Iuka Has New Sign, Parade & Yard Sale Ordinances

In an effort to improve the look of the town, and ensure safety, the City of Iuka has passed several ordinances regarding signs, parades and yard sales, many of which local folks may not be aware of. In March, the Iuka Board of Aldermen passed an ordinance that where and how signs can be located. The new ordinance declares that signs cannot block the view or otherwise distract motorists on roadways, especially where driveways pull off or onto a roadway. Signs have to be at least three feet back from the right-of-way, and the bit of public land beside any road and including the road – a distance which varies depending on the road. Signs can't be lit up in a manner that interferes with driver visibility, or that interferes with traffic controls or signs, and they can't look like a traffic control or emergency device. Signs cannot be obscene or contain untruthful advertising matter. And one of the most common violations will be that you cannot put signs, like yard sale signs, on any utility pole, tree or other marker on or within three feet of the public right of way. Penalty if you are cited by Iuka Police for violation is less than \$25 for each viola-

Parades Require Permit
Another Iuka ordinance issued in March requires a permit for any parade, procession or public demonstration, and requires all participants to behave in a lawful manner. The main purpose is to keep the parades safe and orderly, and ensure support and cooperation of the city police department. The parade or demonstration permit must be obtained by the Iuka City Clerk, who has the authority to deny a permit if he or she finds the conduct of the parade will unreasonably interfere with proper fire and police protection. But the clerk can also suggest changes in, for example, in the date or route, allowing him/her to authorize it. In the case of a denied permit, the applicant can appeal to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen immediately, and get a decision within 48 hours. The route, date and purpose of the parade, and approximate number of people and vehicles involved in the parade need to be included in the application. It also prohibits other people from interfering in the parade, or driving through it. No parade routes can go over the railroad tracks. The ordinance also prohibits "roadblocks" of the sort some organizations use for fund raising: "No parade, assembly, individual or individuals shall

gather in a public intersection or otherwise block traffic to distribute literature, fundraise or for any other such purpose that might engage or otherwise distract automobile drivers passing through." The ordinance does not apply to funeral processions. Fines for violations are no less than \$100. Since public and private property rights, civil rights, and the general welfare may be involved in the violation of this ordinance, and since criminal proceedings may not be an adequate or effective remedy because of the multiplicity of prosecutions and the failure of such prosecutions to protect property and civil rights, city officials are hereby authorized, in addition to criminal proceedings, to seek injunctive relief against violators of this article and such injunctive relief may be sought against individuals and against organizations.

Yard Sales
An older ordinance governing yard sales in the city is also important during this yard sale season. Passed back in September of 2014, the ordinance limits the number of yard sales (rummage sales, flea markets, attic sales, garage or carport sales) for anyone to four per year. And individuals or groups of individuals can only have

their sales on their own property, not at any location other than a single-family residence. This excludes schools, churches or groups having a sale for charitable purposes, or events like Trash to Treasures, as authorized by the city. You don't have to get a permit to have a yard sale. Fine for violation of this ordinance is no more than \$100, and it is enforceable by police, but it would likely have to be in response to a complaint, as the city is not keeping up with how many yard sales citizens are having.



