Threatening Calls Lead to School Dismissals Second time in three weeks county schools get bomb threats

Two Tishomingo County schools received bomb threats Tuesday, prompting evacuation of hundreds of students and, eventually, mid-day dismissal of school for all students in the district.
At 11:55 Tuesday, the Iuka Middle School office received a bomb threat via a phone call to the office. Administrators immediately started loading the approximately 370 students onto buses to evacuate them to a safe place. The safety plan requires students to be moved out to the football field, like a fire drill, but intermittent snowfall and below freezing temperatures prompted the decision to move the students to Tishomingo County High School's auditorium until the threat at IMS could be investigated.
TCHS continued to function normally while the IMS students arrived on campus. But sooner were the students settled in at TCHS when a similar threat was called into the high school office.
"We couldn't keep evacuating [now 1,000] students all over the district, and we had already achieved the required 63 percent mark for attendance purposes, so we made the call to dismiss students for the day, so officials

and investigators could do their job without students on campus," said Superintendent Christie Holly. Holly and other officials had already been riding the roads to determine if the late-morning snowfall had caused any potential road hazards, so a mid-day dismissal was already in consideration.
Parents were notified directly by the school's auto-call system. First only IMS parents were notified of their children being moved to the high school, where they could come retrieve them if they wished, and then the entire district's parents were notified of school being dismissed for the day.
According to Holly, the calls to the two schools were similar. She said at IMS, secretary Amy Cutshall received the call on the main school extension, but quickly passed the phone to school resource officer Kevin Booker, who was in the office. The call was a recorded voice, with what may have been a middle-Eastern sounding accent. At Tishomingo County High School, Mrs. Cheryl Jordan got the call on the office phone.
According to Holly, the call said "there was dynamite at the school," and that "innocent lives would be lost." It also said, "if the bomb didn't deploy, pedestri-


ans would be shot."
The same day, there were reports of similar threats being called into fifteen other schools across Mississippi, the closest being Senatobia, and including Hattiesburg Public Schools, Bassfield High School in Jefferson Davis County, Magee High School, Mendenhall High School, and Jim Hill High School in Jackson.
There have been no reports that any explosive devices were found.
Law enforcement investigation of the local incidents continues, with the school police department, Iuka Police and the Tishomingo County Sheriff Department cooperating to get to the bottom of the situation.
Holly said the district is especially thankful for the law enforcement support.
"The sheriff's department, police, MEMA, MDOT, and the MBI all come at the drop of a hat to support our own school resource officers, and we so appreciate them," said Holly. There were three bomb-sniffing

dogs at the campuses, along with dozens of officers.
The FBI in Mississippi has issued a statement saying that the investigations are all still in the hands of local authorities.

This was the second time in three weeks that local schools were threatened in such a way. January 19th, the district was closed to students after a phoned-in threat the night before. Officials and law enforcement were up all night searching all the county schools for explosives, but never found any-

thing.

In the January threat, the threatening call came to Mrs. Holly's personal cell phone at about 10:30 at night, and an identical call went to the administrative offices. Dozens of schools in the northeast part of the United States got similar calls the next morning, and all the

calls were traced back to a California number. No suspects have been apprehended in that earlier incident.

Mrs. Holly also expressed thanks to all the parents, of the affected students, and shares their frustration that our schools have had to experience this kind of thing that seems to

be something that should be happening in some distant city, not mostly-rural Tishomingo County.

"I know it is upsetting to everyone, but we can't not evacuate students, faculty and personnel," said a frustrated Holly Wednesday. "How do you determine if it is a low level threat? The safety of

the students must always come first."

"It stresses everyone, and as far as I'm concerned, it is an act of terrorism, and we will continue to work with law enforcement to find out the person or persons who are doing this," said Holly.

County rivals Belmont and Tishomingo County

were supposed to play basketball at TCHS last night, but the game was moved to Wednesday night, with various tip-off at 4 p.m., by the boys. Junior games were canceled. Attendance figures for Wednesday were unable to be tallied Tuesday. Holly.

Absentee Ballots Now Available for March 8th Mississippi Presidential Primary Election

Donna Henry Dill, Circuit Clerk, announces that absentee ballots are now available for the March 8, 2016 Presidential Primary Election. You may come to the circuit clerk's office to vote by absentee Monday - Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The clerk's office will also be open on Saturday, February 27, 2016, 8 a.m. to 12 noon and on Saturday, March 5, 2016, 8 a.m. to 12 noon for absentee voting. I would

like to remind all voters who vote by absentee in the clerk's office that you will be required to show a photo ID. Also, all voters who go to the voting precincts on Election Day will be required to show a photo ID.

Because this is a Primary Election, you will be required to tell the election officials the political party that you wish to vote in. You will chose the Democratic Party or the Repub-

lican Party. Should there be a run-off election, you will be required to vote in the same primary in the run-off as you did in the first primary. Mississippi Law does not allow any crossover voting in Primary Elections.

