Belmont Man Faces Meth Charges

A Belmont man is in custody facing drug charges after late Sunday night traffic stop near Mt. Zion Church in the north part of the county.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff John Dennis Daugherty, while on patrol about 10:30 Sunday night, Deputy Jeremy Clark noticed a vehicle in the parking lot at Mt. Zion Church in Dennis. Recognizing this was an irregular time to be parked in a church parking lot, and in consideration of recent vandalism and thefts at some lo-

cal churches, Clark circled back to investigate. When he did, the driver took off and drove to a house of some acquaintances before pulling over for Clark to conduct a traffic stop. People came out of the house, and Clark called for backup while trying to keep the bystanders away so he could conduct the traffic stop.

Captain Joseph Marlar, the canine unit, and Belmont Police Officer Donald Thomas arrived to assist. When the suspect driver exited the vehicle, the officers could smell drug use; the

canine officer also alerted to the presence of drugs. A quantity of methamphetamine (approximately \$2,500 street value) and marijuana was found in the suspect's possession, and Austin Wilson Moore, 23, was taken into custody. He faces charges of possession of controlled substance (meth) with intent to distribute, resisting arrest, disorderly conduct, and possession of a controlled substance (marijuana).

The Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics is assisting in the continuing investigation of this case.

Raid Near Iuka Park Lands Three in Jail

Two men face charges after Saturday night raid near Mineral Springs Park in Iuka.

Iuka Police and Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies executed a search warrant at 509 S. Fulton Street in Iuka and arrested two men and confiscated methamphetamine and associated paraphernalia, reported Iuka Police Chief Randy Hinger. Their charges were enhanced because the house is less than 1,000 feet from both Iuka Middle School and the Mineral Springs Park Youth Center.

Charged with possession of methamphetamine with intent to distribute were Cecil Killough, 57, and William R. "Bud" Durham, 32. Killough was also charged with possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, possession of a stolen firearm, and possession of a firearm

while in possession of meth with intent to distribute, and possession of a controlled substance.

Durham was additionally charged with possession of a firearm while in possession of meth with intent to distribute.

Another person, Kelly McVey was taken into custody during the event, since another agency had a warrant issued - he owed more than \$17,000 in delinquent child support payments.

Sheriff's Department Hires New Canine Unit

The sheriff's department has a new officer and he goes by the name Robbie.

Robbie, the four-year-old Dutch Shepherd, is new to the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, but he's not new to law enforcement and he's already proven himself. Robbie and his handler have made a difference in at least four drug busts since he's been on the job, says Sheriff John Dennis Daugherty.

Robbie and his handler, Officer Scott Walton, are both recent additions to the Tishomingo County department, but Scott has worked with the department before,

Supervisors Faced with Lots of Maintenance Issues in February Meeting

There's a lot of stuff needs fixing around Tishomingo County, and the board of supervisors heard about it in their regular first Monday meeting.

Jail Maintenance Issues

Jailer Talmadge "Tabo" McAnally and Sheriff John Dennis Daugherty met with the board about several maintenance issues at the Tishomingo County Jail. McAnally reported that seals on pressure-reducing valves for water supply to each of the five pods have repeatedly blown out, and they are working to fix the problem. At a cost of more than \$350 each time to replace, the 14-15 times they have been replaced in the past year is seen as one area the jail can save money, and they have been working to cut costs everywhere they can. They also reported that they are working to get several leaks fixed where the fiberglass pods join the rest of the jail building.

"The supervisors have been more than willing to help us get the problems fixed," said McAnally.

The jail is housing ten Itawamba County inmates and is getting paid \$15 a day to do so, reported McAnally.

The 75 bed state inmate side of the jail remains closed down, since the state recalled all the prisoners it was paying the county to keep.

The \$5 million jail facility was opened for service in March of 2012.

New Congressional Office

Probation Officer Melinda Whited met with the board to inform them she was leaving the Mississippi Department of Corrections for a new position operating a branch office for U.S. Congressman Trent Kelly right here in Tishomingo County. It will be the first time in recent memory there has been a congressional district office in Tishomingo County. The office will be downstairs in the Tishomingo County Courthouse, and that was approved Monday by the board of supervisors.

