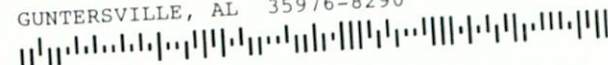

## Tuesday Morning Crash on Hwy. 25 - No Injuries Reported

Amazingly, no one was hospitalized after this Tuesday morning collision at the intersection of Highway 25 and Maria Lane in Iuka.

According to authorities, a white SUV was northbound on Highway 25 when a car that was eastbound on Maria Lane collided with it in the northbound lanes. It was just before 9 a.m. Drivers of both vehicles

were on the scene and declined medical treatment from emergency medical personnel who responded to the 911 call, said authorities.

The SUV driver was headed to work at the health department, and the driver of the car was headed to the Tishomingo County Courthouse for Justice Court, said a first responder on the scene.

### Hwy. 72 Accident

A driver involved in a roll-over on Highway 72 near Tishomingo County High School was airlifted to Tupelo as a precaution after a 6:30 a.m. Tuesday incident. The driver, who was on his way from Leighton, Alabama to his workplace at Van-leigh in Burnsville, was said to be alert, but he did have to be extricated from his vehicle with "jaws-of-life" machine.

## Some Concerned as NMMC Takes Over Local Ambulance Dispatching

Concerns about local ambulance service in the county have been raised by the NMMC takeover of local dispatching, but service will probably remain the same.

According to North Mississippi Medical Center - Iuka (Iuka Hospital) administrator Fred Truesdale, response time has always been an issue with local ambulance service in mostly rural Tishomingo County, but some people have publicly raised concerns since NMMC-Tupelo has taken over dispatch of all ambulances in several area towns in the last month.

The ambulance service in years past has been locally controlled, and local personnel still work the service, assured Truesdale, but now, they may indeed be called to help in Tupelo. They are frequently called to Fulton to help out, as well. Iuka, West Point and Eupora ambulances are now all under the NMMC dispatch umbrella, explained Truesdale.

There are a myriad of factors and variables that go into running an efficient as possible emergency ambulance service, said Truesdale. When we had local control we felt like we would possibly know how to fix a problem, but it is out of our control now, he said.

According to the board clerk, the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors directed Board Attorney, Phillip Whitehead to write a letter to the NMMC EMS Service Board of Directors asking what they are going to do to "address the deficiency of service."

"They are trying to consolidate service and be as efficient

with resources as they can, and we are working with them, of course," said Truesdale. "We hope that something terrible doesn't have to happen before any change is made."

But even if we had total control, we would still have problems, it's not a perfect system, since there are so many variables, explained Truesdale.

A large percentage of ambulance runs are out of the county, since Iuka Hospital is often a stabilization center, where patients are stabilized in the emergency room in preparation for transport to other larger health centers like Magnolia Regional Health Center in Corinth, Tupelo's NMMC, or even Memphis facilities, explained Truesdale. These runs can mean as many as 6-7 hours round trip as the crews work to get a patient checked in, and wait to be released back home, explained Truesdale.

"We make more runs out of Iuka than West Point and Eupora combined," said the administrator.

We are obligated to respond to any 911 call, and if the patient asks to be taken to another hospital, we have to honor the patient's request, he said.

On the way back from an out-of-county run, they may be the closest responder to an accident, or emergency, and they will be dispatched to that.

An additional challenge to all emergency response personnel in Tishomingo County is the geography of the 40-mile long county divided by the Tenn-Tom Waterway. Plus, many please see

