## Tish. County Hosts Cross Country Meet Saturday on Newly Completed Trail

The hills around the county's largest school will be alive with the sound of running feet on Saturday morning when Tishomingo County High School hosts its first cross country meet. Hundreds of runners from more than nine schools, and as far as Grenada, Mississippi, will compete for honors in the annual Tishomingo County Cross Country Invitational. Both high school and middle school teams will compete in four separate races beginning at 8:30, explained Coach Tommy Bonds, who leads the team with his wife, Coach Dana Bonds.

A new trail has been under development since the summer, a cooperative project of private and school resources. It features all the best parts of TC's sprawling campus like lots of wooded trails and hills to run (ugh!) and down (whew!) several wooden bridges, like the one pictured above, have been constructed so runners won't have to run through water-filled ditches, though, with prevailing drought conditions, they have not exactly been tested yet. There's a chance of rain Friday - the closest the region has had to precipitation since August.

Weather for Saturday should be one of the best Tishomingo County has to offer with lows in the 60's. Girls' varsity runs at 8:30

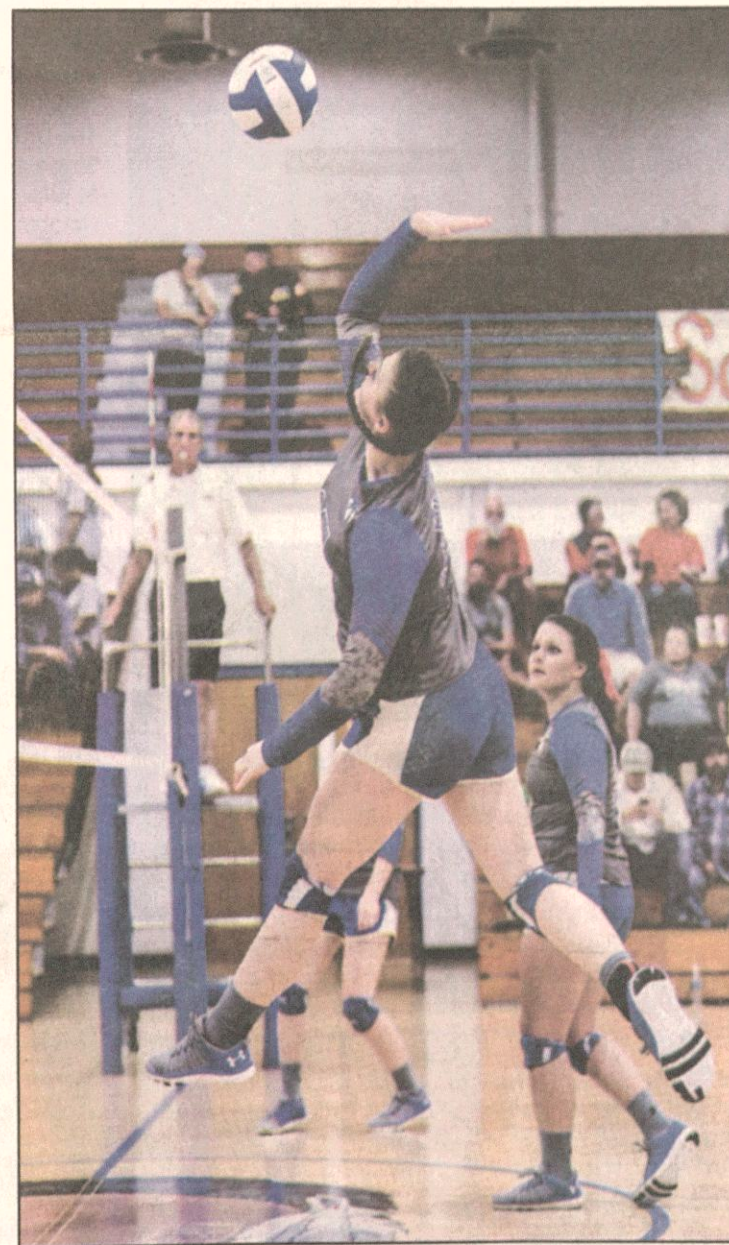

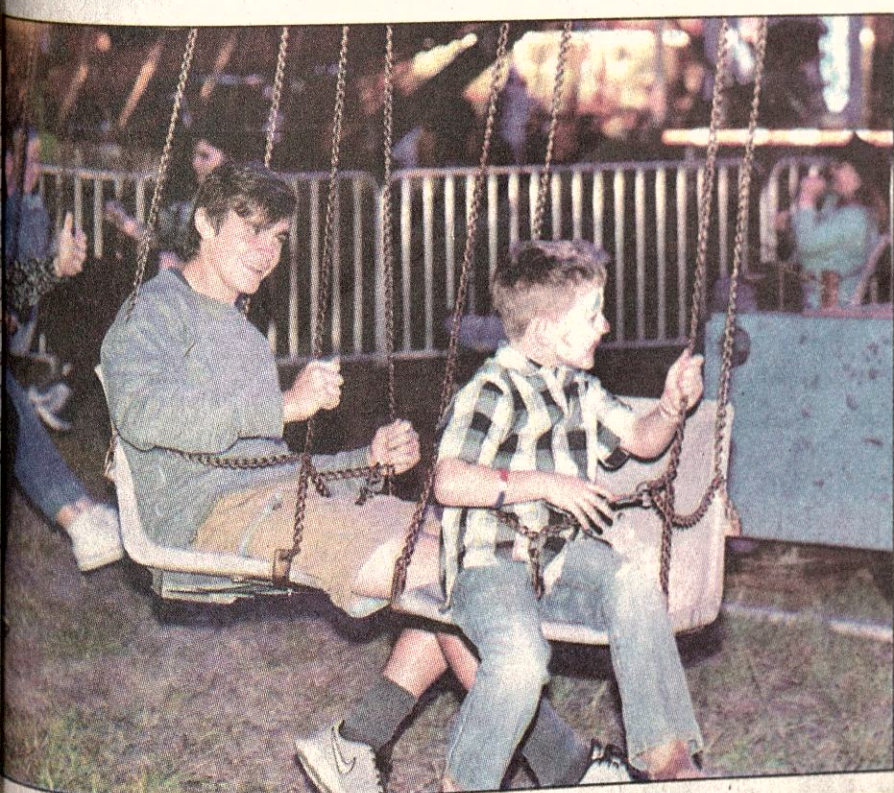

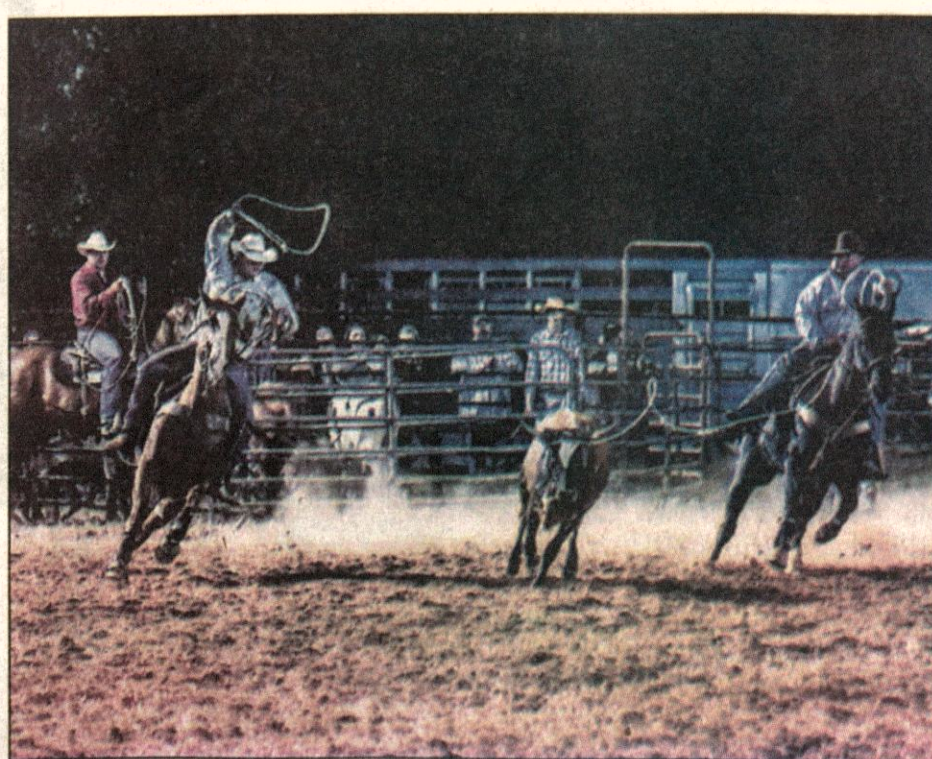

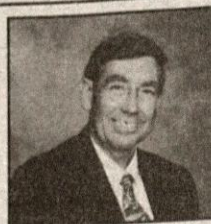
