Judge Pounds Lowers the Hammer on Delinquent Felons

If you've pled guilty in Tishomingo County Circuit Court and haven't met the conditions of your plea agreement, beware. Judge Jim Pounds came down heavy on delinquent cases this week and sent several to jail.

On the schedule this week for the January Circuit Court term were 24 "show cause" hearings in which defendants have to explain to the judge why they are behind on their end of the plea agreement. Judge Pounds sent even convicted felons over to the Tishomingo County Jail for as much as a month to consider their non-payment of fines after they appeared before him for the January term of Circuit Court.

"If I'm a victim and see that person walking around not having to pay the price for the crime or restitution, how does that make me feel?" said Pounds at the county courthouse Tuesday.

About 14 others managed to find the funds to get up to date and pay their fines, court costs, or

restitution during a lunch hour reprieve, according to court officials.

In Tishomingo County, there are rarely actual jury trials; most defendants offer a plea bargain, and in turn receive a reduced, and often, suspended sentence, along with orders to complete a set amount of post-release supervision (probation), and to pay court costs, restitution, fines, investigation fees to the narcotics task force or individual police departments, as well as payments to the Mississippi Crime Victim Compensation Fund. There are 122 persons on post-release supervision at this time, plus seven on house arrest.

All the plea bargains are made with the agreement of the defendant to successfully complete the terms of the plea, or they go straight to jail to begin fulfilling their sentence that was suspended. If they miss court payments, the circuit clerk's office issues a "show cause" list to the court, and that is what happened this week.

