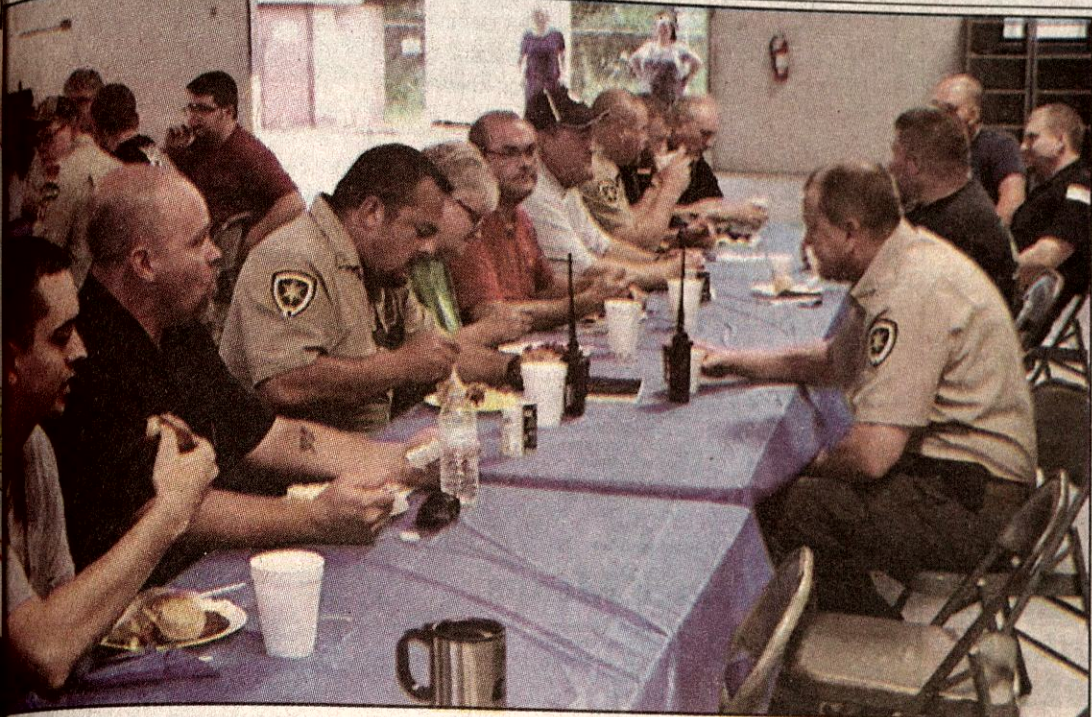

Tuesday Morning Domestic Dispute Results in Stabbing

Early Tuesday morning a domestic dispute near Midway resulted in two injured persons being hospitalized and one person being arrested for aggravated assault.

According to the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, at about 7 a.m. Tuesday, deputies were dispatched to a residence at 125 CR 150 Iuka, where it was discovered that three people were involved in an altercation.

An unidentified victim was stabbed in the stomach, and this same victim apparently had a 9mm semi-automatic pistol in his hand; he fired the weapon toward the ground which caused shrapnel to strike another person who was there with the suspect, in the foot.

Deputies immediately detained Mark Landon Carpenter, and transported him to the Tishomingo County Jail.

The subject who was struck with shrapnel was transported to the NMMC - Iuka via ambulance with non-life threatening injuries. He was treated and released.

All weapons used were found and collected for evidence.

The stabbing victim is still in Magnolia Hospital in Corinth due to the injuries that he sustained during the assault.

Charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon was Mark Landon Carpenter, 49, of 117 County Road 150, Iuka. He is currently in custody at the Tishomingo County Jail awaiting a bond to be set.

Schools Start Thursday; High Schools Start Block Scheduling

County high school students will start the 2016-17 on a block schedule system, with four 94-minute periods each day.

According to Tishomingo County High School Principal Jackie Beals, the school day for high school students will begin a little earlier this year - first period begins at 7:50 a.m. Students go a little longer, too: dismissal from fourth period will be at 2:04 each afternoon.

In the new block schedule, students will go to four 94-minute periods, and will complete an entire course in a semester, instead of over the year. In courses like drivers' education, those will be complete in 9 weeks, and the rest of the semester the student will take health or PE.

Annual Meeting Saturday

August 13th the membership of the Tishomingo County Electric Power Association (TCEPA) will vote on several open spots on its Board of Directors.

There are 13 members on the board that oversees the business of the association; two from each supervisor District in the county, and three At-Large

members. All members (usually meter holders) can vote on any and all positions on the ballot, and voting locations will be the same as in years past- there will be more specific instructions in next week's edition.

