## Rail Repairs Approved at Supervisors Meeting

Tishomingo County Administrator Tabo McAnally got approval last week from the supervisors for \$4,500 of work fixing plumbing issues at the Tishomingo County Jail.

According to reports given at recent meetings, there are plumbing problems at the jail that cause one or more showers in various areas to be unavailable.

Due to valve problems, the cost of \$375 each time a malfunction occurs and has to be fixed, McAnally has been trying to find a fix that will stop the problem. This time they have decided that the \$4,500 fix

to the main line will stop the problem. But McAnally has had problems getting bids to do the work. He finally got the most recent bid on the work that includes service to a 4-inch ductile iron pipe.

In other matters, the supervisors approved a new phone line from the 911 office to the sheriff's department. According to 911 Coordinator Ricky Cummings, there are occasions when the 911 dispatcher needs to transfer a call to the sheriff's

## High Schools Transitioning to Block Schedule Next Year

Tishomingo County school administrators are working toward the adoption of a block schedule for Tishomingo County's two high schools beginning next school year.

Most all other schools in the state are on block schedules, and administrators have been working on the transition to the college-style schedule throughout the state. States are adopting block scheduling in dramatically increasing numbers. Contrast with the traditional six-, seven-, or eight-period day, a block schedule consists of three or four longer periods of daily instruction.

We want to offer more academic opportunities to our students through the format of the block schedule.

Superintendent Christie Holly. In the proposed local plan, students would have four 90 minute classes each day, instead of seven. And each course would only last a semester like in college.

As Holly explains, "Currently, if high school students have a full schedule, they can earn 7 credits in a year. With the 4 X 4 block, students with a full schedule could earn 8. Most students who wish to reach more rigorous, upper-level courses can get to those faster in the block schedule format. For example, a student could take Algebra I as a 9th grader in the 1st semester, and then be ready to take Geometry in the 2nd semester. Right now, students' courses are year-long, preventing the advancement of courses to occur more quickly. We also like the block because it allows

more opportunities for students who need to catch up academically. For example, if a student is not successful in Algebra I the 1st semester, he/she can take the course again in the 2nd semester."

In Tishomingo County, one of the major hurdles in integrating the Career and Technical Center classes and transporting them to the Tishomingo campus.

"Also, we wanted to make sure students involved in multiple extra-curricular activities could work in a schedule that would give them as many academic opportunities as possible," said Holly. "In order to work on both of those issues, our team created a schedule that would allow travel time for CTE students and allow them to continue in that path, and we worked on a modified piece of

the schedule for athletics and other extra-curricular activities. We looked at several models to try to find a system that would work for our students' needs. We hope we have a model that will work."

The administration says they may hold parent nights to help the community understand the changes, and the Board of Education is behind them in their decision.

"As with any change, it will take flexibility for the initiative to work, and it may be bumpy at first," said Holly. "But all the districts we have talked to that have made this switch say it is one of the best things they have done."

In fact, educational consultant Dr. Eddie Britton, former principal of TCHS, said that in several districts he's worked with, grades go up across the

board, without exception.

Current TC principal Jackie Beals says he's excited about the options it will provide students and he's impressed by the school districts he has visited where block scheduling is working well.

"It will be a learning curve for faculty, for them to adjust how they teach, but we are 'all in' and ready for the new schedule," said Beals recently.

Hailed by proponents as a vehicle for greater depth and flexibility in education, block scheduling has turned off some educators and parents, who criticize it as a faddish approach that fails to enhance academic performance.

A handful of factors are motivating middle and high schools

## Judges Will Start Assigning Community Service Hours Doing Trash Cleanup

More and more Tishomingo Countians are waking up to the fact that our beautiful country side is looking pretty trashy, and last week, the county board took some action to help fix the problem.

A work program was approved by the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors to allow the justice court judges to sentence offenders in their court to a period of community service - working with the supervisors to help clean up roadsides. It should begin the first court date in April.

South Half Justice Court Judge Donny Joe Sparks met with the board and was more than willing to start implementing a community service program. His willingness was nothing compared to the supervisors' - who all said they could put someone to work that day helping county crews in roadside cleanup.

"I could use 20 today," said Second District Supervisor Nicky McRae.