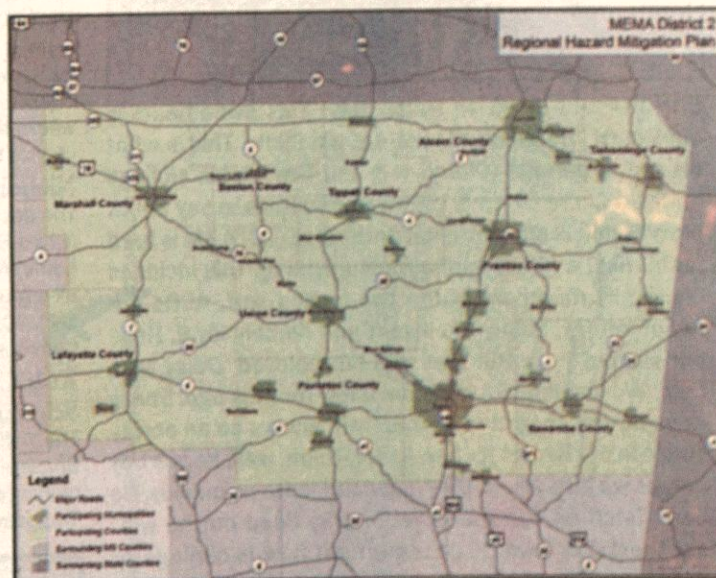
TCHS Cheer Wins at NCA Camp

Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan Online

A regional hazard mitigation plan has been developed that includes Alcorn, Benton, Itawamba, Lafayette, Lee, Marshall, Pontotoc, Prentiss, Tippah, Tishomingo, and Union Counties and the municipalities within these counties. In the event of a disaster or emergency, the Hazard Mitigation Plan would be the "playbook" of reference for law enforcement, first responders and emergency officials. In our area, according to Tishomingo County Emergency Management Director Payton Berklite. For Tishomingo County this includes City of Iuka, Town of Burnsville, Town of Tishomingo, Town of Belmont, Town of Golden and the Village of Paden. The purpose of the plan is to provide a blueprint for community officials to use for reducing vulnerability to natural hazards that impact the counties and their jurisdictions. The plan has been approved pending adoption by both the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency (MEMA). Free Legal Clinic Set for July 19th in Iuka

The Tishomingo County Chancery Court has scheduled a free legal clinic on July 19th, 2016 in Iuka, Mississippi to assist low-income people with family law matters including no fault divorces, child support, visitation, name changes and other simple civil legal matters. The clinic will be held from 3:30 p.m. - 7:00 p.m. at the Tishomingo County Courthouse, 1839 Battleground Drive in Iuka, Mississippi. Volunteer lawyers will be available to assist self-represented litigants in drafting and correcting paperwork associated with the legal proceedings. Volunteer attorneys will explain the proceedings, provide general information and answer questions. The attorneys are not obligated

to accompany clinic participants to court and file documents for them. The expectation is that individuals will be able to represent themselves in court. The Tishomingo County Bar, the Mississippi Volunteer Lawyers Project and the Pro Bono Initiative of the University of Mississippi School of Law are co-sponsors of the clinic. Self-represented litigants often struggle to meet all of the requirements for properly drafted legal documents. If they come to the court for a hearing and their documents do not meet court

requirements, their hearing have to be rescheduled. The clinic is designed to prevent that.

Those who wish to participate in the Legal Clinic cannot have annual incomes that exceed 200% of federal poverty guidelines. For a family of two, that would be \$31,860. For a family of three, that would be \$40,180. For a family of four, that would be \$48,500. Individuals cannot make more than \$31,860 annually.

Clinic appointments are required and must be made by July 12th, 2016 by calling MVLP at 601-960-9577.