"This is a great opportunity for Tishomingo County to host a district office for a Congressman," said attorney Philip Whitehead. "Where we have had to go through about three or four people to contact our

representative before, we can go straight to Melinda right here in the courthouse. With all of the TVA and other non-taxable land in Tishomingo County, and our dependence on that TVA in lieu money, this should be beneficial."

Officer Eric Harris will take over officer Whited's case load, and the house arrest program will be administered by a neighboring county's officer.

Need Speed Limit Signs

Mike Robinson of the North Crossroads Community petitioned the board to post 25 mph speed limit signs on County Road 306, which is often used as a cut through "short cut" by drivers going between Highway 306 and Highway 25. The board said they would post the road, but feared that without enforcement, Robinson and his neighbors might not see much improvement. Sheriff Daugherty said he would try to put some of his officers in the area when he could, but state law prevents local deputies from writing tickets for speeding - that is up to the highway patrol.

Bid Accepted to Fix Building 1000

The board took bids on fixing the exterior of Building 1000 in Tri-State Commerce Park. A bid of \$172,239 by Airlock of Jackson, Mississippi was accepted. The company will repair wall panels, gutters and create a waterproof vapor barrier on the facility that was built in 1991 to house NASA, Lockheed and Aerojet personnel during the ASRM project. It now houses offices for about 30-40 ATK personnel, and in the next couple months will become Northeast Mississippi Community College's Tishomingo County Campus.

According to First District Supervisor Brandon Grissom, work will begin as soon as possible.

Security Fence at Third District Shop

Third District Supervisor Michael Busby got approval from the rest of the board to cut some trees surrounding the Third District Shop near the fairgrounds and use the proceeds from the lumber to build a security fence around the shop.

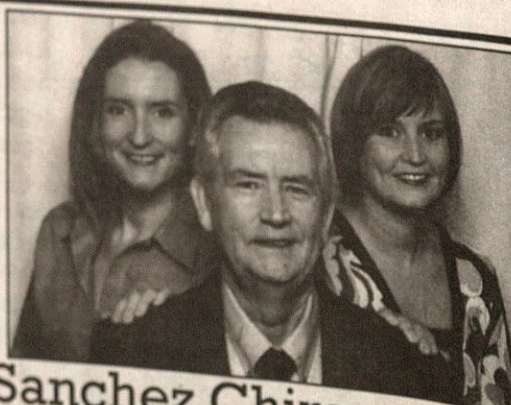

Local Tourist Site Well Represented in State Legislative Session

The Old Courthouse Museum Executive Director, Cindy Nelson, and District 1 State Representative, Lester "Bubba" Carpenter presented Tishomingo County on January 27-28 during the 2016 Legislative Session in Jackson.

Mrs. Nelson met with Mississippi Tourism Association and Mississippi Museums Association partners to network with Legislators and emphasize the economic impact of tourism sites within the state and to work on securing additional appropriations for the tourism budget.

Tishomingo County's Courthouse Museum is a major attraction for tourism with over 3,700 visitors last year from 33 states and 4 countries. In addition, with 50,000 acres of lakes, seven marinas, eight resort and retirement communities, two state parks, several Corps of Engineers parks, the Hitchcock Trace Parkway, and other cultural and heritage interests, Tishomingo County is widely known as the "Outdoor Recreation Capital of the Midwest," according to Tishomingo County Development Foundation (CDF) Executive Director, Gary Matthews.

Lt. Governor Tate Reeves stressed the importance of tourism sites in our state and why we need to tell our story. Given the current economic situation, it is more important than ever to work together to secure funding for tourism in our area. Mrs. Nelson said "Follow up by Lt. Governor Reeves and Representative Bubba Carpenter to secure additional funding will be greatly appreciated by those of us who have vested interest in, and a passion to, develop tourism sites in our county."

The Old Courthouse Museum archives thousands of genealogical records used for research by residents of the county and state and visitors nationwide. In addition, it is a classical museum with

displays of artifacts with three primary themes: 1) Native American (Chickasaw) Indians; 2) Civil War; and 3) County-wide Cultural Heritage. Strategically situated only a few miles from the Alabama and Tennessee borders and on the Hwy 72 corridor between Huntsville and Memphis, it is a tourist gateway and welcome center into Northeast Mississippi.

Representative Lester Carpenter added, "I appreciate Mrs. Nelson's willingness to represent Tishomingo County Tourism Council and the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse on the County's behalf at the Capital. Having folks from home come to Jackson to represent a certain cause means a lot to a Legislator."