Those sentenced to community service would report to the supervisor, who would assign them an area to clean up, and the supervisor would be the ones responsible for making sure the work gets done, and the fine or sentence is fulfilled. They would "sign off" when the community service is successfully completed.

Some of the supervisors are already working a few people cleaning up roadsides. In recent years, a crew of state inmates was available, upon request, to come clean up various areas, but when the state pulled all the state inmates out of the county, the county lost thousands of dollars in free labor that was definitely helping the county look a little less trashy.

And this is a pretty plentiful source of labor. According to Justice Court Judge Matthew Clay Cummings, each week at least a couple dozen folks come through the Tishomingo County Justice Court for all manner of (usually) misdemeanor offenses. Those guilty of traffic and misdemeanor criminal charges will be eligible for the road work, unless they are seriously disabled. They will still have to pay fines.

Additionally, the supervisors and Judge Sparks hope to start instilling some pride in Tishomingo County folks by getting them involved in the hands-on maintenance of the county's potentially scenic roadsides.

"Kids need to pay for their offenses in a way that impacts them, instead of grandma and grandpa coming and paying their fines for them," said Sparks. The supervisors indicated that a lot of the careless littering is garbage being thrown from vehicles - something easily avoided.

across the United States to adopt block scheduling:

- When students attend as many as eight relatively short classes in different subjects every day, instruction can become fragmented; longer class periods give students more time to think and engage in active learning.
- A schedule with one relatively short period after another can create a hectic, assembly-line environment;
- A schedule that releases hundreds or thousands of adolescents into hallways six, seven, or eight times

each school day for four or five minutes of noise and chaotic movement can exacerbate discipline problems.

Teachers benefit from more useable instructional time each day because less time is lost with beginning and ending classes.

Even though more and more schools are switching to block scheduling, the approach has drawn fire from some educators and parents. Critics of block scheduling assert that the new scheduling format creates or exacerbates certain educational

problems.

What will students do for 90-minute periods? critics ask. Proponents of block scheduling cite active learning as the key to keeping students engaged and learning during longer periods. But, even with a block-scheduling format, critics say, many teachers continue simply to lecture students rather than engaging them in active learning. Block scheduling in itself is no guarantee of active learning. And if active learning doesn't take place during, for example, a 90-minute

class period, students may have trouble paying attention for the entire class.

Opponents of block scheduling, like the group Parents for Academic Excellence based in Lansdale, Pennsylvania, point out that student absences create problems under block scheduling. Making up missed work is always difficult. But when a student misses one day of classes under block scheduling, the student misses the equivalent of two days of instruction under the traditional system. A weeklong absence means

the student misses two weeks of material. Such an absence may cause a student to fall behind to the extent that making up the work is difficult.

Teacher absences may lead to other problems, according to doubters. Under block scheduling, will a substitute teacher be qualified to teach 90-minute periods of, for example, physics?

Courses like languages or mathematics are sequential. Some critics of block scheduling point out that a student may take French I in the fall,

not take French in the spring, go to the summer, and take French II the following fall. At issue is much French the student will recall after a break several months. Advocates of block scheduling most forgetting to take in the first few weeks a course is taken. Critics point to studies indicate greater loss over longer periods of time.

# One of My Worries

I have worried about this problem for a number of years—finally deciding to speak out about it in order for you to help me worry. Being old, like me, may be an advantage relative to this problem, i.e., die before it fully explodes. But my wife and I have children, grandchildren and I love them and I love America. I love its people and don't want bad things to happen to them. Of course, we have more than this problem with intentions of destroying America, but I will only address our financial problem today.

Most of the data I found supporting my worry comes from the work of Professor Lawrence J. Kotlikoff and Professor Adam N. Michel through the Mercatus Center located at George Mason University—a great little university... almost good as MSU.

Look out!

Another problem this debt is causing is China is shying away from purchasing US Bonds—instead they are using those yearly half trillion trade surplus dollars they take from us, to purchase our farm lands, cattle ranches, etc. Our leaders help them do this—I'd like to see you try to buy land in China. How could one sleep after selling our ability to feed our people—especially

selling to one of our enemies.

