Two Qualify to Run for 2nd District School Board Seat

Two candidates will be vying for the Second District seat on the Tishomingo County School Board on the November General Election ballot.

Debra Brewer and Gary White have both qualified to run for the second district position, which represents mostly the Burnsville area on the county-wide school board.

The qualifying period was already closed by the time of this announcement. This will be the only local office on the November 8th general election ballot that will include the national presidential election, along with other offices. Only second district voters will vote in this race.

Burnsville Man Dies in Lawnmower Accident

Last Wednesday morning a Burnsville man died in an apparent mishap with a lawnmower.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, James "Jimmy" Elbert Powers, 77, of Burnsville, died of trauma caused when the zero-turn lawnmower with him riding fell 10-12 feet off a bank. The mower pinned him under in a creek, said Wilemon.

Powers' wife had left about 8:30 that morning, and came home later and was unable to find him.

The TC FCA would like to thank our students, teachers, churches, businesses, Iuka Hospital employees, the Antique Car Club as well as the entire community for your contributions to the School Supply Drive for the student flood victims in Louisiana. Whether your contributions were monetary, school supplies, clothing, or Bibles, they were graciously and humbly accepted. The recipients were so appreciative and thankful for the love and concern shown from people so far away. Your gifts were taken to the River Oaks Elementary School in East Baton Rouge Parish. The buildings on that campus did not take on water but all four hundred children of the student body had flood damage to their homes. helped in the September 21st arrest of a driver for felony possession of methamphetamine. Deputies recognized a driver after having dealt with him in the past, and knew the driver's license was suspended. During the course of the resulting traffic stop, Rob-

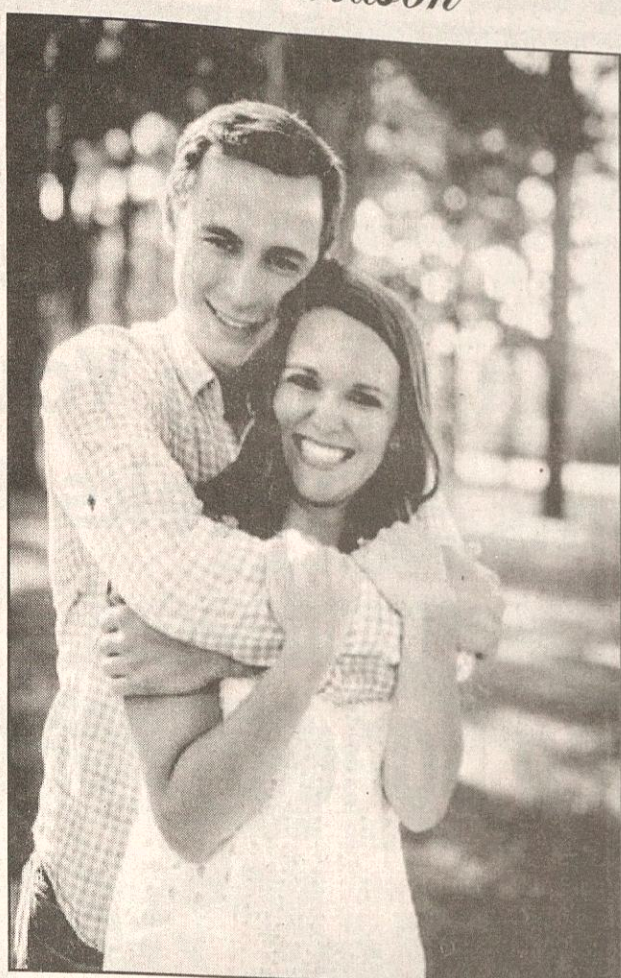

Dr. Lelia Kelly will discuss Plants of the Bible on Friday at the Fair

Please join us on October 7th at the Tishomingo County Fairgrounds as the Tishomingo County Master Gardeners celebrate 25 years of the Mississippi Master Gardener Program. Our featured speaker will be Dr. Lelia Kelly, Extension Horticulture Specialist from Mississippi State University Extension Service. Dr. Kelly will be discussing the plants of the Bible.

Our program will start at 11:45 A.M. just outside the main building at the fairgrounds. We will have a sack lunch with drinks for \$5.00. After the program plan on having a piece of cake and meet our local Master Gardeners as we celebrate the 25th Anniversary of the Master Gardener Program.

