Step back in time and enjoy the holidays the old-fashioned way with A Dickens Christmas Celebration Friday December 11th, in historic Downtown Iuka.

From 3 to 8 p.m. merchants will be open for Christmas shoppers, and there will be music, food, caroling, and lots of celebrating of Christmas downtown! At 6, the Old Courthouse Museum will host a Christmas singing for everyone.

The honor choir from Iuka Elementary and Brave Voices show choirs will be on hand in the Downtown Battlefield Park to entertain with Christmas songs, and other groups, as well.

Last year it was a wonderful atmosphere and downtown stores were filled up with shoppers during the Dickens event. New this year, at 5:30 p.m., historic Iuka United Methodist Church will open its doors for visitors to enjoy Christmas music from their state of the art Allen organ, played by Jane Rhea. There will be two 30 minute programs, so everyone can enjoy this treasure.

Iuka Grand Marshall was L.O. Bishop

Editor's note: The following story from last week's edition was not printed in its entirety. I apologize for this mistake and hope you will enjoy the story this week.

Iuka's Citizen of the Year for 2015 and Grand Marshall of Iuka's Friday night parade is L.O. Bishop, famous for barbecue and being a storyteller extraordinaire.

"I'm humbled to be elected," said L.O. earlier this week. "Iuka has been a part of my life all my life; my daddy got all his lives here."

Such quips are frequent whenever you talk to L.O. Bishop, and he has a story about absolutely everything.

His mother was an Edmondson, and he spent a lot of time as a child in Iuka in places like Uncle Paul's store (Edmondson Grocery), which was located where Iuka City Hall is now. Now a regular member of the 9:35 Coffee Club Downtown Iuka, he is often on hand in town to sit around, invite people to barbecue gatherings, coondog funerals, occasionally do something to feed the staff at Iuka City Hall, and a few times in the Tishomingo County News, and always to tell a story!

Bishop is well known, and never meets a stranger, but he's best known for his barbecue — Bishop's Barbecue has been in Iuka for now for 30 years, he said. He and his family have taken the business from his home in Allsboro, just over

the border in the Freedom Hills of Alabama. He is married to Grace, and they have three children, six grandchildren and their eighth grandchild is on the way, he said.

He says they really messed up when they got married at ages 17 (her) and 19, because if they would have married at 16 and 18, they'd have had one more good year already.

"When we went to having kids, we went to Dr. Cosby's clinic (in Iuka) and got to spend two nights and \$65 to have a baby delivered," said Bishop. "If we'd have realized what a bargain that was for the work involved, we probably would have raised some more babies for other folks."

A lifetime farmer, Bishop said he started expanding into the hog business in 1962 with a goal of making about \$3 or \$4 profit off each hog, and selling about 1,000.

"That would be making a good living back then, about \$3,000 - \$4,000 a year on hogs," he explained.

He said they got into the barbecue business through a friend, and "played with it" about 10 years before a fire burned their small processing facility and forced them to build a better one, and increase production. Now Bishop's Barbecue is in stores throughout the region, and there's been many a gathering in northwest Alabama and northeast Mississippi where the Bishops have

provided the great foods.

When asked about his involvement with politicians and political rallies held in years past, he was quick to explain, "We'd hold barbecues and invite lots of ordinary people and we allowed politicians to come, too."

"I like to recognize people for how important each one of them is," said Bishop. "A fella who can fix a flat tire is just as important as the one that build the car, if you have a flat tire. Other people are the most important thing in all our lives."

