Braves Victorious in First Weekend of Play

The Tishomingo County Braves baseball team is starting the season with a triplet of wins!

In games at the Belmont Classic, the Braves trounced Red Bay (15-5) on Friday, and eeked out a win over Cherokee in the final inning, 8-7, on Saturday.

Friday, junior Logan Talley pitched, and junior Ty James and senior Harrison Moss each had two hits. Senior Payton Arnold had a double to help ensure a win over the Tigers.

Saturday, the Braves outlasted Cherokee after five lead changes, squeaking out an 8-7 win in the Belmont Classic game.

The Braves pulled out the win thanks to a strong seventh inning. The Braves went up for good on an RBI single by Moss off pitcher Carston Smith, allowing Cade Butler to score.

James pitched the win, holding Cherokee hitless over three innings, allowing no earned runs and striking out eight. Talley and sophomore Josh Wadkins had multiple hits, and a double each. James also had a double.

Monday, the Braves hosted Rogers (Alabama) in their home opener and held off the Pirates for a 12-8 victory. Austin Puckett got the win for the Braves despite allowing six runs over five innings. He struck out four, walked eight and gave up four hits. The first three innings were key for the Braves, and they never surrendered the lead after the third inning. Logan Talley and Josh Wadkins had

Luka Restaurant Catches Fire from Discarded Cigarette in Planter

Luka restaurant Lili's Smokie's suffered smoke and fire damage Saturday when a small portion of the exterior caught fire.

According to Luka firefighter Brandon Grissom, firefighters think the fire was possibly caused from a discarded cigarette tossed in one of the whiskey barrel planters out front. The fire smoldered and caught the front of the building on fire, authorities suppose. Employees were in the back part of the building, preparing for Saturday's lunch crowd when passerby came and told them the front of the building was smoking, said co-owner Robert Johnson. The workers escaped without injury, and managed to do-

nate the prepared food to a local church who was having a fundraiser, said Johnson.

The restaurant has some smoke and water damage, but the owners, Philip and Crystal Crow of Saltillo, and Robert and Sherry Johnson, have been working to clean up the mess and make necessary repairs. They have the health department's approval to reopen, and plan to be open for customers later this week.

Robert Johnson said they are so thankful for the support of the community and all the offers of help they have received since the incident. He praised the quick response of the Luka Fire Department, and everyone who has helped them.

Mississippians Vote in Presidential Primary Tuesday

Next Tuesday, March 8th, Mississippians will be voting for their choices in the hotly contested Democratic and Republican Primary elections.

Voters will need to show identification and be ready to choose either the Republican or Democrat ticket to vote.

Saturday will be the last day to vote absentee in the presidential primary election in Mississippi and the local circuit clerk's office will be open from 8 until noon for final voting.

By Mississippi law no one will be allowed to vote by absentee ballot in the clerk's office on Monday, March 7, 2016.

Because this is a primary election, you will be required to tell the election officials the political party that you wish to vote in. You will choose the Democratic Party or the Republican Party.

Those who are voting by mail, remember that absentee ballots must be received in the circuit court office by Monday, March 7th, at 5 p.m. in order for their ballot to be counted. No absentee ballots may be hand delivered to anyone.

Fatal Wreck Claims Another Life

The surviving driver of a February 15th head-on collision just south of Iuka died unexpectedly last week, according to the coroner.

Arthur Lee Graham, 56, of Vardaman, Mississippi was driving the 18-wheeler that a pickup truck hit early that Monday morning. The driver of the pickup, Mark Killingsworth, was

killed in the collision, but Graham was taken from the scene that day for medical treatment.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, Graham suffered a broken hip in the collision and had to have his spleen removed after the wreck. Apparently, he developed a blood clot and died Wednesday, February 24th.

Old Fines in County Court? Amnesty Program Offers Chance to Come Clean

If you have old fines in Tishomingo County, you can get them cleared up this month, and avoid a Contempt of Court charge, in an amnesty program being offered by local authorities.

But you have to come in voluntarily, and your fines have to be before this month.

