Judges Will Start Assigning Community Service Hours Doing Trash Cleanup

More and more Tishomingo Countians are waking up to the fact that our beautiful country side is looking pretty trashy, and last week, the county board took some action to help fix the problem.

A work program was approved by the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors to allow the justice court judges to sentence offenders in their court to a period of community service - working with the supervisors to help clean up roadsides. It should begin the first court date in April.

South Half Justice Court Judge Donny Joe Sparks met with the board and was more than willing to start implementing a community service program. His willingness was nothing compared to the supervisors' - who all said they could put someone to work that day helping county crews in roadside cleanup.

"I could use 20 today," said Second District Supervisor Nicky McRae.

Those sentenced to community service would report to the supervisor, who would assign them an area to clean up, and the supervisor would be the ones responsible for making sure the work gets done, and the fine or sentence is fulfilled. They would "sign off" when the community

Some of the supervisors are already working a few people cleaning up roadsides. In recent years, a crew of state inmates was available, upon request, to come clean up various areas, but when the state pulled all the state inmates out of the county, the county lost thousands of dollars in free labor that was definitely helping the county look a little less trashy.

And this is a pretty plentiful source of labor. According to Justice Court Judge Matthew Clay Cummings, each week at least a couple dozen folks come through the Tishomingo County Justice Court for all manner of (usually) misdemeanor offenses. Those guilty of traffic and misdemeanor criminal charges will be eligible for the road work, unless they are seriously disabled. They will still have to pay fines.

Additionally, the supervisors and Judge Sparks hope to start instilling some pride in Tishomingo County folks by getting them involved in the hands-on maintenance of the county's potentially scenic roadsides.

"Kids need to pay for their offenses in a way that impacts them, instead of grandma and grandpa coming and paying their fines for them," said Sparks. The supervisors indicated that a lot of the careless littering is garbage being thrown from vehicles - something easily



gh Schools Transitioning to Block Schedule Next Year

Superintendent Christie Holly.

In the proposed local plan, students would have four 90 minute classes each day, instead of seven. And each course would only last a semester like in college.

As Holly explains, "Currently, if high school students have a full schedule, they can earn 7 credits in a year. With the 4 X 4 block, students with a full schedule could earn 8. Most students who wish to reach more rigorous, upper-level courses can get to those faster in the block schedule format. For example, a student could take Algebra I as a 9th grader in the 1st semester, and then be ready to take Geometry in the 2nd semester. Right now, students' courses are year-long, preventing the advancement of courses to occur more quickly. We also like the block because it allows

more opportunities for students who need to catch up academically. For example, if a student in not successful in Algebra I the 1st semester, he/she can take the course again in the 2nd semester."

In Tishomingo County, one of the major hurdles in integrating the Career and Technical Center classes and transporting them to the Tishomingo cam-

"Also, we wanted to make sure students involved in mulextra-curricular activitiple ties could work in a schedule that would give them as many academic opportunities as possible," said Holly. "In order to work on both of those issues, our team created a schedule that would allow travel time for CTE students and allow them to continue in that path, and we worked on a modified piece of

the schedule for athletics and other extra-curricular activities. We looked at several models to try to find a system that would work for our students' needs. We hope we have a model that will work."

The administration says they may hold parent nights to help the community understand the changes, and the Board of Education is behind them in their decision.

"As with any change, it will take flexibility for the initiative to work, and it may be bumpy at first," said Holly. "But all the districts we have talked to that have made this switch say it is one of the best things they have done."

In fact, educational consultant Dr. Eddie Britton, former principal of TCHS, said that in several districts he's worked with, grades go up across the

board, without exception.

Current TC principal Jackie Beals says he's excited about the options it will provide students and he's impressed by the school districts he has visited where block scheduling is working well.

"It will be a learning curve for faculty, for them to adjust how they teach, but we are 'all in' and ready for the new schedule," said Beals recently.

Hailed by proponents as a vehicle for greater depth and flexibility in education, block scheduling has turned off some educators and parents, who criticize it as a faddish approach that fails to enhance academic performance.

A handful of factors are motivating middle and high schools



across the United States to adopt block scheduling:

· When students attend as many as eight relatively short classes in different subjects every day, instruction can become fragmented; longer class periods give students more time to think and engage in active learning.

· A schedule with one relatively short period after each school day for four or five minutes of noise and chaotic movement can exacerbate discipline problems.

· Teachers benefit from more useable instructional time each day because less time is lost with beginning and ending classes.

Even though more and more schools are switching to block scheduling, the approach has drawn fire from some educators and parents. Critics of block scheduling assert that the new scheduling format creates or exacerbates certain educational problems.

What will students do for 90-minute periods? critics ask. Proponents of block scheduling cite active learning as the key to keeping students engaged and learning during longer periods. But, even with a block-scheduling format, critics say, many teachers continue simply to lecture students rather than engaging them in active learning. Block scheduling in itself is no guarantee of active learning. And if active learning doesnot take place during, for example, a 90-minute

class period, students may have trouble paying attention for the entire class.

Opponents of block scheduling, like the group Parents for Academic Excellence based in Lansdale, Pennsylvania, point out that student absences create problems under block scheduling. Making up missed work is always difficult. But when a student misses one day of classes under block scheduling, the student misses the equivalent of two days of instruction under the traditional system. A weeklong absence means

the student misses two weeks of material. Such an absence may cause a student to fall behind to the extent that making up the work is difficult.

Teacher absences may lead to other problems, according to doubters. 