We encourage those who need to vote by mail to call our office as soon as possible so they will have ample time to go through the absentee process. When an absentee

ballot is requested, an application for an absentee ballot will first be mailed to the voter. This application shall be completed by the absentee voter and mailed back to the Circuit Clerk's Office. When the application is received, the ballot will be mailed to the voter. No absentee ballots may be hand delivered to anyone.

Any registered voter is eligible to vote by absentee in the clerk's office, but only five groups are allowed to vote absentee by mail. These five groups are: (1) A registered voter who is 65 years of age or older; (2) A registered voter who is temporarily residing outside the county; (3) A registered voter who is temporarily or permanently physically disabled; and or; (4) A registered voter who is the parent, spouse or dependent of a temporarily or permanently physically disabled person who is hospitalized outside the county or more than 50 miles away from his/her residence and will be with that person on Election Day. (5) All registered voters who are members of the Armed Services, their spouses, dependents, and overseas citizens who fall under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA).

All absentee applications and ballot envelopes must be notarized except for a registered voter who is physically disabled, either permanently or temporarily. The disabled voter's application and ballot envelope must be witnessed and signed by a

The 9th through 12th grade talent show at TCHS Monday night was a showcase of talented students, whose impressive and inspirational performances impressed the nearly capacity crowd at





Dr. H. Lloyd Storment

Dr. H. Lloyd Storment, beloved and long serving Baptist minister, passed away on February 3rd, after a brief illness.

A model of Christian faith and work all of his adult life. Dr. Storment was born September 11th, 1922 in Iuka, Mississippi to John and Myrtle Storment. He answered the call to arms and enlisted in the Army in 1943. He joined in the heroic work of the Greatest Generation in his military service in the invasion of France and Germany in World War II. He returned after the war to marry his sweetheart, Maxine Ivy and was determined to get an education and commit himself to Christian ministry. He graduated from the University of Mississippi in the class of 1952, and from the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary with the Master of Divinity in 1955, and later earned the Doctor of Ministry in 1976. Thereafter he embarked on a quiet, balanced, and effective ministry in both church and community from 1955 to the present.

He began in 1955 as Associate Pastor of the First Baptist Church of Frankford, Kentucky, and in 1958 became pastor of the Walnut Street Baptist Church in Owensboro, Kentucky. In 1964, Dr. Storment began his pastorate at Bethany Baptist Church, in Louisville, serving the longest pastorate in the history of the church until his retirement in 1986. However, as he said on many occasions, he "flunked retirement," and was soon back in ministry to serve two decades beyond retirement as the beloved and admired Associate Pastor of Broadway Baptist Church in Louisville, Kentucky, continuing these many years until his recent "real retirement". Dr. Storment served as a trustee of Georgetown College and Kentucky Southern, Moderator of Long Run Baptist Association, and board member of Highland Community Ministries.

He is survived by his loving wife of 66 years, Maxine Ivy Storment; daughter, Amanda Storment of Louisville; granddaughter, Cathryn Lloyd Hunt of Washington, D.C.; son, Harold Storment and wife, Connie; and grandchildren, Olivia Ivy Storment and Jackson Lloyd Storment of Louisville; sister, Martha Grisham and husband, James of Iuka; nieces and nephews, and a host of loving friends.

He is predeceased by brothers, John B., James Robert and Ben, and sisters, Ruth Moore and Mildred Curtis.

Dr. Storment's wise, sage advice, serene disposition, insightful Christian theology has blessed hundreds of lives as expressed in his counsel, friendship, sermons and especially his thoughtful and inspiring prayers. Over his time, from boyhood to manhood, as husband, father, grandfather, and in the ministry, Lloyd Storment touched so many lives — and so many lives touched him.

The funeral service was held on Monday, February 8th at 11 a.m. at Broadway Baptist Church with a private burial at Cave Hill Cemetery.



What Is Jesus Saying To The Churches? (part XXXIV)

In Revelation 3:7 Jesus is speaking to the church at Philadelphia, and He says in the latter part of this verse: "He that openeth, and no man shutteth; and shutteth, and no man openeth." I have already commented on the first part of this verse, so I am giving only a portion of it here. It is significant, and also against much modern thinking, that Jesus can literally open opportunities or other things, and no man can shut those opened things. I have been amazed for 54 years as a preacher of the Scriptures that God can open doors of opportunity for the preaching of His Word, and no man can shut those doors. The apostle Paul is a prime example of how Jesus Christ did this very thing in his life. When he was imprisoned for preaching the gospel, he preached to guards and inmates. When he was stoned and left for dead at Lystra, he arose the very next day and continued preaching, moreover, he came back through Lystra and confirmed his converts that he had won on the first trip (see Acts 14:8-23). Men cannot shut the doors that Jesus opens for the ministry of His Word. On the other hand, men cannot open the doors that Jesus has shut, even though many have tried. It is a great day when we realize that He is the One Who can open or close doors, and when He closes a door, we should not try to crawl through a window, as someone has wisely said.

