Homeowner Apprehends Burglary Suspect; Holds at Gunpoint

Late Saturday night, a homeowner in Belmont managed to apprehend a burglar and hold him at gunpoint until authorities arrived.

Justin Howard Gober, 19, County Road 864, has been charged with burglary of a dwelling for at least one home invasion and likely two, after he forced the home of Harold and Wanda Rogers, pilfered through their things and was apprehended by the homeowner.

According to Belmont Po-

lice Officer Donald Ray Thomas, he and Sheriff John Dennis Daugherty were on patrol around midnight in the area dealing with another incident when they were advised of a young white male walking to different homes on County Road 864, Redbud Road, in Belmont.

Around midnight, officers got a call that the Rogers had the suspect detained. Officer Thomas arrived to see that Harold Rogers had Gober on the ground, as advised by the dispatcher. Thomas took him into custody, and Daugherty and others arrived soon after.

Wanda Rogers recounted on social media: Woke up around 11:30 by a strange man standing at our bedroom door only 2 feet away from our heads with a gun and a knife. He was highly

drugged and had rambled outside and broke in our kitchen window, went through our kitchen cabinets and was headed down the hall I guess when I woke up and saw him. By God's grace, Harold chased him out of the house, was able to get to a gun and held him down at gunpoint until our wonderful lawman of this county arrived.

Thomas said that Gober lives nearby with an aunt, who noticed he seemed "out of it," when he came home, and Gober

said he was going to walk out on the road. She went to bed and was unaware of the events of the night, said Thomas. Thomas said Gober apparently also broke into another, unoccupied home, and had in his possession prescription medicine from the deceased homeowner.

Gober was held on a \$25,000 bond in the Tishomingo County Jail.

Attempts to contact the homeowners for a direct statement were unsuccessful.

Supervisors Asks County to Get on Board with Great American Cleanup

Tishomingo County will be part in the Great American Cleanup on April 23rd and the board of supervisors is asking everyone to pitch in and help the county cleaned up!

April 23rd, the supervisors will be on hand to distribute big garbage sacks to use in road cleanup. Most will be at their shop, but Jeff Holt will be at the Tishomingo Community Center to distribute to both 4th District and Tishomingo town volunteers.

Volunteers can leave filled bags on roadsides and supervisors crews will come pick them all up.

Volunteers are encouraged to get a group together, and community groups like Pilot, Rotary, and the many other organizations throughout the county are encouraged to turn out to make a difference this day.

Turner is currently being held at the Tishomingo County Jail with a charge of Possession of Controlled Substance (Methamphetamine). Turner had a \$25,000 Felony bond set for the Possession of Controlled Substance. Turner will be presented to the next Tishomingo County Grand Jury.

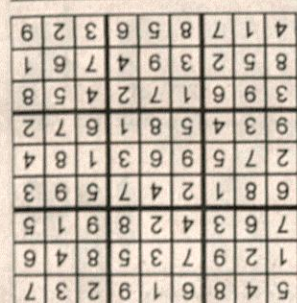

United Daughters Of The Confederacy Met

The United Daughters of the Confederacy, John Marshall Stone #394 met March 15th at 4 p.m. at the Tishomingo Archives and History Museum in Iuka. We met in the John Marshall Stone Library. Those present were Mary Ledbetter, Vickie Durham, Eunell Handy, and Sharon Hairrell.

We saluted the United States Flag, Mississippi Flag and the Confederate Flag, completed the U.D.C. rituals, the Lord's Prayer and the singing of Dixie. The meeting was called to order by President Sharon Hairrell, she read the minutes from the last meeting and they were approved. The old business was discussed and new business was discussed. Three members were making plans to attend District 1 meeting being hosted by Corinth 333 at the Alcorn County Extension Center in Corinth, Ms. We voted to purchase a wreath for the Mississippi Monument at Shiloh National Park, all chapters were asked to bring a wreath for this event April 9th. We decided that we will have a Confederate Memorial Program April 22nd at 10 a.m., we will be placing a wreath at the Mississippi Monument at the Tishomingo County Archives and History museum and at the graves of Unknown Soldiers in the Shady Grove Cemetery. The Sons of the Confederacy, newly formed "Brigadier General Henry Little" will be joining us. Eunell Handy gave the treasure report and it was approved and she gave Registrar Report, she has five applications that she is working on. Chaplain Mary Ledbetter had nothing to report.