Talent Shows at TCHS

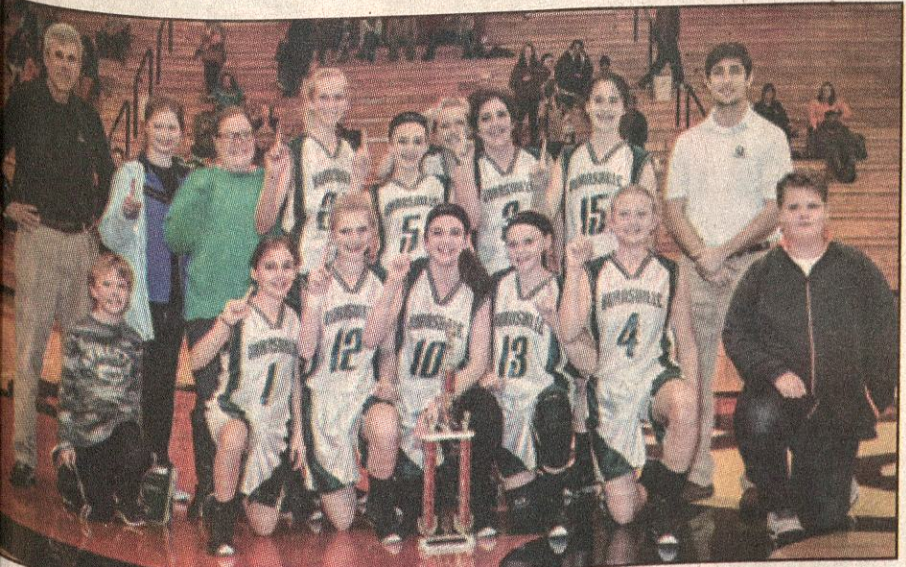

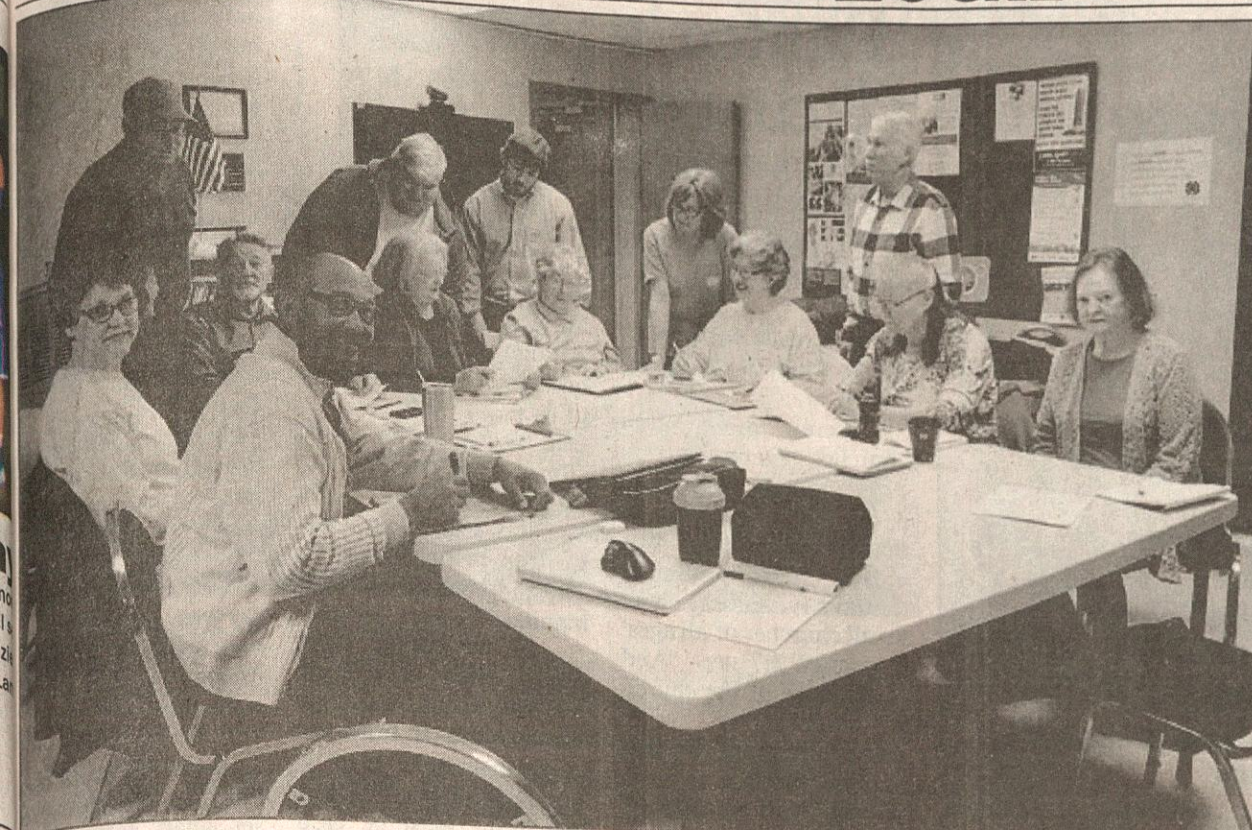

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Dairy Farmers' Focus on Cow Care and Milk Quality Result in Better Milk

Carla Taylor is similar in many ways to the members of the Iuka Rotary Club she spoke with on Jan. 13 - working hard and taking pride in providing a quality product to customers. But unlike the typical local business, Taylor's most important asset is cows and her product is milk. Taylor and her family are dairy farmers.

Taylor's family owns Taylor Jersey Farm outside of Booneville. They milk 110 registered Jersey cows twice a day, every day. On the 325 acre farm, a variety of forages are raised for grazing. To dairy farmers, the ultimate reward is knowing their actions help create a healthy, abundant and affordable food supply for this community.

"We love what we do," Taylor said. "Dairy farmers across Mississippi differ in how many cows we milk and some of the ways we farm so that our methods work well for the environment, but we all share a passion for what we do. It is our responsibility to take care of the natural resources and animals on our farm and we take that responsibility with a great deal of pride and commitment."

The family lives and works on the farm and that is a strong incentive for protecting the land, water and air. In addition, cow comfort and health is carefully monitored every single day. Taylor works with a dairy animal nutritionist to formulate the best diets for the cows and

veterinarians come to the farm regularly to check on the animal's health. Every day, advancements in animal care and milk quality methods result in better milk. "What we do on our farm is the starting point for safe and nutritious dairy foods in the supermarket," Taylor said. "Because of this commitment at the dairy farm, people can count on wholesome dairy foods."

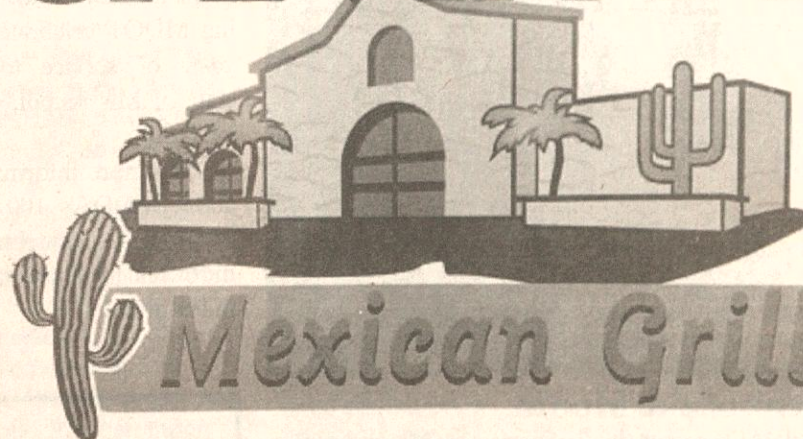
The Homemakers will adjust the meeting time

"This year marks MDOT's 100th anniversary," said MDOT Executive Director Melinda McGrath. "Our transportation system has greatly evolved over this time, and we want to show Mississippians how far it's come and where the future is taking us."

To add to this important celebration, MDOT is seeking two important pieces of information. First, MDOT is looking

for the oldest living former employee. These former employees will be invited to celebration events being held later this year. Second, MDOT is seeking photographs and/or videos that show the history of transportation in Mississippi. These photos and videos will be included in the timeline showing the evolution of transportation in Mississippi.

The Mississippi State Highway Commission was formed by the Missis-

siippi Legislature in 1916 with the purpose to act in a supervisory capacity in the administration of federal funds allotted to the state and to work with the Federal Bureau of Public Roads in the planning of a system of highways.

