One Hospitalized After Shooting Last Thursday Night

A dispute over money turned violent landed a Dennis man in the hospital with gunshot wounds last Thursday night.

According to Chief Investigator Greg Mitchell, the dispute happened at 713 County Road 993, also known as Forest Grove or Valley Grove Road, about 8 p.m. Thursday, June 16th. Michael Alan Barnes, 38, of that address, allegedly fired a shotgun at Mark Lovelace, 34, of Dennis, during a dispute over less than \$100.

Lovelace suffered at least some damage to his face and was bleeding profusely when he managed to make it to a neighboring house, where the inci-

dent was called in. He was airlifted to the hospital at Tupelo from the scene, and authorities say he went on to Memphis for further treatment.

Barnes was arrested the next morning, when he turned himself in to Sheriff John Dennis Daugherty.

Michael Alan Barnes, 38, of that address, has been charged with possession of a firearm by a convicted felon and aggravated assault with extreme indifference to human life.

TCEPA Head, Grisham, Retires

After 38 years with Tishomingo County Electric Power Association, General Manager Robert Grisham is retiring, and many friends, family members and power company employees were on hand Tuesday to give him a sendoff.

Robert Grisham, C.P.A., 1970 graduate of Iuka High School, and Millsaps College, was hired by the previous general manager, Cecil Brown, as vice manager for the power company in 1978. He became general manager in 1986.

"I've been so thankful to work here in my own hometown, raise a family here and be part of the community," said Grisham in remarks to about 100 employees and guests at a luncheon in the TCEPA building Tuesday. Grisham says he will be spending more time with family, but he will still come in to help when there are storms, critical time for the rural power association.

Since he's been with TCEPA, they have rebuilt each substation in the system. The biggest power consumer for the association has changed from Mississippi Stone (later Vulcan), near the Alabama state line, to the Atlanta ATK in the Tri-State Commerce Park. The consider-

able and growing steel industries of the Yellow Creek Port are also large consumers.

The growth in heavy industry in Tishomingo County has been helped along the way by the cooperation of TCEPA to make sure that the county can support the power needs of various industries. Grisham has been a part of that - meeting with the power company is always one of the first steps for landing a prospective industrial client in the county.

One of the biggest challenges of Grisham's career has been managing the repercussions of the historic 1994 ice storm that crippled the power infrastructure of the Mid-South and left many customers in Tishomingo County without power for as long as 21 days. Grisham said TCEPA went from an outside (meaning not the office/management staff) workforce of 30 to 112, and increased heavy equipment from 11 pieces to 30 to get people's power back on. This included crews and equipment that came in from elsewhere in Mississippi, Tennessee, Alabama and Georgia.

After the ice storm, there was greater emphasis on the right-of-way program, keeping trees and vegetation cleared where they are near a power

line. In the fall and winter, ROW crews cut trees and trim them back using heavy equipment designed for that purpose.

"We were just doing it all with bucket trucks and chainsaws before the ice storm," explained Grisham.

Another challenge was the employee strike, which lasted two weeks in July 2002. In the next three years after the strike, county voters voted in all new board members except for Jimmy Marlin in the first district.

Another difference in providing customers power, explained Grisham, has been the need for quick reestablishment of service for an increasing number of homes operating critical care medical equipment.

"Years ago, treatments like ventilators or oxygen were done mostly in hospitals, but now it's more critical to get those folks' power back on as soon as possible," explained Grisham. "There's a lot of impatience when the power goes out, but we get them back online quicker, now, too."

Tim Wigginton will become general manager July 1st. He has been Director of Finance and Administration most all the time Grisham has been general manager.

hago Begins Operations at Yellow Creek Port

The support we have received from Mississippi Development Authority, Tishomingo County, Tennessee Valley Authority, the port and the companies around us has been instrumental in our successful transition into the local business community," said hago Automotive President Joerg Goepfert. "Our first employees are performing wonderfully, and we have already been nominated to produce additional parts."

Mississippi Development Authority provided assistance for the purchase of equipment and for relocation costs. Tishomingo County and Tennessee Valley Authority also assisted with the project.

I think the "too much

okra incident" happened on a Tuesday. It had to have been a week day, something like that would never happen on a weekend, and certainly not a Sunday.

We all loved fried okra, there is nothing I know of that is better, it's kind of like really good popcorn, but with a warm, long-lasting taste.

