#### Corinth Woman **Killed Friday** Night on Hwy. 350

A Corinth resident was killed late Friday night after she passed another motorist on Highway 350 just inside the Tishomingo County line.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, Brittney Nicole Moser, 27, was killed in a motor vehicle accident on eastbound Highway 350 just inside Tishomingo County about 11:10 p.m. Friday, January 20th. Wilemon said she was passing another motorist and lost control shortly after that and hit some trees. The accident was called in by the other motorist who witnessed it from behind, after Moser passed him or her in her 2005 Saturn. The accident happened near the intersection of County Road 375, said Wilemon.

She was living in Corinth, but was from Greenville, Tennessee originally. Magnolia Funeral Home in Corinth is in charge of arrangements. Her father lives in Corinth, said Wilemon.

The accident is still under investigation by the Mississippi Highway Patrol.



School.





## The Two Beasts In Revelation Chapter Thirteen

I want to write basically about the worship of the devil and the antichrist in this article, for I fear that many people may not be acquainted with what the Bible actually says about this subject. I am giving Revelation 13:3-4 again, because I need to use it for my point on devil and antichrist worship: "And I saw one of his heads as it were wounded to death; and his deadly wound was healed: and all the world wondered after the beast: And they worshiped the dragon which gave power unto the beast, and they worshiped the beast, saying, Who is like unto the beast? Who is able to



the past several decades we have heard much more about devil worship; perhaps this is the way the devil and the unsaved will prepare the world for the worship of both the devil and his antichrist. I mentioned the deadly wound of the first beast (the antichrist) in the last article, so I will not say much more about that, except that this will be the major reason for the worship of the antichrist and the devil. It will seem to the unsaved that the devil is



really in charge of life and death, since the antichrist will be wounded with a deadly wound and healed, perhaps a resurrection from the bottomless pit (see Revelation 17:8). The language in our verses above says that "all the world wondered after the beast". This means that the masses of people in the tribulation will worship the antichrist, but Revelation 13:4 also says that the world will worship the dragon, and Revelation 12:9 shows that the

In the early years of my ministry, which began in 1961, I never heard anything about devil worship, although it had been around since the fall of man. In the last several decades, however, I am hearing more and more about devil worship, with some people seemingly thinking that such worship is the "smart thing to do". The reason for devil worship in the tribulation period, which will be when the antichrist rules, is partly because of the church having been raptured, thus her influence will be gone. Yes, there will be 144,000 Jewish evangelists preaching Christ in the tribulation (Revelation chapter 7), but they will not be able to convince everybody with the truth of Christ. It is interesting that God will allow the devil and his false trinity (the devil himself, the antichrist and the false prophet) to have great power during the tribulation, especially the last half. This power will convince many people to actually worship the devil. II Thessalonians 2:6-7 shows the rapture of the church, as I understand it, then verses 8-12 says, "And then shall that wicked (one) be revealed, whom the Lord shall consume with the Spirit of His mouth, and shall destroy with the brightness of His coming: Even him whose coming is af-



## Decades of bad habit can be changed

You don't have to quit smoking alone, get free help

McDowell, Marie a retired administrative specialist for Southern Farm Bureau, has been smoking

menthol-flavored cigarettes since she was 16 years old. She started out lighting cigarettes for a friend. But that courtesy turned out to be habit forming.

"There was just one person that I use to light cigarettes for," said Mc-Dowell, now 57. "But I kept doing it and I liked it. I just got used to it and started smoking."

About three years ago, McDowell decided to stop smoking for good. But she needed help. She heard about resources provided by the Mississippi Tobacco-Free Coalition through her physical therapist. At the time, McDowell was receiving physical therapy for her leg after a recent surgery. Her doctor told her if she quit smoking she would not only feel better, but her body would respond to her medications better.

"A lot of doctors will tell you when you are on medication, especially pain meds, that you shouldn't smoke because your medicine may not have the full effect, McDowell said. "Once I started the program to quit smoking, I noticed my meds enhanced. I quit smoking in three weeks." Experts agree that

getting professional help can make a huge difference for those trying to quit smoking. The Mississippi Tobacco Quitline provides free assistance to any Mississippian who has decided to make the decision to quit smoking. Individuals can get help through phone calls, online access, and even text messages.

"If you use tobacco or an electronic nicotine delivery system, make 2017 the year you stop," said Amy Winter, Director of the Office of Tobacco Control at the Mississippi State Department of Health (MSDH). Quitting can be made

easier by calling the Mis-sissippi Tobacco Quitline at 1-800-784-8669 (1-800-QUIT-NOW). The program is free. Calls are accepted from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 9 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. on Saturday. Callers to the Quitline can speak with health care experts about tobacco's impact on health, receive advice on successful cessation and, like McDowell, get free access to counseling and medications.