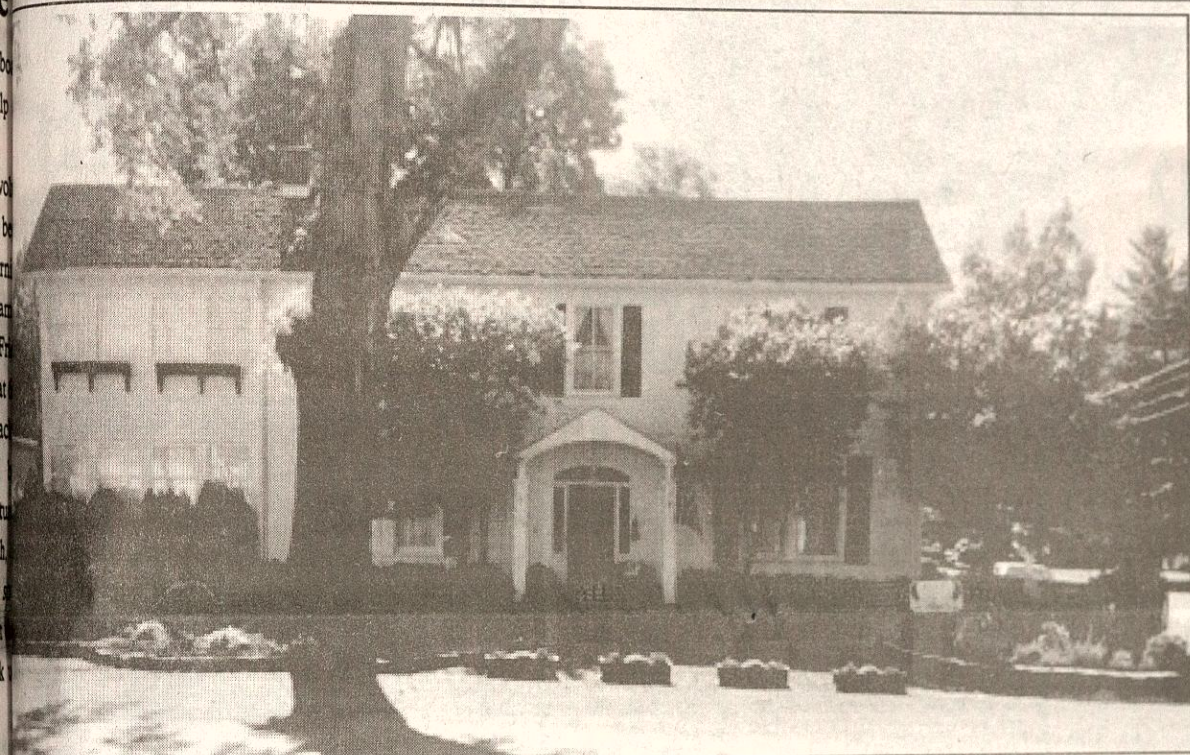

Tishomingo County Farmer's Market Now Open Beside Walmart

Days and hours of operation for the market will be Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday, 7 a.m. to 12 p.m. The location of the Farmer's Market will be located between Wal-Mart in Iuka and

the old Tishomingo County Jail. The Tishomingo County Extension Service, The Tishomingo County Master Gardeners, Tishomingo County Farm Bureau, the City of Iuka, and the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors are working together to provide this market.

Vendors will need to attain a Farmer's Market Vendor Permit with photo ID from the Farm Bureau Insurance Office in Iuka. There is no charge for the permit and permit must be displayed in clear view of customers and inspectors.

Produce, flowers, arts, and crafts sold at the Market must be produced at the vendor's home or farm in Tishomingo County or adjacent county. Prices are controlled by the individual vendor. No items will be allowed to be resold if purchased from another venue. Produce should not be sold by weight unless the vendor has scales that have been certified by the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce. Vendor locations inside the mar-

ket will be available on a first-come first serve basis and vendor are responsible for keeping his/her area clean. No alcoholic beverages are will be allowed inside the Market.

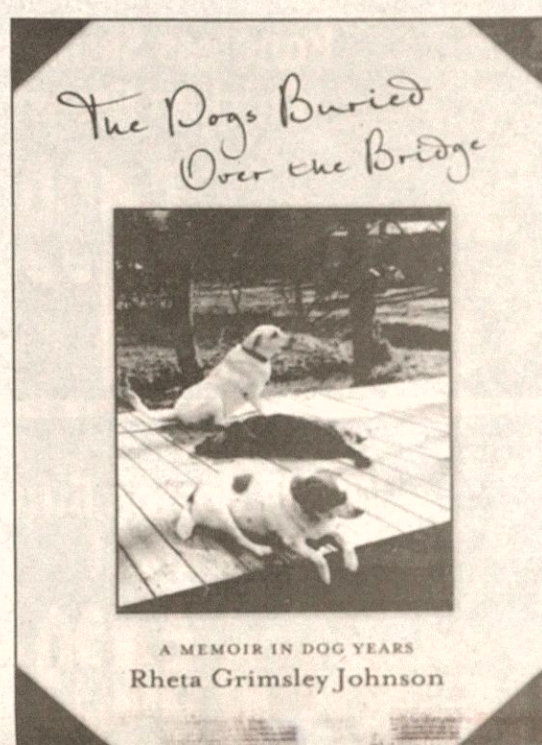
Here is a bit of what Rheta has to share in the book:



Charlotte's Attic



1950s Parade in Downtown Iuka

This photo was in our old files and shows a parade in downtown Iuka in the 1950's. The people in the photo were identified by Benji Gaines, who was one of the Boy Scouts pictured above. On the right of the photo in the back of the pickup, are Glenda Foote and Judy Holtsford. Scouts in front of the truck are, from left: Eddie Byram, unidentified, Neal Harwell, Benji Gaines, Lucian King, Frank Brinkley, Jim-bo Chambers, and Carol Tuckier. The group of boys on the left are Earl Enlow, Genie Foote, Johnny Stormont, Tony Gaines, Billy Pyle, Lloyd Murrah, and the younger boys are unidentified.