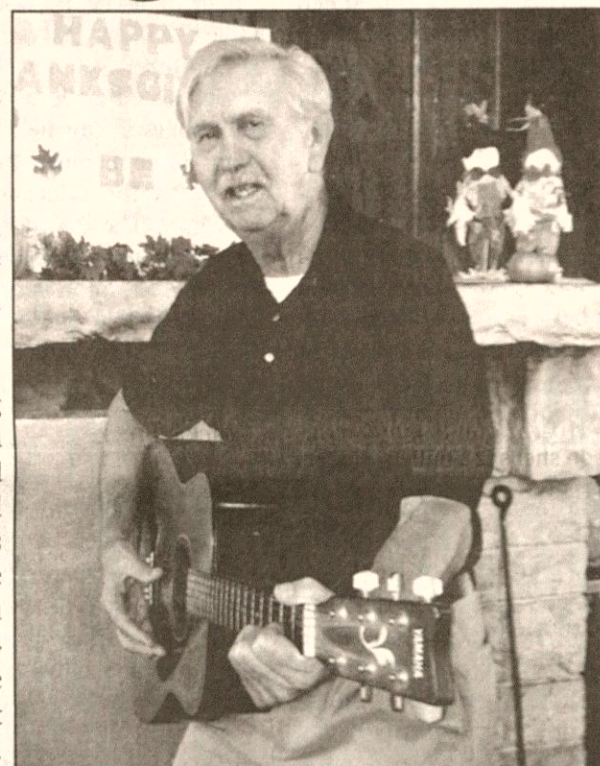

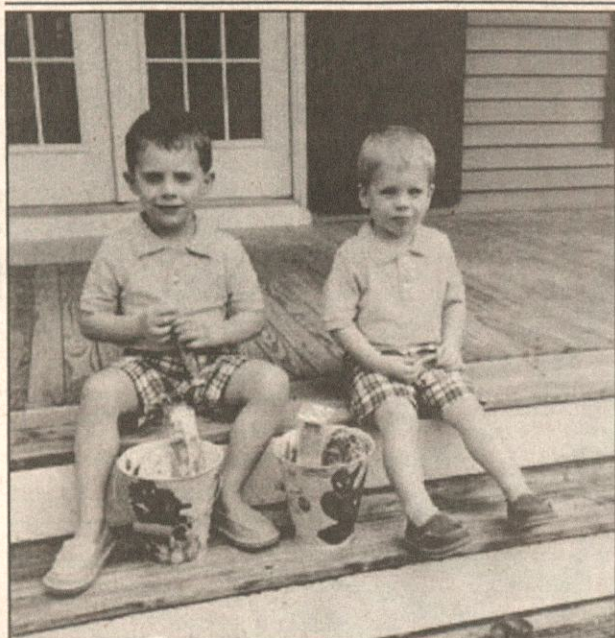

January meeting will be at the library at 2:00, hosted by Ruth Ellen Cox. Action Plan - bathroom tissue for Food Pantry.

