



Another Moonshine Still Busted by Sheriff's Department

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department has made another moonshine manufacturing arrest.

According to the department, deputies were serving a chancery court order on Robert Junior Voyles, 48 of County Road 317 in Burnsville when they noticed an active and operational moonshine distillery along with other items used to make the illegal whiskey, and firearms. Voyles is a convicted

felon, and is forbidden the possession of firearms.

The sheriff's department contacted the Mississippi Alcoholic Beverage Control agents, who continued the investigation and brought in Voyles. Charges are pending.

Charlotte's Attic

1895 Bootlegger Funeral

In December of 1895 Ed Thomas of the Red Sulphur Springs area was laid to rest, surrounded by his family and friends. In the crowd were his three uncles, the famous "moonshiners" Gus

Thomas, Bob Thomas and Dick Thomas. Ed had been killed by revenuers at his still. The Thomas family was known for their illegal moonshine operations in Hardin County, Tennessee and Tishom-

ingo County, Mississippi. They operated more than 30 stills in the area, with Bob in charge of the Mississippi operations some three miles inside the Mississippi line just across Yellow Creek.

The Thomas brothers were born about one mile north of the Red Sulphur Springs Hotel (which still stands today). Their father, James Thomas settled the land from there to the river and taught the

boys the art of making good moonshine. The unlicensed moonshine made by the Thomas family was carried by boats to Sheffield, Alabama, where it was labeled and then shipped to Paducah, Ken-

tucky. A book, "Moonshine, Murder, Mercy and More," written in 1960 by Russ Roberts of Pickensville, Tennessee, tells the story of the Thomas family. He tells of a traveling salesman who was killed at the Red Sulphur Springs Hotel on New Year's Eve 1894. The body was found in Tishomingo County. Comments taken from the *Vidette* about the murder: "One of the most ATROCIOUS murders ever committed in the area."

Because Ed and Gus Thomas were suspected of the murder of the stranger, the law began to close in on the Thomas operations. When the collector raided the Ed Thomas place they found Ed there alone and commanded "Hand up!" Ed raised his Winchester rifle and was shot immediately.

The shooting of Ed Thomas led to the murder of John Kennedy (thought to be an informant). Bob, Gus and Dick Thomas stood trial for the Kennedy murder. This ended the moonshine stills of the Thomas family in Hardin and Tishomingo Counties.



South Cousins

Sue, Pud, and Abe South were first cousins who grew up in the New Salem Community. Sue was born in November, Pud in February and Abe in April. As first cousins do, they spent their early years together playing in the yard at the Willie South home place. The

photo below was taken in the early 50's when the cousins were in the third grade at Central School.

The trio gathered at a family reunion in 1994 and posed for a photo in the same position as when they were young. Today only Pud Hendrix lives in Iuka. She returned home

after fifty years of being away. Sue Hill lives in Cabot, Arkansas and Abe South lives in Killen, Alabama.

A Glimpse Into Heaven (part VIII)

The scene before us in Revelation is a heavenly scene, but it shows terrible judgments that Jesus Christ is about to pour out on earth during the tribulation through the opening of the seven sealed book. Revelation 6:5-6 says, "And when He had opened the third seal, I heard the third beast say, Come and see. And I beheld, and lo a black horse; and he that sat on him had a pair of balances in his hand. And I heard a voice in the midst of the four beasts say, A measure of wheat for a penny, and three measures of barley for a penny; and see thou hurt not the oil and the wine." The seven sealed scroll (called a book) is being opened by the Son of God, Who has both the right and the power to judge the wickedness of men on earth! When Jesus had opened the third seal, one of the angels (beasts) invited John, and us, to come and see what was about to happen. It is interesting that most people want to think only of the good and exciting things that are going to happen to the saved in the future. Perhaps we should understand that the judgment of wickedness on earth is also a part of God's plan to eventually give the earth to the people of God, so the judgments being poured out here are both for the glory of God and the good of His people, moreover, they are necessary for the fulfilling of God's plan to remove the open practice of wickedness from the earth during the period of the thousand year reign of Christ on earth!

