## Little Church Gets a Paint Job

One of Iuka's most charming architectural treasures got a facelift this past week and is looking pretty as a bride. That's a good thing, because the caretakers would love to see her used more often as a wedding chapel.

The Church of Our Saviour, also known as "The Little Church," sits beside the Iuka Methodist Church on East Street in Iuka. Erected in 1873, this board-and-batten carpenter Gothic structure was designed by James B. Cook, architect, and was purchased from the Episcopal Diocese by citizens of Iuka in 1985 to prevent removal. The Little Church was placed on the National Register of His-

toric Places in 1991 and just a year later received an Award of Merit from the Mississippi Historical Society for exemplary restoration. Iuka Heritage, Inc., the nonprofit formed in 1990, owns and maintains The Little Church.

This past week, Roberts Builders of New Albany repainted and made repairs to the Little Church, after years of fundraising by Iuka Heritage, according to Frank Thomas, Chairman of the Board of Iuka Heritage.

"We want this lovely little chapel to become a place for more weddings and other uses by the community," said Thomas. "It's available for weddings, and it's unique histo-

ry and interior is a great choice for brides wanting something unique, with character."

Thomas and his brother, Eddie, have held many concerts in recent years in the Little Church, and the proceeds have gone to raise the \$12,000-\$13,000 it took to paint the exterior and roof. But the historic building needs constant care, and, as Frank said, "Insurance is due next month." So more concerts are planned, and rentals are being encouraged.

## Nick Phillips Honored by State Legislature for Career of Distinguished Public Service

Longtime county prosecutor and local attorney Nick Phillips was recently honored with a resolution in the State House of Representatives commending his distinguished career and exceptional public service.

At 60-something, Phillips is not retiring from practicing law at his Phillips & Phillips, PA law firm in Iuka, but he has retired from more than 20 years as Tishomingo County's Prosecuting Attorney. His protégé Lee Thorne, an associate with the Phillips' firm, was elected last fall to that position.

First District Representative Lester Carpenter authored the resolution and presented it to the House in February. It recognizes Phillips for "becoming

more than a name, but a face and disposition that is synonymous with professionalism and equitable treatment."

The county prosecutor job is not an easy one or one to take lightly, but Mr. Phillips fulfilled his duties with great poise and integrity. In addition to his work as an attorney, Phillips is a Presbyterian pastor at New Hope Presbyterian in Biggersville, and is pursuing his Doctorate of Divinity through Eden Theological Seminary in St. Louis.

He is married to his law partner Adrienne C. Phillips and they have a daughter, Casey, who will be married later this month. Nick hopes to spend more time with family and in his many other pursuits.

## Iuka Police Charge Two Juveniles in Vandalism of Sunflower Antique Mall

Two juveniles are charged with malicious mischief after they vandalized the Sunflower Antique Mall on Constitution Drive in Iuka Saturday night.

According to owner Mack Lloyd Wadkins, the Iuka Police have charged a 13-year-old and 17-year-old with malicious mischief for breaking out the glass windows or door of Sunflower Antique Mall with metal chairs that were sitting outside the store. The two did the damage on Saturday night after dark, when they were walking the streets "because they were

bored," said Wadkins. They were caught on surveillance cameras.

Since the perpetrators are under age, names are not released or printed. The two are in custody at a juvenile detention center.

They didn't go into the store, and didn't take anything but a bicycle from outside the store, said Wadkins.

"I want to brag on the Iuka Police for doing a great job and being very responsive," said Wadkins.

## Recent Arrests in County

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department made several drug related arrests in the past week.

### Oxy Found In Car

A Burnsville man faces drug charges after the county K9 officer found oxycodone in his car. According to Tishomingo County Sheriff John Dennis Daugherty, May 19th, Tishomingo Sheriff K9 Officer Scott Dalton conducted a traffic stop on Jefferson Street in Burnsville. During the course of the traffic stop, the deputy asked the driver for consent to search to which the driver of the vehicle gave his consent. The deputy used his narcotics dog to assist in the search of the vehicle and the dog alerted to the presence of narcotics within the vehicle. A search of the driver yielded several pills of alleged oxycodone which was in a clear plastic bag under the driver's seat. The driver was then transported to the Tishomingo County Jail to await charges.

