Verlon Hawkins, 38, of  
Shoals, last week, and  
extradited to Tishomin-  
County where he was served

moved to Alabama since

dicated he raped a 16-year-old  
who lived at the same  
place as Hawkins back in  
2015.

The 16-year-old victim  
reated at the hospital fol-  
the incident, where  
was gathered, and in  
of 2016, investigators  
arrested Hawkins and ob-  
tained a DNA sample, which  
compared to the initial evi-  
dence at the Mississippi State  
Lab.

The Grand Jury set  
Hawkins' bond at \$20,000; he  
remains in the Tishomingo  
County Jail.

The victim, now 18, and  
her family have been advised  
of the arrest and charges.

the vehicle, at the jail. They both  
have holds on them from  
Corinth Police Department.

After re-  
ports of a  
black Cadil-  
lac on County  
Road 169 driv-  
ing suspicious-  
ly, pulling into and out of vari-  
ous driveways, K9 Deputy Scott

Dalton conducted the traffic stop  
on that road. Since they stopped  
in a blind spot, the officer di-  
rected them to move up to the  
intersection of County Road  
169 and High-  
way 72. During  
the stop, the  
deputy asked  
the passenger  
to exit the vehicle, and a search  
resulted in several individually  
bagged packages of marijuana

on his person. Officer Dalton  
got in a struggle with the pas-  
senger and the passenger fled  
north across the highway, to-  
ward Tishomingo County High  
School. While pursuing the sus-  
pect, the deputy was grazed by  
a vehicle on the highway, caus-  
ing injuries he was later treated  
for at the hospital, and released  
that night. Some motorists  
stopped to aid the obviously  
injured deputy. Several motor-  
ist eyewitnesses saw the suspect  
flee into the woods, the deputy

could not give chase due to his  
injuries. The suspect tried to get  
into one vehicle that had slowed.  
Leatherwood had run out of his  
flip-flop sandals and discarded  
his shirt, described as a neon one  
that would have made him more  
visible, and was in the woods  
with only his sweatpants on.

## Board says No Field Trips for Students with Delinquent Lunch Charges

Sports, Band, Activities Could Be Next - Pay Those Charges

schools across the county  
nearly \$4,000 in out-  
standing lunch charges, and  
the school board has decided  
that is enough. If a student  
has outstanding lunch charges,  
they will be missing the  
school field trip, and be-  
hind for sports or other  
extracurricular activities may be

the regular meeting Mon-  
day of the Tishomingo  
County Special Municipal Sep-  
arate School District, the board  
decided that students  
behind in lunch charges  
cannot attend school field trips  
until they pay late charges.  
There are several field trips on  
the calendar for the next month, so  
the board hopes that the loss of field  
trip privileges will motivate stu-  
dents and their parents to get up  
to date on lunch charges.

At times, they pay  
to go on the field trip,  
but they have money for that,  
they would have money to pay  
for lunches," said Second  
District Board Member Jeff  
Wadkins. "The thing is, nearly  
all students can qualify for free or  
reduced lunches, if they are hav-  
ing trouble paying."

behind paying for charges are  
called before the School Board,  
said Third District Board Mem-  
ber Jim Perkins. What does the  
board do, then?

Perkins said everyone pays  
before that, so they don't have to  
be called before the board.

The current policy allows  
students to charge lunches even  
if the parents have not paid - no  
one wants students to be denied  
a meal - but few realize how  
these charges have accumulated,  
and the impact that debt has on  
school budgets.

Regulations mandate the  
food services budget balance  
each year, so any unpaid stu-  
dent debt has to be paid by each

school's principal through the  
school's general fund.

Principals, counselors and  
staff use many approaches to  
getting outstanding charges  
paid, but clearly, they are not  
all successful. Many times it is a  
lack of communication between  
parents and students, as the  
school has reminded them sev-  
eral times that they are behind  
on paying for lunches.

For older students, many  
times the cash sent for lunches  
gets spent on other things with-  
out the parents' knowledge, but  
the student still wants to eat  
lunch, so they charge.

A recent announcement at a  
high school saying that students  
may be subject to break deten-  
tion for unpaid charges resulted  
in at least half the debt being  
paid that day, so it doesn't seem  
that the students are unable to  
pay in most cases, paying for  
school lunches is just not a daily  
priority for many families.

"That money has to come  
from somewhere, and when it  
comes out of the school's gen-  
eral fund, that takes away from the  
overall classroom student expe-  
rience," explained First District  
School Board Member Emily  
Wadkins.

## Board Discusses Some Facility Upgrades & Projects

Several proposed facility  
upgrades and projects were dis-  
cussed at the Monday evening  
school board meeting, but fund-  
ing may be an issue in getting  
them accomplished.

