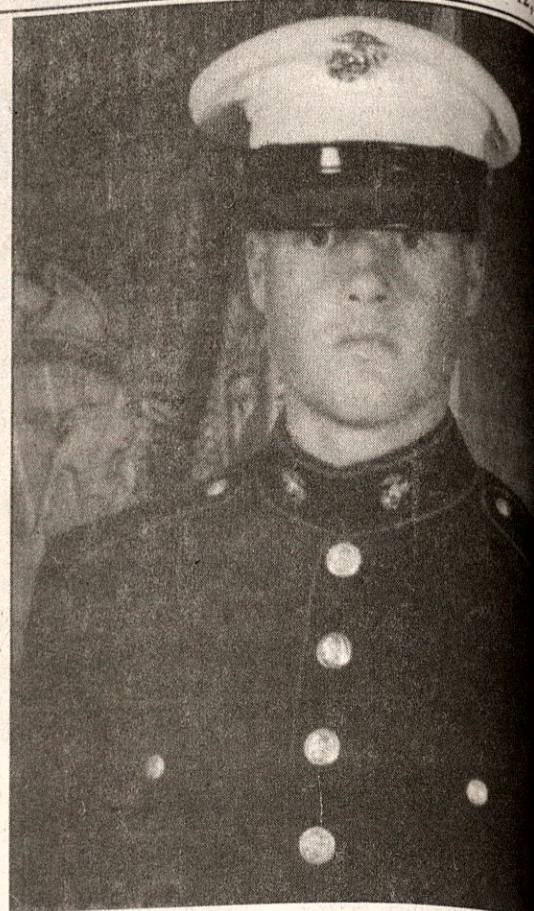

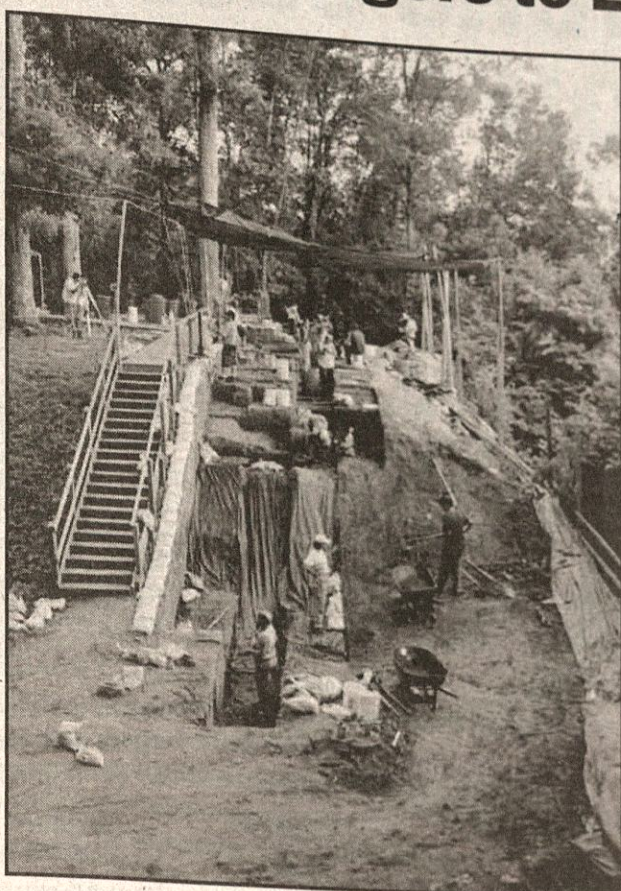

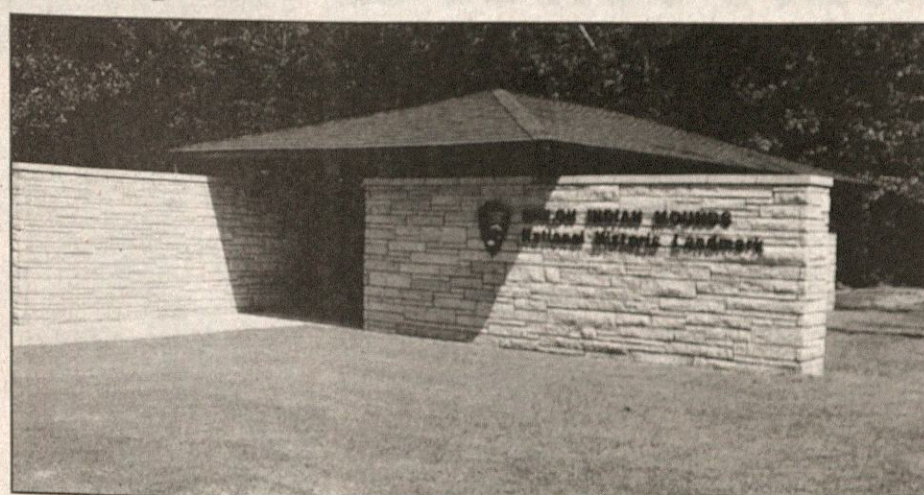
Shiloh Battlefield Rangers to Lead Special Indian Mound Hike

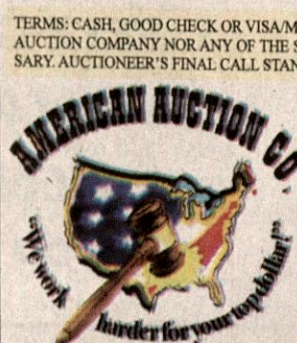

Master Gardeners Welcome New County Agent Zach Yow

Tishomingo County Master Gardeners were among the first in the county to welcome newly appointed County Agent Zach Yow during last week's regular meeting. Rich Vanatta, president of the county master gardeners, led the meeting during which project leaders gave updates on each of the master gardener projects throughout the county. A class is being planned to begin in February for individuals who want to become part of the master gardeners group. Master gardeners are trained and operate under the supervision of the Mississippi State University Extension Service, and a trainee agrees to give 40 hours of volunteer service within a year in exchange for the 40 hours of educational training required. There is a one-time fee for the initial training workshops, and more information is available at (662) 423-7016.

Among the projects Tishomingo County Master Gardeners have under way are: maintaining plants and landscaping at Iuka's downtown Jay Bird Park; a butterfly garden at Iuka Elementary School; maintaining demonstration beds at the Mississippi State Extension Office in Iuka; maintaining plantings at the Iuka Library; maintaining planting beds at the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse; holding an annual plant sale each spring; and more. New projects being planned include: Installing planting beds at the Iuka Mineral Springs Park Youth Center, and conducting planting workshops for middle school Boys & Girls Club members and working with the volunteer group for Tishomingo State Park. Last week was Yow's first week on the job, and he said he is looking forward to working with

master gardeners, 4-H and other countywide projects in his new role. Yow came to the county extension position after Danny Owen's retirement at the end of June. The 25-year-old Iuka native graduated from Tishomingo County High School, attended Northeast Mississippi Community College, and obtained his bachelor's degree in wildlife, fisheries and aquaculture from Mississippi State. Before coming back to his home county as extension agent, Yow worked with the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks as a conservation associate biologist. "I'm very thankful this job came open at the time it did," Yow said. "I've always admired Mr. Danny's involvement with the cattleman's association, the forestry association and 4-H." As he grew up on the cattle farm owned by

his parents, George and Connie Yow, Zach Yow gained a lot of experience working with livestock and agriculture. In his new role Yow will assist local farmers and work with youth in shooting sports, livestock activities and 4-H. Those responsibilities blend well with his interest in continuing to work with cattle, timber and pursuing his activities as an outdoorsman and hunter. "I encourage everybody to be involved if you have an interest or question," Yow said. "I'll assist you in any way I can."