Qualification deadline to run in the election has ended, and those who qualified are listed below.

Theoretically, nominations from the floor of the

upcoming annual meeting this Saturday are possible if there are at least 10 percent of the membership physically present; but would be about 1,500 people, and usually less than a dozen attend, according to reports.

The annual meeting is Saturday, 10 a.m. at the Tishomingo County Courthouse, and all members are invited.

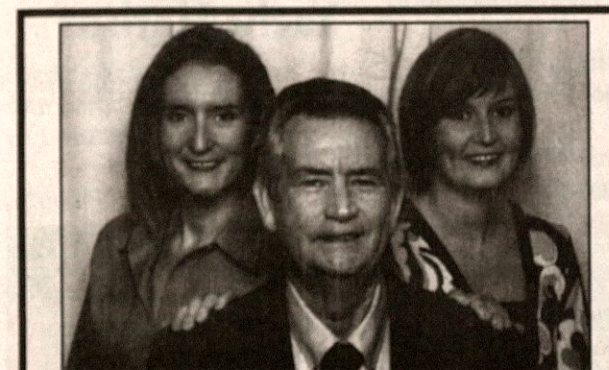

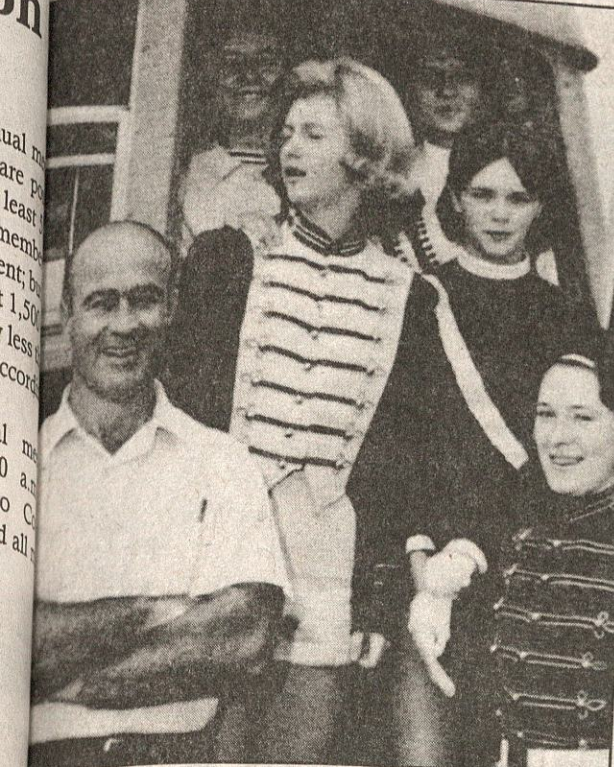

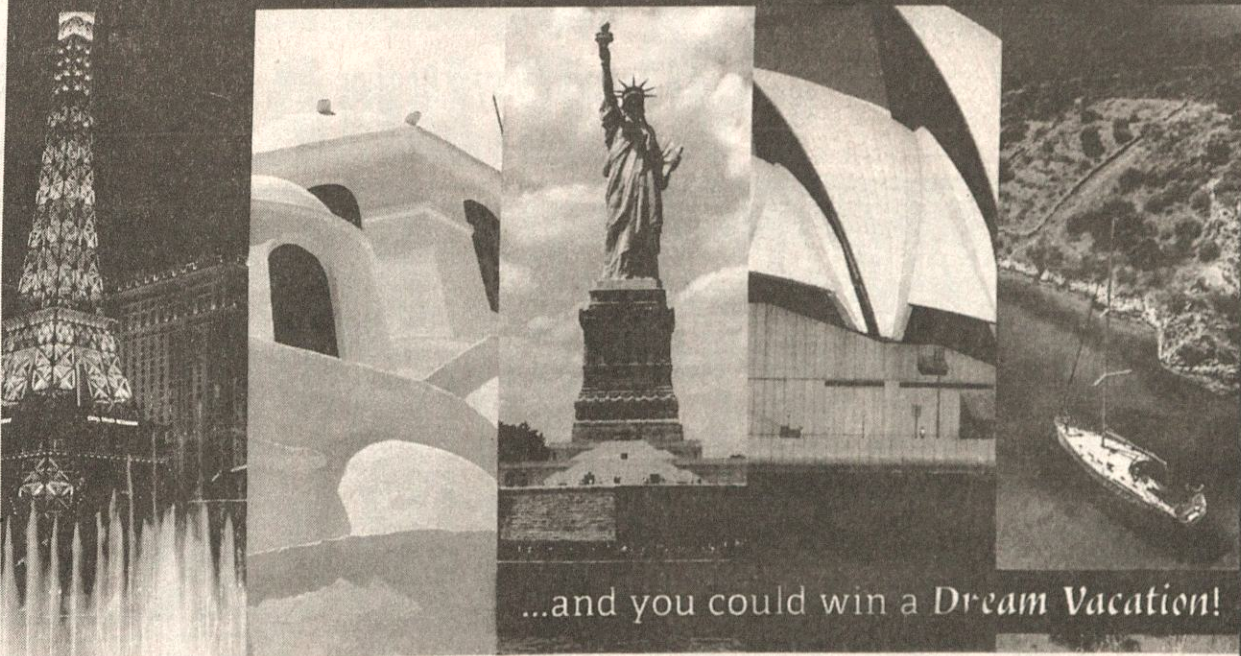

Thirty Minutes Of Silence In Heaven!

The ideas that human beings on earth have about heaven and its activities and sounds are interesting, to say the least. It may cause a few mouths to drop open when some people learn that the Bible speaks about roughly half an hour of silence in heaven. I have the idea that much of what we will learn in heaven will be "new territory" for us. I am convinced that "heaven" will be much more than just singing and shouting God's praises, although that will certainly be done, for there will be some kind of service that we will render to God for eternity. Revelation 22:3 says: "And there shall be no more curse: but the throne of God and of the Lamb shall be in it; and His servants shall serve Him." Since we are learning about things that will happen in heaven, I will give the verse that speaks

of "about half an hour" of silence in heaven; it is Revelation 8:1: "And when He had opened the seventh seal, there was silence in heaven about the space of half an hour."

It is not clear as to why John wrote about the time period of silence as being "about half an hour". Perhaps he is not trying to give the exact length of time in this period of silence. Can you imagine what it will be like for all who are in heaven when this time comes, which will include all of those saved in the Old Testament age; during the church age and some who are saved dur-

ing the early part of the tribulation and then die, or are killed? Heaven is pictured in the minds of most Christians as being a place of great joy, exuberance, singing, shouting and praise, and it will be all of these. However, something will "stop the music" and other audible sounds for about half an hour. This is likely a head scratcher for all of us, at least to some extent, yet there seems to be some bit of light on it in the things that follow Revelation 8:1, which says, "And when He had opened the seventh seal, there was silence in heaven about the space of half an hour." The One