Arrested was Danny Lane Wilson, Jr. of 12 Foot Street, Burnsville, 29 year-old, white male, was

charged with Possession of Controlled Substance (Oxycodone). A property bond was given by the judge.

### Possession & Burglary Charges

Felony possession and burglary charges on an Iuka man resulted from a traffic stop in Burnsville, and related investigation.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff John Dennis Daugherty, May 22nd, Burnsville Police arrested Timothy Ray Waldrep, 19, of 1359 North Pearl Street Iuka, in a traffic stop. During the course of the arrest, it was discovered that Waldrep may have been involved in another felony crime that occurred within Tishomingo County. Later that evening, Tishomingo Sheriff's Deputies responded to a complainant on County Road 476 of the Burnsville area where the complainant stated that someone had burglarized their vehicle and taken large sums of cash from the vehicle.

Waldrep, 19 year-old, white male, was transported to the Tishomingo County Jail where he was

charged by Burnsville Police for Possession of Controlled Substance (Methamphetamine) and by Tishomingo Sheriff's Department for Burglary of Automobile. Bond was set at \$5,000 for each charge.

### Failed to Show in Circuit Court

U.S. Marshals aided the sheriff's department in serving an arrest warrant on a potentially violent suspect after he failed to report for his court date in Tishomingo County Circuit Court.

On May 25th, the Tishomingo Sheriff's Department with help from the United States Marshals service, executed an Alias Capias arrest warrant for Harold Barnes, 47, of County Road 989 Iuka. Barnes failed to come to the Tishomingo Circuit Court on May 6th to answer to the felony charge of Sale of Hydrocodone. Sheriff John Daugherty asked for the assistance of the U.S. Marshals due to the violent nature of Barnes.

Barnes was successfully brought back into custody after more than two weeks. Barnes is being held without bond.

### Sex Offender Violates Terms

A convicted sex offender who failed to properly register his location with the county was located in Crump, Tennessee and is now in custody in Tishomingo County.

On May 25th, Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, again with help from the United States Marshals service, executed an arrest warrant for Failing to Register-Sex Offender for Jonathan Larry Price, 35.

Price last reported to law enforcement on February 4th, 2016 with an address of 305 Adams Street in Iuka, Mississippi, but had apparently left that address. The U.S. Marshals were able to locate Price at a residence in Crump, Tennessee and he was successfully brought back to the Tishomingo Sheriff's Department.

Jonathan Larry Price was issued a professional bond in the amount of \$10,000. Price is currently still in jail due to a Mississippi Department of Corrections hold being placed against him.

## Free Legal Clinic Set for July 19th in Iuka

The Tishomingo County Chancery Court has scheduled a free legal clinic on July 19th, 2016 in Iuka, Mississippi to assist low-income people with family law matters including no fault divorces, child support, visitation, name changes and other simple civil legal matters.

The clinic will be held from 3:30 p.m. - 7:00 p.m. at the Tishomingo County Courthouse, 1839 Battleground Drive in Iuka, Mississippi. Volunteer lawyers will be available

to assist self-represented litigants in drafting and correcting paperwork associated with the legal proceedings. Volunteer attorneys will explain the proceedings, provide general information and answer questions. The attorneys are not obligated to accompany clinic participants to court and file documents for them. The expectation is that individuals will be able to represent themselves in court.

The Tishomingo County Bar, the Missis-

sippi Volunteer Lawyers Project and the Pro Bono Initiative of the University of Mississippi School of Law are co-sponsors of the clinic.

