## Fergusons & Tri-State Foundation Provide Opportunities for Local Students, Schools, & Community

UM Haines Memorial Scholarship Added to Scholarship Offerings for Local Students

OXFORD - The game of bingo was first played in Italy as early as 1530. France took up the game in the 18th century. The game was standardized in the United States during the 1920s, with a rule book published in 1933. Fast forward to the 21st century, when retired educators Sylvia and Bob Ferguson, of Iuka, are using bingo to help people from 18 counties in a 50-mile radius of their home earn college degrees. To date, the Fergusons have generously provided \$1.6 million for scholarships to assist students enrolled at the University of Mississippi.

The Fergusons point out that they didn't choose bingo; bingo chose them. Iuka has two state-regulated bingo halls, and its northeast Mississippi location attracts regular players from a three-state area. With the facilities owned by parties in other cities,

Iuka residents watched as earnings left their community for years. Some of them appealed to the Fergusons to buy one of the halls and invest the proceeds in the community, possibly through education. Always known for being innovative thinkers and dedicated educators, the Fergusons agreed. "We thought about it and prayed about it, and we could definitely see a tremendous need for the profits to expand educational opportunities," said Bob Ferguson, who has led school districts in the role of superintendent from Long Beach to Iuka to Kansas City, Kansas. With 572 current scholarships (2,648 since inception) and countless local educational initiatives funded, the Fergusons' Tri State Educational Foundation is making its mark not only in Iuka and at Ole Miss but also at many other higher education institutions.

To apply for a scholarship, an applicant has to be a resident in one of the seven Mississippi counties, five Alabama counties or six Tennessee counties covered by the foundation. Scholarship dollars follow recipients to whatever higher education institution they choose. "We applaud the Fergusons and the Tri State Educational Foundation for identifying a creative source to ensure major investments are made in the lives of students, teachers, and their community," UM Chancellor Jeff Vitter said. "Sylvia and Bob are expanding their remarkable legacies as dedicated educators by now funding an exceptional number of educational opportunities. The University of Mississippi is deeply grateful for this important scholarship support." The wall of the Fergusons' Riverhills bingo hall is lined with framed university and community college emblems noting

each school attended by one or more of the Fergusons' scholarship recipients. The larger frames reflect schools that receive major investments, and Ole Miss is prominent in that group. "This is our way of telling our patrons how the profits are used," said Dana Degraw, who oversees the foundation's day-to-day operations as executive director. "They

are usually very interested to walk around and see all the universities on display." Bob Ferguson remembers the challenge of figuring out how to cover the costs of attending college. "Don't forget whose shoulders you stood on," he said, referring to the philosophy he hopes scholarship recipients will share. "I personally had to have a lot of help to attend

college when I was young, so I am so happy to have this opportunity to give back." The Fergusons' Tri State Educational Foundation also recently created the James Robert Haines Memorial Scholarship in the UM School of

Pharmacy. An Iuka native, Haines graduated from the pharmacy school in 1985 and practiced pharmacy at St. Joseph Hospital in Memphis and Eliza Coffee Memorial Hospital in Florence, Alabama. He died in 2001. Haines' widow, D.D. Walker-Haines Lambert, is an Ole Miss alumna who serves on the Tri State Educational Foundation Board. Scholarships are the Fergusons' main focus but far from the only way the couple and the Tri State Education Foundation board members strengthen the community.

The foundation has provided resources to bring professors to Iuka so teachers could attain master's degrees through evening classes, support to help local educators earn National Teacher Certification, resources for students to travel to science fairs and student organization conferences, support for local band camps, funds for computers, funds for smart boards, and support for various community activities.

"We never thought the foundation could have this major impact," said Sylvia Ferguson, a veteran teacher. "The first year (1999), the goal was to award 12 scholarships, and we're so pleased that it has grown. And it's fascinating to learn what our scholarship recipients are able to achieve after earning their college degrees."