"We understand that there are those who may have had difficulty in paying their fines in the past," said Sheriff John Dennis Daugherty. "And that is why the amnesty program has been brought back, but you have to come yourself and take care of it between March 1, 2016 and April 1, 2016."

In an effort to clear a backlog of old fines and warrants that are owed to Tishomingo County, the Tishomingo County Justice Court, will be offering an amnesty program during the month of March.

This amnesty program will pertain to old fines only. The purpose of this program is to

provide relief to individuals who may have found themselves in violation of a court ordered obligation because they were financially unable to pay fines.

This program will also allow officers to focus on recent cases and allow individuals to avoid further penalties and possible incarceration.

Program Details

- The Program will run from March 1, 2016 through April 1, 2016
- It will cover any old fine balances that have been previously set by the court or any old fines remaining PRIOR to March 1, 2016
- Anyone with outstanding fines can come in and resume payments or schedule a new payment plan
- Anyone taking advantage of this program will have arrest warrants for FAILURE TO PAY, or FAILURE TO APPEAR rescinded
- Individuals who voluntarily appear at the Tishomingo

County Justice Court to address delinquent fines or warrants for FAILURE TO PAY and FAILURE TO APPEAR will not be arrested

- It is very important to remember that under this program there are two qualifying factors for AMNESTY
- INDIVIDUALS MUST HAVE COURT ORDERED OBLIGATIONS THAT WERE INCURRED PRIOR TO MARCH 1, 2016
- INDIVIDUALS MUST COME IN VOLUNTARILY

The judges and court administrators have agreed that this amnesty program will allow people who have fallen behind on their payments or have failed to pay as previously agreed to by court order to make good on their payments and NOT be subject to being held in Contempt of Court for nonpayment.

four years in grades 5-8."

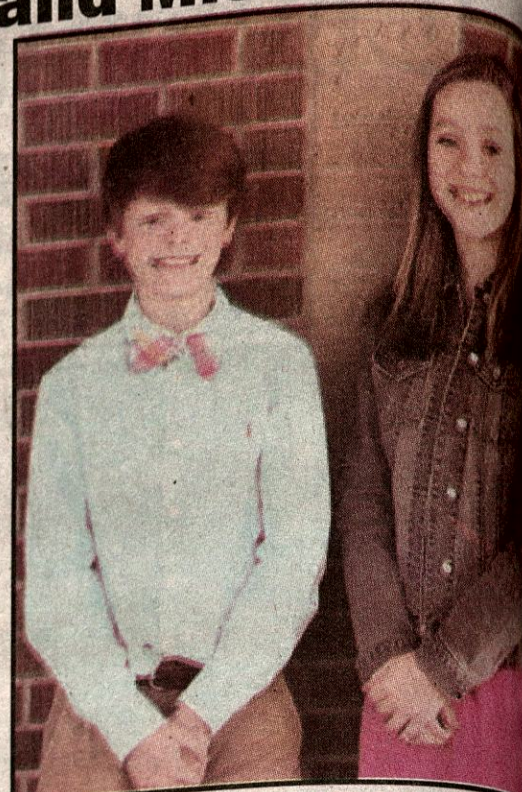
"The top 25 are the Hall of Fame, and the girl and boy with highest points are Mr. and Miss IMS," she said.

United Daughters of the Confederacy, John Marshall Stone #394 Met

The United Daughters of the Confederacy, John Marshall Stone #394 met Tuesday, February 16th at 4 p.m. at the Tishomingo County Archives and History Museum in Iuka. Those present were Eunell Handy, Mary Ledbetter, Sharon Hairrell and guest, Ariana Hairrell.

We did the pledges to the American Flag, Mississippi State flag, and the Confederate flag, complete the U.D.C. rituals and sang "Dixie".

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. Eunell Handy gave the financial report and it was approved. Registrars were not present and Chaplin Mary Ledbetter had nothing new to report. Eunell Handy stated that we have one member being re-instated, one working on application and one new request for application... New business was about our District I meeting that will be held March 19th in Corinth, Ms.; applications were given to members that plan to attend. Eunell Handys hared that U.D.C.'s will be honoring our Mississippi Monument at Shiloh Park, Tn. in March. We also discuss plans for our "Confederate Memorial Day" program.