We have two options for solving this hidden problem. If we start now, it will take either a 57 percent increase in everyone's taxes or a 37 percent decrease in spending or some combination thereof and these changes will have to be very long term, i.e., permanent. If we wait another few years to start solving this debt the tax increase will be 63 percent or the spending cut will be 40 percent. ## Amnesty Program Ends in Two Weeks

\*\*\*UPDATE: March 15, 2016 - Tishomingo County Sheriff John Daugherty would like to remind everyone to get their fines took care of during this AMNESTY period. The Justice Court office is seeing some great results and we would like for everyone to be able to get their fines took care of! Remember, we have just 2 weeks left before the AMNESTY PROGRAM is concluded\*\*\*

In an effort to clear a backlog of old fines and warrants that are owed to the Tishomingo County, the Tishomingo County Justice Court, will be offering an AMNESTY PROGRAM during the month of March.

This AMNESTY PROGRAM will pertain to OLD FINES ONLY. The purpose of this program is to provide relief to individuals who may have found themselves in violation of a court ordered obligation because they were financially unable to pay

fines. This program will also allow officers to focus on recent cases and allow individuals to avoid further penalties and possible incarceration.

**Program Details:**  
The Program will run from March 1, 2016 through April 1, 2016

It will cover any old fine balances that have been previously set by the court or any old fines remaining PRIOR to March 1, 2016

Anyone with outstanding fines can come in and resume payments or schedule a new payment plan

Anyone taking advantage of this program will have arrest warrants for "FAILURE TO PAY" "FAILURE TO APPEAR" rescinded

Individuals who voluntarily appear at the Tishomingo County Justice Court to address delinquent fines or warrants for "FAILURE TO PAY" and "FAILURE TO APPEAR" will not be arrested

PEAR" will not be arrested

It is very important to remember that under this program there are two qualifying factors for AMNESTY

INDIVIDUALS MUST HAVE COURT ORDERED OBLIGATIONS THAT WERE

INCURRED PRIOR TO MARCH 1, 2016

The judges and court administrators have agreed that this AMNESTY PROGRAM will allow people who have fallen behind on their payments or have failed to pay as previously agreed to by court order to make

good on their payments and NOT be subject to being held in "Contempt of Court" for nonpayment.

It is in the best interest of those with warrants for unpaid fines to come in voluntarily. Sheriff Daugherty states, "We understand that there are those who may have had

difficulty in paying fines in the past, and is why the AMNESTY PROGRAM has brought back, but you have to come yourself and take care between March 1, 2016 and April 1, 2016"

