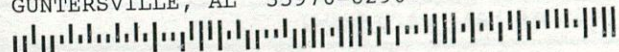

County Board Makes New Term Appointments & Contracts for Services

The newly elected 2016-20 Tishomingo County Board Supervisors met officially for the first time Monday to make routine appointments and accept bids.

The board members were sworn in last Wednesday, and they met for their regular first Monday meeting at 8:30 a.m. Fifth District Supervisor Greg Collier was elected president of the board and First District Supervisor Brandon Grissom was elected vice-president.

Tommy Jean Daugherty, Director of the Department of Human Services, met with the board to discuss the work fair program ABAWD, which stands for Able-Bodied Adults without Dependents. The program is designed as a way for adults ages 18-50 who receive SNAP (food stamps) to earn and remain eligible for the benefits by working for the county in exchange. ABAWD recipients can work for the county helping with courthouse maintenance duties, cleaning other county facilities, or helping pick up county roads.

Fish. Man Arrested After Breaking into Neighbor's Truck with a Brick

A Tishomingo man has been charged with burglary of a vehicle after breaking into his neighbor's truck Monday morning.

According to Tishomingo County Chief Investigator Greg Mitchell, Joseph Tidwell, 43, County Road 112 in Tishomingo, was observed breaking the window of his neighbor's truck with a brick Monday morning.

The owner of the Chevrolet pickup truck heard the commotion and caught Tidwell in the act. His wife called 911 and the homeowner held Tidwell until deputies arrived on the scene.

Tidwell was taken to the Tishomingo County Jail, where he failed to report that he still had marijuana on his person. He was additionally charged with production of contraband into a correctional facility, said Investigator Mitchell.

It is a program the county participated in years ago, reported purchasing clerk Lynn West. It is at no cost to the county and it gets people out working and earning their public benefits, say officials.

The board voted 3-2 to keep Cook Coggins Engineers of Tupelo to do all Tishomingo County's State-Aid Road work, and allow supervisors of each district to choose engineering firms as they like to work on industrial or development projects in their particular district.

Phillip Whitehead was reappointed as attorney for the Board of Supervisors.

Lynn West was reappointed Purchasing Clerk, with Kelly Prather and Peyton Cummings as her assistants.

Chancery Clerk Peyton Cummings was appointed County Inventory Clerk, with Gina Underwood as his assistant. Cummings was also appointed Comptroller.

The board chose First American National Bank as the county depository.

The board determined from bids submitted by suppliers of materials what suppliers would be by county crews for the next year, including:

Booneville Trucking - haul garbage from county dump to regional landfill in Ripley. This contract is renewable every two years.

Hoover Stone - Limestone and rip-rap supplier.

APAC - Hot mix in place, with alternate Bonds.

Fulton Pipe - metal culverts, with alternate GNO.

Fulton Pipe - Plastic culverts, with alternate Milligans.

The board appointed Third District Supervisor Michael Busby to represent the county on the Northeast Mississippi Planning and Development District board.

The board appointed Fourth District Supervisor Jeff Holt to the TAP Alliance and the Northeast Mississippi Community Service Board.

The board meets again for their regular meeting at 8:30 on January 19th, due to the Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday on their regular "third Monday" meeting date.

New Sheriff Assembling New Department, Hiring Staff

There's a new sheriff in town, literally, and he's hard at work organizing the county office with the highest visibility to the average citizen.

Tishomingo County Sheriff John Dennis Daugherty officially took over this week and but he has been working on hiring deputies and staff for a few weeks.

Born and raised in Iuka, Daugherty has been with the Mississippi Department of Transportation for years, and worked with Iuka police department as well as the sheriff's department previously.

Key new personnel include two shift captains, Ryan Glover and Joseph Marlar, who will be available to on-duty deputies around the clock.

Heading up the jail will be Talmadge "Tabo" McAnally. They run about 36-40 county prisoners, including men and women. They do not have the state prisoners, so the state side of the jail is shut down.