Tri State Scholarships are paid directly to Ole Miss and other institutions, and the funds can be used for tuition, books, meal tickets, residence halls and fees. Students who commute to college may ask for part of their scholarships to be converted to gas vouchers or even childcare expenses.

Undergraduate students in the scholarship program must successfully complete a minimum of 12 hours and maintain at least a 2.0 grade-point average with no failures. Students must submit their grades to the Tri State Educational Foundation twice a year. Individuals who wish to pursue graduate degrees in the field of education also are eligible to apply for the scholarships.

Among other initiatives supported by the foundation are vocational education, Boys & Girls Club, Crime Stoppers of Northeast MS, law enforcement training and docent training for volunteers at the Tishomingo County Archives and History Museum.

The amount of money the foundation has to fund its scholarships and projects each year depends on the proceeds earned in the Riverhills bingo hall, which operates seven days a week. Bingo itself has embraced modern technology, as many enjoy the game on the array of computers offered at Riverhills, while others still enjoy the traditional paper

sheets.

Natives of New Albany, the Fergusons were high school sweethearts and have been married 56 years. In fact, they wed on the day of Sylvia Ferguson's college graduation from Delta State University. Bob went on to earn a master's degree from the University of Kansas and a doctorate from the University of Southern Mississippi, while Sylvia also received a master's degree from USM.

They are parents of two grown children and grandparents to three; their daughter Kristi, an educator in Iuka, is involved with the work of the Tri State Educational Foundation. The Fergusons' second-oldest grandchild, Braxton Phelps, will join the Ole Miss student body in the fall.