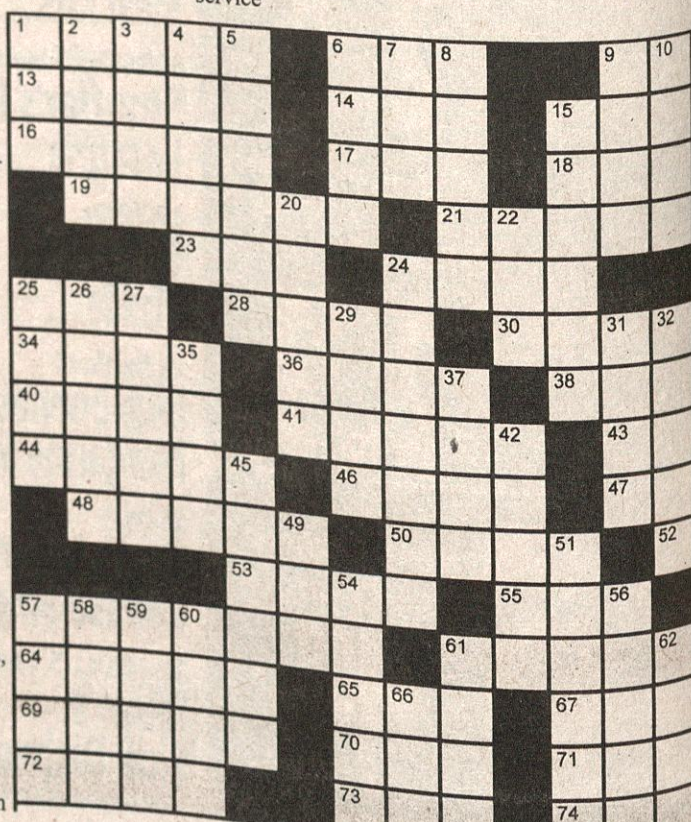

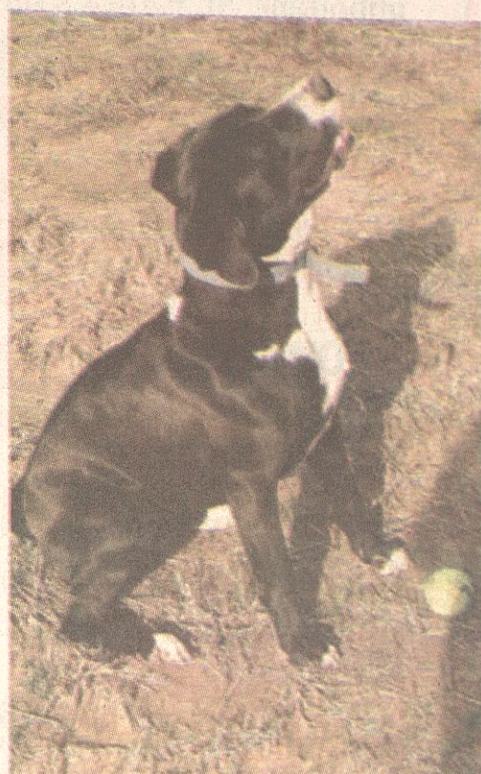

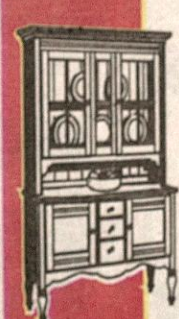

## Turkey Season Begins

Mr. Keele, 74, of Iuka hit the woods early Tuesday morning on the first day of turkey season and brought home a trophy bird before lunch. The turkey, suspected to be 4 or 5 years old weighed 21 pounds, had 1 1/4 inch spurs and an 8-inch beard. Mr. Keele, an avid hunter that brought home the Mississippi state record turkey in 2011, killed this bird in the north end of Tishomingo County in the Sharp Hunting Club. Mr. Keele, who will turn 75 this week, does not let anything keep him out of the woods. He reported he recently had a mishap with his pacemaker, had two shocks, and turned up and he's in the woods again and will be till turkey season ends on the last day of May.

## Turkey Hunting Safety

### Conservation Corner

Warm weather is upon us and the early spring turkey season is slowly adding hunters to the woods again. Turkey hunting has been going on for many years and turkey hunters have been gobbling and calling for many years. The 2016 season. Once your calling has been fine-tuned, safety is the next concern, one that is too many. More accidents occur every year to turkey hunters than in any other kind of hunting. Many of these accidents could be prevented if hunters would follow the Ten Commandments of Firearm Handling - something which every person who has a hunter education should know and follow. While we're on the subject, it's not a bad idea to enroll in a hunter education course, just for the fresher (take along a shotgun or hunting buddies). You're never too old to learn about safety. Because the hunter is often in the woods, turkey hunters should wear hunter orange. Most turkey hunt-

ing accidents occur when hunters are mistaken for a turkey. However, there are several things a hunter can do to prevent such a tragedy from happening:

- (1) There are only two kinds of safe turkey hunting: calling the birds in, or standing and waiting. Never try stalking.
- (2) Be sure you are completely camouflaged; however, when moving to and from a hunting site, always wear hunter orange.
- (3) Pick your hunting spot with a good backrest. A tree or embankment wide enough to completely cover your outline from the rear will protect you from being shot from behind.
- (4) If another hunter comes near, call out in a calm voice. Don't shout, whistle, stand or wave and especially don't give a turkey call. Keep your distance from other hunters.
- (5) Use only hen decoys. Place the decoy so you are safe from shots by other hunters. Position yourself either to

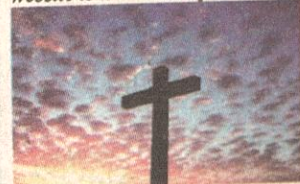
the front or rear of the decoy. If the decoy is shot from the sides (the most likely angle) you will not be in the line of fire.

- (6) Always practice safe gun handling.
- (7) Always carry a harvested turkey out of the woods in a hunter-orange game bag.

When you are in the woods this spring, make every effort not to throw trash on the ground. If you see trash in the woods or on the ground at the parking area, pick it up, put it in your pocket or throw it in the back of the truck.

Have a safe and successful turkey season.