Dr. Lelia Kelly is a Consumer Horticulture Specialist for MSU Extension Service and is also responsible for the Statewide Mississippi Master Gardener Program. Prior to joining MSU Extension Service Dr. Kelly owned and operated two businesses: a landscape design and consulting business, and a wholesale herb growing greenhouse operation. She is a regular contributor to Mississippi Gardening along with newspapers and other gar-

dening publications.

For 25 years, Master Gardener volunteers have beautified Mississippi community landscapes. In 2015, statewide, the volunteers have donated 64,000 hours of time at an estimated value of \$1.4 million along with contacting 1.3 million individuals in the performance of their services.

Locally the Tishomingo County Master Gardeners over the past 10 years had presented programs on various horticulture subjects at the Iuka Elementary School, Tishomingo Middle School, Boys and Girls Club of Iuka, and the Iuka Methodist Church Children's Summer Program just to mention a few.

The Tishomingo County Master Gardeners projects include the Butterfly Garden at the Iuka Elementary School, the flower beds at Jay Bird Park and demo plots at the County Extension Office. We have more projects on the planning board as our membership grows.

Master Gardener volunteers receive 40 hours of training provided by staff from MSU Extension Service along with our current members. After completion of the training we ask all new



members to contribute 40 hours of volunteer work over the next year. While performing this work volunteers are able to learn more about gardening, make new friends, and have fun along the way.

If you want to learn more about our programs please join us this Friday at the Tishomingo County Fairgrounds at 11:45 A.M. The program will be interesting and you may find yourself wanting to join an organization dedicated to helping our community beautification projects.