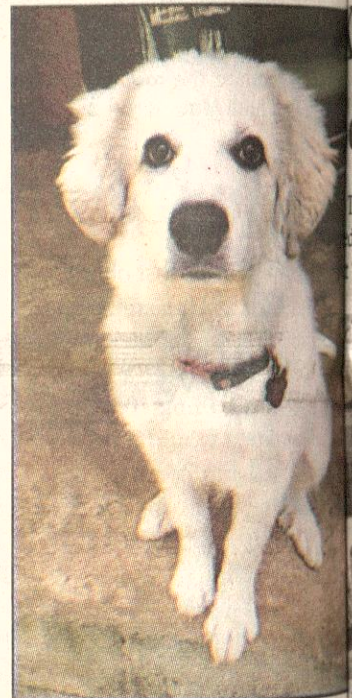
Self-represented litigants often struggle to meet all of the requirements for properly drafted legal documents. If they come to the court for a hearing and their documents do not meet court requirements, their hearing have to be rescheduled. The clinic is designed to prevent that.

Those who wish to participate in the Legal Clinic cannot have annual incomes that exceed 200% of federal poverty guidelines. For a family of two, that would be \$31,860. For a family of three, that would be \$40,180. For a family of four, that would be \$48,500. Individuals cannot make more than \$31,860 annually.

Clinic appointments are required and must be made by July 12th, 2016 by calling MVLP at 601-960-9577.

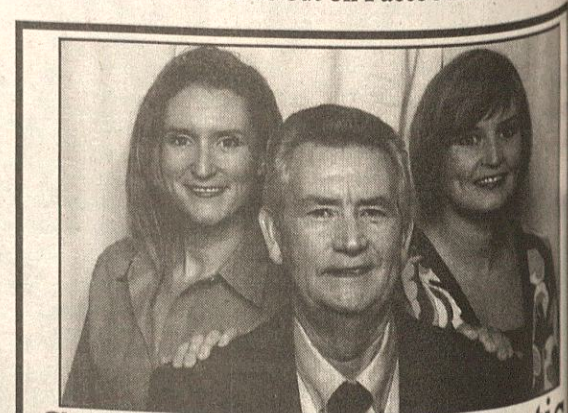

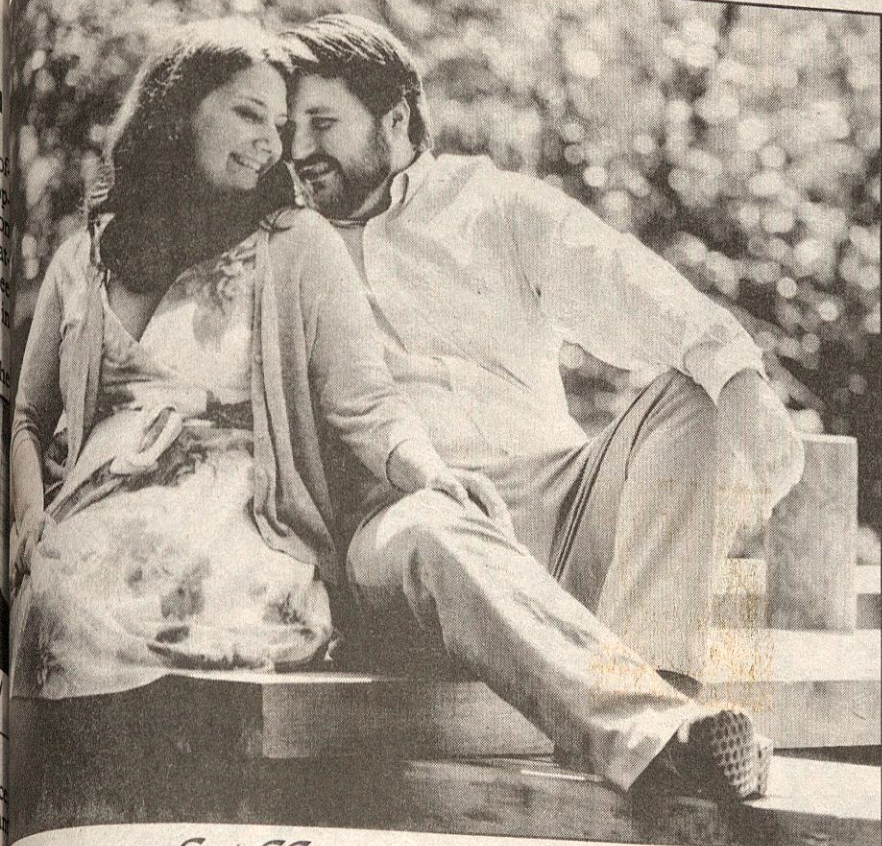

## NOTICE OF PROPOSED AD VALOREM TAX EFFORT TISHOMINGO COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District will hold a public hearing on its proposed school district budget for fiscal year 2016-2017 on June 13, 2016, 6:00 p.m., at the Superintendent's office. At this meeting, a proposed ad valorem tax effort shall be considered.