New investigators hired are Chief Investigator Greg Mitchell, and investigator Jeff Sparks.

Deputies hired so far include Jamie Reynolds, Shane Wood, Perry Mask, Jeremy Clark, Scott Dalton, Darrell Hopkins, Scott Marlin, Monica Bronson, Lane

White and Adam Kostelensky. All are certified as full time officers but Clark, and he will be in the next year, said Sheriff Daugherty. Some of these will be working part time.

Training and updating certifications for every officer and staff member is a priority for Daugherty, who has worked as a training officer for MDOT.

"In today's law enforcement, it's vital for every officer to be trained how to handle every situation," said the sheriff. "It cuts down on liabilities, and helps us serve the people better."

Daugherty said the depart-

ment is looking at maintenance issues for vehicles, and getting the website updated and integrated with social media accounts to continue that popular service.

New uniforms are in the works, so that deputies and officers will be easily recognizable and professional looking.

He also wants to get the DARE program going again in every school in the county, since he says enforcing drug laws is one of his top priorities. Along those lines, he hinted at a new officer coming into service soon - a four-footed one.

Retired Iuka Business Woman, Dora Williams, Dies

Dora Ruth Williams, 72, of Iuka, Mississippi, died Thursday, December 31, 2015, at the North Mississippi Medical Center in Iuka after a short illness.

A retired business woman of Iuka, Dora was the longtime owner and operator of the Friendly Florist, which is now owned by her daughter, Kim. Dora purchased the business in 1983 when it was located in the Wiley's Tobacco Building, from there she moved to a shop on Eastport Street and later expanded and moved to downtown Iuka next to Iuka Guaranty Bank. Miss Dora retired in 2004, but continued to help her daughter for several years at the present location next to the Snack Bar on Front Street. Dora was known for her frankness and quick wit and made many lasting friendships during her 21 years in business.

Her greatest joy was spending time with her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. She was a member of Mt. Evergreen United Methodist Church, and also belonged to the Iuka Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star.