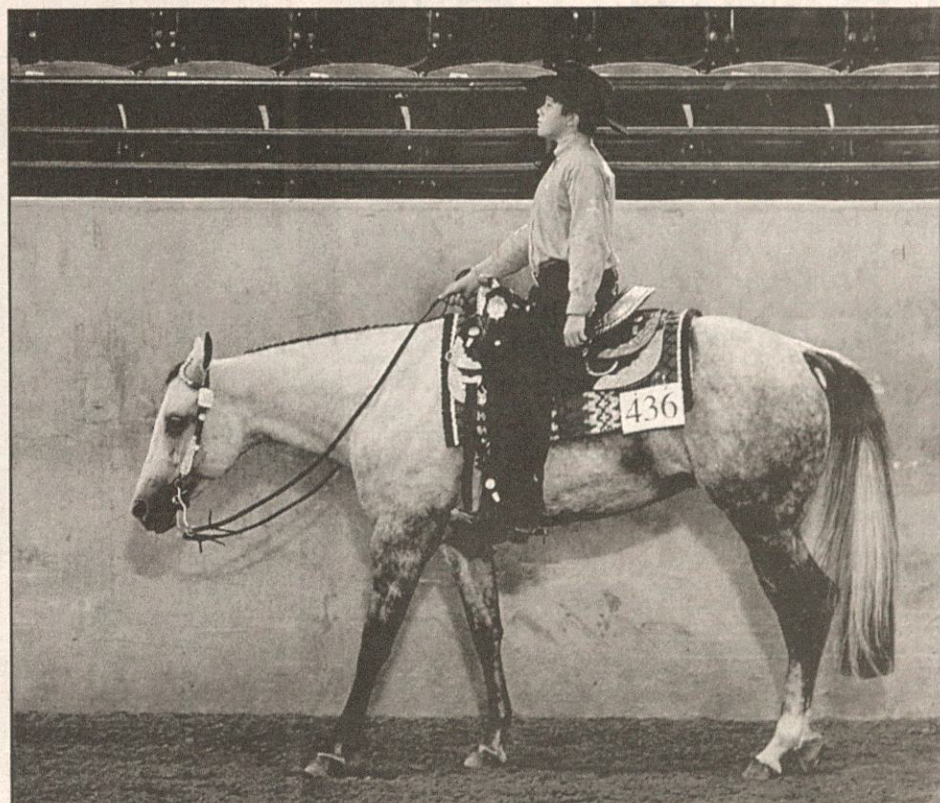

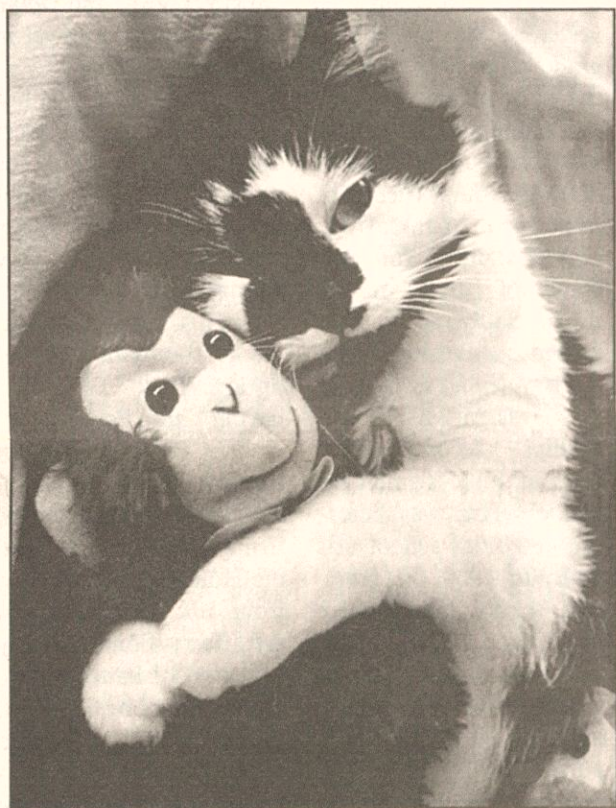
## Noah Carpenter Competes at State 4-H Horse Show

I look at this photo often and it only seems like yesterday that the second grade class of IES was in the park playing. I was in Mrs. Leona Phillips' second grade class at Iuka Elementary School. This was before the new (old) school was built. ## Tobacco Against the Law at Youth Events

Summer is here and youth sports in Tishomingo County are in full swing at our local parks. With this in mind, it is worth reminding our citizens that the State of Mississippi has taken positive steps to protect the health of our children by limiting the use of tobacco during youth sporting events. According to Miss. Code Ann. § 41-114-1 (2010), Smoking at Public Facilities during Organized Athletic Events: During any time that persons under 18 are engaged in an organized athletic event at a public facility, no participant in or spectator of the athletic event shall smoke in the facility, if the facility is enclosed, or within 100 feet of the facility, if the facility is not enclosed. Tobacco use is the leading preventable cause of disease and death in the United States. In Mississippi, 5,400 adults die each year from smoking, and 192,000 children are exposed to

secondhand smoke at home. Secondhand smoke is dangerous to children. Children exposed to secondhand smoke get sick more often and are more likely to develop bronchitis, pneumonia, ear infections, severe asthma attacks and Sudden Infant Death Syndrome. It doesn't take much. Even breathing in secondhand smoke for a short time can be harmful. There is no safe level of exposure to secondhand smoke.



The 22-year-old from Tishomingo County relished every minute as June camp days at Mississippi College spilled into July. The former MC Student Government Association president taught adult Bible study, battled scorching summer temperatures, and welcomed campers from across the South.

Not every moment went smoothly for the 2016 Mississippi College graduate, so Mary leaned on God's help. "I think God can overcome ev-

everything," she said. At times, "Satan attacked the staff," but, no worries. "The Lord is over everything."

A former FUGE camper as a kid at Union University in Jackson, Tennessee, McRae arrived well-prepared at the new assignment at her alma mater. Last summer, she served as a staffer at Southern Baptist-affiliated camps in North Carolina. McRae also received training at Southern Baptist Convention headquarters in Nashville before MC's camp season kicked off.

Coming to America's second oldest Baptist college as FUGE director seemed to be the perfect fit for the Tishomingo Baptist Church member.