Our Family's Autism Story

My son John and I recently attended a packed book signing at Millsaps recital hall. In *A Different Key: The Story of Autism* is written by two accomplished journalists, John Donvan and Caren Zucker. At 650 pages, it is by far the most comprehensive popular book on autism.

As it turned out, sitting next to us was Donald Triplett, age 82, from Forest, Miss. He is the first person in the world to be diagnosed with autism.

As a young child, Triplett's parents agonized about what to do. They were confused. There were no answers to their child's condition. At one point, they sent him to an institution before rejecting this solution. They never gave up, and their effort became the start of a world movement to understand autism.

Over time Donald learned to drive, was graduated from Millsaps, has traveled to dozens of countries and loves golf. He is well known and popular in Forest.

Afterward, John and I were able to talk to Donald Triplett. At the end of the conversation, my son John shook his hand, looked him in the eye and said, "It's an honor to meet you, sir. Your life has been an inspiration to me."

It was a perfect moment, coming together in a way that seemed providential. You see, the Emmerlich family knows the word autism in a very personal way.

I asked John several times if it was OK to tell our story. "Sure, go ahead," he said. "Just be sure to get the diagnosis right."

Indeed, understanding the nature of autism is what this outstanding book is all about. Autism, after centuries of being swept under the rug and misunderstood, is finally coming out into the open. As the diagnosis has expanded, now as many as one in 50 children are considered to be on the autistic spectrum.

The key is the word spectrum. Autism is a different way the brain works. Its pattern is clearly diagnosable, yet it manifests itself in as many ways as there are people. In its worst forms, it is a horror, leading to low intelligence, inability to speak and violent seizures. In its best form, it is a gift, leading to some of the greatest advances of mankind.

For centuries, severely autistic children were locked away and forgotten. Parents were told to think of their other children and move on with their lives. Mildly autistic children were labeled nerds, eccentrics or geniuses. Einstein exhibited classic autistic symptoms, not speaking until age four.

Autism comes from the Greek word "autos," meaning self. Autistic children seem to lack the normal ability to interact naturally with others. Instead, they are in a world of their own. Some never come back.

For decades, this was blamed on the mothers, termed "refrigerator moms." The prevailing psychiatric wisdom was that cold-hearted mothers caused the syndrome. Tragically, mothers were required to undergo therapy as well as the children. Later research proved this to be nonsense.

The book does an excellent job of charting the world's progress in understanding autism, using poignant examples of children and parents refusing to surrender to the prevailing attitudes of ignorance.

In the end, the greatest advances have come in the last 20 years, dovetailing the rise of the Internet, which allowed parents from all over the world to share stories and resources. Humanity is better for this.

Like many people, I had almost no understanding of autism when John was born.

As so often is the case, he progressed normally until about 18 months, at which point he seemed to forget the 20 or so normal words he had learned and quit speaking entirely.

For the next two years, he would point and grunt. He seemed transfixed by shapes and lights and sounds. He was unaware of others around him and would stare out into space.

My wife Ginny was devastated. Being ever the optimist, I kept telling her that some kids develop differently and not to worry.

I remember speaking of John optimistically to a dear friend. As I spoke, tears began streaming down her face. She thought I was in total denial.

Then one day, we were driving down the road and John spoke for the first time in years. "Turn right on Meadowbrook Road," he said perfectly.

Ginny and I looked at each other in shock. Then John proceeded to read all the street signs as we passed. He could not only speak, he had somehow taught himself to read. That was the beginning of the most strange and remarkable behavior.

He would spin for 30

minutes at a time. He talked like a little professor. He could hardly bear direct sunlight. He ran screaming at the sound of flushing toilets. He would hide under tables rather than leave the house. No amount of discipline could alter his behavior. He had no interest in other children. His ability to memorize was unbelievable. He would become mesmerized by inanimate objects. His hearing was off the charts.

And there were the excruciating meltdowns. Only parents of autistic children can ever truly understand.

As he grew older, he would be obsessed with various subjects. At age seven, he started learning everything he could about physics. After riding on a big roller coaster, I came home to find 100 pages of physics equations on a notepad. He had looked up the roller coaster on Wikipedia and calculated the momentum, force, speed and every other physical aspect of his ride by applying physics equations.

