# hreatening Calls Lead to School Dismissals econd time in three weeks county schools get bomb threats

Two Tishomingo County ools received bomb threats esday, prompting evacuation hundreds of students and ntually, mid-day dismissal school for all students in the strict.

At 11:55 Tuesday, the Iuka ddle School office received omb threat via a phone call the office. Administrators imdiately started loading the apmimately 370 students onto ses to evacuate them to a safe ce. The safety plan requires dents to be moved out to the tball field, like a fire drill, but ermittent snowfall and below ezing temperatures prompted decision to move the stunts to Tishomingo County gh School's auditorium until threat at IMS could be invesated.

TCHS continued to funcn normally while the IMS dents arrived on campus. But a sooner were the students setd in at TCHS when a similar reat was called into the high hool office.

"We couldn't keep evacuatg [now 1,000] students all over district, and we had already thieved the required 63 percent ark for attendance purposes, we made the call to dismiss and investigators could do their ans would be shot." job without students on campus," said Superintendent Christie Holly. Holly and other officials had already been riding the roads to determine if the latemorning snowfall had caused any potential road hazards, so a mid-day dismissal was already in consideration.

Parents were notified directly by the school's auto-call system. First only IMS parents were notified of their children being moved to the high school, where they could come retrieve them if they wished, and then the entire district's parents were notified of school being dismissed for the day.

According to Holly, the calls to the two schools were similar. She said at IMS, secretary Amy Cutshall received the call on the main school extension, but quickly passed the phone to school resource officer Kevin Booker, who was in the office. The call was a recorded voice, with what may have been a middle-Eastern sounding accent. At Tishomingo County High School, Mrs. Cheryl Jordan got the call on the office phone.

According to Holly, the call said "there was dynamite at the school," and that "innocent lives would be lost." It also said, "if

The same day, there were reports of similar threats being called into fifteen other schools across Mississippi, the closest being Senatobia, and including Hattiesburg Public Schools, Bassfield High School in Jefferson Davis County, Magee High School, Mendenhall High School, and Jim Hill High School in Jackson.

There have been no reports that any explosive devices were found.

Law enforcement investigation of the local incidents continues, with the school police department, Iuka Police and the Tishomingo County Sheriff Department cooperating to get to the bottom of the situation.

Holly said the district is especially thankful for the law enforcement support.

"The sheriff's department, police, MEMA, MDOT, and the MBI all come at the drop of a hat to support our own school resource officers, and we so appreciate them," said Holly. There were three bomb-sniffing



## School Threat, continued from page 1

This was the second time in three weeks that local schools were threatened in such a way. January 19<sup>th</sup>, the district was closed to students after a phoned-in threat the night before. Officials and law enforcement were up all night searching all the county schools for explosives, but never found any-

thing.

In the January threat, the threatening call came to Mrs. Holly's personal cell phone at about 10:30 at night, and an identical call went to the administrative offices. Dozens of schools in the northeast part of the United States got similar calls the next morning, and all the calls were traced back to a California number. No suspects have been apprehended in that earlier incident.

Mrs. Holly also expressed thanks to all the parents, of the affected students, and shares their frustration that our schools have had to experience this kind of thing that seems to be something that should be happening in some distant city, not mostly-rural Tishomingo County.

"I know it is upsetting to everyone, but we can't not evacuate students, faculty and personnel," said a frustrated Holly Wednesday. "How do you determine if it is a low level threat? The safety of the students must always

come first." "It stresses everyone, and as far as I'm concerned, it is an act of terrorism, and we will continue to work with law enforcement to find out the person or persons who are doing this," said Holly. 

Any registered voter is eligible to vote by absentee in the clerk's office, but only five groups are allowed to vote absentee by mail. These five groups are: (1) A registered voter who is 65 years of age or older; (2) A registered voter who is temporarily residing outside the county; (3) A registered voter who is temporarily or permanently physically disabled; and or; (4) A registered voter who is the parent, spouse or dependent of a temporarily or permanently physically disabled person who is hospitalized outside the county or more than 50 miles away from his/her residence and will be with that person on Election Day. (5) All registered voters who are members of the Armed Services, their spouses, dependents, and overseas citizens who fall under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA).

All absentee applications and ballot envelopes must be notarized except for a registered voter who is physically disabled, either permanently or temporarily. The disabled voter's application and ballot envelope must be witnessed and signed by a

It is a great day when we alize that He is the One Who can open or close doors, nd when He closes a door, we should not try to crawl brough a window, as someone has wisely said.

Revelation 3:8 says, "I know thy works: beold I have set before thee an open door, and no nan can shut it: for thou hast a little strength. nd hast kept My Word, and hast not denied My ame." Now we see that Jesus clearly said that He ad opened a door of opportunity for the church at hiladelphia that no man could shut. I sometimes wonder why so many churches sit in conference noms trying to figure out some scheme that will grow the church", when Jesus is the One Who tan open doors for witness or church growth. Certainly, it is not wrong for churches to have plans of evangelism, but it is wrong for them to depend on nose plans more than on Jesus Christ to "set before hem an open door" which no man can shut. Mark 4:24 says, "....and unto you that hear shall more be given." This indicates that Jesus will give more understanding to those who have received what they have already heard, and this applies to churches and church growth. It is one thing for churches to have big crowds; it is often a very different thing for churches to "grow" people in the understanding of the things of God! It is great if both of these are facts within the local church. Those preachers who say they do not care about big crowds are perhaps verlooking the fact that bigger crowds give bigger opportunities to propagate the Word of God. have always desired to preach to bigger crowds, but I refuse to use unbiblical methods to draw those crowds! While God does use programs and plans that men devise, that does not mean that God will always use every plan that men have made. God has a way of doing things His way, whatever part SHe may allow men to play in His program. Dear pastors and church leaders, may I say to you that it s good to have a plan, but please do not depend on the plan, rather depend on God Who Himself may have given you the idea for the plan!

SECTION 4: Any person found guilty of violating the provisions of this article shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and may be punished by a fine of no less than \$25.00 for each violation.