Black usually speaks of something bad or judgmental in the Bible, even as it often does in our day. The third horse is black, and his rider is delivering a bad message. It is Christ Who tells this rider what to say, even though the rider does not seem to be good. The rider says that it will take a day's wages (called a penny here) to buy a measure of wheat, or one may buy three measures of barley for a penny. (Barley made a more course and cheaper bread.) The rider was to leave the oil and wine untouched by judgment, which seems to mean that the more wealthy will fare better in this time of tribulation than the poor, as has usually been the case throughout history. The rider on the black horse has a pair of scales in his hand to measure exactly how much food can be bought for a day's wages. It is sad that individuals and nations will not have enough money, or enough food supply, to meet daily needs during this time of judgment. I may need to say that God will be primarily judging Israel during the tribulation to get them ready to receive Jesus as their Messiah, but others will also suffer during this terrible time. If it should seem that Christ is being too hard on mankind during the tribulation, it might be worth noting that mankind has spit in the face of God for thousands of years, thus judgment is being measured out according to the deserving of fallen humanity!



History and Religious Studies Student to Participate in Summer Archaeology Program in Israel

Judson College (Marietta, AL) junior Marianna Nichols of Iuka will be attending the Harvard University Summer Program in Ashkelon, Israel this summer.

The 6-week program offers the opportunity for participating students to work alongside volunteers and a professional archaeological staff to excavate Ashkelon, an important ancient seaport on the Mediterranean coast. Nichols will complete field training in methods of stratigraphic excavation, recording, and interpretation and will have opportunities to attend workshops on such topics as surveying, photography, ceramics, geology, GIS analysis, and conservation of artifacts.

Nichols's Ashkelon experience will continue learning she began last summer when she worked at the Historic Trades Internship at the George Washington Entrepreneur Internship Program. As she volunteered with Mount Vernon's Archaeology Department at a slave cemetery dig site, she recognized the project's significance for her future.

"That opportunity was particularly significant for me because I want to go into archaeology and anthropology for my graduate work."

Her summer opportunity at Ashkelon holds special significance for the double History and Religious Studies major, who now adds "with a specific

focus on ancient religions" to her graduate school plans. With artifacts dating back to the Neolithic era and spanning occupations by Canaanite, Philistine, Persian, Christian, and Islamic peoples, Ashkelon is an important opportunity for Nichols, who dreams of becoming a college professor and traveling with her students to historic sites to study archaeology and anthropology.

Her participation in the Mount Vernon and Ashkelon programs aren't Nichols's first time to seize opportunities to explore the field of archaeology during her time at Judson. Last spring, her paper "Pompeii: Archaeology and the Life of a City" won the award for best undergraduate conference paper at the regional Phi Alpha Theta Alabama Regional Conference at the University of Alabama at Huntsville. Nichols earned other accolades at Judson's Spring 2016 Honors Convocation, winning Outstanding Student awards in both History and Religious Studies.

In addition to her study abroad experience at Ashkelon this summer, Nichols has plans to


study overseas this fall. She recently learned of her acceptance into Oxford University's "Scholars' Semester in Oxford" Program for the Fall 2016 semester.

Graduation Facts

* The famous tune, "Pomp and Circumstance," created by Sir Edward Elgar, became a graduation ceremony mainstay in the turn of the 21st century, first at Yale University. It was there that Elgar received an honorary degree from his friend, music professor Samuel Sanford. At Sanford's request, the ceremony paid homage to Elgar's various works, and "Pomp and Circumstance" played as the graduates filed out of the auditorium. Other schools (Princeton, Columbia, Rutgers) adopted the song and made it part of their own ceremonies, and before long the majority of schools used it as the official processional graduation song.

* The first class ring was created in 1835 for the United States Military Academy at West Point.

* Adults with advanced degrees (master's, professional or doctoral degrees) earn four times more than high school grads, an average \$82,000 earnings vs \$31,000. A bachelor's degree holder averages \$56,000, while high school dropouts earn just \$20,000.

* The valediction is a speech delivered by the graduate with the highest scholastic standing in the graduating class. The speech usually themes the challenges the students are facing, typically brushed by youthful expectations of a bright future.