This photo plainly shows the Hotel Leatherwood which stood at the west end of Front Street

where it was located for many years. The original hotel burned in 1899 and was replaced with the structure shown, featuring its trademark round Victorian style turret, on the southeast corner, which shows in the photo below.

The photo taken at the parade shows a more aged building, probably shortly before it was torn down. The exact date it was torn down could not be found but, at this location a dental office was built by Luke Robinson. Dr. Joe Barlow bought the dental practice and building in 1960, and he said Robinson had practiced there for five years. Later Dr. George, Dr. King, and Dr. Segars built their medical clinic next to the dental clinic, and later moved near the hospital. First American

National Bank then built their first office at the site.

Also shown in the photo is the former Iuka City Hall on the corner, behind the truck, and the building which now houses the Vidette office. At the time of the photo, Barnett's Drug Store was in one part of the building and a service garage in the other.

(It has been difficult to pin down the exact date of this photo. Benji was pretty sure it was taken at a parade for Iuka Day, which according to newspapers was on July 6, 1950.

But looking at the photo, it appears it was taken in the fall when there were no leaves on the trees, and the Ford parked at the Leatherwood Hotel has been identified by one of our local vintage car experts as a 1955 model. These two things indicate that the photo was taken after 1955 in the fall or winter.

This photo has appeared in the Vidette before, but with not much information, just the names.

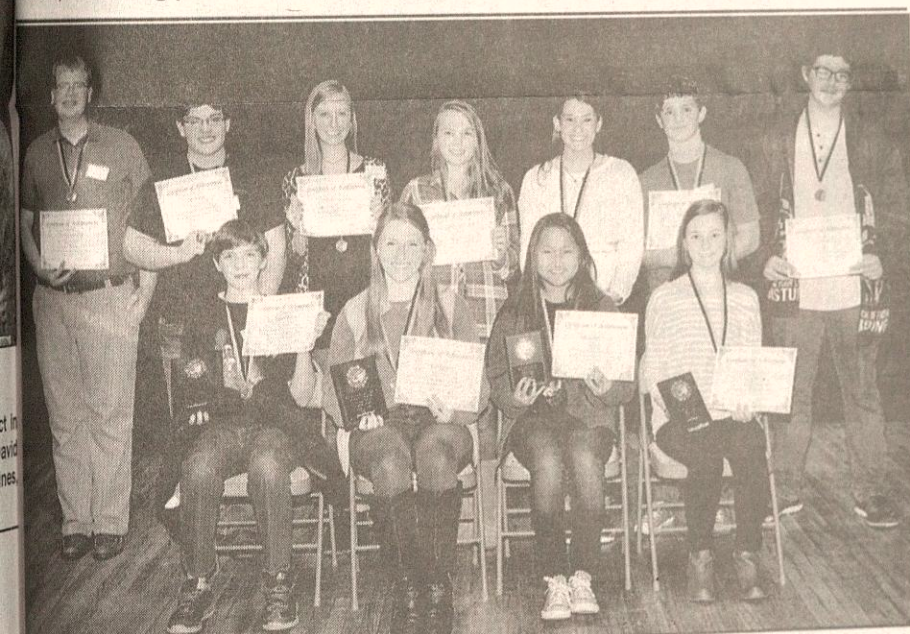

CONSERVATION CORNER Take a Kid Fishing by James L. Cummins

Some of the fondest memories from my childhood are the many outings spent with my father, fishing the productive farm ponds in the hills where my grandparents lived or in the oxbow lakes of the Delta. Whether we were successful or not usually didn't matter. The important thing to me was spending time with my father as he introduced me to all the wonders of the outdoors.