There was never a time when it wasn't a welcome sight, and it was always finished off early in the meal. But, there it was, on that memorable day, in the bowl, LEFTOVERS.

Some still in the skillet! It's hard to imagine. We had often had leftover beets or leftover rutabaga, but never ever any leftover okra.

I guess strange things happen in every family.

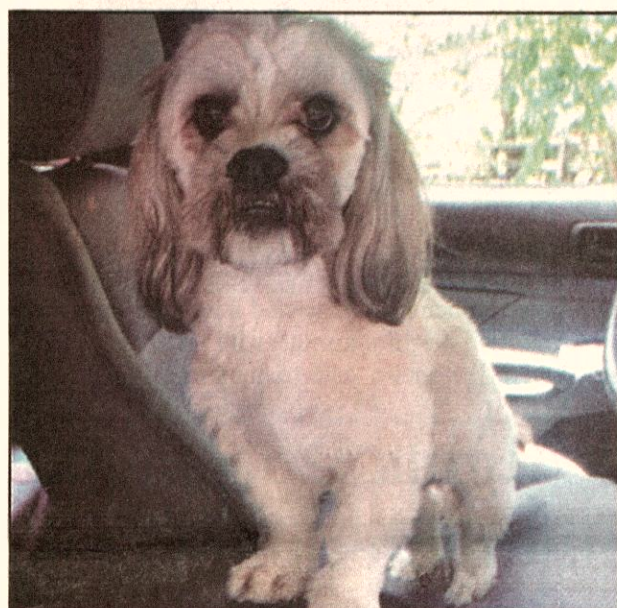
Most significantly, tourism visitation and spending are increasing for Northeast Mississippi faster than the state average annual increase.