"I loved the size - it's not too big, and not too small," McRae said Tues-

Making things extra special: her brother Conner, 18, and sister, Emma, 15, were among hundreds of campers enriched by the Christ-centered experience in Clinton.

As many as 740 children attended FUGE camps at Mississippi College campus one week. They were supervised by as many as 32 staffers while parents tagged along as chaperones. Each summer, there are more than 6,000 boys and girls invading MC for sports and church camps.

No matter what challenges she faced, McRae proved to be an effective FUGE director. Loud worship services at Swor Auditorium, quiet times

for Bible study, sports activities at the Healthplex, overnights at residence halls and countless ice cream scoops were packed into every week.

"Mary just did a great job for us," said Ken Giliam, who oversees Life-way's FUGE camps as MC's continuing education director. "She's had a great career at Mississippi College and topped it off at Fuge. She's got a bright future."

Next up for Mary McRae: a Mississippi Baptist Convention mission trip to Hawaii. It's not just fun times at the beach and sight-seeing. The week-long mission trip in July is designed to spread the Gospel to people knowing little about Jesus. Beyond that, her destination is the Bayou State.

An outstanding mathematics student, Mary will put her skills to the test. She goes to work in late

July at Louisiana University as manager of finances for the Campus Ministry. 150 LSU students to the organization. Baton Rouge campus.

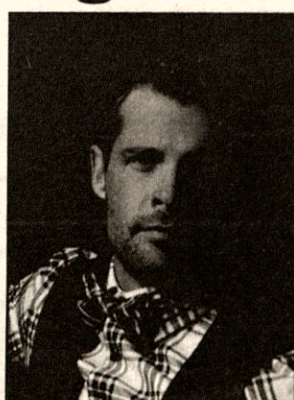

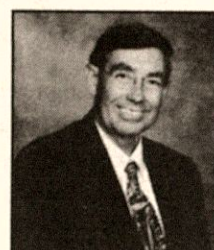
Please remember to bring your box and a cooler for your frozen items on pick up day.

### Who Are The 144,000 In Revelation Chapter 7? (part II)

It always amazes me that some churches and religious groups work so hard at "straining Scripture" to make it say what it really does not say. This has been done with Revelation chapter 7, as well as with many other parts of the Bible, particularly the Old Testament, to make Israel somebody else beside Israel. With all that God has done in both testaments to distinguish Israel from the rest of the world and from the church, it is a wonder that anyone would even try to replace Israel with any other group. So, the 144,000 in Revelation chapter 7 are all Jewish people, or Israelites. (I realize that the name "Jew" is not as old as the name "Israel", but both have been used to designate the 12 tribes of Israel for many centuries, so I feel safe in doing the same here. The purpose of the 144,000 is to evangelize the earth during the tribulation, or at least that is indicated in Revelation chapter 7, though not necessarily clearly stated. It is interesting that there are saved people from every nation mentioned in connection with the 144,000 within this same chapter.

Revelation 7:5-8 gives the names of the 12 tribes that make up the 144,000, with 12,000 coming from each of the 12 tribes. I will not give all of the content of these verses here, since much is repetitious, but I do want to name the 12 tribes that are named within these verses. Those named are: Judah, Reuben, Gad, Asher, Naphtali, Manasseh, Simeon, Levi, Issachar, Zebulun, Joseph and Benjamin. Those who are not named here are: "Dan and Ephraim". Those named here who are not named in most other lists of the 12 tribes are: Levi and Joseph. Some say that Dan and Ephraim are omitted because of their connection with idolatry, but that may not hold water, for all 12 of the tribes embraced idolatry at some points in their history. Levi is not usually named in the lists of the 12 tribes because they had no land inheritance, since they served as priests and helpers of priests. It is interesting that Ezekiel 48:1 and 48:5 show portions of land for both Dan and Ephraim in the millennium, so their idolatry may keep them from being "evangelists" in the tribulation, but it will not keep them from land inheritance during the millennium. Ephraim and Manasseh are both mentioned in Ezekiel 48: 5, but Joseph is not mentioned, yet he is represented by these two sons: Ephraim and Manasseh. Since God has the right to divide up the "jobs" and "inheritances" of Israelites as He wishes, we see the distinction in the two lists from Ezekiel chapter 48 and Revelation chapter 7, with Ezekiel giving the tribes who inherit land in the millennium and Revelation giving the tribes who serve as evangelists during the tribulation. So, my conclusion is that the 144,000 are all Israelite evangelist whom God has honored to witness during the tribulation and to win to Christ a number that is beyond any ability to count, or at least too numerous to bother with counting. The 144,000 is a very important group, even more important than the churches, cults or religious groups who want to "steal their identity"!