Who opens the seventh seal of the seven-sealed book is Jesus, according to Revelation 5:5-7. We have seen several things that have happened in the opening of the first six seals, but now that the last seal is about to be opened, there is silence in heaven! Have you ever noticed, or at least been told, that there is often a deadly silence just before the breaking of a terrible storm on earth? I think this is what is taking place in heaven in Revelation 8:1. God is about to pour out more severe judgments on the earth after the opening of the seventh seal, so heaven stands silent for about half an hour! When we see the things that will follow, as the Book of Revelation discloses them, we will know that the judgments God is sending are indeed worse than any that have come before. For all those who think that God will

never judge sin or sinners, I would recommend an honest reading of the Book of Revelation! Many people do not like this book, because it does show so many different judgments that God will pour out on the earth. The good news is that those who are saved now will escape this terrible time of God's wrath. For those who think that "God would

never do this", I need say that such people have a faulty view of God. It is also a faulty view of and God's hatred for sin. Yes, He will save any who repent and believe in His Son Jesus Christ, but unbelievers beware of the coming day of wrath. Sin and sinners who refuse to repent and believe

Prepare my own meals. These are certainly not the many course dinners I made for my family in the "good ole days." If I cook large amounts of food

I call my youngest sister who comes to help me empty the Crock Pot. She is happy to take my leftovers.

And I still drive. I have disabled plates so please pass me if you need to go faster.

I often slow down to let the vehicle behind me pass. They almost always slow down too.

Cannot do

Fasten my best jewelry. I wear pearls on an elastic stringer and earrings that hang from the holes in my ears.

Cut my own toenails. Fortunate for me, I have a real cosmetician come to my house and finishes with a pedicure. She also cuts my hair.

Open pop-top cans, bottles, canned foods, etc. Same goes for child-proof medicine bottles. Large juice bottles are the most difficult.

Always reach the door before a visitor departs. Give us two minutes or more.

Wear most of my old clothing. I keep it because I truly wish I could gain that weight back. For years I lost 10 pounds then gained it back many, many times.

Being ill caused me to lose 40 pounds. Now I long for "curves."

Wear pretty shoes or high-heels. Judge Judy said her doctor told her the best way to live a long life was not to fall. I make every effort to stay upright.