## County Republicans to Meet March 22<sup>nd</sup>

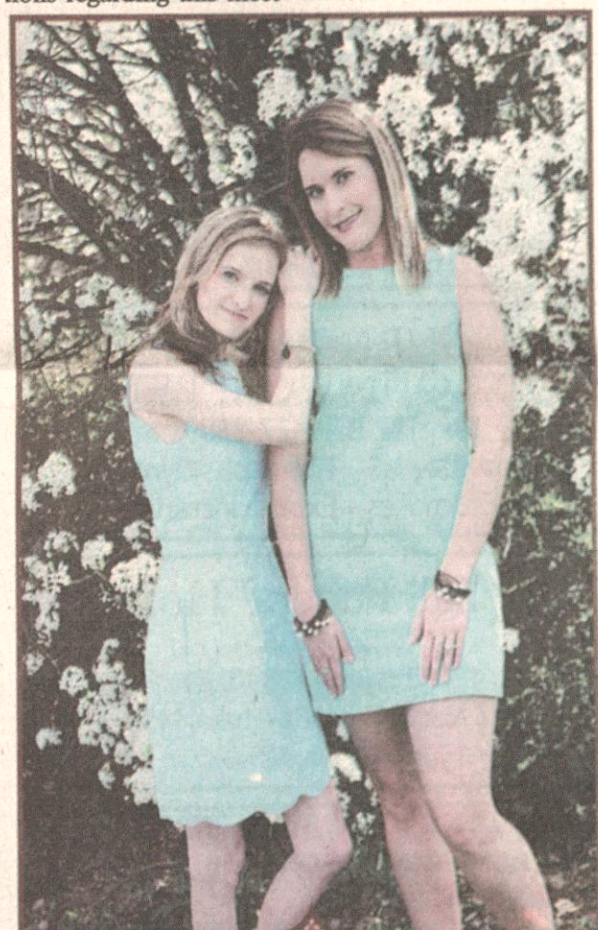

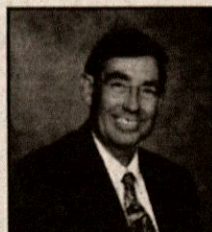

## What Is Jesus Saying To The Churches? (part XL)

Revelation 3:13 says, "He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches." These words are given at the end of each of the seven letters to the seven churches, but it could be that we might miss the meaning of what is being said here. First, Jesus is saying more than that we should listen with our physical ears, for most of us could do that. Rather, He is saying something to those who have "ears attuned to the spiritual message" that He is giving to the churches. Secondly, Jesus is saying that He allows all to hear who really

want to hear; all who have "ears for the truth" can hear the truth. Thirdly, we need to notice that it is the Spirit Who is saying something to the churches, but we have in Revelation 1:10-20 the fact that Jesus is speaking through John to the churches. Then each of the seven letters has Jesus speaking to them in the first parts of those seven letters. Now we see that our verse says that the Spirit is speaking to the churches. If this does not give us the idea that the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are three members of the one Godhead, then it may be that we need to sharpen our spiritual perception a

bit! If Jesus is speaking to the churches, yet the Spirit is speaking to them, then Jesus and the Spirit are members of the same Godhead, along with the Father, moreover Revelation 1:1 says that God gave John "The Revelation", or the Book of Revelation.

Revelation 3:14 says, "And unto the angel of the church of the Laodiceans write; These things saith the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the beginning of the creation of God;" The angel of the church is clearly the pastor, speaking as God's messenger to the church, for the word "angel" means: messenger. So, Jesus is speaking to the pastor of the Laodicean church. Perhaps some church members need to understand that God still leads the churches through godly pastors. I said "godly pastors", because there are some pastors who are simply hired to do a job! Jesus is called the Amen,

because He is the "so-be-it" of God's plan, meaning that He is the One Who will carry out all that God the Father has given Him to do. Men may say the word "amen", but they may not be able to make it to be so, but when Jesus is the "Amen", whatever He decrees will happen! Jesus speaks to the church at Laodicea as the faithful and true witness, meaning that He sees all that is in the church and He will give witness to the truth that He knows. Men may color their witness on the witness stand, but Jesus is a faithful witness to the truth of God. He is the beginning of the creation of God. Some cults love this phrase, because they want to believe that the Son of God is a created being, but the word here means: "a commencement; or chief; (in various applications of order, time, place or rank)." The word for "beginning" is also translated:

"corner, first, magistrate, power, principality, principle and rule." So, when we put the statement given in our verse with the rest of Scripture, we learn that Jesus is not a created being, but that He is the Creator, along with the Father and the Holy Spirit. (His body was "prepared" by the Father, according to Hebrews 10:5, so it could also be in view in our verse.) Hebrews 1:8-10 shows the Father speaking to the Son: "But unto the Son He saith, Thy throne, O God, is for ever and ever: a scepter of righteousness is the scepter of Thy kingdom. Thou hast loved righteousness, and hated iniquity; therefore God, even Thy God, hath anointed Thee with the oil of gladness above Thy fellows. And Thou Lord, in the beginning hast laid the foundation of the earth; and the heavens are the work of Thine hands." Then we have verses like

Tishomingo County  
Isaiah 44:24, "Thus saith the Lord, thy Redeemer, that formed thee in the womb, I am the one that maketh all things stretch forth alone; that spread abroad the earth by myself." If there is no deity, then we have a problem with two Creators since there is a Trinity. We have God (Father, Son, Holy Spirit) saying, "I have made the heaven and the earth alone, or myself. There are no other references to show that Jesus is a member of the Godhead, not a created being." Colossians 1:15-17, "The Son of God, the firstborn of all creation, by whom all things were created, visible and invisible, things in heaven and things on earth, all things were created by Him and for Him; and He is before all things, and by Him all things were sustained." 1:16, "By Him all things were created, visible and invisible, things in heaven and things on earth, all things were created by Him and for Him; and He is before all things, and by Him all things were sustained." 1:17, "He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation, by whom all things were created, visible and invisible, things in heaven and things on earth, all things were created by Him and for Him; and He is before all things, and by Him all things were sustained." 1:18, "He is the head of the church, His body, of which He is the Savior, who has redeemed Himself by His own blood, to present to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or anything of the kind, but that it should be holy and without blemish." 1:19, "This is the mystery of the church, the body of His flesh, which He has saved with His blood, to present to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or anything of the kind, but that it should be holy and without blemish." 1:20, "That He might present to Himself the church in all its glory, having no spot or wrinkle or anything of the kind, but that it should be holy and without blemish, which He has cleansed by the word of His water with the word of His blood, that He might present to Himself the church in all its glory, having no spot or wrinkle or anything of the kind, but that it should be holy and without blemish."



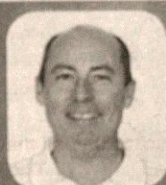

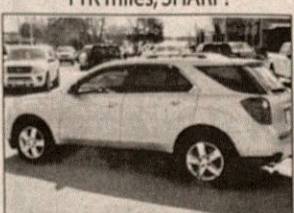

## ORDINANCE OF CITY OF IUKA, COUNTY OF TISHOMINGO, MISSISSIPPI, PROHIBITING SIGNAGE WITHIN THREE FEET OF ANY ROADWAY RIGHT-OF-WAY WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY.

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Iuka do hereby by FIND, DETERMINE AND ADJUDGE as follows:

That signage cannot block the view or otherwise distract motorists on, pulling off or pulling onto public roadways; and That the City and public safety would be served to reduce possible traffic and safety hazards through sign regulation by levying reasonable restrictions on said signage.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF IUKA, MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1:** It shall be unlawful for any sign which by reason of size, shape, content, coloring, location or manner of illumination interferes with driver visibility or any traffic control device or sign.

**SECTION 2:** It shall be unlawful for any public individual or entity to place any sign which resembles any traffic control or emergency device or sign which creates any traffic disruption.

**SECTION 3:** It shall be unlawful for any individual or entity to place any sign which bears or contains statements, words or pictures of an obscene, pornographic, immoral character, or which contains advertising matter which is untruthful.

**SECTION 4:** It shall be unlawful for any individual or entity to place any sign or any type of advertising material including written on or affixed upon any tree, bush, shrubbery, utility pole, traffic sign, fence or street marker on or within three feet of a public right-of-way.

**SECTION 5:** It shall be unlawful for any individual or entity to place any sign placed on, in or over any private property without the consent of the property owner.

**SECTION 6:** Any person found guilty of violating the provisions of this article shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and may be punished by a fine of no less than \$25.00 for each violation.