Sharon Hairrell presented the program on confederate spies in "Hoop Skirts," Belle Boyd and Laura Ratcliffe. Belle Boyd was born into a Vir-

ginia family with strong Southern loyalties. At the age of 17 she killed a drunk Union soldier that invaded her home, tore down a Confederate flag and spoke offensively to her mother. She was acquitted of the crime but watched closely by Union troops. She became a spy for the Confederate armies including General Stonewall Jackson. She was imprisoned in 1862 in Washington D.C., but was released a month later; a second arrest the next year ended with her banishment back to the south.

She sailed to England in 1864 to serve as a Confederate courier but was intercepted by Union troops. One of them, a Union Naval officer named, Samuel Hardings, fell in love with her and helped her escape to London, where they wed. He died a short time later. She was a widow and mother at the age of 20, she stayed in England to compose her memoirs and launch a successful state career. She later returned to America and married twice more.

Laura Ratcliffe's home in Frying Pan are, Fairfax County, Virginia, was sometime used as headquarters by C.S.A. Col. John Singleton Mosby's Rangers during the Civil War.

Laura discovered a Union plan to capture Mosby and notified him so he could elude capture.

When Mosby captured a large cache of federal dollars, he had her to hold the money for him. She used a rock near her home to conceal messages and money for Mosby. She was also associated with Major General J.E.B. Stuart. Although it was obvious that her home was the center of Confederate activity, she was never arrested or formally charged for her activities. She later married Milton Hanna, a Union Veteran Soldier.

Mary Ledbetter shared with us an article on one of her Ancestors, the article was in the "Kay's Newsletter" that she receives every three months. She stated that the Iuka Public Library has a copy of these letters. Ariana Hairrell, a student at the Iuka Middle School shared with us an English assignment of her's, it was on "Frederick Douglass," author and Civil Rights Activist during the 1800's. Douglass was born on a plantation belonging to Edward Lloyd in February, 1818. He was named Frederick Bailey after h is mother (Harriett Bailey), though he only met her three or four times in h is life. Around the age of eight, he was sent to live wit h one of his owner's relatives in Baltimore, Maryland. It was while living in Baltimore that he was mistakenly taught the first several letters of the alphabet. Those few let-

ters opened a new world to him and began his lifelong love of language.

At 15, the now literate Douglass was returned tot eh Eastern shore to work as a field hand. At the age of 18 he disguised himself as a sailor, and carrying a friend's passport, boarded a northbound train from Baltimore. He arrived in New York City and declared himself a free man.

After escaping form slavery, Douglass changed his name to avoid being recaptured and turned his efforts to healing those still held in bondage. Douglass wrote his first autobiography, *The Narrative of the Life of Frederick Douglass* (1845), in which he revealed his original name, his owner's names, and where he was born. The book was wildly popular, but with his identity known, Douglass was in danger of being returned to slavery. Once again, he had to flee, this time to England, Scotland, and Ireland.

He died on February 20th, 1885, in Washington D.C., at the age of 77. He was said to be not full-blooded African American and that one of his master's was believed to be his father.

State Senate Strengthens Charter School Law, Expands Educational Options

JACKSON — Legislation opening rural areas in the state to public charter schools passed the Senate today, Lt. Gov. Tate Reeves said. The bill heads to the House for consideration.

Senate Bill 2161 updates the public charter school law by allowing students to cross school district lines to attend a public charter school. The bill is sponsored by Education Chairman Sen. Gray Wilson, R-Oxford, will make Mississippi's rural areas more attractive to public charter schools and provide more options for parents and students.

"Public charter schools can offer students an opportunity for academic success, and I believe all of Mississippi could have the ability to attract these schools,"

said. Lt. Gov. Reeves said. "By allowing students to cross district boundaries, public charter schools can build the capacity to operate effective campuses wherever there is demand from families."