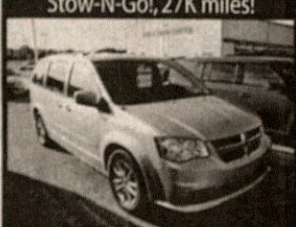

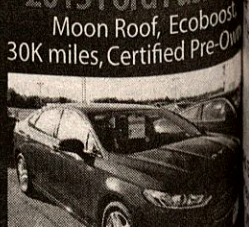

Be it resolved that the Tishomingo County, Mississippi Board of Supervisors at their regular meeting on the 18th day of July, 2016 for the purpose of passing a resolution as required by House Bill 1782 which amended Chapter 928 of Local and Private Laws of 2015, and having considered the statutory requirements imposed upon the board of supervisors to which requires Board to provide for an election for the Board of Commissioners for the Tishomingo County Water District and upon a motion by Supervisor Brandon G. Malone a second by Supervisor Michael Busby and unanimous vote of the Board, the Board hereby find and resolves as follows:

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors finds that the Mississippi Legislature passed and the Governor approved Mississippi House Bill 1782 and the Bill became law after passage which requires that the Board of Supervisors provide for an election of the Board of Commissioners for the Tishomingo County Water District and further requires that said election be held on the first Tuesday of September 2016 and on the first Tuesday of September every five years thereafter. The Board further finds that said House Bill 1782 mandated that the election would be an "at large" election with the top five vote receiving the highest number of votes will be elected to serve as Board of Commissioners for five year terms. The candidates receiving the five (5) highest vote totals will take office on the first Monday of October following the election held in September 2016. The votes shall be counted and the results published by posting the results on the bulletin board of the office of the Tishomingo County Water District office in written form noting the results of said election.

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors finds and resolves that pursuant to House Bill 1782 from the 2016 Mississippi Legislative session an election for the Board of Commissioners will be held by paper ballot at the Tishomingo County Water District office located at 117 East Eastport Street, Iuka, Mississippi 38852 on Tuesday September 6, 2016 and voting hours shall be between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. at the Tishomingo County Water District Office. The Board further finds and resolves that the election will be conducted by the Tishomingo County Election Commissioners and the results will be tabulated by the Tishomingo County Water District office after the result tabulations are concluded and certified by the Election Commissioners.

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors finds and resolves that pursuant to House Bill 1782 that the qualifications for the office of Board of Commissioner for the Tishomingo County Water District are specified that a Candidate for said office shall have the following qualifications:

1. A person must be at least twenty-five (25) years of age;
2. A person must be a water meter holder of the Tishomingo County Water District;
3. A person must be a resident of the service boundaries of the Tishomingo County Water District areas where water service is presently being provided;
4. A person must not be precluded from being bonded in the sums and manner as required by Section 19-5-171(2) of the Mississippi Code of 1972 which requires that each Commissioner, elected or appointed as a commissioner, before entering upon the discharge of the duties of the person's office, shall be required to execute a bond payable to the State of Mississippi in the penal sum of not less than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) condition that the person will faithfully discharge the duties of the office. Each bond shall be approved by the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and filed with the Clerk.

The Board further finds and resolves that the qualifying for the Office of Board of Commissioners shall begin on the first Monday in August of 2016 and shall continue for twenty-one (21) days thereafter. The Board finds and resolves that if the final day for qualifying falls on a weekend or holiday then the qualifying period shall be extended until closing business hours of the Tishomingo County Water District Office on the next business day.

The Board further finds and resolves that the candidates for the office of Water District Board of Commissioners may obtain an application to qualify at the Tishomingo County Circuit Clerk's Office or the Tishomingo County Water District Office. All qualifying forms must be submitted to the office of the Tishomingo County Water District Office or the Tishomingo County Circuit Court Clerk's office by close of business on the last day for qualifying for said office.

The Board further finds and resolves that after the election has been conducted and the results tabulated and certified by the Tishomingo County Election Commissioners, the candidates receiving the five (5) highest vote totals will be sworn into office after taking the prescribed oath of office which shall be administered by the Circuit Clerk of Tishomingo County, Mississippi.

The Board further finds and resolves that the Notice of Election, Qualifications and Resolution shall be posted on the front door and bulletin board at the Tishomingo County Courthouse, the door of the Tishomingo County Water District and published in a newspaper of general circulation within Tishomingo County, Mississippi for a period of three consecutive weeks prior to the election with the date of the last publication being twenty-one (21) days more preceding the date of the election.

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors further finds and resolves that the Board shall pass legislation in substantially the following form so as to provide for the election of the Tishomingo County Water District.