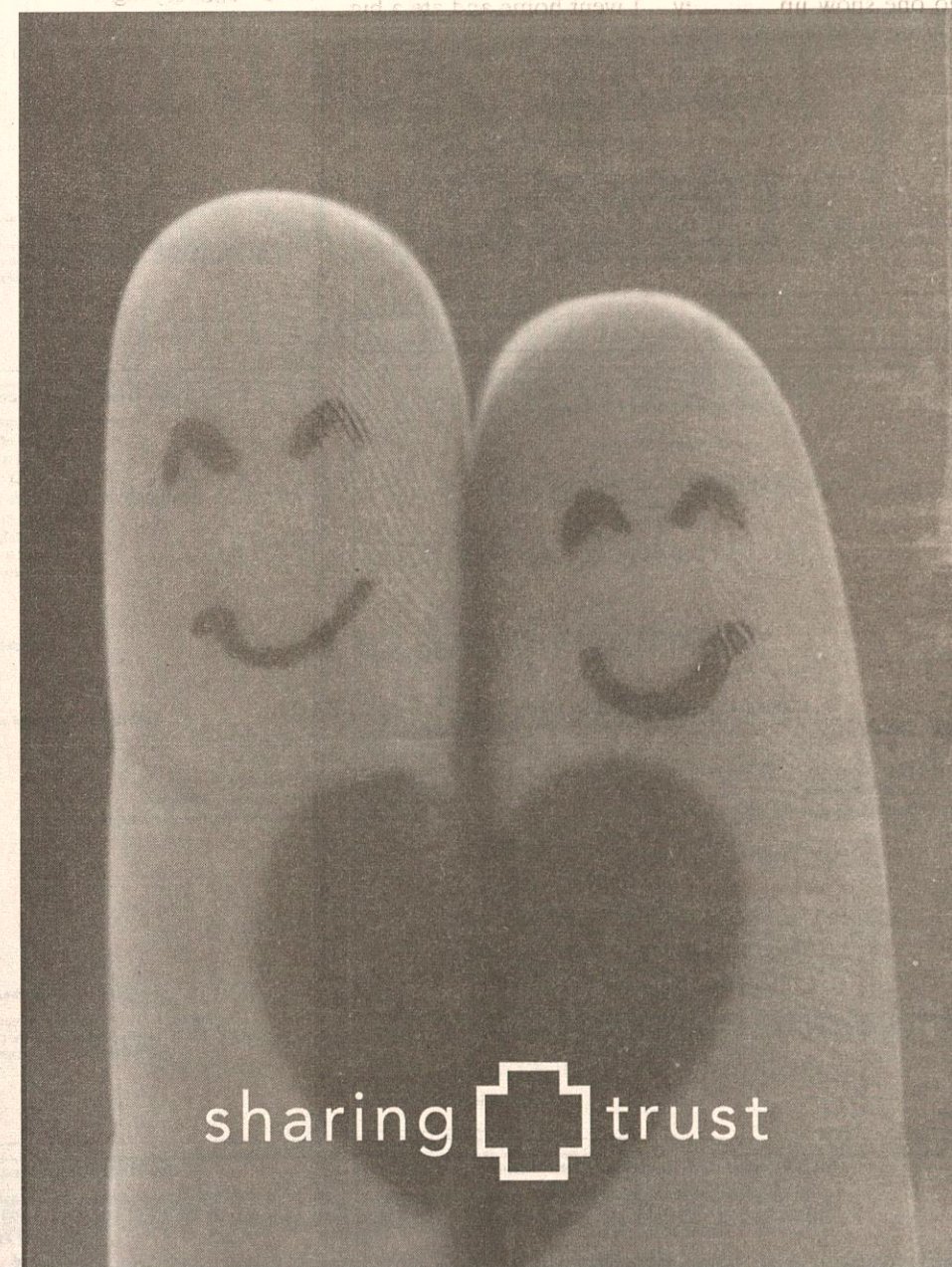
Master Gardener Training Course Begins Next Month