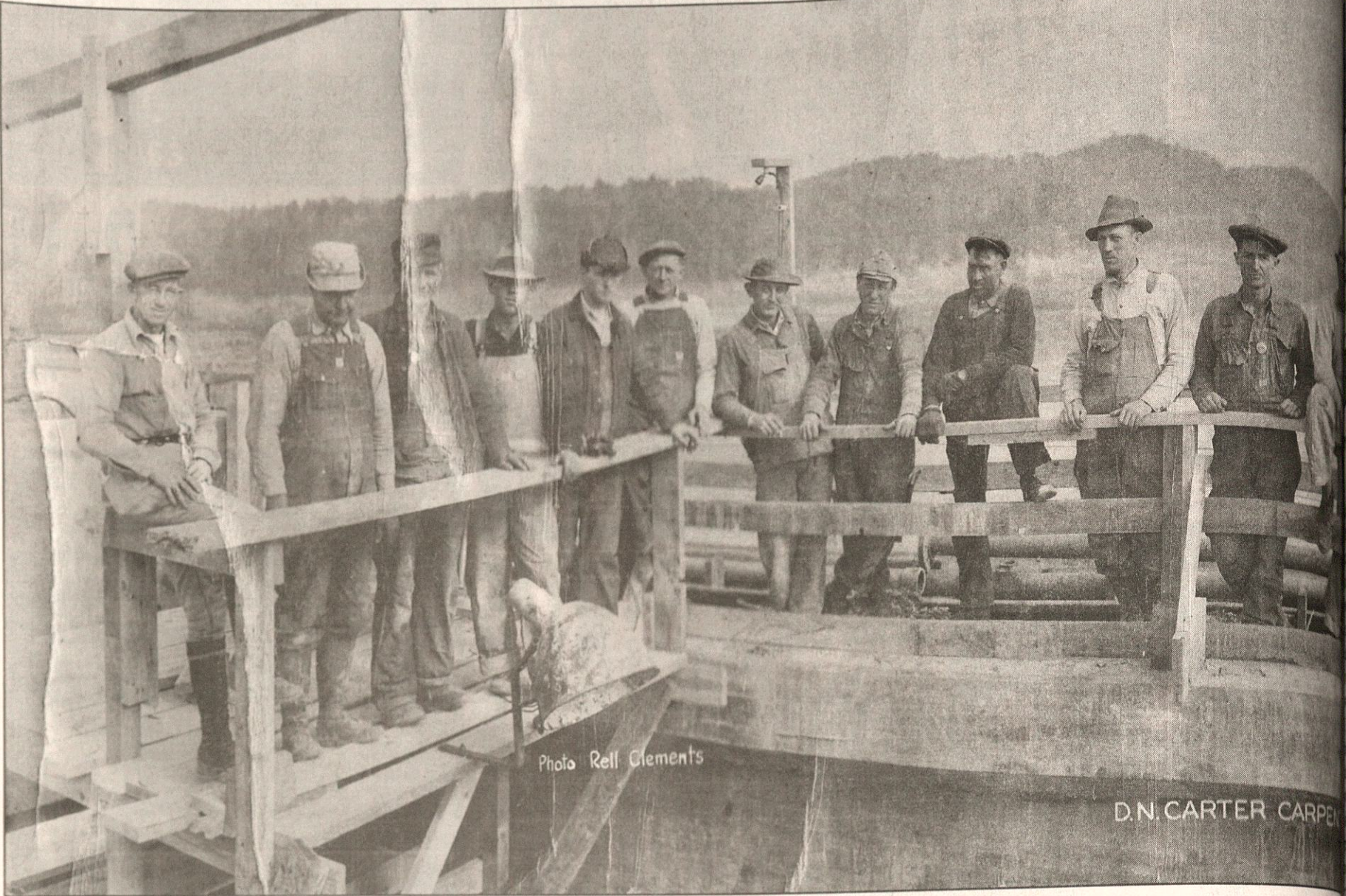

Conservation Corner

National Fire Prevention Week

National Fire Prevention Week will be observed October 9 - 15, 2016. This year's theme is "Don't Wait-Check the Date! Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years." Did you know that your home smoke alarm should be tested every month? People don't test their alarms as often as they should and when there is a fire the smoke spreads fast. Your alarm will give you time to get out. Be sure to test yours every month.
This yearly observance was established to remember the Great Chicago Fire, which occurred in 1871. It killed more than 250 people, left 100,000 homeless, destroyed more than 17,400 structures and burned more than 2,000 acres. The fire began on October 8, but continued into and did most of its damage on October 9, 1871.
While the Great Chicago Fire was the best-known blaze to erupt during this fiery 2-day period, it wasn't the largest. That distinction goes to the Peshtigo Fire, the most

destructive forest fire in American history. The fire, which also occurred on October 9, 1871, roared through Northeast Wisconsin, burning down 16 towns, killing 1,152 people and scorching 1.2 million acres before it was done.
The Peshtigo Fire began when several railroad workers clearing land for much needed tracks unintentionally started a brush fire. Soon the fast moving flames were raging across the land. It was the small town of Peshtigo, Wisconsin that suffered the worst damage. Within an hour, the entire town had been destroyed.
People start most wildfires but some are attributed to lightning from electrical storms. These fires can spread quickly, igniting brush, trees and even homes. We need to be especially careful when using campfires or bonfires.
Without proper precautions, they are potentially dangerous. You need to know how to property build one, how to keep it going and how to properly extinguish it. Most of these fires burn out

of control in one of two basic ways: on the ground or in the trees. Dead leaves or pine needles on the ground may ignite from direct contact or airborne embers or sparks may ignite overhanging branches.
No fire should be lit near trees, tents or other fire hazards. Never leave a fire unattended. You should always have sand and/or water on hand to smother the fire if it does get out of control. Water is more efficient and effective in extinguishing a fire. The water should be poured until all hissing noises stop. Then you need to stir the ashes with a stick to make sure the water has penetrated all layers.
If water is unavailable, sand may be used to smother the fire. Once the fire has been covered thoroughly with sand, you will then need to stir the ashes with a stick to make sure it has been fully extinguished.
Don't forget safety at home and while you are enjoying the great outdoors and having fun this fall.

NMMC-Iuka ACT Center to Host Sign-ups for Free Smoking Cessation Program

Individuals who are seeking assistance to quit smoking or tobacco use can find a helping hand as the North Mississippi Medical Center-Iuka's ACT Center program will host an open enrollment on October 11, 2016, from 5:00 PM until 7:00 PM. The first class of this new session will begin on October 18th at 6:00 PM. The center, based at NMMC-Iuka, is staffed by respiratory therapists certified in helping people quit using tobacco using an evidence-based planning method that is recognized state-wide for its effectiveness and is sponsored by the Mississippi Department of Health. The treatment for clients involves a six-week course and provides some medications in order to help people kick the tobacco habit.

The ACT Center program is designed to help people quit using tobacco, and many people each year make this commitment, but are unable to succeed without the proper assistance. For more information on the ACT Center or other Respiratory Therapy programs at NMMC-Iuka, please call (662) 423-4675.