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is now operating with a projected total budget revenue of \$29,401,988. Of that amount, 22% or \$6,481,710, of such revenue is obtained through ad valorem taxes. For the next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$29,632,273. Of that amount, 22% or \$6,632,147, is proposed to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

For the next fiscal year, the proposed increase in ad valorem tax effort by Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District may result in an increase in the ad valorem tax millage rate. Ad valorem taxes are paid on homes, automobile tags, business fixtures and equipment, and rental real property.

## Mattress Making in the 1930's

Tim Walker of Iuka is sharing another old photo from his collection. The photo was taken behind the old Mineral Springs Hotel in the yard of the Annex (stood near the railroad behind the old courthouse). The photo shows a group of folks who came to town

to make mattresses to be used in their homes probably in the late 1930's. This project was a part of "The New Deal" which helped communities during the Depression. President Franklin D. Roosevelt initiated the program called "The New Deal" which set up many

government agencies to provide work for persons without jobs and to provide necessary needs. These agencies were the W.P.A., C.C.C., T.V.A. and C.W.A. Many state and government offices were housed in the Mineral Springs Hotel before it was destroyed by fire in

1944. Mattress making was part of the W.P.A. or Works Progress Administration. The following info was found on the internet, posted by a lady in Mississippi, "She explained the process of making a mattress, which involved two to four peo-

ple working on one mattress per day. There was space enough to make up to four mattresses at one time. In order to get a mattress from the W.P.A., people had to have an income of less than \$2,000 per year and they had to help make a mattress."

Tim identified his family members on the photo: the lady in the center is his grandmother Adaline Rhea Walker with her band in the hat, Marshall Walker. Annie Rhea Walker is also in the photo.