The bill allows employees of public charter schools to participate in the Public Employees' Retirement System. It also disallows school boards of C-rated districts from limiting educational options for students.

Currently, Mississippi has two public charter schools in Jackson. Both schools have waiting lists for enrollment due to overwhelming interest from parents and students. Public charter schools successfully operate in several rural communities, including the Arkansas Delta and in Tennessee.

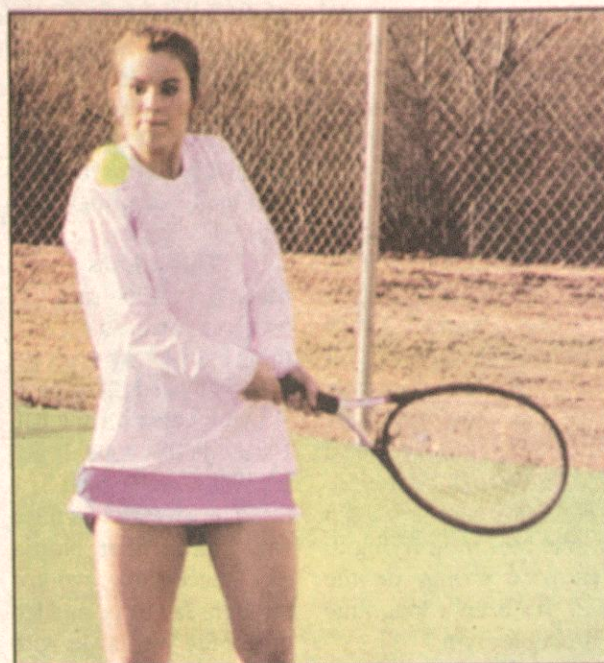

Marlin's Late Heroics Lift Tigers to Home Victory Over Calhoun

Booneville, Miss. - Austin Marlin had not felt a home run launch of his bat in nearly three years. But that all changed in one swing during a pivotal situation for the Northeast Mississippi Community College baseball program.

Marlin connected for what turned out to be the game-winning homer in a 3-2 victory over Calhoun (Ala.) Community College on Saturday, February 27 at Harold T. White Field.

"His focus was there and I'm so proud for him," said Northeast head coach Richy Harrelson. "He and I have worked a whole bunch on trying to put good swings on the ball. It's been a long time coming for him."

Marlin last knocked a pitch out of the park during Tishomingo County High School's run to the quarterfinals of the Mississippi High School Ac-

tivities Association (MHSAA) Class 4A playoffs in 2013.

He ended that drought with one out in the bottom of the sixth inning. Marlin crushed a one ball, no strike pitch over the left-centerfield wall to break a stalemate and put the Tigers ahead by what was eventually the final margin.

"This means everything," Marlin said. "I was just trying to do anything to help my team get the win by getting on base. When it came off the bat, I knew it was gone. It just felt really, really great."

The seventh was filled with drama that Northeast successfully worked through. Jay Copeland led off for the Warhawks with a single, but was erased on a beautiful pickoff play from pitcher Taylor Bobo to first baseman John David Poss.

A catcher's interfer-

ence call allowed Hunter Davidson to reach base moments later. However, the Tigers eliminated him and clinched the triumph by rolling a smooth double play with Eric Patterson, Garrison Howell and Poss all involved.

"Our guys give us so much energy and effort everyday," said Harrelson. "I told them before the game, 'You've just got to keep grinding and pushing.' We're excited because we're going in the right direction."

Northeast took an early 2-0 advantage in the second frame. Ryan Watts got things started with a double into the right-centerfield gap before Cole Camp, who entered as a courtesy runner, scored on A.J. Rye's fielder's choice.

Howell completed the solid inning by the Tigers (3-7) with a RBI single that brought Patterson, who was hit by a pitch for

the sixth time already this season, home standing.

The Warhawks (12-8) used RBI hits from Andrew Chuba in the fifth and a squeeze bunt from Tanner Burns one frame later to tie the contest and setup Marlin's heroics for Northeast.

