## Miranda Nash Signs Softball Scholarship with "The W"

Tishomingo County High School senior student Miranda Nash signed her letter of intent on November 16th, 2017 to play college softball with the Mississippi University for Women otherwise known as "The W". She is the daughter of Reid Nash and Candace Cummings. Her coaches at TC are Jerry Long and Jeremy Reece.

The celebration was the first one for this early signing period for the TCHS Braves. Her high school junior year, she ended with a .413 Bat-

ting Average and a .506 OBP. She received several awards including 1st Team All Division, which is an award voted on by the coaches within the division. She was voted MVP by her teammates, and Slugger Award which is the highest batting average on the team, to close out her junior year. For her high school team she has played outfield and 3rd base. Nash's high school stats are as follows: BA: .413 OBP: .506 Runs: 20 RBI's: 13.

She has played travel ball

since she was 10 years old and her travel ball career stats are a .365 Batting Average with a .590 OBP. She is considered a utility player on her travel ball teams. Her primary positions in travel ball have been 3rd base and 2nd base.

She plans to play softball for the Owls and major in Secondary Education with hopes to teach history or science. Along with teaching, she wants to be able to coach softball, the sport that she has played for many years.

## Ecstasy Arrest Made in Tishomingo County

On November 10<sup>th</sup> the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office conducted a Safety Check-Point in the area of CR 172 Iuka. A vehicle approached the check-point and deputies could smell a strong odor consistent to that of Marijuana, coming from the vehicle. Two arrests were made during this stop, Calvin Docken, 19, of Corinth, Mississippi was officially charged with

the felony possession of a controlled substance, ecstasy. Docken had a bond set by the Justice Court in the amount of \$2,500. Also Arrested was Iesha Warren, 19, of Rienzi, Mississippi. She was officially charged with the felony possession of a controlled substance, ecstasy. Warren's bond was also set at \$2,500 by the Justice Court.

Docken was asked for

his license when he informed the deputy he had no driver's license. The deputies asked about the alleged Marijuana odor coming from the vehicle and Warren admitted to the deputies that they had smoked some Marijuana prior to arriving at the safety check-point. The passenger then handed the alleged Marijuana over to the deputies and a search of the vehicle yielded

some alleged Ecstasy as well. At this time, both the driver and passenger were arrested and transported to the Tishomingo County Jail. Docken and Warren were also charged with a misdemeanor possession of controlled substances and the felony cases will be presented to the next available Grand Jury.

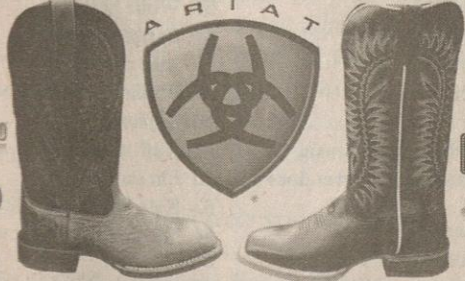

and yet is. And here is the mind which hath wisdom. The seven heads are seven mountains, on which the woman sitteth. And there are seven kings: five are fallen, and one is, and the other is not yet come; and when he cometh, he must continue a short space. And the beast that was, and is not, even he is the eighth, and is of the seven, and goeth into perdition."

I have read many comments on these verses, but nobody seems to be one hundred per cent sure about all that is said here. Our verses say that
