If you've pled guilty Tishomingo County fircuit Court and haven't net the conditions of your lea agreement, beware. udge Jim Pounds came own heavy on delinquent ases this week and sent everal to jail.

On the schedule this reek for the January Ciruit Court term were 24 show cause" hearings in which defendants have to xplain to the judge why hey are behind on their nd of the plea agreenent. Judge Pounds sent even convicted felons ver to the Tishomingo lounty Jail for as much as month to consider their on-payment of fines after hey appeared before him or the January term of ircuit Court.

"If I'm a victim and see that person walkng around not having pay the price for the rime or restitution, how loes that make me feel?" aid Pounds at the county ourthouse Tuesday.

restitution during a lunch hour reprieve, according to court officials.

In Tishomingo County, there are rarely actual jury trials; most defendants offer a plea bargain, and in turn receive a reduced, and often, suspended sentence, along with orders to complete a set amount of post-release supervision (probation), and to pay court costs, restitution, fines, investigation fees to the narcotics task force or individual police departments, as well as payments to the Mississippi Crime Victim Compensation Fund. There are 122 persons on post-release supervision at this time, plus seven on house arrest.

All the plea bargains are made with the agreement of the defendant to successfully complete the terms of the plea, or they go straight to jail to begin fulfilling their sentence that was suspended. If they miss court payments, the circuit clerk's office issues a "show cause" list to the court, and that is what happened this week.

County Unemployment Rate Tells the Story

Tishomingo County had its lowest unemployment rate in more than 15 years in April of 2015, according to state statistics.

Statistics from the Mississippi Department of Employment Security reveal that Tishomingo County had an unemployment rate of 5.4% in April 2015. This is the lowest unemployment rate in over 15 years and the first time during that time period that the unemployment rate for Tishomingo County has been lower than the state and national unemployment rates. The unemployment rate changes from month to

unemployment rate for April 2015 for Mississippi was 6.9% and 5.9% for the USA. In October, the latest available figures, the county unemployment rate was 5.7%.

Retail and service business employment is increasing and several local manufacturers are hiring, according to the Tishomingo County Development Foundation.

Local manufacturers that are hiring or will be hiring soon include Vanleigh RV, Villa International, Mississippi Silicon, Max Home, Comfort Revolution, Roll Form Group, and others.

According to the Mis-

sissippi Department of Employment Security. non-manufacturing ployment in Tishomingo County for April 2015 was 3,850 while manufacturing employment for the same month was 2,020. The numbers four years ago for April 2011 were 3,580 for non manufacturing jobs and 1,510 for manufacturing jobs.

Tishomingo County has averaged around 150 new manufacturing jobs each year for the past ten years, while losing around 35 manufacturing jobs per

The old types of manufacturing jobs are being replaced by new types of

manufacturing jobs that require more training and advanced skills.





Dairy Farmers' Focus on Cow Care and Milk Quality Result in Better Milk

Carla Taylor is similar in many ways to the members of the Iuka Rotary Club she spoke with on Jan. 13 - working hard and taking pride in providing a quality product to customers. But unlike the typical local business, Taylor's most important asset is cows and her product is milk. Taylor and her family are dairy farmers.

Taylor's family owns Taylor Jersey Farm outside of Booneville. They milk 110 registered Jersey cows twice a day, every day. On the 325 acre farm, a variety of forages are raised for grazing. To dairy farmers, the ultimate reward is knowing their actions help create a healthy, abundant and affordable food supply for this community.

"We love what we do," Taylor said. "Dairy farmers across Mississippi differ in how many cows we milk and some of the ways we farm so that our methods work well for the environment, but we all share a passion for what we do. It is our responsibility to take care of the natural resources and animals on our farm and we take that responsibility with a great deal of pride and commitment."

The family lives and works on the farm and that is a strong incentive for protecting the land, water and air. In addition, cow comfort and health is carefully monitored every single day. Taylor works with a dairy animal nutritionist to formulate the best diets for the cows and

veterinarians come to the farm regularly to check on the animal's health. Every day, advancements in animal care and milk quality methods result in better milk. "What we do on our farm is the starting point for safe and nutritious dairy foods in the supermarket," Taylor said. "Because of this commitment at the dairy farm, people can count on wholesome dairy foods."



To add to this important celebration, MDOT is seeking two important pieces of information. First, MDOT is looking

The Mississippi State Highway Commission was formed by the Missis-

sippi Legislature in 1916 with the purpose to act in a supervisory capacity in the administration of federal funds allotted to the state and to work with the Federal Bureau of Public Roads in the planning of a system of highways.

In 1930, the Mississippi Legislature enacted the "Stansel Act" creating the first effective Highway Department and highway system in the state. This act created a three-member elected Highway Commission with full and general supervisory responsibility over all highway matters and the authority to appoint an executive director with responsibility over the day to day operation

of the agency. In July 1992, the State Commission Highway and Highway Department were reorganized into the Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) which is governed by the Mississippi Transportation Commis-

"We would like to thank the citizens for helping MDOT celebrate 100 years of service to the state of Mississippi," said McGrath.



What Is Jesus Saying To The Churches? (part XXXII)

are There churches mentioned in Revelation chapters 2 and 3, but this does not mean that Jesus' message was only for those churches, for there is a message here for all churches of all ages! Revelation 3:7 says, "And to the angel of the church in Philadelphia write; These things saith He that is holy, He that is true, He that hath the key of David, He that openeth, and no man shutteth; and shutteth, and no man The things openeth;" that are said about Christ in these chapters to the seven churches are very interesting, for they give much information about the character of the Son of God. Jesus seems to be addressing the pastor's (angel means: "messenger") of the churches in these two chapters of Revelation. Here He speaks of Himself as being holy, and this is not a matter of His boasting, for it is simply a true statement. It is interesting that Revelation "And they 15:3-4 says, sing the song of Moses the servant of God, and the song of the Lamb, say-



manifest." If we couple these verses with Revelation 3:7, which has Jesus saying that He is holy, we learn that only God is holy (Revelation 15:4b), thus Jesus must be God the Son! There is no way one can honestly interpret the Bible, both Old and New Testaments, without seeing that there is a godhead that consists of three persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. If only the "Lord God Almighty" is holy, as Revelation 15:4b clearly says, then Jesus has to be God to be holy, which Jesus says of Himself in Revelation 3:7. Men are holy only in the sense that they have the holiness of God attributed to them at the point of salvation. So, we should not speak of men as being "his holiness" etc., since none of us can claim holiness apart from God's holiness in us! My aim is not to of-