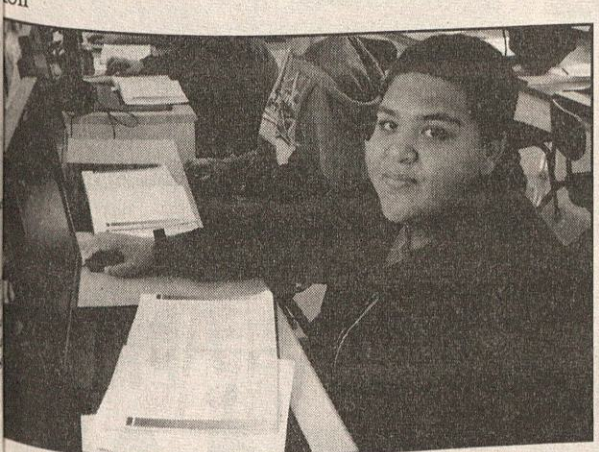

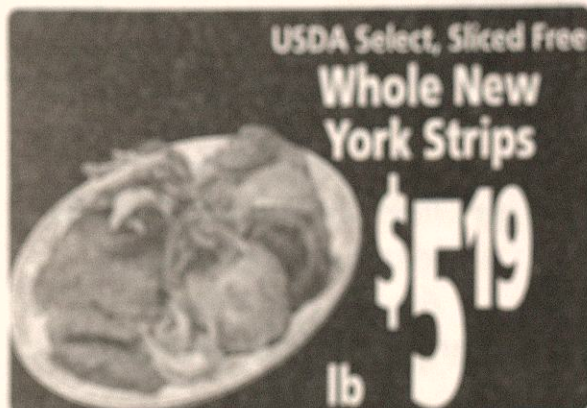

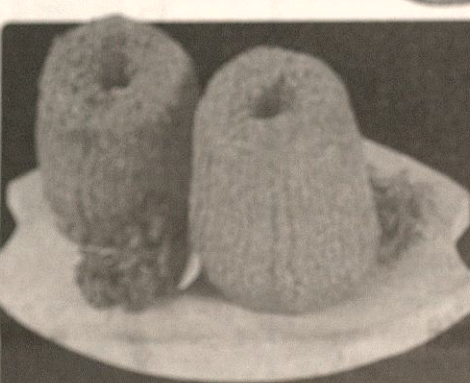

Conservation Corner

Swamp Rabbits

Most Mississippi hunters are familiar with the cottontail rabbit, but less familiar with the swamp rabbit, or cane cutter as I call them. The swamp rabbit, also a member of the cottontail family, is a challenging quarry and possesses a number of unique characteristics.

Perhaps its most distinguishing feature is its large size relative to the cottontail. The swamp rabbit ranges in length from 18 to 22 inches and reaches a weight of over 6 pounds. In addition to its large size, the swamp rabbit can be identified in the field by the black to rusty-brown color of the fur.

Although swamp rabbits

are found generally along streams and rivers, within these areas they are found in greater numbers where brush piles, fallen trees and dense vegetation provide optimum food and cover. Swamp rabbits are always found in close proximity to water, but they may temporarily utilize other areas in response to seasonal food availability.

The habitat value of wetlands to swamp rabbits is directly related to the size of the area. Typically, areas of at least 250 acres are more likely to maintain stable populations than narrow strips along streams or patches of wooded wetlands.

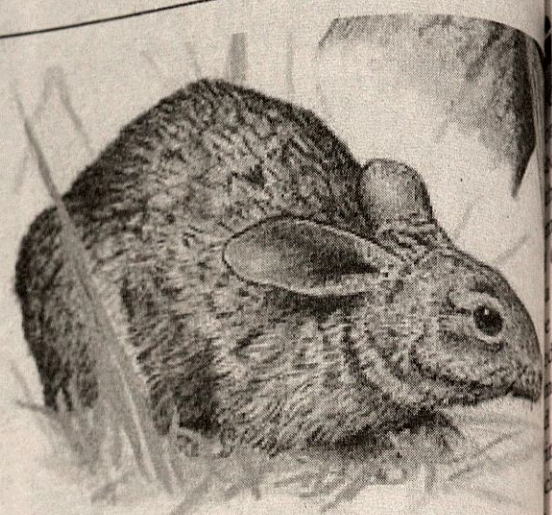
If you have the use of a pack of beagles, they can

be a great help. However, beagles trained on cottontails often have difficulty with swamp rabbits, due to some special behavioral differences between the two. It is very important to hunt slowly, since swamp rabbits will often hide and remain still, allowing danger to pass.

Weather has a profound effect on swamp rabbit movement. When it is cold (below 40 degrees Fahrenheit), they tend to sit longer and are difficult to jump. As long as the temperature doesn't get into the single digits, cold weather is a benefit in that you are able to get close to the rabbits before they jump.

When the temperature is extremely cold, swamp rabbits tend to stay in hollow logs and trees for protection, and you may as well stay home. On warmer days above 60 degrees Fahrenheit, they tend to run before you get very close, often jumping out of gun range.

It seems like over the years, fewer and fewer folks are willing to keep up a pack of good rabbit dogs. Now, I mostly hunt without dogs, walking slowly through the habitat and trying to jump a rabbit for a quick shot. It is best to hunt slowly, stopping periodically. On many occasions after stop-



ping and then starting to walk again, a swamp rabbit will jump, providing me with a shot.

If you want a challenging hunt for a very special quarry, give the swamp rabbit a try.