# Seven Angels With Seven Trumpets (part VIII)

It is interesting that some people go too far in seeking to interpret the Bible as a book of mostly all figurative language, but such is not the case. On the other hand, some people interpret the Bible so literally that they allow for nothing figurative. The actual fact is that most of the Bible is to be taken literally. When there are things that are to be taken figuratively, the Bible will have some kind of key "hanging near the doorway" of that verse or passage. We have that kind of thing in Revelation chapter 9, which shows "locusts" coming out of the bottomless pit that has been opened

by a "star", or an angel. Revelation 9:7-10 says, "And the shapes of the locusts were like unto horses prepared unto battle; and on their heads were as it were crowns like gold, and their faces were as the faces of men. And they had hair as the hair of women, and their teeth were as the teeth of lions. And they had breastplates, as it were breastplates of iron; and the sound of their wings was as the sound of chariots of many horses running to battle. And they had tails like unto scorpions, and there were stings in their tails: and their power was to hurt men five months." There are "keys"

hanging all over the doorway to these verses, with such words as: "like unto; as it were; as etc. All of these words tell us that there is a similarity between the locusts and the other things or persons mentioned. So, the locusts are not horses, women, lion's teeth, but they have characteristics like these. I am not about to guess what all is meant by this allegorical lan-

guage, but I do know that there are characteristics in these locusts that are like those of men, women and lions. We might see that some of the characteristics described in these locusts picture deception; beauty (as the hair of women) or strength and fierceness as lions. The breastplates are not iron, but are protective like iron; the wings of the locusts make a sound as

that of horses running to battle, thus producing fear in those who hear their approach. Perhaps there is much more here, but there is also sometimes much speculation on matters like this, which cannot possibly be proven, so I will leave it to my readers to do their own speculation, if they wish to go beyond what we see in the verses. The locusts have the power of the sting of a scorpion in their tails, showing us that they will inflict pain on those people who do not have the seal of God in their foreheads, even like the pain of the sting of a scorpion. This torment will last five months, without bring-

ing death to anyone. Should anyone be severely judged by the judgment, I would only a taste of the torment to come on the saved when they are before Jesus Christ the great white throne judgment (Revelation 20:11-15). At that time, the unsaved will be cast into the fire forever, with no possibility of release. Good news is that unsaved can still come to Christ, as long as they are living on earth and are sensitive to the Spirit of God's leading them to come! By J. Briggs King, (678) 451-0921