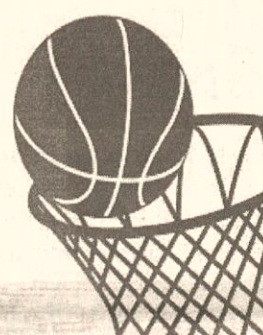

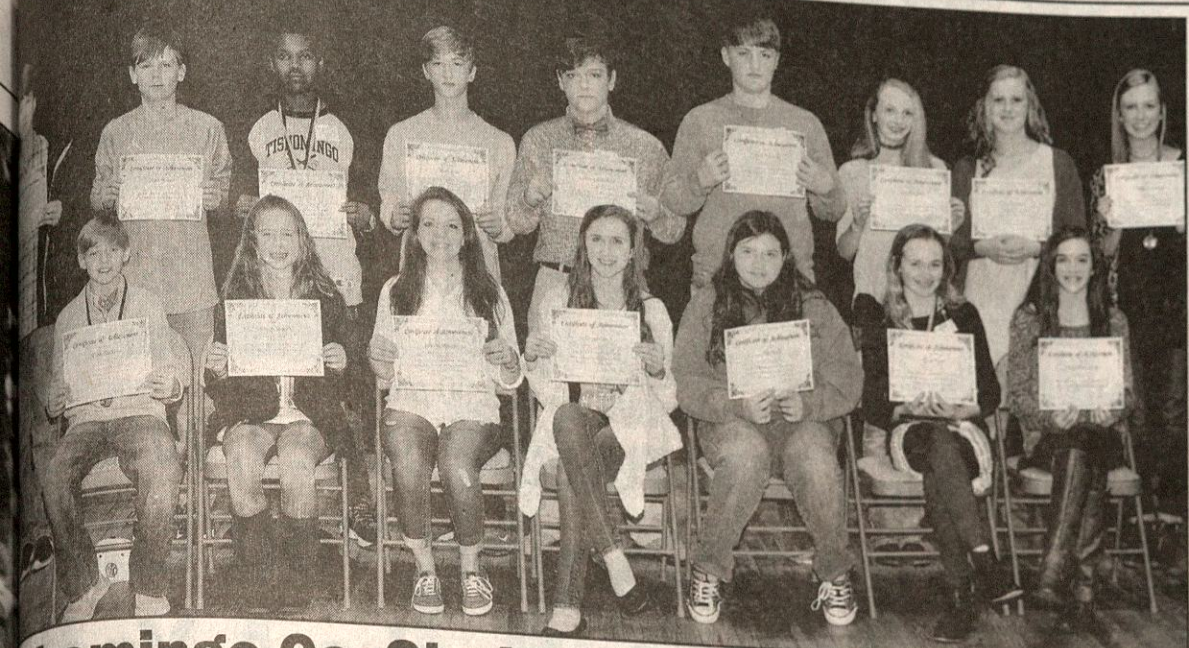

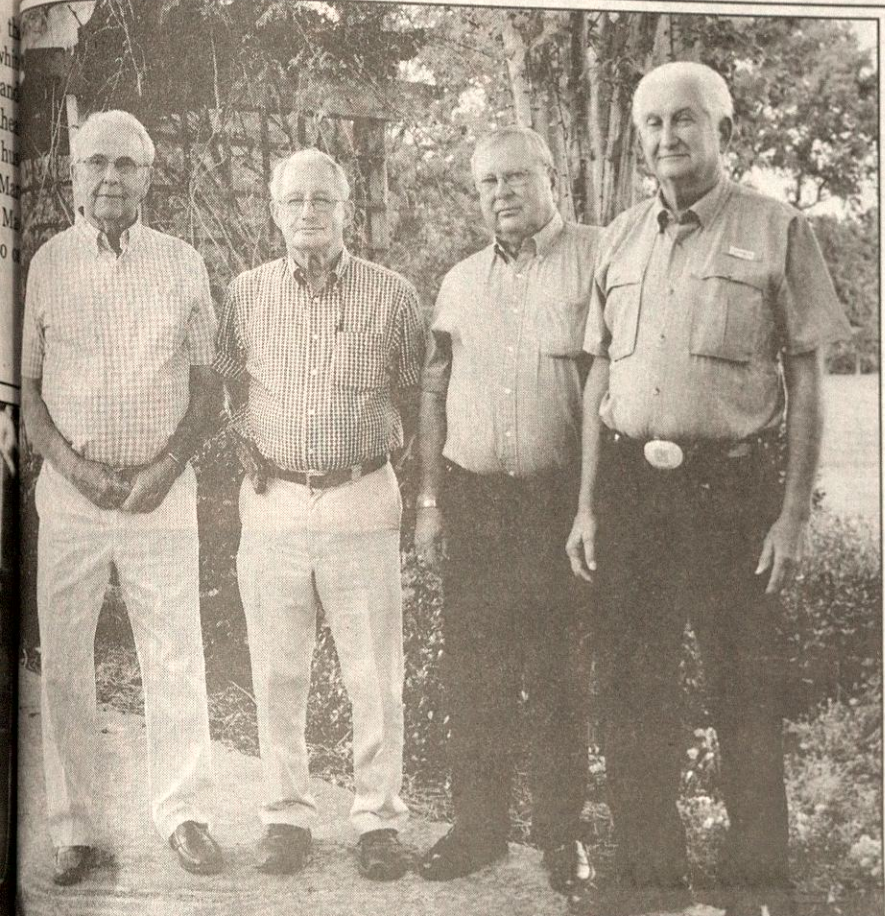

## United Daughters Of The Confederacy Met

The United Daughters of the Confederacy, John Marshall Stone Chapter 394 met May 17<sup>th</sup>, 4 p, at the Tishomingo Archives and History Museum in the John Marshall Stone Library.