In 1930, the Mississippi Legislature enacted the "Stansel Act" creating the first effective Highway Department and highway system in the state. This act created a three-member elected Highway Commission with full and general supervisory responsibility over all highway matters and the authority to appoint an executive director with responsibility over the day to day operation of the agency.

In July 1992, the State Highway Commission and Highway Department were reorganized into the Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) which is governed by the Mississippi Transportation Commission.

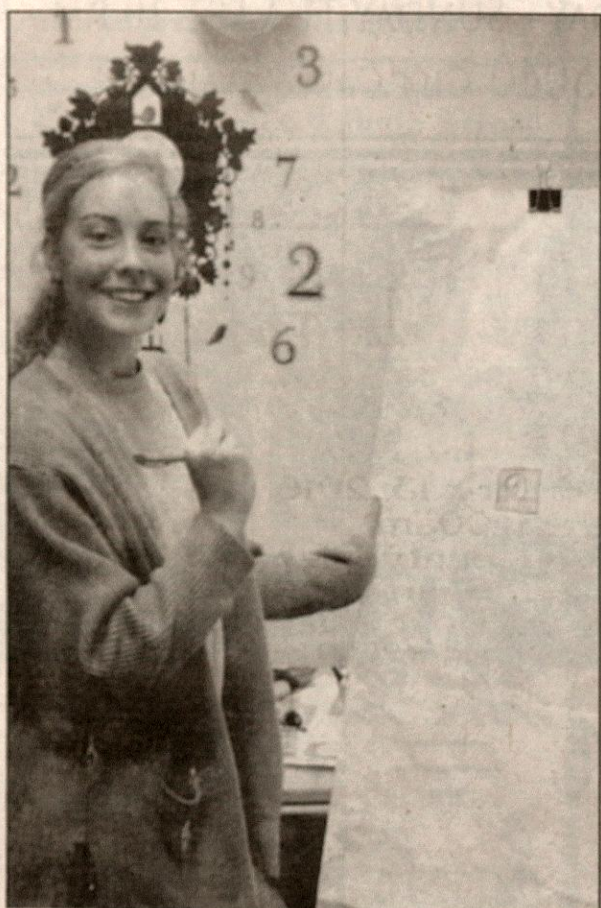
"We would like to thank the citizens for helping MDOT celebrate 100 years of service to the state of Mississippi," said McGrath.

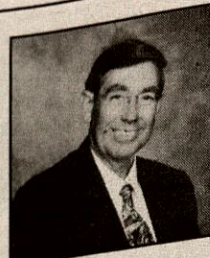

What Is Jesus Saying To The Churches? (part XXXII)

There are seven churches mentioned in Revelation chapters 2 and 3, but this does not mean that Jesus' message was only for those churches, for there is a message here for all churches of all ages! Revelation 3:7 says, "And to the angel of the church in Philadelphia write; These things saith He that is holy, He that is true, He that hath the key of David, He that openeth, and no man shutteth; and shutteth, and no man openeth;" The things that are said about Christ in these chapters to the seven churches are very interesting, for they give much information about the character of the Son of God. Jesus seems to be addressing the pastor's (angel means: "messenger") of the churches in these two chapters of Revelation. Here He speaks of Himself as being holy, and this is not a matter of His boasting, for it is simply a true statement. It is interesting that Revelation 15:3-4 says, "And they sing the song of Moses the servant of God, and the song of the Lamb, say-

ing, Great and marvelous are Thy works, Lord God Almighty; just and true are Thy ways, Thou King of saints. Who shall not fear Thee, O Lord, and glorify Thy name? For Thou only art holy: for all nations shall come and worship before Thee; for Thy judgments are made manifest."

If we couple these verses with Revelation 3:7, which has Jesus saying that He is holy, we learn that only God is holy (Revelation 15:4b), thus Jesus must be God the Son! There is no way one can honestly interpret the Bible, both Old and New Testaments, without seeing that there is a godhead that consists of three persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. If only the "Lord God Almighty" is holy, as Revelation 15:4b clearly says, then Jesus has to be God to be holy, which Jesus says of Himself in Revelation 3:7. Men are holy only in the sense that they have the holiness of God attributed to them at the point of salvation. So, we should not speak of men as being "his holiness" etc., since none of us can claim holiness apart from God's holiness in us! My aim is not to of-

fend those who have in the area I mention but to call their attention to what the Bible teaches. It is very interesting to me that when taken as a whole makes some things clear that no one really has any room for argument against what it says. We need someone with credentials to tell us what it means, for the Spirit of God within us will give us light on Scripture though we may need to receive help from teachers. The Spirit of God is the final teacher of all believers, for He says "yes", or "no" to men teach us! So, we established that Jesus is holy, thus He is God, only God is holy!

Since He is meaning something set apart from all when applied to Him, He is also true. I follow One Who is for there is more to the world than most people can even imagine. The matter of knowing is not as hard as people make it seem. It does necessitate being willing to follow One Who Himself came when people refused to listen to the conclusion of listening to clearly revealed Word of God in the Bible!