Even more important to me now is thinking back on how hard my father worked, and how busy he always seemed to be, yet he always made time to take me fishing. He firmly believed in that old saying, "If you introduce your kids to hunting, you won't ever have to hunt for your kids." That goes for fishing as well.

As parents, we should

be willing to give our time, just as our parents did, to ensure that our children can participate and have fun doing the things we enjoy. If you enjoy fishing, introduce your kids to it, and chances are they will enjoy it.

In the beginning, the most important things to remember are to keep it simple and fun. Don't expect your kids to be able to handle your fishing gear. Get them started with small, spin-casting equipment. This will be easy for them to handle and they will become accustomed to it quickly.

Begin by teaching your kids to cast in the backyard. Simply tie a sinker, hook-less or practice plug on the line and turn them loose. You will want to supervise the first few sessions, but encourage them to practice on their own.

On your first outing, take them to a farm pond, small lake or other area you are familiar with so, hopefully, the fish will be

easy to catch. Bluegill, bream as they are commonly called, is a species that is easy to catch when they are biting. An impoundment with an abundance of small largemouth bass would also be a good choice. Use simple equipment such as small artificial baits for bass, and crickets or worms with a float for bluegill.

Keep your outings short. The younger the child, the shorter their attention span. You should be able to read the mood of your kids to know when they have had enough. Always try to take along snacks and drinks, even on those short outings, to help keep them excited.

Make the experience enjoyable for them by pointing out bugs and small reptiles or amphibians. Let them take in everything that nature has to offer on each outing. Also teach them to care for and respect the environment.

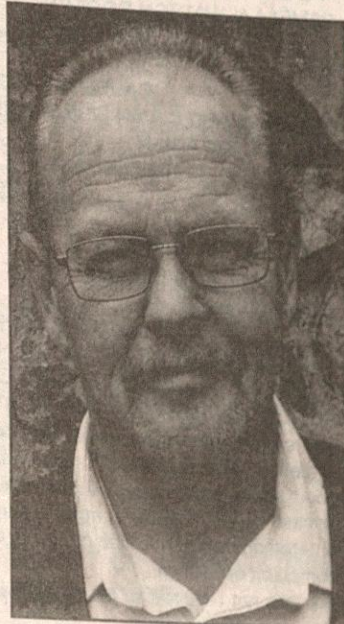

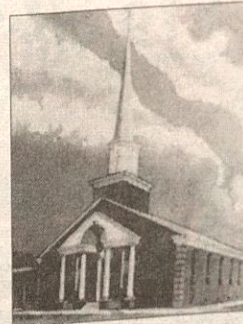

A Glimpse Into Heaven (part XI)

No matter what "Bible teacher" says he knows when Christ is coming again, or that he knows great details about the timing of God's judgment program, it is still a fact that nobody but God knows all of this! I am amazed that books keep selling in large numbers, if they give a story about someone who went to heaven or hell and came back to write perhaps two or three hundred pages about the details of what he has seen. It would be wise if we would realize that the Bible gives us what God wants us to know about heaven, moreover, most people have very little acquaintance with what is written in Scripture about these things. When I read books, and I have read parts of several, about trips to heaven or hell, with details that clearly contradict the Bible, I know that the writer has been deceived, thus his information is not from God! I am willing to take the Bible over any and all of the writings of men!

I was in Revelation 6:9-11 in the last article, which shows the "souls" of those under the altar in heaven who are asking God how long it will be until their murderers on earth are judged. I will not give those verses again here, but I do want all of us to realize that those in heaven are not "dumb" as to what is going on in the earth. People often ask me whether or not we will know each other in heaven. It seems clear to me that if these martyred saints in heaven still know who murdered them on earth, then we will also know those who are in heaven with us. There are many details that the Bible does not give about heaven, but it gives enough to make me anxious to be there when my time comes to go. Revelation 6:11 shows "fellow servants" and "brethren" of the martyred saints in heaven who are yet to be killed for their faith and their stand on the Word of God. Do you see anything in the world today that is leading the various nations and religions of the world to a time and place that many will desire to kill all of those who believe that Jesus is the only Savior of men and that the Bible is the only Book that God has inspired and left us as a means of knowing how to be saved and to serve Him? We are living in dangerous times (called perilous in II Timothy 3:1-9), for the world is being prepared for the coming of Christ without even realizing it, and even if Christ's coming might still be some time away.