He taught himself ancient Gaelic and would speak it to us. At age 10, he read and memorized a medical textbook on biochemistry. His visual IQ tested genius level. His sense of direction was uncanny. I could write a book on his bizarre and unbelievable abilities and behavior.

All the while, I was constantly having to correct him in public, "John, please stop the inappropriate vocalizations," as a variety of weird sounds would come from his mouth, seemingly oblivious to those around him.

Once a member of my church took me aside. "You know," he said. "Most fathers would have written off a child like John." I was both hurt and challenged by his comment.

Thank God for New Summit School. When we were politely but firmly asked to withdraw John from his private school at age seven, New Summit joyfully embraced his uniqueness and gave him a great education.

During puberty, John

decided he didn't want to grow up and would be around with his legs trying to pretend smaller. Then he decided he wanted to join the Scouts. I could see it in the scoutmaster's eyes the first day we showed up. In the end, Scoutmaster Neil Payne and the Troop 302 became a shell. They befriended and became some of the biggest fans.

When John finished his social interaction, he was hopelessly bored. So everywhere I went, I dragged John along—parties, new conferences, the PTA, Club, work, any place he could interact with people. Slowly but surely, his perceptual abilities were to compensate for his of intuitive social skills turned a vicious downward cycle into a positive upward cycle.

I am running out of space. Suffice to say, I learned to swing, ride a bike, drive and even do a big part of this miracle. The many people in the community who, like Ginny and me, embraced and encouraged John, just like the community of Forest for Donald Triplett. Equally as important is John's given spirit, which I believe is distinct from the structural attributes of the brain. It is a spirit of determination, curiosity, kindness and love.

Autistic brains are wired differently. At worst, autism is a terrible condition. But in its best forms, it is a gift. I would change one thing about John nor would he. It is an attitude and understanding of autism that they promote. As a society, we need to celebrate our diversity, not condemn it.

Just this week, John received a four-year academic scholarship to Millsaps College. The boy that wouldn't shut up, to me, is nothing short of a miracle.

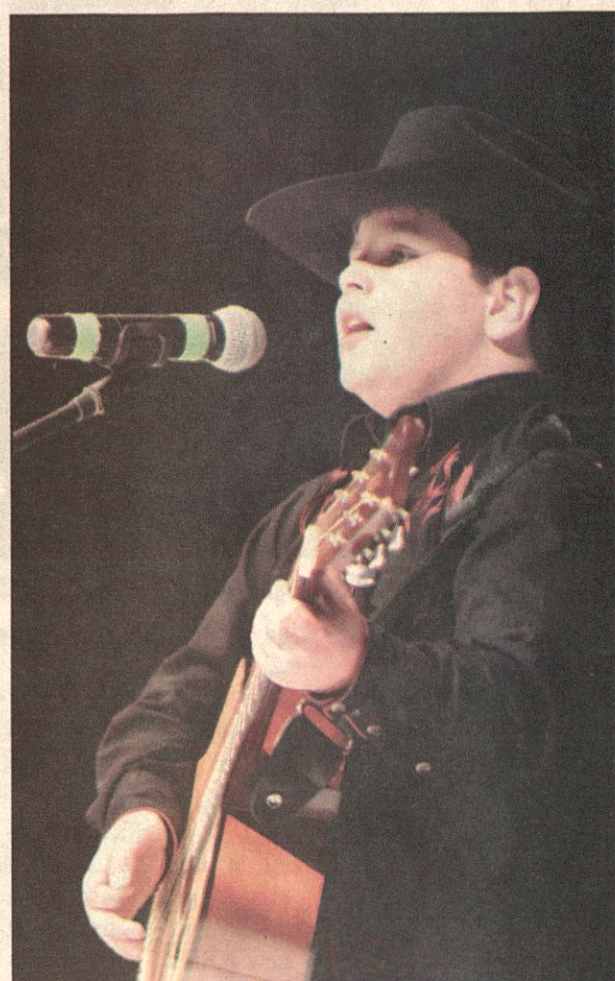

The AEDs will be in place at each school on January 5th, when the students return from Christmas Break. Free Trees at County Soil & Water Office