From a recent bus bond,  
the district has about \$140,000  
remaining that would have to  
be used for facilities, but board  
members are hesitant to spend  
it, since pinching pennies has  
become the norm for Tishom-  
ingo County, as well as other  
districts across the state.

### Belmont Weight Room

One proposed project is a  
60' x 40' weight room at Bel-  
mont probably to be located  
near the gym. Buildings and  
Grounds Supervisor Matthew  
Walker said that Athletic Direc-  
tor Kerry Moody has specified  
they would like space for 11  
bench stations around the pe-  
rimeter of the facility, and that  
size would give them plenty of

room in the center of the room for group activities. That size, Walker roughly estimated, would be about \$35,000-37,000 to build.

Board members said they would recommend adding on space in addition for two bathrooms, at an estimated additional cost of \$10,000, making it about 76' x 40'.

"You'll want them sooner or later, so you may as well put them in now," said Second District School Board Member Jeff Allred of the restrooms. The closest restrooms would be in the gym or at the softball field, and board members agreed that in a case of sickness, injury or emergency, a restroom would be important to have in a weight room.

Fifth District School Board Member Greg Smith said that they thought this could be a \$75,000 project, and even with the restrooms, it may come in under \$50,000, so that is good.

### IMS Gym Restrooms

Another proposed project would add about 1,400 square feet of space onto the Quitman Street side of the Iuka Middle School gym to add public bathrooms. Currently the original single-stall

bathrooms are very small, especially for a big person, and certainly not handicapped accessible. Walker said this project was estimated at \$75,000. Additionally, connecting the new restrooms to the city utilities would require some destruction of the asphalt parking lot between the gym and the street, so it would probably need to be resurfaced, at an estimated cost of \$25,000.

Since the proposal was now pushing \$100,000, the board directed Walker to look at enlarging the current restrooms to make them handicapped accessible.

Allred stated that the newer Burnsville gym only has two handicapped accessible restrooms, and it serves the purpose adequately, especially when funding is tight.

The Board also discussed looking at upgrading existing security cameras on every campus. Currently they have a quote for \$300,000, but are still looking.

The board decided to forgo attending the national conference of the ASBA in Denver, since it would cost up to \$20,000 for travel expenses for the board members to attend.

partment of Transportation, Itawamba, and more set up a search perimeter, and a canine team from Itawamba was brought in to track the suspect. School officials were advised, and restricted access to the school, which was hosting basketball games with Saltillo. Plainclothes officers circulated, to keep

tension low, and not many within the crowded gym were aware of the situation, though every light on every athletic field along the woods to the west of the school was on, to aid the search.

Eventually, Leatherwood was apprehended in the area of several parked buses in the northeast

parking lot. He was taken to Iuka Hospital where he was treated and released for minor injuries sustained in the initial struggle.

The driver of the Cadillac, Linda McAfee, 33, cooperated with the investigation, but is being held on charges of driving without a license, and the

Corinth Police Department has outstanding warrants for her.

Alcorn County, Corinth also has outstanding warrants on Leatherwood. He is charged with possession with intent to distribute marijuana, fleeing and assaulting a police officer.

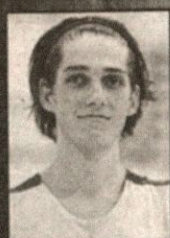

Members elected 2017 officers and board members of the foundation.