We opened the meeting with the pledges to the United States Flag, Mississippi State Flag and the Confederate Flag. We completed the U.D.C. Rituals, the "Lord's Prayer", and we sang "Dixie". The minutes of the last meeting was read and approved, Eunell Handy gave the treasure report and it was approved. Registrar reported that one had paid to be reinstated and one application was ready to send in and we have four more that we are working on. Chaplin Mary Ledbetter had no report. Our old business was planning our Confederate Memorial Day Service and we had two services one at the Monument at the Tishomingo Archives and History Museum and the other at the Graves of the Unknown Soldiers at the Shady Grove Cemetery. New business was ordering acid free sleeves for our past and present applications and Eunell Handy stated that this has been done.

Vickie Durham presented the program "More about Jefferson Davis". Jefferson Finis Davis, the first and only President of the Confederate States of America was a planter, politician and soldier born in Kentucky and raised in Mississippi. He was the 10<sup>th</sup> and youngest child of Revolutionary War soldier, Samuel Davis and his wife, Jane Cook Davis. (Finis in Latin means final – the couple wanted no more children after Jefferson.) He was born June 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1808, he was heavily influenced by his oldest brother, Joseph, who saw to it that he was well educated.

Davis attended college in Kentucky at Transylvania before entering the U.S. Military Academy at West Point. He graduated in 1828. He was 23<sup>rd</sup> out of a class of 34.

He married Sarah Taylor, the daughter of his Colonel Zachary Taylor. They married in 1835 against her father's wishes. Sadly, the couple both came down with bad cases of malaria only three months after the wedding, and the young bride died.

He married the second time in 1845 to Varina Howell, a young woman eighteen years old. They had six children – two girls and four boys – but only their daughters lived into adulthood.

He was in the Senate in 1845 and resigned in 1846 to fight in the Mexican War. He was appointed U.S. Secretary of War in 1853. In 1857, he returned to the Senate. He withdrew from the Senate in 1861 when Mississippi seceded from the Union. One month later he was elected provisional President of the Confederacy. He was inaugurated for a six-year term the following year on February 22<sup>nd</sup>, 1862. The Confederate President was captured by Northern soldiers near Irwinville, Georgia on May 10<sup>th</sup>, 1865.

Davis was imprisoned at Fort Monroe, Virginia for two years. He was never tried for treason, but released in May 1867. He lived out his retirement years at his beloved estate called Beauvoir near Biloxi. Mississippi tried to return him to the U.S. Senate, but he was not legally qualified to serve since he refused to request an official pardon from the United States for his role in the Civil War. He died December 6<sup>th</sup>, 1889.

We will not meet until the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of September.

# Selden's Alabama Battery to Present Artillery Demonstrations at Shiloh

The Living History organization, Selden's Alabama Battery, CSA, will conduct field artillery demonstrations on Saturday, June 4 and Sunday, June 5 at Shiloh National Military Park. The demonstrations will take place at Tour Stop #4, "Ruggles' Battery," and include the loading and firing of black powder Civil War cannon. A period camp will also be open for the public to visit. Between programs, everyone is invited to visit with members of Selden's Battery to learn more about the western volunteer soldier in the Civil War. Park Rangers will be on duty to direct parking and to assist visitors with any questions.

Historically, Selden's Battery, commanded by Captain Joseph Selden, was mustered into service at Uniontown, Alabama, in the spring of 1862. The battery served for two years at Mobile, Alabama, on garrison duty. Following that, the unit fought with the Confederate Army of Tennessee at the battles of Resaca, Kennesaw Mountain, New Hope Church, and Peachtree Creek during the Atlanta Campaign of 1864. The battery was also engaged in the battle of Nashville, losing several men killed and hav-



ing their guns captured. The remainder of the battery surrendered in Meridian, Mississippi at the end of the war.

Firing demonstrations will take place at 11:30 am, 1:00 pm, 2:30 pm, and 4:00 pm, on Saturday, June 4; and at 11:30 am, 1:00 pm, and 2:30 pm on Sunday, June 5. As always, the

park is free. Rain or severe weather will cancel firing demonstrations.