Bobo (1-0) recorded the inaugural victory of his sophomore campaign. He tossed the final two innings and conceded just one run and two hits during his second relief stint of the week.

"It was just good to be back out there," Bobo said. "My catcher Marlin and my infield really helped me. We just got the job done. It was definitely a team effort and a great win for us."

Watts kept Calhoun off balance for the initial five frames and gave up only one run and four base knocks. He was one of three multiple hitters for the Tigers as well alongside Howell and Patterson.

In addition to books for all ages, the book fair will also have other items such as posters, interactive software and much more.



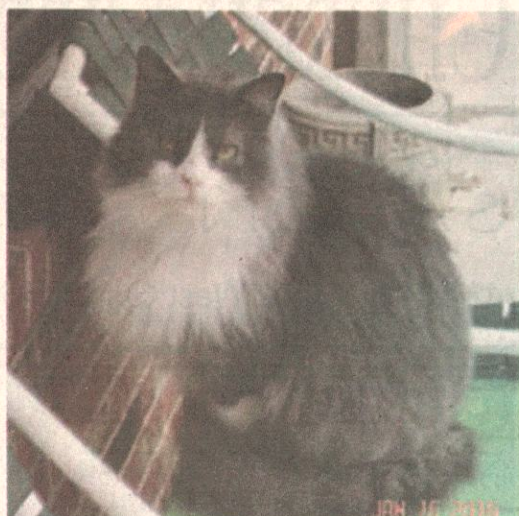
TCHS Senior Places 3rd in Oratorical Contest

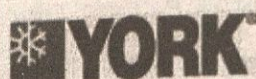

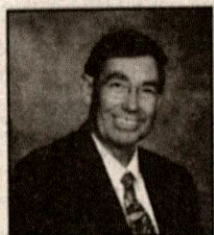

What Is Jesus Saying To The Churches? (part XXXVIII)

Revelation 3:11 says, "Behold, I come quickly: hold that fast which thou hast, that no man take thy crown." Crowns and rewards are coveted by most of the world's peoples, yet not everybody in the world will win a crown from Christ! It does seem that all of the saved will have at least the "crown of life", for James 1:12 says that God has promised this crown to "them that love Him". Then I

Corinthians 16:22 says, "If any man love not the Lord Jesus Christ, let him be Anathema Maranatha." This means that all who do not love Jesus are under the judgment of God, for that is what the word "Anathema" means, so all saved people do love Jesus, at least to some extent. The "crown of life" may simply be the full benefits of eternal life, which are bestowed upon all of the saved, and these benefits are not all bestowed until we are with the Lord.

There are at least four other crowns mentioned in the New Testament, which may be won, or "lost". Salvation is a free gift, so it will not be lost by those who know Christ, but crowns bestowed for service may be "lost", in the sense that they are never bestowed on some at the judgment seat of Christ. We often say of those in competitive sports that: "He or she lost the crown, but that does not mean that he already had it. It is not that some believers held these crowns in their hands and then lost them, for no crowns will be given until the judgment seat, much as it is with those in athletic games. So, it seems that crowns that could be won can be forfeited

by those in the "game", if they do not hold fast what God has given them and taught them concerning His work on earth.

To forfeit a crown is a tormenting thing, even in crowns offered in this life for sporting events, but to forfeit a crown that God wants to bestow on faithful believers will be much more troubling and shameful than any "loss" of a crown that men might bestow. Perhaps I should have said already that Jesus promised the church at Philadelphia that He was coming quickly. I must point out that He did not mean that He was coming right away, for it has been almost 2,000 years since He ascended to heaven. He meant

that when He comes the event will take place quickly, for I Corinthians 15:52 shows that the rapture of the church will take place "in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye". The indication is also that He will come unannounced, thus the church was admonished to keep a watchful eye, while they guarded the precious things that Christ had put in their hands. I do not know how many of you think, but to me it is very important that I make full use of what God has entrusted into my hands, including the matter of writing and speaking the message of the Word of God!