Eunell Handy presented the program, Emeline Pigott, Confederate Nurse and Spy. North Carolina native Emeline Pigott offered her services to the Confederate Army as a spy. Single and 25 years old, Pigott hosted parties for local Union soldiers and gathered information about their plans. Emeline had a great passionate desire to assist the Confederate cause. She offered her services as a spy and gathered food and clothing for the soldiers. She would hide the items in designated hollow trees, so the soldiers could retrieve them later. She also cared for wounded soldiers, sometimes nursing them back to health in her home.

Working in three neighboring counties, she distributed mail and supplies to the soldiers, and gathered information about Federal ships, their tonnage and cargo, and passed it on to the authorities across Calico Creek.

When the Union won the Battle of New Bern and the Confederate's were rushed out of town, Emeline went along to care for the wounded on the last train out before the northerners occupied the town. When the Union arrived they found the town and homes empty.

Emeline and a soldier named Stokes McRae fell in love, but decided not to marry until after the war. When McRae went to the battlefield, he took along a special Confederate flag that Emeline had made him. He survived the Battle of New Bern but lost his flag. McRae was killed at Gettysburg, in July 1863.

She narrowly escaped capture several times,

and disregarded her own safety in order to complete her mission. She sometimes carried up to thirty pounds of supplies and intelligence information in huge pockets inside her hoop skirt.

She was arrested and sent to prison by Union soldiers. While waiting for a female to search her, Emeline ate some of the papers she had tucked in her blouse which contained important infor-

mation and tore up other papers. The Unionists discovered the large amount of supplies that were hidden in pockets inside her skirt. She faced the death penalty, but was released after two months, with-

out going to trial. She returned to her family's farm. She never married; her heart was always with Stokes McRae. She never revealed how she came to be released from prison. She died May 26th, 1916

at the age of 80. Our next meeting be April 22nd at 10 a.m. at the Tishomingo County Archives and History Museum for the "Confederate Memorial Day Program"

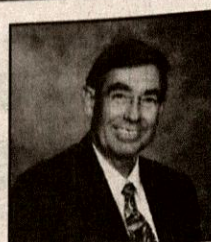

What Is Jesus Saying To The Churches? (part XLI)

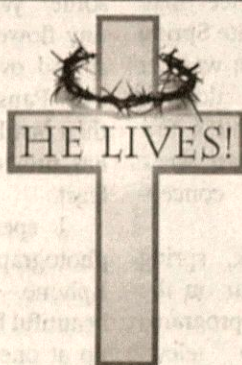
The church at Laodicea was likely the least spiritual church of the seven churches named in Revelation chapters 2 and 3. Revelation 3:15-16 shows the attitude of Jesus toward this church: "I know thy works, that thou art neither cold nor hot: I would that thou wert cold or hot. So then because thou art lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will spue thee out of My mouth."

