One Hospitalized After Shooting Last Thursday Night

A dispute over money turned violent landed a Dennis man in the hospital with gunshot wounds last Thursday night.

According to Chief Investigator Greg Mitchell, the dispute happened at 713 County Road 993, also known as Forest Grove or Valley Grove Road, about 8 p.m. Thursday, June 16th. Michael Alan Barnes, 38, of that address, allegedly fired a shotgun at Mark Lovelace, 34, of Dennis, during a dispute over less than \$100.

Lovelace suffered at least some damage to his face and was bleeding profusely when he managed to make it to a neighboring house, where the inci-

dent was called in. He was airlifted to the hospital at Tupelo from the scene, and authorities say he went on to Memphis for further treatment.

Barnes was arrested the next morning, when he turned

himself Sheriff Dennis Daugherty. Michael Alan Barnes, 38, of that address, has been charged possession of a



firearm by a convicted felon and aggravated assault with extreme indifference to human life.

The growth in heavy industry in Tishomingo County has been helped along the way by the cooperation of TCEPA to make sure that the county can support the power needs of various industries. Grisham has been a part of that - meeting with the power company is always one of the first steps for landing a prospective industrial

client in the county. One of the biggest challenges of Grisham's career has been managing the repercussions of the historic 1994 ice storm that crippled the power infrastructure of the Mid-South and left many customers in Tishomingo County without power for as long as 21 days. Grisham said TCEPA went from an outside (meaning not the office/management staff) workforce of 30 to 112, and increased heavy equipment from 11 pieces to 30 to get people's power back on. This included crews and equipment that came in from elsewhere in Mississippi, Tennessee,

Alabama and Georgia. After the ice storm, there was greater emphasis on the right-of-way program, keeping trees and vegetation cleared where they are near a power

able and growing steel indus- line. In the fall and winter, ROW crews cut trees and trim them back using heavy equipment designed for that purpose.

"We were just doing it all with bucket trucks and chainsaws before the ice storm," explained Grisham.

Another challenge was the employee strike, which lasted two weeks in July 2002. In the next three years after the strike, county voters voted in all new board members except for Jimmy Marlin in the first district.

Another difference in providing customers power, explained Grisham, has been the need for quick reestablishment of service for an increasing number of homes operating critical care medical equipment,

"Years ago, treatments like ventilators or oxygen were done mostly in hospitals, but now it's more critical to get those folks' power back on as soon as possible," explained Grisham. "There's a lot of impatience when the power goes out, but we get them back online quicker, now, too."

Mystery of the Leftover Okree!


One of the great mysteries of my life as a boy was the time Mama fried too much okra.

Mama use to boil it sometimes, which I considered a waste, but I never said anything, because Daddy liked it. I still don't know why. Boiled okra and stewed tomatoes are two of the biggest wastes in the vegetable world.

Conservation Corner

Is Boating Insurance Needed? by James L. Cummins

Now that the boating season is in full swing, most of us have made sure we have the proper safety equipment on board. However, have you considered boat insurance?

Of course, the wise thing to do is to have your vessel insured properly - that is, if it has a value which would be difficult for you to replace. There are several factors to consider when dealing with this topic. You will have to do some research on your own before actually obtaining the appropriate insurance for your boating

The first thing to do is find a good insurer. Ask friends who have had a claim in the past about their experiences with their insurer. Do they have a separate policy or did they add their boat to their

homeowner's policy. If the boat is covered under the homeowner's policy, then this could be very limiting. Just check it out.

Do you want coverage for the fishing gear on board? What about towing service for any on-thewater problems that might occur?

"Agreed Value" and "Actual Cash Value" are two types of coverage. The difference between them is depreciation. "Agreed Value" costs more up front but your boat is covered at whatever value you and your insurer agree upon. "Actual Cash Value" coverage costs less but the company will factor in depreciation and only pay up to the actual cash value at the time the boat is declared a total or partial loss or the property is lost.

Another item to consider is "cruising areas." This means there are certain areas where the policy

is in force. For example your cruising area lim to Ross Barnett Reserve or Eagle Lake? You n have to contact your surer for an "extension" you travel outside of th areas. Find a compa that doesn't put limits where you can trailer yo

If you fish in tour ments, make sure have the liability covera required. Also, look a policy that offers son type of reimbursement for your entry fee if some thing unforeseen preven you from competing at you have paid.

It doesn't matter if w are new to the water or you've been acquain with it for years, it is ve important to have the no kind of insurance cover age. Make sure you know exactly the coverage you are getting and what is not covered.





A Glimpse Into Heaven (Part XII)

We are still looking at the opening of the seven sealed book, which only the Son of God is worthy to open. For those who may not have read my previous articles on this subject, I will say that the seven sealed book, mentioned first in Revelation chapter five, is a book of judgments that will be poured out on the earth during the tribulation, and only Jesus is worthy to judge men. This is true because He became a man, yet still God, and walked among men on earth, thus He is qualified by experience to judge earthly creatures, since He lived in a physical body on earth and never sinned, but also because He is God and knows everything about every person.

Revelation 6:12-13 says, "And I beheld when He had opened the sixth seal, and lo, there was a great earthquake; and the sun became black as sackcloth of hair, and the moon became as blood; And the stars of heaven fell unto the earth, even as a fig tree casteth her untimely figs, when she is shaken of a mighty wind. And the heaven departed as a scroll when it is rolled together; and every mountain and island were moved out of their places." We are looking at the effects of a great earthquake that will take place during the tribulation at the command of Jesus Christ! The reason many people do not like the Book of Revelation is the fact that it does speak much about judgment, namely the judgment that Jesus will pour out on the earth and its inhabitants during a seven year period which is called the tribulation. (I do not believe that the church will be on earth during this time, but I will not try to prove that point here.) Jesus has just opened the sixth of the seven seals that are on the book called "the seven sealed book". The earthquake mentioned here will black out the sun and make the moon appear as red as blood. The stars will be cast to the earth like a fig tree drops off its figs early, because of a mighty wind. Many have said that stars cannot fall to earth, because their size is so much greater than the size of the earth. I do not think that there is a problem here, first, because the Bible makes no distinction between stars and meteors, and secondly, because we do not know that actual stars will not be burned out, for the most part, before they reach the earth. I confess that I do not know all about what is here, but I do know that heavenly bodies or objects will fall to the earth during the tribulation! The heavens will roll up like someone would role up a scroll, when this great earthquake takes place. All of earth's mountains and islands will be shaken and rearranged during this earthquake. I have no doubt that Jesus Christ is going to shake things up on earth during this horrible time, because mankind, for the bigger part of it, has refused to acknowledge God and His Word! There is still time, at present, for lost people to repent and believe Christ for salvation, thus escaping this coming judgment during the tribulation.