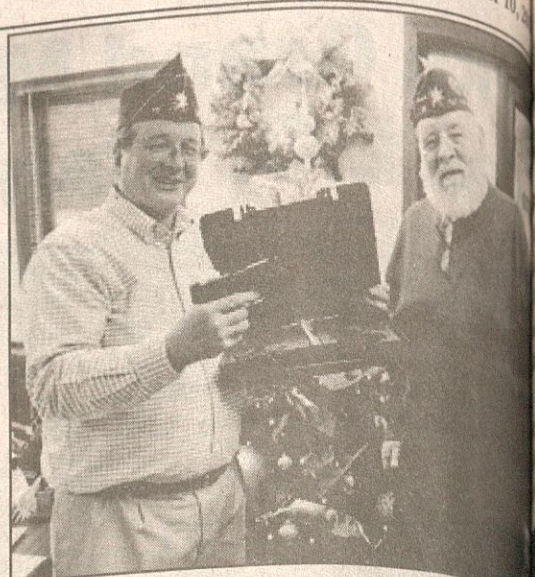

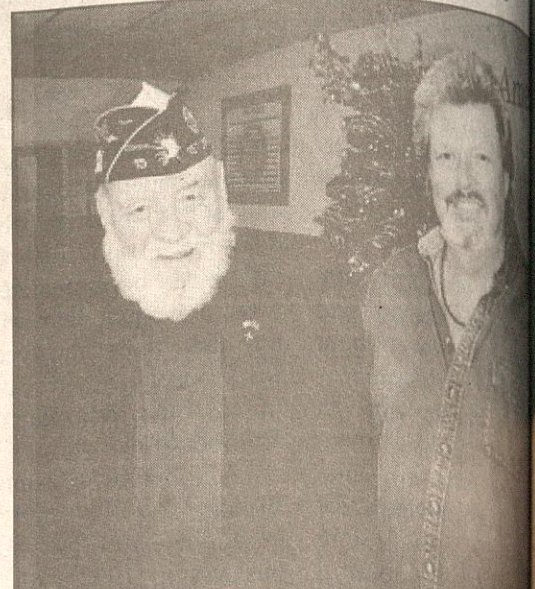

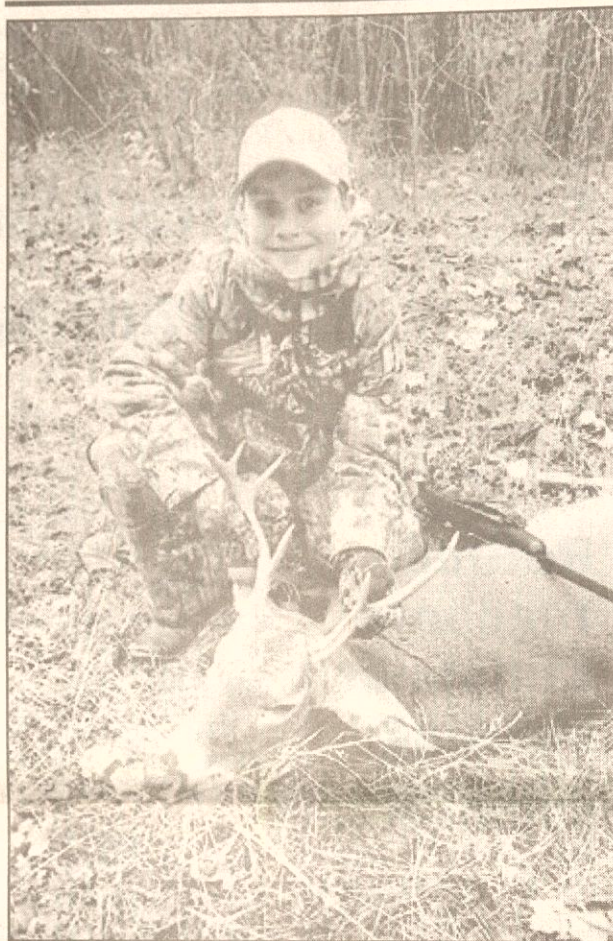

Iuka Middle School "Can" Help!

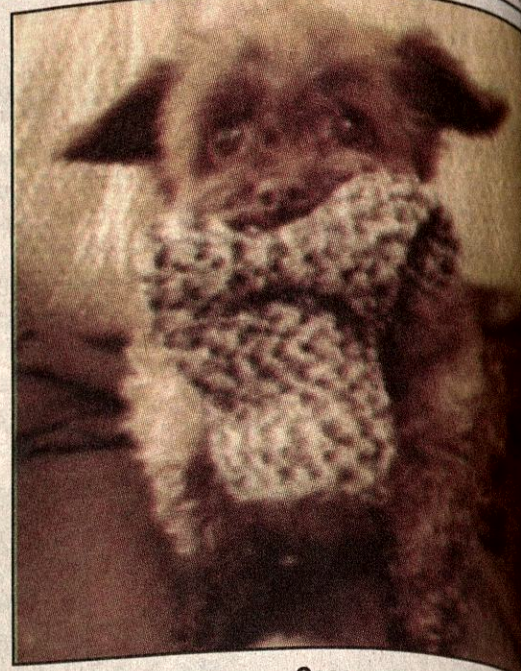

Kindness Remembered: Luttrell Leaves Estate to UVA ROTC

After meeting with the University of Virginia ROTC personnel more than 50 years ago, a Mississippi man has left his entire estate to the program, bequeathing around \$400,000 for scholarships.

Deward Houston Luttrell Jr., a Uka, Mississippi, a U.S. Army military policeman stationed in the early 1950s when he came in contact with the UVA ROTC program.

The Mississippi man left his entire estate, valued at around \$410,000, to the UVA Cavalier Battalion. Luttrell, who served as an Army military policeman, and later a civilian. The Mississippi man left his entire estate, valued at around \$410,000, to UVA's Cavalier Battalion.

Apparently when he was stationed at the Pentagon, the ROTC officers and cadets from the University of Virginia trained him and some of the other ROTC officers. Luttrell's attorney, T.K. Moffett, said they took him down in 1974 and he was very ill. He was apparently cleaning one of his 9 mm pistols and it went off, putting a hole in his truck.

Moffett will present the check to Lt. Col. Mark Ston, commander of the Cavalier Battalion, on Saturday's UVA vs. University football game, which marks Military Appreciation Day. Luttrell, who died of cancer in June at age 72, had no immediate family, was married and had no children, Moffett said. He was preceded by his sister, Linda Gail, who preceded him in death, as did his parents. He never attended college.

Moffett described Luttrell as "eccentric," "pleasant" and very nice to the staff, bringing books and small gifts on the few times he would come to visit. He was shrewd in his dealings and he apparently

remembered the kindnesses that the ROTC cadets and officers showed him.

"This is a good lesson for the cadets to learn," Houston said. "When they are leading soldiers, they can show a little compassion as part of their leadership. It is about building relationships. The cadets he encountered would have been about the same age he was. Through this, cadets can see that the littlest thing can leave a lasting impression."

Luttrell lived in a house he inherited from his parents, Deward Houston Luttrell Sr. and Colene S. Luttrell. He was a 1959 graduate of Tishomingo High School in Tishomingo, Mississippi, where he served as class president his senior year.

"He lived a simple life," Moffett said. "He loved his guns. He had a bullet hole in his pick-up truck from the inside going out. He was apparently cleaning one of his 9 mm pistols and it went off, putting a hole in his truck."

Moffett said Luttrell collected guns, including a Belgian Sweet 16 over/under shotgun that fetched around \$1,000 at auction.