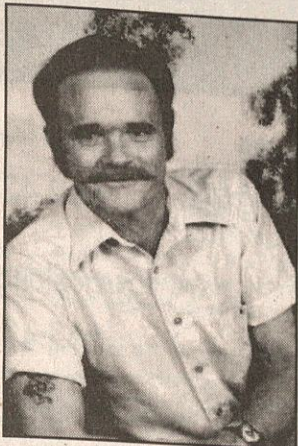

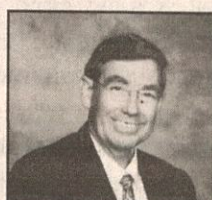

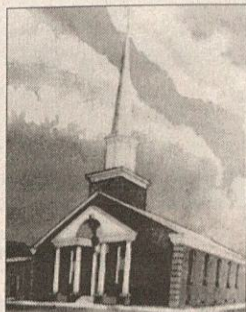
What Is Jesus Saying To The Churches? (part XXX)

Revelation 3:2-3 says, "Be watchful, and strengthen the things which remain, that are ready to die: for I have not found thy works perfect before God. Remember therefore how thou hast received and heard, and hold fast, and repent. If therefore thou shalt not watch, I will come on thee as a thief, and thou shalt not know what hour I will come upon thee." Our word "watchful" simply means: "to keep awake", so there is an admonition from the Lord Jesus to the church at Sardis to keep awake, even though they have a name that they are alive! God's idea of watchfulness is not the same as that of most humans, for our day is replete with people who are "watchful" concerning everything in the media world, but are asleep concerning the things of God, and this is true of many professing Christians! Now we have the Lord telling the church at Sardis to strengthen the things that remain, evidently meaning the small shred of true spirituality that they still retain. So, the "newest thing on the church block" is not necessarily what God has "ordered" for the work of His body, the church. Rather it seems that God is still calling for the old tried and true doctrines and ways of life that have been around for centuries. Yes, it is true that we can use some modern things, such as the computer I am using at this moment, and these are not necessarily wrong, but we have to keep our eyes open, spiritually, for the things that may "sneak through to us" by modern means.

Jesus said that He had not found the works of the church at Sardis perfect in His sight, and that tells us something about how He looks on at all the local churches are doing! It is interesting that Jesus calls on this church to remember certain things, even if the world around says that we should forget the old ways and cling to the latest fad. The church at Sardis was to remember what had been taught by those before them. I always chuckle when I see young people who seem to think that nobody over age 50 has any sense. While it is true that many of us go to our children and grandchildren to learn how to operate a computer, and that is not bad, yet there are some things that are learned only with age. I look back many times now, at age 72, and see bits of wisdom my father had that did not necessarily get my attention at earlier ages. Youth is great; many of us wish we still had the benefits of it, but the teaching of the "fathers of the church" are still to be revered as worthy of our strict scrutiny! This is especially when we are considering the things that God inspired men to write as Scripture in the early days of the church and in the Old Testament. Jesus called on the church at Sardis to repent, because they had slipped away from their moorings; they had gotten away from the teaching of the spiritual leaders of days gone by. I love to pick up books written by those believers who lived centuries ago, because they help us to cut through the chaff of modern day thinking and see things from a different point of view. Jesus warned the church at Sardis about His coming to chasten them, if they did not watch where they were going spiritually. I wonder if this might not be a good admonition for all churches of our day!

By William Gordon McCabe

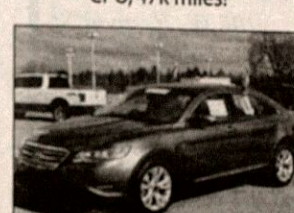

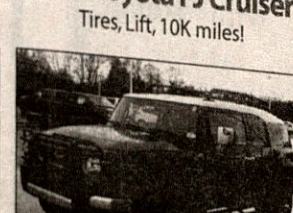

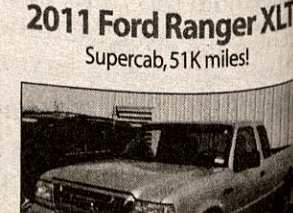