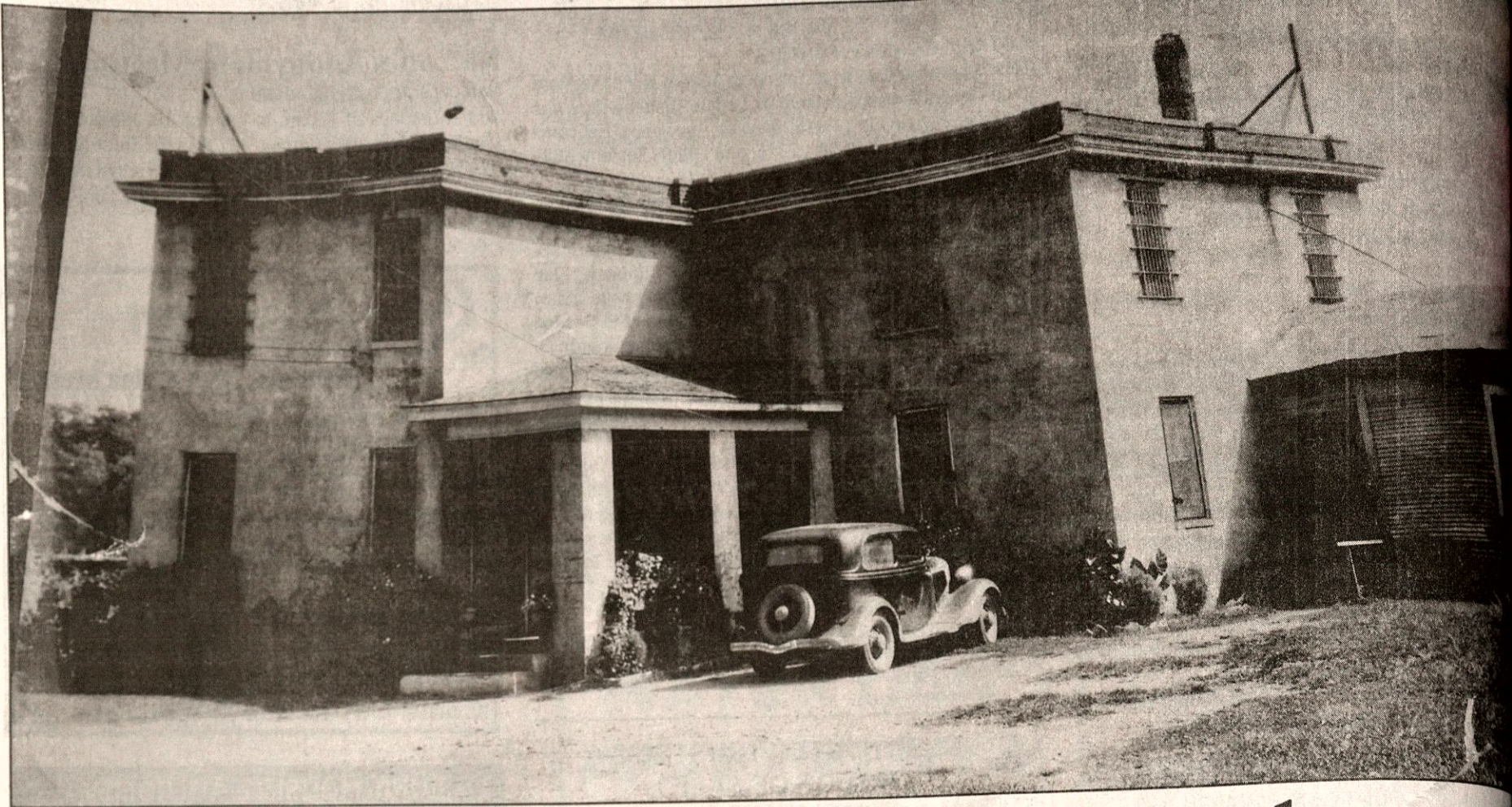

Barbara Nell King Cooper of Midway, Georgia found the photo taken by Mr. Simmons in some old papers that belonged to her parents, Tobuck and Margaret King. Photos of the jail in the 1960's and even after it was closed and used as "The Haunted Jail" are frequently found, but this is the oldest photo I have ever seen of the jail. The car in the photo is believed to be a 1934 Ford. Isaac M Jackson was sheriff from 1932-36 and Omer J. Bullen was sheriff from 36-40.