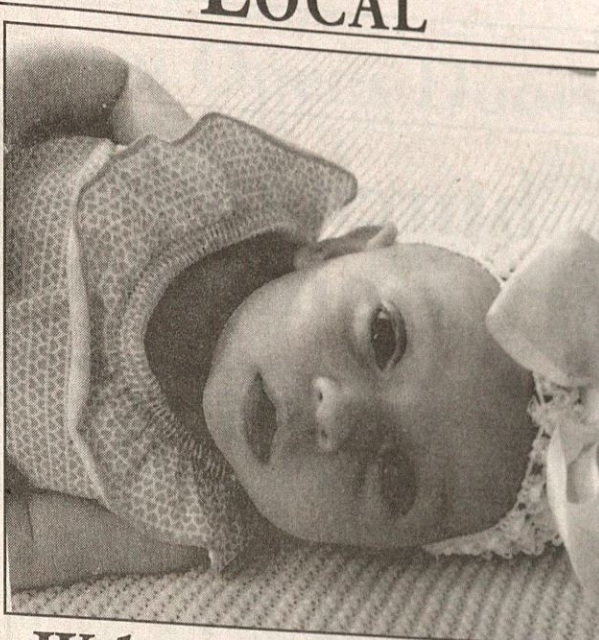

Photographers Attend State And National Convention

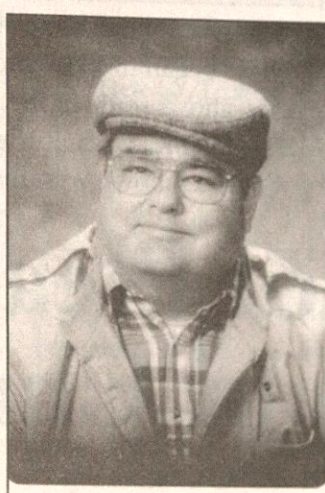

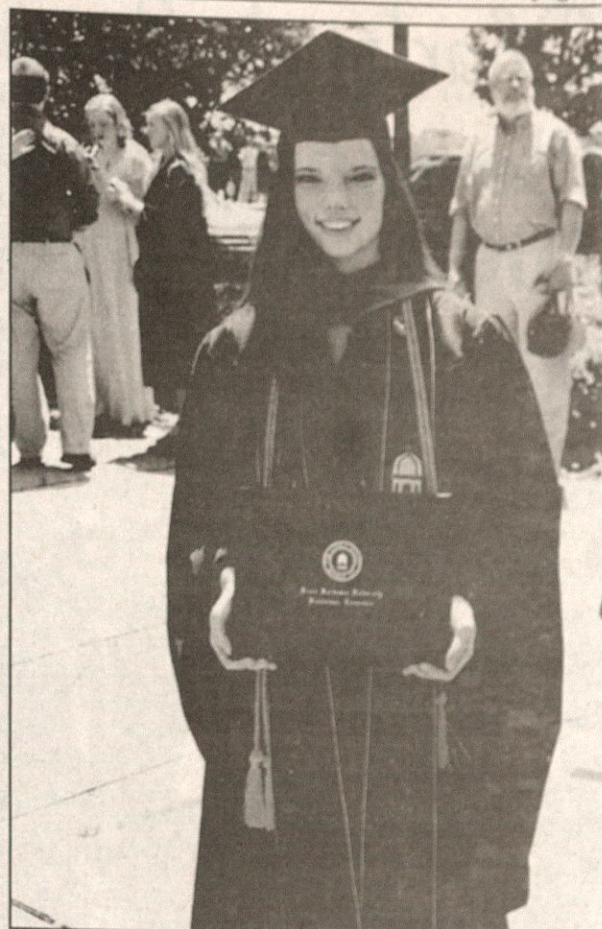

Pleasant Grove Church of Christ Celebrates 100th Anniversary Homecoming

Brief History of Pleasant Grove Church of Christ

Started in 1916

Brother W. B. Kelly came to this area from Kendrick, Mississippi and at that time he began to preach in one room of Joseph Rubin Marlar, Jr.'s home and also in a one room schoolhouse believed to be Barnes Chapel, north of the first location.

According to the family Bible, Joseph and one of his sons, named Early, were baptized in the year 1914 by Brother Kelly in the ole fish trap hole located in the Yellow Creek canal.

Brother Kelly and other brothers would come from Kendrick to

preach and baptize believers.

W. Jesse Reynolds was the first treasurer, Kenny Lambert was the second, and George South was the third.

The Elders were appointed by the congregation while Brother Kelly was serving as the preacher. The elders were as follows: W. T. Seaton and James W. Reynolds. The deacons were appointed some time later. They were Burley South, and Kenny L. Lambert. Joseph Rubin Marlar, Jr. deeded the first two acres to Pleasant Grove Church of Christ on October

24, 1916.

And we are told that Pauline Reynolds was age thirteen when she overheard them discussing the need for a name for the new Church location and she stated, "This was a pleasant grove for a new church building." Thus it became known as the Pleasant Grove Church of Christ.

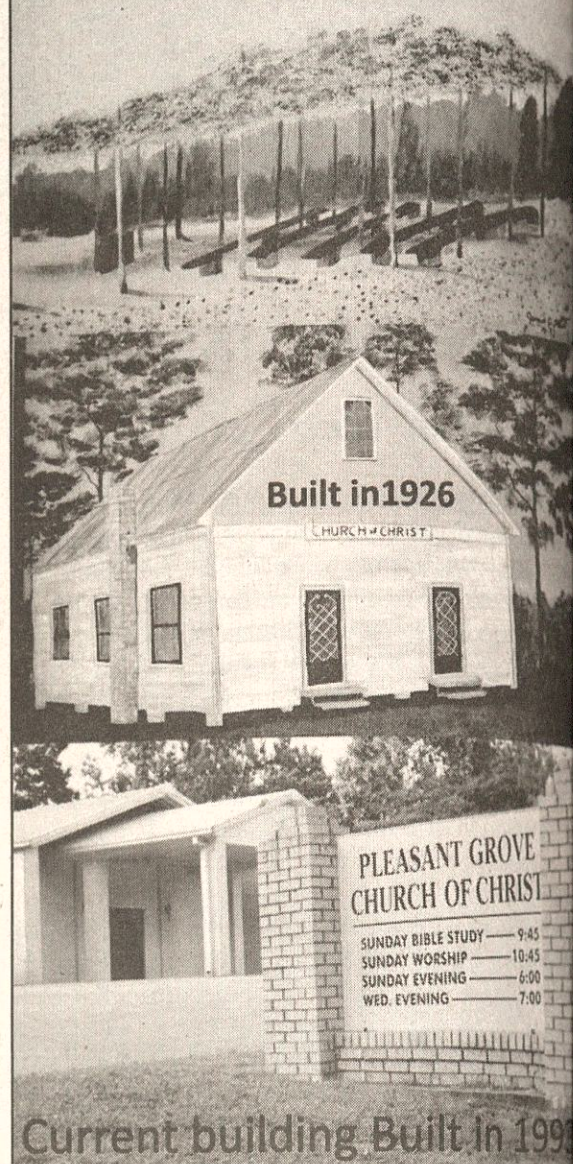
The church building has undergone several improvements and the latest one being our new auditorium. We were privileged to hold our first services in this building on May 30, 1993.

