Dollar General Burglarized; Thieves Get Nothing

Dollar General in Tishomingo was broken into in the early morning hours Monday, but the burglars did not get anything, say authorities.

Chief Mike Kemp said that the break in was found when the morning employee went to open Monday morning. Burglars cut a hole through the back of the metal building, and through the inside layer to enter the store right near the breaker box. They cut phone lines before they went in, and moved to the nearby breaker box to kill the electricity - and security cameras. All the cameras got was one suspect, heavily covered with hat and face mask, entering through a tiny, 12-inch hole at 2:39 a.m., and crawling as far as the breaker box, where he or she switched

off all the breakers,

Kemp thinks that they must have been scared off from their failed attempt at burglary, because they took nothing from the store. Cash registers are left open and empty, and a safe was undamaged and locked.

The MO (modus operandi) is identical to a recent break in at a convenience store in Belmont, where burglars got away with about \$11,000.

"This wasn't our kids from around here," said Kemp, referring to a recent string of petty thefts and burglaries in Tishom-

Authorities urge anyone with information about these break-ins to contact Tishomingo Police at 438-6302 or Belmont Police at 279-0100.

Accidental Shooting Sends One to Hospital

Saturday, a teenager was hospitalized after an accidental shooting while cleaning a gun.

January 14th, deputies responded to the North Mississippi Medical Center - Iuka, when a person was brought to the hospital in a private vehicle with an

apparent gunshot wound. According to the family, the patient, a juvenile, accidentally shot himself in the abdomen

while trying to take a .9 mm pistol apart while target practicing with his 22-year-old brother.

The 13-year-old was then transported to Le Bonheur Children's Hospital where he underwent surgery and was listed in critical condition. Authorities are treating this as an accidental shooting and no charges are being filed at this time.







Tishomingo County's Old Courthouse Museum is a major attraction for tourism with over 4,500 visitors last year from 24 states and 2 countries. The Old Courthouse Museum archives thousands of genealogical records used for research by residents of the county, state, and visitors nationwide. In addition, it is a classical museum with displays of artifacts with three primary themes: 1) Native American (Chickasaw) Indians; 2) Civil War; and 3) County-wide Cultural Heritage. The courthouse, built in 1870, is on the National Register of Historic Places; it is also a Mississippi Historical Landmark.

The Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society recently celebrated 12 years at the Old Courthouse Museum and 20 years as the county's stewards of history. «The world includes many fine private collections and archives, but as soon as those are open to the public, the museum becomes an educational institution." 

The Two Beasts In Revelation Chapter Thirteen (part III)

We are actually looking at the first beast of Revelation chapter thirteen, but we will also see the second beast in a later article. Revelation 13:3-4 says, "And I saw one of his heads as it were wounded to death; and his deadly wound was healed: and all the world wondered after the beast. And they worshiped the dragon which gave power unto the beast: and they worshiped the beast, saying, Who is like unto the beast? Who is able to make war with him?" We learned from Revelation 13:1 that the first beast (the antichrist) has seven heads, which represent seven world empires, but we see only four of those empires in Daniel chapter two and Revelation 13:1-2. This is because Daniel gave only the empires that existed in his time and those that would follow them. So there are three other empires in view in the seven heads. Because of speculation about the identity of these three empires, I will not speculate here and try to name them, since they are not clearly identified in

Scripture, as the last four are. The idea in Revelation 13:3 is that one of the kingdoms ceased to exist as a kingdom, but then it will come back into existence during the days of the tribulation. This is clearly the Roman empire and can be substantiated from Daniel chapter two and Revelation 13:1-2. Some people believe that the antichrist will be one of the Roman emperors who died and will be raised again; others believe that the antichrist himself will be killed and brought back to life. It may be hard to prove either of these, but we do have this bit of light from Revelation 17:8: "The beast that thou sawest was, and is not; and shall ascend out of the bottomless pit, and go into perdition: and they that dwell on the earth shall wonder, whose names were not written in the book of life from the foundation of the world, when they behold the beast that was, and is not, and yet is." Something has to be said about the fact that the beast ascends out of the bottomless pit, a place where Satan will be bound for a thousand years, according to Revelation 20:1. So, it may be that the antichrist is killed and brought back to life, which would explain the ascension of the beast from the bottomless pit. Admittedly, there are some things hard to understand here, but it will all be clear at some point in the future. Revelation 17:9-11 also gives more information on the seven heads of the beast, for verse 11 shows that the beast is the eighth ruler, yet he is also of the seven, so the seventh head has to be put down and brought up again, perhaps by the physical death of the antichrist. Our verse from Revelation 13:3 does say that the first beast has a deadly wound and that the deadly wound is healed. So there seems to be a death here, else there would be no reason to say in Revelation 17:8 that the first beast ascended out of the bottomless pit. There would be no reason for this beast to be in the bottomless pit, unless he had died. Keep in mind also that we are looking at a human being, yet one who is empowered and even later indwelt by the devil. There is much about angelic beings, both those who are fallen and those who are not, that we do not know. So those who speculate outside of what is written in Scripture need to label their speculations as such.

ur Mules Sam

Jerrell McNutt of Grovetown, Georgia (a native of Dennis) is sharing a collection of some of his stories about growing up in Tishomingo County with our readers.

We purchased two young unbroken mules. We named them Sam and Kate. Sam was a light gray and Kate was a dark tan. They were rather lively and full of energy but they were not wild.

Our mother was a widow woman and three of us boys and a sister did the farming. Sherben was 17, Christine 16, Orville was 13 and I was 10. In addition to going to school we took on the task of training these two young mules. Some of our neighbors allowed that these young mules would run away and hurt us boys.

Mules are very smart and learn very quickly if handled properly. We started out by working with one mule at a time. A short rope was tied around the head. Then one of us boys would lead the mule around the barn yard and down through the pasture. After several days we started using a bridle with bits. A large collar was placed around the neck next to the shoulder. Later on the full harness was added so that the mule would not get frighten by rattling chains. 