Luttrell was in the Army from 1961 to 1964, with another three years in the Army Reserve, then pursued a career in welding after he left the service. In 1974, he received a technical degree in Industrial Electricity and Welding from the Tishomingo County Area Vocational Technical Complex, and in 1989, he completed an additional vocational course in the same field.

"He was one of the best around and could weld anything," Moffett said. "He did a lot of work with his hands."

Moffett said Luttrell approached him in 2010

about his estate, Moffett believed because of his military connections. Luttrell, who lived alone, suffered from diabetes and entered a nursing home several weeks before he died, Moffett said. As the executor of Luttrell's will, Moffett auctioned off his property and put the money in the estate.

"You never know, when you are nice to people, how it will benefit you or your organization," Moffett said. "Deward marched to his own drummer and he was a little odd, but he remembered the only people he thought were nice to him."

What Is Jesus Saying To The Churches? (part XXVI)

It is interesting that Jesus does not give the same message to everyone to whom He speaks, for He speaks to people according to the need in their lives, whether in judgment or blessing. I have a strange notion that much of today's preaching and teaching will not win the approval of God, because it says only the "nice, positive things" that so many people want to hear. Jesus did not preach or teach

like that; He preached to the needs of people, either in blessing them or in judging them. This old worn out notion that nobody should ever "judge" anyone else is poppycock! Revelation chapters 2 and 3 show both blessings on the churches and judgment on those who deserved judgment. Yes, God is the judge, but we who represent Him are to tell people about both His blessings and His judgments.

Revelation 2:24-25 says, "But unto you I say,

and unto the rest in Thyatira, as many as have not this doctrine, and which have not known the depths of Satan, as they speak; I will put upon you none other burden. But that which ye have already hold fast till I come." It is clear that there were some in the church at Thyatira who were true believers, while the followers of Jezebel were false professors. Jesus told the "rest" to hold fast to the truth they knew. Truth is not an option; it is a requirement for those who would follow Christ! We have sunk into a great abyss in our day concerning doctrine, for there is nothing more important than the teaching of right doctrine in the churches! Some

at Thyatira had learned the "depth of Satan", as they called it, meaning that they supposed that they knew some secrets that the average person did not know. Beware of religious groups, or anyone, who claims that he has some important secret teaching that nobody can know unless they are initiated into the group. Satan is a master of deceit, and he will stop at nothing in his attempt to lead people away from the truth of the Bible. Some groups actually use the Bible in a wrong way in an attempt to persuade people to follow their teachings, moreover, the world has its supply of gullible people who will follow anything that claims to be the truth.

My word of advice to everyone is that each person can learn truth for himself. Even though one may follow a good teacher, he still needs to check out what he is being taught by the Bible itself, in fact, I want all of you to do that with what I teach. Jesus taught the true believers at Thyatira to hold onto what they knew as truth until He should come again. He did not come in their day, but He may come in ours, so I admonish each of you to hold to what you know as truth. 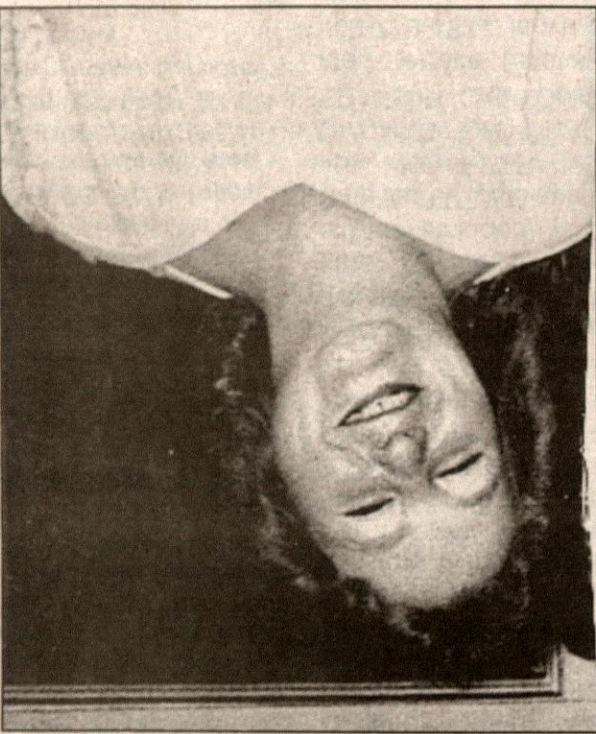

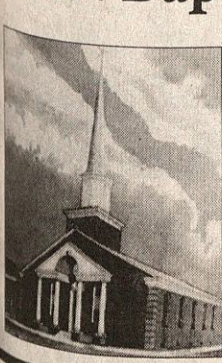