**SECTION 7:** That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from thirty days from the date of this passage.

**SECTION 8:** That this ordinance be published one time as required by statute, and shall be recorded in the Ordinance Book of the municipality.

# ORDINANCE OF CITY OF IUKA, COUNTY OF TISHOMINGO, MISSISSIPPI, REQUIRING ALL PARADES, PROCESSIONS AND PUBLIC DEMONSTRATIONS TO OBTAIN A PERMIT FROM PARTICIPANTS AND SPECTATORS TO BE IN A LAWFUL MANNER AND TO PRESCRIBE PENALTIES IF THEY DO NOT, AS WELL AS SET AN APPEAL PROCESS.

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Iuka Mississippi hereby ordain and adjudge as follows:

FIND, DETERMINE AND ADJUDGE as follows:  
That parades, public demonstrations or other events that take place in public roadways or walkways may be dangerous due to the place in said trafficked areas; and That the City and public safety would be served levying restrictions on said events.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF IUKA, MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1:** It shall be unlawful to organize or hold a parade, procession or other public demonstration on the streets or roadways of the city, unless a permit therefor has been secured from the city clerk.

**SECTION 2:** To secure such permit, written application shall be made to the city clerk, setting forth the approximate number of persons and vehicles which will be engaged in such parade, procession or other public demonstration, the purpose for which it is to be held, and the streets or other public ways over, along or in which it is to be held, and the city clerk shall grant a written permit for such parade, procession or other public demonstration, prescribing the streets or other public ways which may be used therefor, and the city clerk shall find the conduct of the parade will unreasonably interfere with fire and police protection. The city clerk in denying the application for a parade permit shall be empowered to authorize the conduct of a parade on a date, at a time, or over a route different from that requested by the applicant if reasonable.

**SECTION 3:** If any application for a permit required by this ordinance is denied, after the filing of a proper application therefor, the applicant shall have the right to have the mayor and board of aldermen review the application immediately, and to pass on whether the request should be issued or not, by filing with the city clerk a written request for a review of the action of the city clerk with respect to the application. Such review shall be held within forty-eight (48) hours after the filing of such request with the city clerk, and the applicant shall have the right to appear thereat and to present proof in support of the application. The mayor and board of aldermen shall, without delay, determine the question of whether the permit should be issued or not, and it be of the opinion that such permit should be issued, the same shall be issued forthwith.

**SECTION 4:** Participants in parades, processions or other public demonstrations subject to this article shall conduct themselves in the following manner:  
All traffic directions at intersections along the route of the parade or procession of police officers shall be obeyed.  
All persons covered by the permit shall adhere strictly to the direction of the route.  
All persons covered by the permit must assemble at the place designated and in formation.  
No parade route shall be approved that physically crosses a track.

No parade, assembly, individual or individuals shall gather at an intersection or otherwise block traffic to distribute literature, or for any other such purpose that might engage or otherwise interfere with automobile drivers passing through.

**SECTION 6:** Parade spectators and the general public in and around such demonstrations or parades shall conduct themselves in the following manner:  
No person shall unreasonably hamper, obstruct or impede the progress of any parade or parade assembly or with any person or vehicle participating or used in a parade.  
No driver of a vehicle shall drive between the vehicles or persons participating in a parade when those vehicles or persons are in motion or conspicuously designated as a parade.

**SECTION 7:** This article shall not apply to funeral processions.  
**SECTION 8:** Any person found guilty of violating the provisions of this article shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of no less than \$100.00. Since public and private property, civil rights, and the general welfare may be involved in the enforcement of this article, and since criminal proceedings may not be an effective remedy because of the multiplicity of prosecutions, the failure of such prosecutions to protect property and civil rights, the city is hereby authorized, in addition to criminal proceedings, to grant injunctive relief against violators of this article and such injunctive relief may be sought against individuals and against organizations.

**SECTION 9:** That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from thirty days from the date of this passage.

**SECTION 10:** That this ordinance be published one time in the official newspaper of the City of Iuka, Mississippi, as required by statute, and shall be recorded in the Ordinance Book of the City of Iuka, Mississippi.

**SECTION 11:** If any Section, subsection or sentence of this document is found to be unlawful or otherwise unenforceable, the remaining enforceable portions shall remain in full effect and shall not be voided herein.