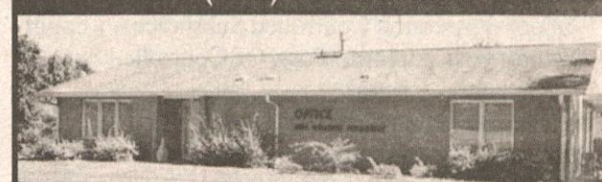

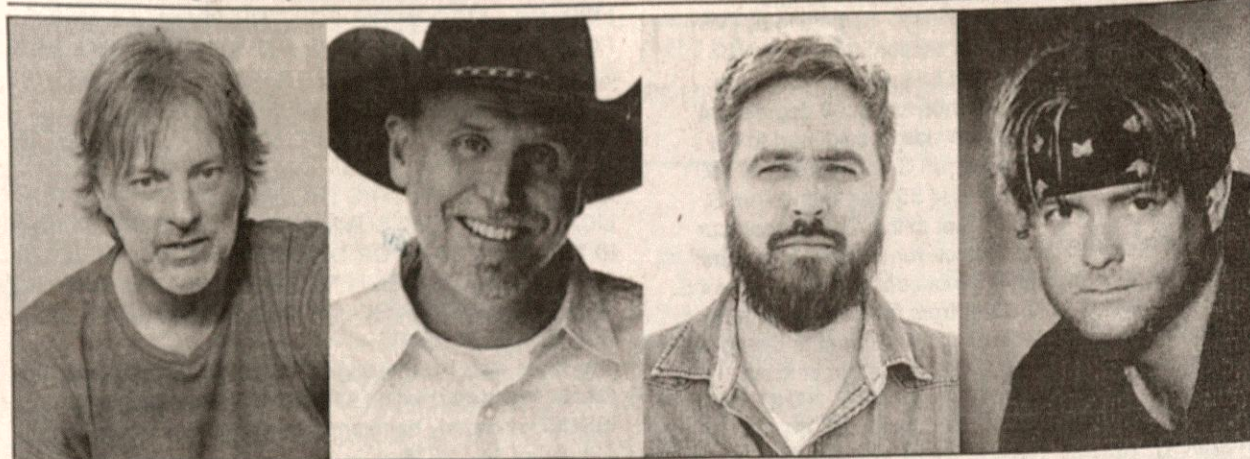

## TCEPA Taking Nominations for Board of Directors

In accordance with the Bylaws of Tishomingo County Electric Power Association, nomination for positions on the Board of Directors are now being accepted. There will be five positions open for election. One director is to be elected for a three (3) year term for each of the following supervisors' districts: 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, and an area at large position.

Members of the Association may make nominations by either of the following methods:

1. Nominees must be residents of the supervisors' districts which they will represent. Any member, regardless of place of residence, may be nominated for the area at large position; provided, that the nominees for the at large position may not be a resident of the third or fourth supervisors' district. These districts presently have a resident serving in an at large position.

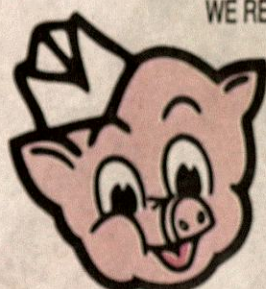