The church has seen many good gospel preachers come and go, and a few that were not.

We have Brother John Hardwick back with us now and he has played a strong role as well as others in getting the job done. Our prayer is that you enjoy many services in worship to our Lord in this building.

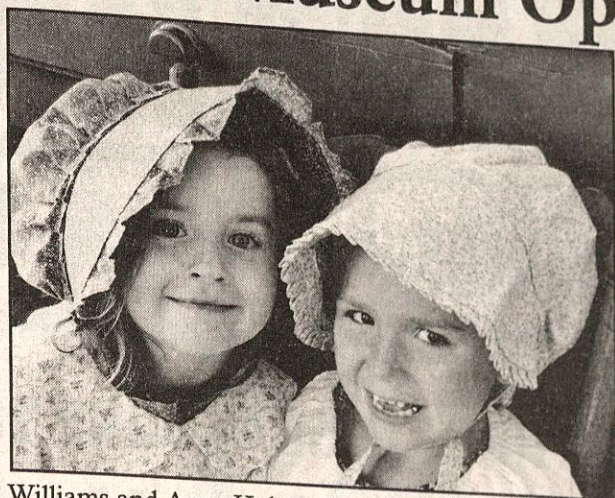
Old Courthouse Museum Opens Doors for Teaching

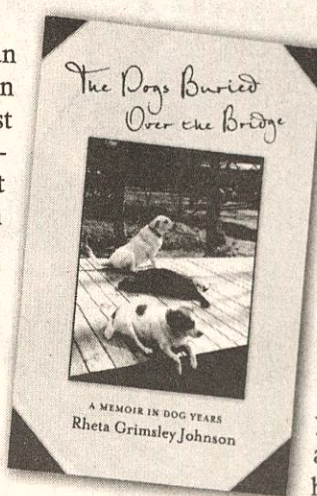
Tuesday, the Friends of the Iuka Library hosted a nationally-syndicated columnist, Rheta Grimsley Johnson, who spoke of her virtues and blessings of the dogs in her life, and authors by whom she was influenced, Tishomingo County. Told by an editor early in her columnist career to "never write about her children or dogs," Ms. Johnson has taken special pleasure in finally writing about the dogs she has loved in her new book, *The Dogs Buried Over the Bridge*.

She said it is a dog book like most others: "the dog dies."

She has always loved dogs, and has an extensive library of dog books, in which, she said, the dog



always dies. Ever since she was devastated by the death of Ol' Yeller in the movie, Johnson said she wanted a yellow dog, and it took her 44 years to get one, Maybelle. This particularly special dog was also the one who changed her from a "dogs outside" person to one that welcomed them into her home.

The book also includes local people like her neighbor Terry Martin, and

Barbara Moore, and others -- many of whom were part of the large audience in the library.

"Here in Tishomingo County, it's so often the case that dogs find us, choose us," she said, referring to abandoned dogs that wander up a hopefully friendly driveway in search of refuge. One of our county's sad legacies is the large number of people who drop off dogs and cats, sick dogs, even whole litters of pups in remote areas of the county like her own Fishtrap Hollow, near the Mill Creek area on Bear Creek.

The author signed and sold books afterwards to the hundred or so people attending.

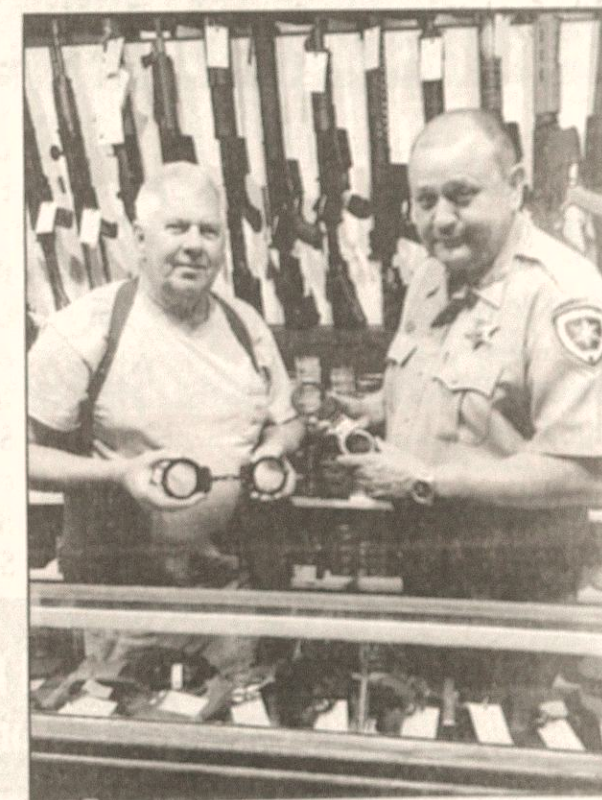

Conservation Corner

Is Boating Insurance Needed?