There was a time, even in my early ministry, which started on August 13, 1961, that more people had a fear (respect or reverence) of God, but we have slipped beyond that in many ways today. Many in places of governmental leadership do not fear to speak against God and His Word in our day, whereas in the early days of our nation the Bible was used as a textbook in some of our schools. I realize that our government, according to the constitution, cannot make a "state religion", and I do not want it to do so, but it should also read the part of the amendment that says government should not hinder the free exercise of religion. In a society and government that cries out for tolerance, I fail to see much tolerance for the Bible and those who believe and practice what it teaches. These intolerances are opening the door for what will happen in the days ahead as believers, like those mentioned in Revelation 6:9-11, will die for their testimony and their stand on the Word of God. Since we cannot keep the atheist from propagating what he believes wherever he wishes, why do so many people want to stop the mouths of Christians? Where is the "tolerance" in all of this? The problem is that those blinded by their own sins and actions do not desire that any light be thrown on what they are doing!

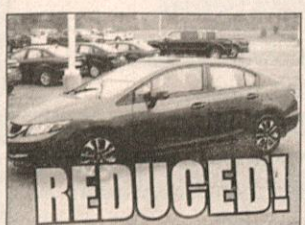

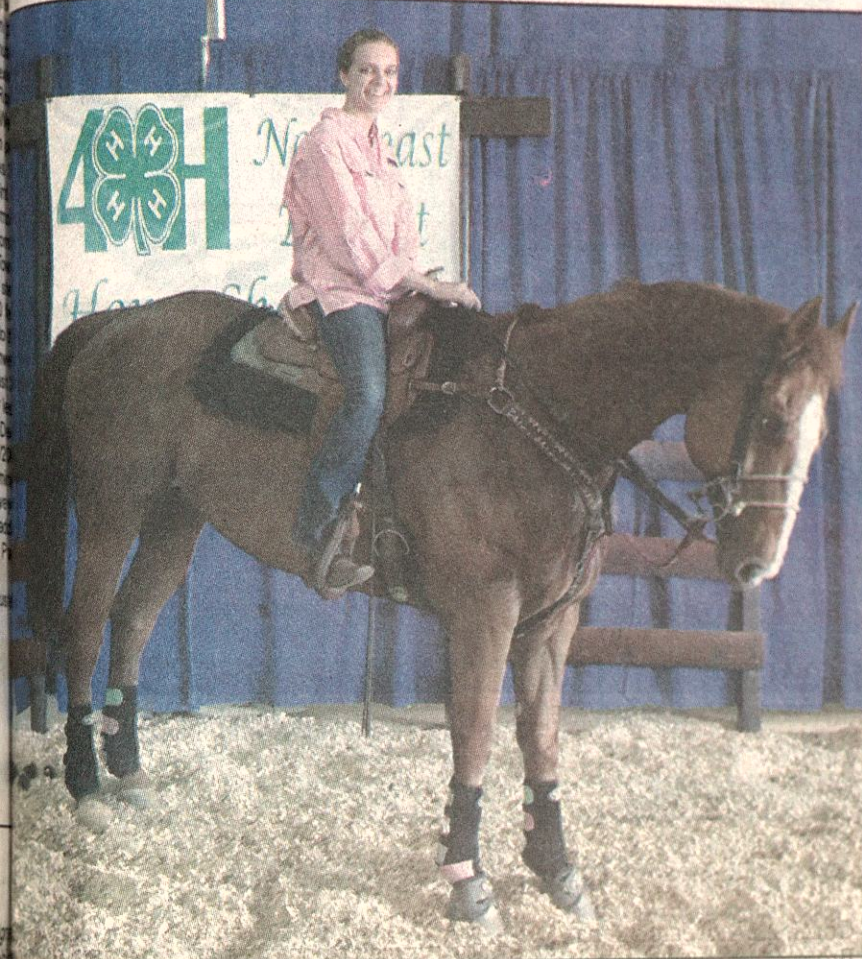