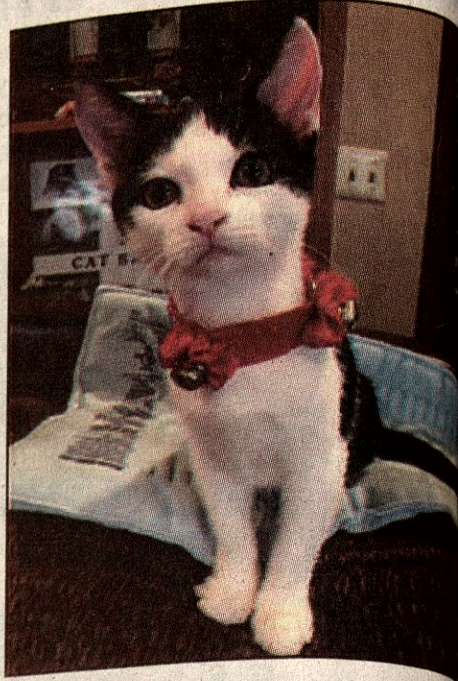

Support Group Forming to Help Victims of Sexual Abuse

Sexual abuse happens in every community and affects people of all genders and ages. The impacts of sexual violence affect individuals, families, communities, and society as a whole. But prevention is possible.

A new support group will start meeting in Iuka to help victims of present and past sexual exploitation and violence, with the hope that people can learn the facts about sexual violence and play an active role in changing misconceptions.

The group will meet at Iuka Library on the first Saturday of each month at 4:30 p.m., beginning this Saturday. Abuse survivor Nellie White Lomenick says that the group's goals will be to help overcome the shame of being a victim of sexual abuse/violence and provide answers and resources to get help and counseling. Professional counselors will be present, or the group can put you in contact with someone who can help. Participants of any age are welcome, and if you need more information, contact Ms. Lomenick at 79-7989.

What is sexual violence? Sexual violence is any type of unwanted sexual contact. This can include words and actions of a sexual nature against a person's will and without their consent. Consent is voluntary, mutual, and can be withdrawn at any time. Reasons someone might not consent include fear, age, illness, disability, and/or influence of alcohol or other drugs. A person may use force, threats, manipulation, or coercion to commit sexual violence. Anyone can experience sexual violence, including children, teens, adults, and elders. Those who sexually abuse can be acquaintances, family members, trusted individuals, or strangers.

Facts about sexual violence Sexual violence affects people of all genders, ages, races, religions, incomes, abilities, professions, ethnicities, and sexual orientations. There is a social context that surrounds sexual violence: oppression and social norms that allow for sexism, racism, and other forms of inequality are all contributing factors. Nearly 1 in 5 women in the United States have experienced rape or attempted rape some time in their lives. In the United States, 1 in 71 men have experienced rape or attempted rape. An estimated 32.3% of multiracial women, 27.5% of American Indian/Alaska Native women, 21.2% of non-Hispanic black women, 20.5% of non-Hispanic white women, and 13.6% of Hispanic women were raped during their lifetimes. Nearly 1 in 2 women and 1 in 5 men have experienced sexual violence victimization other than rape at some point in their lifetime. Victims often know the person who sexually assaulted them. People who sexually abuse usually target someone they know — a friend, classmate, neighbor, coworker, or relative. Nearly 3 out of 4 adolescents (74%) who

have been sexually assaulted were victimized by someone they knew well. One-fifth (21.1%) were committed by a family member.

- In 2005-10, about 55% of rape or sexual assault victimizations occurred at or near the victim's home, and another 12% occurred at or near the home of a friend, relative, or acquaintance

Victims are never at fault.

It doesn't matter what someone is wearing or how they are acting, victims are never to blame. A person may use force, threats, manipulation, or coercion to commit sexual violence. An absence of injuries to the victim does not indicate consent.

Rape is often not reported or convicted.

Many victims who do report a rape or sexual assault find that there is no arrest or conviction.

- The majority of sexual assaults, an estimated 63%, are never reported to the police
- The prevalence of false reporting cases of sexual violence is low, yet when survivors come forward, many face scrutiny or encounter barriers.

There are many reasons why someone may choose not to report to law enforcement or tell anyone about an experience. Some include:

- Concern about not being believed
- Fear of the attackers getting back at them
- Shame or fear of being blamed
- Pressure from others not to tell
- Distrust of law enforcement
- Belief that there is not enough evidence
- Desire to protect the attacker

Sexual violence is preventable.