Now that the boating season is in full swing, most of us have made sure we have the proper safety equipment on board. However, have you considered boat insurance?

Of course, the wise thing to do is to have your vessel insured properly - that is, if it has a value which would be difficult for you to replace. There are several factors to consider when dealing with this topic. You will have to do some research on your own before actually obtaining the appropriate insurance for your boating needs.

The first thing to do is find a good insurer. Ask friends who have had a claim in the past about their experiences with their insurer. Do they have a separate policy or did they add their boat to their

homeowner's policy. If the boat is covered under the homeowner's policy, then this could be very limiting. Just check it out.

Do you want coverage for the fishing gear on board? What about towing service for any on-the-water problems that might occur?

"Agreed Value" and "Actual Cash Value" are two types of coverage. The difference between them is depreciation. "Agreed Value" costs more up front but your boat is covered at whatever value you and your insurer agree upon. "Actual Cash Value" coverage costs less but the company will factor in depreciation and only pay up to the actual cash value at the time the boat is declared a total or partial loss or the property is lost.

Another item to consider is "cruising areas." This means there are certain areas where the policy

is in force. For example, your cruising area limited to Ross Barnett Reservoir or Eagle Lake? You may have to contact your insurer for an "extension" if you travel outside of these areas. Find a company that doesn't put limits on where you can trailer your boat.

If you fish in tournaments, make sure you have the liability coverage required. Also, look for a policy that offers some type of reimbursement for your entry fee if something unforeseen prevents you from competing after you have paid.

It doesn't matter if you are new to the water or if you've been acquainted with it for years, it is very important to have the right kind of insurance coverage. Make sure you know exactly the coverage you are getting and what is not covered.

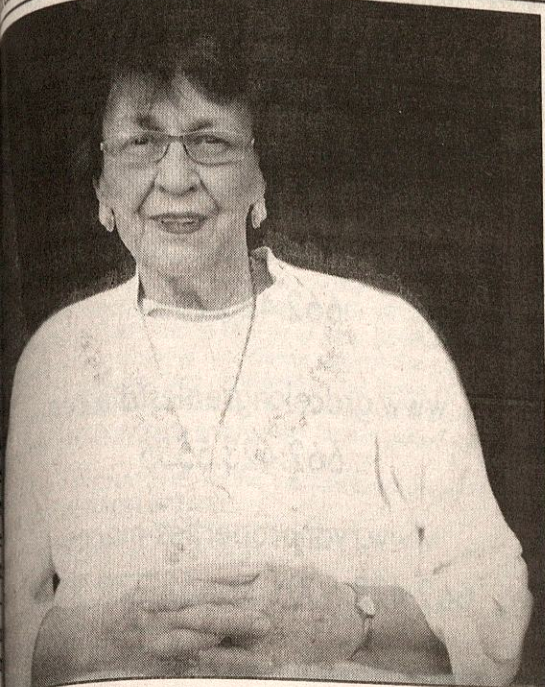

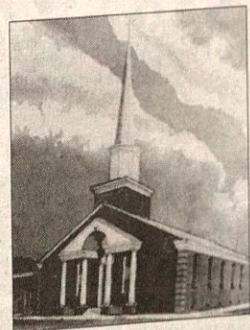

A Glimpse Into Heaven (Part XII)

We are still looking at the opening of the seven sealed book, which only the Son of God is worthy to open. For those who may not have read my previous articles on this subject, I will say that the seven sealed book, mentioned first in Revelation chapter five, is a book of judgments that will be poured out on the earth during the tribulation, and only Jesus is worthy to judge men. This is true because He became a man, yet still God, and walked among men on earth, thus He is qualified by experience to judge earthly creatures, since He lived in a physical body on earth and never sinned, but also because He is God and knows everything about every person.