Revelation 3:8 says, "I know thy works: behold, I have set before thee an open door, and no man can shut it: for thou hast a little strength, and hast kept My Word, and hast not denied My name." Now we see that Jesus clearly said that He had opened a door of opportunity for the church at Philadelphia that no man could shut. I sometimes wonder why so many churches sit in conference rooms trying to figure out some scheme that will "grow the church", when Jesus is the One Who can open doors for witness or church growth. Certainly, it is not wrong for churches to have plans of evangelism, but it is wrong for them to depend on those plans more than on Jesus Christ to "set before them an open door" which no man can shut. Mark 4:24 says, "...and unto you that hear shall more be given." This indicates that Jesus will give more understanding to those who have received what they have already heard, and this applies to churches and church growth. It is one thing for churches to have big crowds; it is often a very different thing for churches to "grow" people in the understanding of the things of God! It is great if both of these are facts within the local church. Those preachers who say they do not care about big crowds are perhaps overlooking the fact that bigger crowds give bigger opportunities to propagate the Word of God. I have always desired to preach to bigger crowds, but I refuse to use unbiblical methods to draw those crowds! While God does use programs and plans that men devise, that does not mean that God will always use every plan that men have made. God has a way of doing things His way, whatever part He may allow men to play in His program. Dear pastors and church leaders, may I say to you that it is good to have a plan, but please do not depend on the plan, rather depend on God Who Himself may have given you the idea for the plan!

TOWN OF TISHOMINGO
STATE OF MISSISSIPPI

Ordinance Number 2016-1

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING ROUTES FOR COMMERCIAL VEHICLES WITHIN THE R-1 RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT AND PROHIBITING CERTAIN TRAFFIC AND PARKING THEREIN AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION HEREOF.

WHEREAS, the board of alderman have the authority to make ordinances in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the community;

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Tishomingo that use, parking, or traversing of vehicles with three axles or more, or which have a gross weight of more than 8,000.00 pounds, are prohibited within, or upon the roadways of the Central Residential District (R-1) as described and defined in the Town of Tishomingo Comprehensive Land Use Regulation and Zoning Ordinance and Official Zoning Map with the following exceptions:

1. Jackson Street, Madison Street, Third Avenue between Jackson Street and Madison Street, and Jefferson Street East of Third Avenue may be used as route for deliveries to and from the school during daylight hours;

2. Commercial vehicles making delivery of goods or services to residences during daylight hours. In the event services are related to construction, said vehicles may be parked on the premises at night during the construction period;

3. School buses and church buses;

4. Vehicles owned by the Town or persons contracting with the Town;

5. Three quarter (3/4) ton or less pick-up trucks with trailers less than 10 feet belonging to a resident.

6. Utility vehicles involved in the placement, repair, testing, or maintenance of utilities.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that any person violating this ordinance will be responsible for any damage done to the street, town property, or personal property and also, violation of this ordinance be a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than \$500.00 for the first offense and not more than \$1,000 for the second and subsequent offenses.

This ordinance shall take effect thirty days from its passage. THIS ORDINANCE WAS ADOPTED by the following vote of the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Tishomingo, Mississippi, at its regular meeting held February 2, 2016:

Free Trees at County Soil & Water Office



ORDINANCE OF CITY OF IUKA, COUNTY OF TISHOMINGO, MISSISSIPPI, PROHIBITING THE USE OF PORTABLE STORAGE BUILDINGS OR CAMPERS TO BE USED OR CLASSIFIED AS DWELLINGS AND TO DEFINE A DWELLING.

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Iuka do hereby FIND, DETERMINE AND ADJUDGE as follows:

- That the City has an interest and duty to enhance the economic value of the community and each area thereof through the regulation of such things as zoning and defining the type of building that can be described as a dwelling.
- That the City has an interest and duty to describe such minimum standards for a dwelling so as to provide safety to its citizens and their guests.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF IUKA, MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: It shall be unlawful to use any portable building, designed and built for use as storage, to be used as a dwelling.

SECTION 2: That the City adopts the definition of a "dwelling" as follows: "A site-built structure of a minimum of 500 square feet of heated area, built in compliance with all applicable International Building Codes.

SECTION 3: It shall be unlawful for any individual or entity to use any camper trailer, camper, or other unit typically utilized or moved either pulled behind a motor vehicle or by the power of its own motor as a dwelling.

SECTION 4: Any person found guilty of violating the provisions of this article shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and may be punished by a fine of no less than \$25.00 for each violation.

SECTION 5: That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from thirty days from the date of this passage.

SECTION 6: That this ordinance be published one time as required by statute, and shall be recorded in the Ordinance Book of the municipality.

SECTION 7: If any Section, subsection or sentence held within this document is found to be unlawful or otherwise unenforceable, then the remaining enforceable portions shall remain in full effect as stated herein.