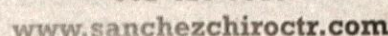

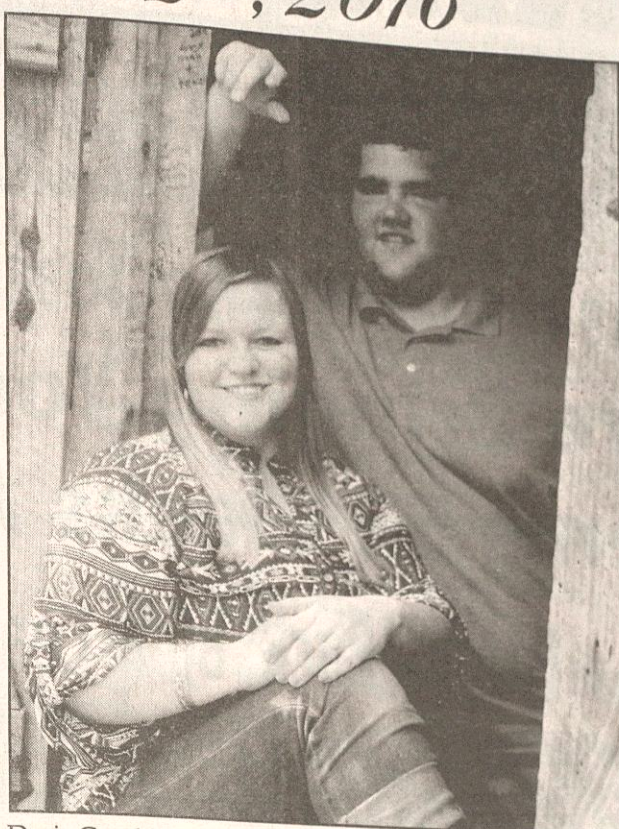


# Mitchell-Davis, To Wed October 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2016

## Charlotte's Attic

The photo shown below was brought by the office by Fred and Bobbie Counce. It is the Carpenters on No 1 Draft Tube Power House, Pickwick Dam, Tennessee 4-15-1937. Construction on the Pickwick Dam started in March 1935 and the power plant and dam opened on May 8, 1938. Many local men helped in the building of TVA's Pickwick Dam bringing much-needed work to the area. However, the flooding of the area destroyed many towns and took many homes and farms from settlers.

Dr. A. E. (Eddie) Foote, a native of Iuka, shared this info: Alabama Heritage published a 2007 article on effects of Pickwick Lake flooding in 1937-38. Patricia Bernard Ezell writes in Volume 83 that the post office in Riverton, Alabama -- across Bear Creek from Eastport, Mississippi -- closed on 1 August 1937 and flooding reached the town site by February 1938. When TVA held dedication of Pickwick Dam a few years afterward, they invited the Sheffield High School Band to join a Memphis Shiner's band for entertainment to 30,000 people. Bill Erwin, WHNT's Shoals reporter until 1998, has restored photo of carpentry crew on Pickwick Dam, that includes his dad.

## Iuka's Connection to the Hindenburg Remembered

The recent premiere of the NBC history drama, *Timeless*, featured the crash of the German Zeppelin aircraft, the *Hindenburg*. One of our readers, Dr. Eddie Foote of Florence, pointed out an obscure connection to this historic event.... and the town of Iuka.

A former Iuka boy named Dick Merrill became a barnstorming pilot in the early days of aviation before World War I. In the mid-1930s, he made several trans-Atlantic flights, including the first round trip flight (made it from New York to Wales in 18 hours 36 minutes, a record time). He also made the first commercial transatlantic round-trip flight, and it is this one that ties into the *Hindenburg*.

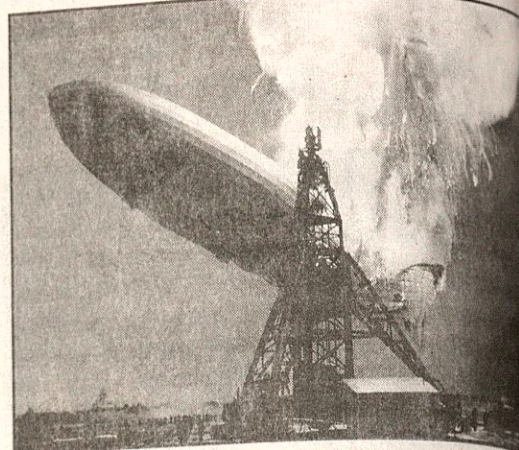
Merrill and co-pilot Jack Lambie were set to fly to England and bring back photos of the May 10<sup>th</sup>, 1937 coronation of King George VI for newspaperman William Randolph Hearst. The photos would help the legendary publisher scoop other papers by publishing photos in his newspapers of the coronation before any others.

Preparing for departure from Floyd Bennett Field on May 9<sup>th</sup>, Merrill was being interviewed by reporters when he was interrupted by news that Germany's airship *Hindenburg* had gone down in flames while attempting to land at Lakehurst, N.J., killing 35 passengers and crew members. Merrill was instructed to delay the takeoff so he could carry film of the disaster to London, where Hearst owned a newspaper. Dick agreed, in part because the revised assignment would give him the first commercial flight in each direction.

A History.net article online gives an interesting history of Merrill's career and life, a bit of which we have included here.

Born on February 1, 1894, Merrill grew up in Iuka, Mississippi, where his ability to pitch a baseball with either arm earned him the unlikely nickname "Dick," after ambidextrous storybook sports hero Dick Merriwell. He was talented enough to play minor league ball, once winning both games of a double-header by pitching right-handed in one, left-handed in the other.

But his attention was drawn skyward after



The Hindenburg disaster occurred on May 6, 1937, as the German passenger airship LZ 129 *Hindenburg* caught fire and was destroyed during its attempt to dock with its mooring mast at Naval Air Station Lakehurst in New Jersey. Of the 36 people on board (36 passengers and 61 crewmen), there were 35 fatalities (13 passengers and 22 crewmen). One woman on the ground was also killed, making a total of 36 fatalities.

watching aviatrix Katherine Stinson stunting in 1914. Upon the outbreak of World War I, he joined the Navy with dreams of dogfighting German Fokkers. But his lessons with French instructors left him frustrated, complaining, "I didn't learn a thing." His interest in aviation never waned, even after he joined the railroad, as his father had done. When the federal government announced the sale of surplus Curtiss Jennys in 1920, he and a buddy scratched up \$600 for a plane and began taking flying lessons.