The statement that Jesus knew the works of the church at Laodicea should remind us that He knows the works of all churches and individuals! While other churches in our list have some things which Jesus could commend, the



church at Laodicea has none! The idea that this church was neither cold nor hot seems to be saying that they were a "sickening" lukewarm church, sort of like lukewarm coffee! Some churches remind me of this church, for they want to be sure that they are not "too fundamental" or "too liberal"; they want to be in a position that everybody will like. It is time true believers stand up for the Word of God; Christian convictions and principles and the right to voice our opinions in a world of ungodliness! So what if some people may not like us; most people did not really like Jesus

Tishomingo County
Christ, for they basically followed for the "loaves and fishes".
Jesus said that He would spue this church out of His mouth, which does not mean that they had been saved and would then be lost, rather it means that He would have no fellowship with them. It is not a "given" that everybody in this church was saved, nor is it a "given" that all were lost. In most all churches there are both saved and lost people on the roles.
Revelation 3:17-18 says, "Because thou sayest, I am rich, and increased with goods, and have need of nothing; and knowest not that thou art wretched, and miserable, and poor, and blind, and naked. I counsel thee to buy of Me gold tried in the fire, that thou mayest be rich; and white raiment, that thou mayest be clothed, and that the shame of thy nakedness do not appear; and anoint thine eyes with eye-salve, that thou mayest see."
The understanding of Jesus had of the condition of this church was far different than the attitude she had about herself! This church was rich; Jesus said she was poor. She had plenty of gold, but Jesus said she was poor, miserable, and naked. The counsel of Jesus was to buy of Him gold that had been tried in the fire; she should have white raiment that she would appear naked in public, so that she could see her spiritual condition. I have heard that many churches are so proud of their "church", when the real reason to be of the supply that Jesus offers, for we have no worth boasting about our own!

Mayapple

CONSERVATION CORNER

by James L. Cummins

The mayapple is a herbaceous plant. It is found primarily in woodlands and partially shaded hillsides. This plant goes by several names including: duck's foot, Devil's apple, wild lemon, hog apple, love apple, Indian apple and umbrella plant.

Mayapple grows between 1 and 2 feet in height. Some plants produce a single leaf from a long stalk. These plants do not produce a flower. Mayapple plants with two leaves produce a single nodding flower that blossoms below the leaves. The plant typically bears lobed leaves that span up to 1 foot across and 1 foot in length. There are between 5 and 9 lobes per leaf that are deeply divided. The flower that is produced is about 1.5 inches across and has between 8 and 9 white petals. The blooming period occurs from mid- to late spring and lasts about 3 weeks. Each flower is replaced by an egg-shaped berry that resembles a cherry, is fleshy and contains several seeds. Two weeks after the berries are ripe, this berry produces only when cross-pollination of the flower occurs. Mayapple often produces dense vegetative colonies that exclude other spring flowering plants.

All parts of the plant, except the fruit, are poisonous. Even the fruit, though not dangerously poisonous, can cause unpleasant indigestion. Ancient records show that American eth-



nic groups drank a ferment prepared from the dehydrated and crushed rhizome of mayapple as a medication to cure worms in the intestines. They also used the substance as a remedy for snakebites and as a laxative to clean the bowel.

Later, mayapple was used as an ingredient for preparing a laxative and sold over the counter as a medicine called "Carter's Little Liver Pills." Today, herbal practitioners use different parts of the mayapple to treat things such as warts or moles and have used them to combat some skin cancers.

According to researchers, podophyllotoxin, (the fatal ingredient of the herb), stops cell division and also possesses the ability to restrain tumor production. Of significant note, the Federal Drug Administration (FDA) has approved two drugs—etoposide and teniposide—prepared from podophyllotoxin for use in the United States.

Etoposide is administered as a treatment for testicular and small-cell lung cancers and rheumatoid arthri-

tis. Teniposide is used for conditions including brain tumors, infancy leukemia, a variety of lymphomas and other neoplastic diseases. However, the FDA has banned the use of mayapple as a laxative due to the highly toxic nature of the plant which makes dosing difficult to calculate.

Podophyllotoxin is too toxic for home use due to its caustic nature and products for oral use have been withdrawn from the market for safety. Topical preparations of podophyllotoxin require professional application and must be rinsed off after 1 to 4 hours. Because human poisoning can result from topical application, as well as ingestion, it is important that you be able to identify this plant in order to avoid contact.