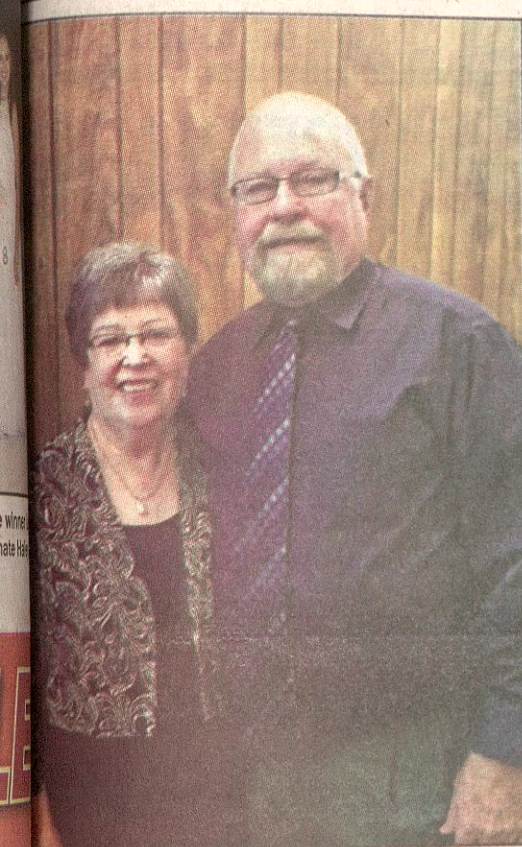

### Seven Angels With Seven Trumpets (part XI)

Although it may look like I have departed from the judgments that the seven angels with the seven trumpets are pouring out, I really have not. There is extra information given concerning some of the judgments by the seven angels, but we are still looking at those judgments, the judgments of the sixth angel being given here. I began to mention the sins of those who escaped death by judgments mentioned earlier in Revelation, but I did not finish. I gave Revelation 9:20-21 in the last article, but I will give those verses again, because I did not finish with them: "And the rest of the men which were not killed by these plagues yet repented not of the works of their hands, that they should not worship devils, and idols of gold, and silver, and brass, and stone, and of wood: which neither can see, nor hear, nor walk. Neither repented they of their murders, nor of their sorceries, nor of their fornication, nor of their thefts." I said in the last article that there was a tie between the sins mentioned in these verses, and I think you will see it. The first sin in verse 21 is murder, but these murders often come through people high on drugs; they often come in relation to sexual sins (fornication); they often come through acts of theft. Now let's see the tie: It is not uncommon for those who are hooked on drugs to steal for the money to buy a new supply of drugs. It is not unusual for murder to be committed during these thefts, nor is it uncommon for those involved in these things to be involved in fornication, either with a willing partner, or by rape etc. So, we can see a tie between many different sins.

Now let's take a closer look at the sins mentioned. First we have the sin of murder, which has become very commonplace in the United States and around the world. Many people in our day are quite willing to murder others to get what they want, whatever it may be. The sixth commandment says, "Thou shalt not kill". This was a part of the law given by Moses to Israel, but this particular commandment is repeated at various places in the New Testament (see Romans 13:10). Jesus made clear what was meant by this commandment in the Old Testament, for He said in Matthew 19:18: "Thou shalt do no murder". So there is a difference between murder and some other ways of killing people, such as in wartime etc. Some people go so far on the statement: "Thou shalt not kill" that they are unwilling to kill an animal for food, or even a fly. We must learn to rightly divide the Word of God, and even the Bible itself will clarify many things, if we keep reading! The next sin in our list is the sin of sorceries. The Greek word for sorceries is "pharmakeia"; its meaning is given as: "medication (pharmacy), i.e. (by extension) magic (literally or figuratively)." Pharmakeia is translated in our Bible as: "sorcery, witchcraft". I have copied this information word for word from a Greek dictionary, so this is not a guess! Now let's draw some conclusions. One of the common sins of the people who refuse to repent during the tribulation and after severe judgments is the sin of illicit drug use, tied also to witchcraft. Do you see where America is heading by these sins? Do you see that they will be even more common during the tribulation? Could it be that we are getting pretty close to the coming of Christ?

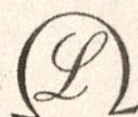

Hollywood has not helped in this area, for many of its pictures are designed to arouse the lusts of men, women, boys and girls, with no distinction being made between sexual activity within marriage or outside of it! We are living in a sad and dangerous day, and it will get worse after the rapture of the church! The last sin in our list is the sin of theft, and that sin can take all kinds of forms. For example, when one person has a sexual relationship with another's spouse, theft has been committed! When one takes anything without paying the amount of the price tag, theft is involved. When one uses all of his time for self and leaves none for God and others, theft is also involved, and the list could go on, but you get the picture by now. Sin is not "that beautiful thing" that is often pictured on screens and billboards; it is ugly and repulsive to God, and should likewise be to us! It will always cost far more than we want to pay! The characters shown in our verses are like some we know today, for they were too stubborn to repent of their sins by turning to God for mercy and forgiveness!

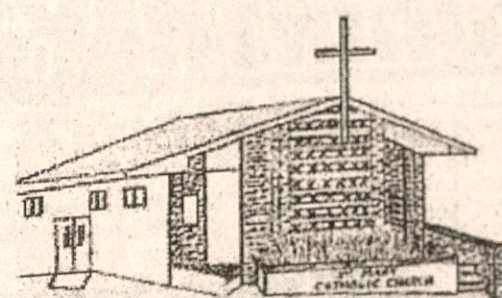

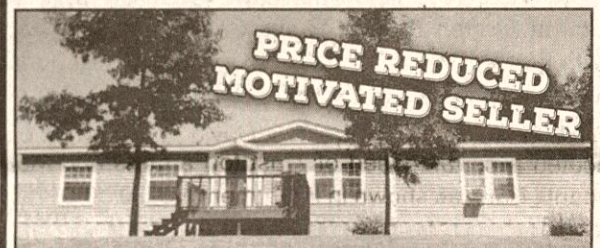