Despite limited experience, Merrill soon ventured into barnstorming. His youthful good looks, blue eyes and natural charm helped spare him from starvation in that unforgiving line of work. As crowds demanded ever-more-dangerous stunts, Dick's charm enabled him to win a relatively safe job offering plane rides for the famed Gates Flying Circus.

After five years of barnstorming, he learned that the government was hiring pilots for a pioneering network of airmail routes. His skill and commitment to safety—including being a teetotaler amid legions of heavy drinkers—made him an attractive candidate. However, his first job flying nights between Atlanta and New Orleans in a weatherworn biplane provided no guarantee of longevity.

In May 1928, he upgraded to a company founded by wealthy young Harold Pitcairn, flying the mail in a more modern aircraft between Atlanta and Richmond. The ambitious Pitcairn had hired an engineer to design the Pitcairn Mailwing specifically to serve a government postal route. Still, flying at night over mountains was a treacherous undertaking.

One night, with an empty fuel tank, he rolled the aircraft over a field far below, he was searching the ground for his body. "Here's the body," he called out.

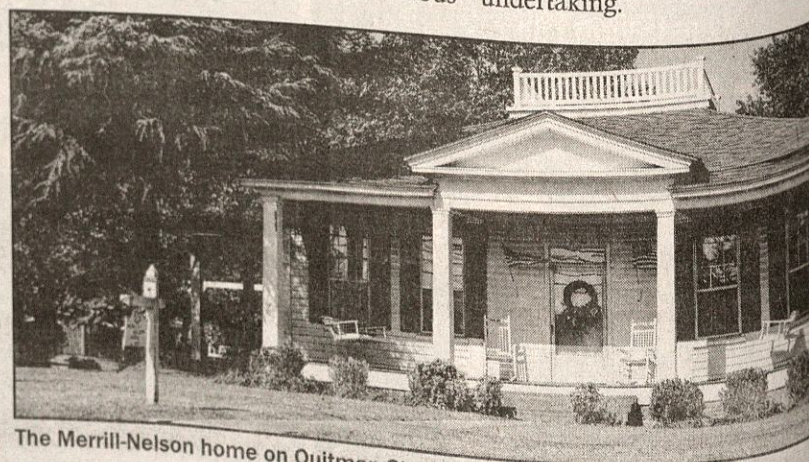
Not only did he survive his years in the mail, he even made money doing it. By the time newly formed lines were beginning to take over the airmail business, he boasted a year period when he canceled a Pitcairn flight and earned unprecedented \$11,000 a year.

He died at the age of 88, with his wife, Toby, at his bedside, on October 31, 1982. Toby would follow him in March 1983, working until the end to preserve her husband's legacy in aviation history.

In recent years, writer Chris Evans wrote about Dick Merrill in the *Tishomingo News*, and contacted Merrill's wife and daughter. They were unfamiliar with his roots in Iuka, but came visit and see his hood home, which bears the Merrill name. Quitman Street near Middle School.

Recently, the Gold Strike Casino in North Mississippi honored Dick Merrill for his 1937 flight for William Randolph Hearst. There was an exhibit for the Lockheed Electra, London's Big Ben, an Audi sedan. The pean auto represented man Hindenburg, which delayed the take-off from New airfield.

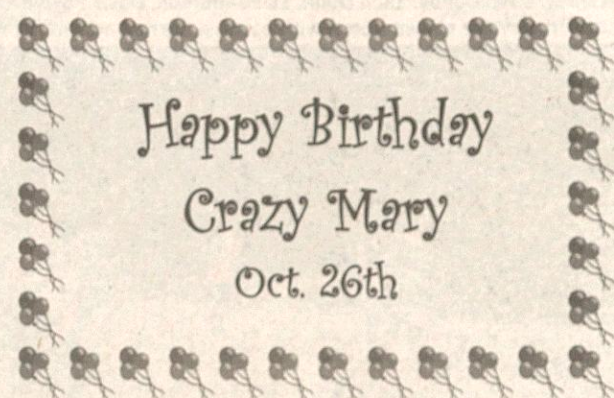

The 2016 Tishomingo County Beaver Control Program sign-up will continue through December 31st. Any landowner in Tishomingo County is eligible for this program. A fund has been set up by the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors to help with the cost of trapping the beavers in our county. To take part in this cost-share program you must call the Tishomingo County Soil & Water Conservation District at 662-423-6272 or drop by the office at the Tishomingo County Ag Building at 240 Kaki Street Iuka, MS.

Beginning January 3, 2016 the bounty on the beavers will be paid. To collect the bounty (\$12.50 per Beaver) the landowner or his trapper must bring in frozen the Full Tail and Front left paw. Bounties will be paid the first Tuesday of each month through April or until the funds are depleted. Beavers cost landowners thousands of dollars each year in damages to their forest and young tree seedlings. The BCP is in place to help landowners of our county.