We can all help create a culture of empathy, respect, and equity. Prevention starts with challenging victim-blaming and believing survivors when they disclose. In your personal life, you can model supportive relationships and behaviors and speak up when you hear sexist, racist, transphobic, or homophobic comments. Each of us is essential in challenging harmful attitudes and the societal acceptance of rape.

A Personal Story

When I was a very young girl, there was a man that gained the trust of my family. He started abusing me and I didn't know right from wrong at that time. He and his wife would bring me all kinds of jewelry and little gifts and take me to town. I guess you wonder how Mama and Daddy would let me go off with them, but he was my uncle's father.

I never thought it was wrong what he was doing to me, because my brain had not yet learned right from wrong. As I began to get older and knew something wasn't right about what he was doing, I told him I was going to tell Daddy and that's when he started scaring me. He would tell me he was going to throw me off Indian Creek Bridge or the big gravel pit. My other brothers and sisters would be playing while he was holding me. It caused me to have emotional problems and physical problems. I had trouble in school learning. The teachers back then didn't look for signs of abuse, but I hope they do today. I didn't tell my Mama till I was married and had three children. I never told my Daddy, he was already dead when I told Mama. Somewhere right now there are children going through what I did. I am starting a sexual abuse group at the library on Saturday, February 6th at 4:30. Maybe this will save someone, or help get it off their chest, anyone is invited and what is told will stay there, unless it is an on-going abuse.

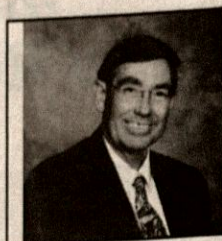

What Is Jesus Saying To The Churches? (part XXXIII)

In the last article I was writing about the holiness of Jesus Christ, as it is seen in Revelation 3:7. I also mentioned the fact that Jesus is true, but I did not finish with all I wanted to say about that point, so we will look again at Revelation 3:7: "And to the angel of the church in Philadelphia write; These things saith He that is holy, He that is true, He that hath the key of David, He that openeth and no man shutteth; and shutteth, and no man openeth." The word "truth" is more vital to the existence of man on the earth than any man alive or dead has ever realized, other than Jesus



Christ! In John 14:6, Jesus said, ".....I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by Me." Anyone can claim to be truthful, but Jesus has demonstrated that fact through the centuries! Truth is provable, while falsehood always proves to be untrue eventually. It always amazes me that human beings are willing to follow human teachers who never prove their teaching to be true. Whole religious systems are based on the teachings of one man or woman, in many cases, but the truth of the Bible has been tested and proven true by multitudes of people from the days of the first writings of Scripture by Moses. With all of the efforts of men to destroy

the teaching of the Bible, the truth of Scripture remains with us!

Our verse above also says that Jesus has the key of David. Perhaps we should think about what this means. In Luke 1:31-33, the angel Gabriel said to Mary: "And, behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son, and shalt call His name Jesus. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest: and the Lord God shall give unto Him the throne of His father David: And He shall reign over the house of Jacob for ever, and of His kingdom there shall be no end." Then we read in II Samuel 7:10-11: "Moreover I will appoint a place for My people Israel, and will plant them, that they may dwell in a place of their own, and move no more; neither shall the children of wickedness afflict them any more, as beforetime. And as since the time that I commanded judges to be over My people Israel, and have caused thee to rest from all thine enemies. Also

the LORD telleth thee: He will make thee an house. I realize that these few words will not be enough for you to understand fully what is taught here, but the gist is that God promised to David a "house", or a dynasty, and Jesus is the key to that dynasty and holds the key of the Davidic house kingdom.

The promise is that David's people, Israel, will dwell in their own land in peace, but that peace never come, thus Gabriel said to Mary that her Son, Jesus, would reign over the house of David forever. This does mean the church, for David's house has always been Israel, not the church. It is the throne of David that Jesus will inherit, and that throne was in Jerusalem, even if David did reign seven and a half years in Hebron. It is the city of Jerusalem that God promised to bless above all cities (see Psalm 122 and Chronicles 7:12-22).

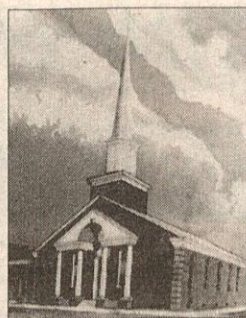