One of My Worries

I have worried about this problem for a number of years-finally deciding to speak out about it in order for you to help me worry. Being old, like me, may be an advantage relative to this problem, i.e., die before it fully explodes. But my wife and I have children, grandchildren and I love them and I love America. I love its people and don't want bad things to happen to them. Of course, we have more than this problem with intentions of destroying America, but I will only address our financial problem today.

Most of the data I found supporting my worry comes from the work of Professor Lawrence J. Kotlikoff and Professor Adam N. Michel through the Mercatus Center located at George Mason University-a great little university . . . almost good as MSU.

We are being subjected to a conspiracyhiding our true debt--this con is carried out by the Congressional Budget Office-CBO. The CBO is responding to pressure from Congress and the Executive Branch-both



Democrats and Republicans. The current debt number you see on TV of \$19 trillion-is approximately 10 percent of our total debt of \$210 trillion--if my source is correct and I believe they are. The \$19 trillion is borrowed by selling bonds to keep us afloat, but it does not address our big growing, problem created by unfunded debt. Most of this unfunded debt is created by Congress taking large sums of money from agencies and programs funded from sources other than income taxes-examples are retirement funds, social security, medicare, etc.

Social Security has had trillions, all funds intended for future payments, taken to fund social programsour Congress buying votes with these social programs rather than keeping our retirement funds financed as the law intends, the retirement program we have worked and paid into for 20, 30, 40, 50 years. Currently, every penny paid each year must be used to support that years retirement checks with no funds accumulating for the future. Our first problem with Social Security (SS) is about to occur as baby boomers begin retiringcurrently there are not enough people with jobs paying into SS to support this occurring increase in retirees. Look out!

Another problem this debt is causing is China is shying away from purchasing US Bonds-instead they are using those yearly half trillion trade surplus dollars they take from us, to purchase our farm lands, cattle ranches, etc. Our leaders help them do this-I'd like to see you try to buy land in China. How could one sleep after selling our ability to feed people-especially our

selling to one of our enemies.

We have two options for solving this hidden problem. If we start now, it will take either a 57 percent increase in everyone's taxes or a 37 percent decrease in spending or some combination thereof and these changes will have to be very long term, i.e., permanent. If we wait another few years to start solving this debt the tax increase will be 63 percent or the spending cut will be 40 percent. Ladies and Gentlemen of America we have to build a fire under our politicians in Washington. If they don't respond appropriately right away, let's replace all of them.

ing accidents occur when hunters are mistaken for a turkey. However, there are several things a hunter can do to prevent such a tragedy from happening:

(1) There are only two kinds of safe turkey hunting: calling the birds in, or standing and waiting. Never try stalking.

(2) Be sure you are completely camouflaged;

the front or rear of the decoy. If the decoy is shot from the sides (the most likely angle) you will not be in the line of fire.

- (6) Always practice safe gun handling.
- (7) Always carry a harvested turkey out of the woods in a hunterorange game bag.

What Is Jesus Saying To The Churches? (part XL)

Revelation 3:13 says, "He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches." These words are given at the end of each of the seven letters to the seven churches, but it could be that we might miss the meaning of what is being said here. First, Jesus is saying more than that we should listen with our physical ears, for most of us could do that. Rather, He is saying something to those who have "ears attuned to the spiritual message" that He is giving to the churches. Secondly, Jesus is saying that He allows all to hear who really



want to hear; all who have "ears for the truth" can hear the truth. Thirdly, we need to notice that it is the Spirit Who is saying something to the churches, but we have in Revelation 1:10-20 the fact that Jesus is speaking through John to the churches. Then each of the seven letters has Jesus speaking to them in the first parts of those seven letters. Now we see that our verse says that the Spirit is speaking to the churches. If this does not give us the idea that the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are three members of the one Godhead, then it may be that we need to sharpen our spiritual perception a bit! If Jesus is speaking to the churches, yet the Spirit is speaking to them, then Jesus and the Spirit are members of the same Godhead, along with the Father, moreover Revelation 1:1 says that God gave John "The Revelation", or the Book of Revelation.

Revelation 3:14 says, "And unto the angel of the church of the Laodiceans write; These things saith the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the beginning of the creation of God;" The angel of the church is clearly the pastor, speaking as God's messenger to the church, for the word "angel" means: messenger. So, Jesus is speaking to the pastor of the Laodicean Perhaps some church. church members need to understand that God still leads the churches through godly pastors. I said "godly pastors", because there are some pastors who are simply hired to do a job! Jesus is called the Amen, because He is the "so-beit" of God's plan, meaning that He is the One Who will carry out all that God the Father has given Him to do. Men may say the word "amen", but they may not be able to make it to be so, but when Jesus is the "Amen", whatever He decrees will happen! Jesus speaks to the church at Laodicea as the faithful and true witness, meaning that He sees all that is in the church and He will give witness to the truth that He knows. Men may color their witness on the witness stand, but Jesus is a faithful witness to the truth of God. He is the beginning of the creation of God. Some cults love this phrase, because they want to believe that the Son of God is a created being, but the word here means: "a commencement; or chief; (in various applications of order, time, place or rank)." The word for "beginning" is also translated:

So, when we put the statement given in our verse with the rest of Scripture, we learn that Jesus is not a created being, but that He is the Creator, along with the Father and the Holy Spirit. (His body was "prepared" by the Father, according to Hebrews 10:5, so it could also be in view in our Hebrews 1:8-10 verse.) shows the Father speaking to the Son: "But unto the Son He saith, Thy throne, O God, is for ever and ever: a scepter of righteousness is the scepter of Thy kingdom. Thou hast loved righteousness, and hated iniquity; therefore God, even Thy God, hath anointed Thee with the oil of gladness above Thy fellows. And Thou Lord, in the beginning hast laid the