Seven Angels With Seven Trumpets (part VI)

It always amazes me that so many people in the world seem to think that God should never judge anybody for anything, but the actual fact is that everybody who has ever lived will face God in some kind, and in some place, of judgment at some point in the future. The only person Who will not be judged is Jesus the sinless One, for He has already been judged, as if a sinner, on the cross for our sins. Revelation is not the favorite book of many people, chiefly because it speaks so much of judgment on human beings and their earthly habitat. Revelation 9:1-11 shows the fifth angel with a trumpet that he will sound. Verses 1-4 of this chapter say, "And the fifth angel

sounded, and I saw a star fall from heaven unto the earth: and to him was given the key of the bottomless pit. And he opened the bottomless pit; and there arose a smoke out of the pit, as the smoke of a great furnace; and the sun and the air were darkened by reason of the smoke of the pit. And there came out of the smoke locusts upon the earth: and unto them was given power, as the scorpions of the earth have power. And it was commanded them that they should not hurt the grass of the earth, neither any green thing, neither any tree; but only those men which have not the seal of God in their foreheads."

This is perhaps the most difficult chapter in

Revelation to understand, and I make no claim to understand all that is indicated here. I do see that a star that falls from heaven is given a key to the bottomless pit and opens it. The word "fall" can also mean to "alight", so we cannot be positive that this star has had a "fall from heaven", as Satan did, thus we cannot be positive that Satan is the star here. It seems more logical that this star, or angel, is some-

one other than Satan that God has sent to open the bottomless pit. Revelation 20:1-2 shows an angel who comes down from heaven with a key to the bottomless pit and who binds Satan in that pit for a thousand years. So, the star may simply be an angel to whom God has given the key of the bottomless pit, so that he can release demonic beings who are there for the purpose of bringing judgment

on unsaved people on the earth. It is altogether possible that the angel in Revelation 20:1-2 is the same angel (a good one at that) who is given the key to the bottomless pit in Revelation 9:1. It is not wise for any of us to be too dogmatic on the identity of the "star" in Revelation 9:1, or the angel in Revelation 20:1-2, since God does not give us the identity of the "star" or the "angel". Both could be the same angelic being, or there could be two different angels in these two passages. It is possible that Satan is the one who "fell" from heaven in Revelation 9:1-2, but it seems a little unlikely that God would allow Satan to have the key to the bottomless pit. Moreover, Satan

is not the prime pouring out the judgments mentioned in Revelation, though does allow him and cause him to bring this time. the One worthy of Revelation 5, which contains the seven seals of the judgment, are recorded in the Book of Revelation, so my opinion of Revelation 9:1-2 the "star" is an angel whom Jesus will pour out the judgments announced through the sounding of the trumpet.

Severe Storm Program Scheduled for October 11

Storm observing, reporting, procedures, and safety to be emphasized

The fall severe storm season is approaching. Are you ready for whatever is in store? Do you have a severe weather plan at your home and your workplace? Can you recognize the clues that suggest large hail, flash flooding, or a tornado is possible? Do you want to become part of the severe weather warning system in your county?

As part of its area-wide weather preparedness campaign, the National Weather Service in Memphis will answer these and many other questions at the Skywarn storm spotter training program on Tuesday, October 11, from 6:30 to 8:30 PM. The program will be in Iuka at the Tishomingo County Courthouse, 1008 Battleground Dr., and is held in partnership with Tishomingo County Emergency Management.

The program will discuss thunderstorm formation, severe weather production, and features associated with severe

storms. The presentation will also review tornado formation and behavior, non-threatening clues which may be mistaken for significant features, and safety tips to keep in mind when thunderstorms threaten. The program will discuss spotter operations and recommended reporting procedures. The two-hour presentation will be in multimedia format, featuring numerous pictures of storms and nearly 25 minutes of storm video clips.

The network of trained storm spotters plays an important role in Tishomingo County. "We could not do our job as well as we do without storm spotters", said Gary Woodall, Warning Coordination Meteorologist at the Memphis NWS Office. "Real-time reports from storm spotters play a huge role in our warnings. Radar is a great tool, but it only tells us part of a storm's story. The combination of spotter

reports and radar data gives us the best possible picture of the storms and what's going on inside them."

The program is free and open to the public. "By coming to this program, you will learn a lot about thunderstorms", Woodall said. "Even if you don't become an active storm spotter, you will learn about how storms work and the visual clues you can identify when storms are in your area. We will discuss severe weather safety tips. This will better prepare yourself and your family for the threats that storms pose."

The Tishomingo County severe weather program is one of 15 that the Memphis NWS Office will conduct between September and early November. The National Weather Service in Memphis provides forecasts, warnings, and weather services for 57 counties across the mid-South. For more information on severe
